DELAWARE RIVER BASIN COMMISSION

Commission Meeting and Public Hearing

The Delaware River Basin Commission will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, February 26, 1997. The hearing will be part of the Commission's regular business meeting which is open to the public and scheduled to begin at 2 p.m. in the Goddard Conference Room of the Commission's offices at 25 State Police Drive, West Trenton, New Jersey.

An informal conference among the Commissioners and staff will be held at 11 a.m. at the same location and will include a presentation on the Christina River Basin point and nonpoint study; a demonstration on the New Castle County GIS program; discussion of proposed amendments to the Southeastern Pennsylvania Ground Water Protected Area Regulations and a review of Basin States' policies on discharges to intermittent streams.

In addition to the subjects listed below which are scheduled for public hearing at the business meeting, the Commission will also address the following matters: Minutes of the January 22, 1997 business meeting; announcements; General Counsel's report; report on Basin hydrologic conditions, a resolution concerning funding in connection with the Christina Basin study and public dialogue.

The subjects of the hearing will be as follows:

Applications for Approval of the Following Projects Under Article 10.3, Article 11 and/or Section 3.8 of the Compact.

1. *New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) D-77-20 CP (Revision No. 3).* An application to add the schedule of experimental augmented conservation releases for Cannonsville Reservoir to the current experimental augmented conservation release program of the Pepacton and Neversink Reservoirs. Along with the Cannonsville Reservoir program, the applicant requests an extension of the existing experimental augmented conservation release program for Pepacton and Neversink Reservoirs for a 3 year period. New release valves at the Cannonsville Reservoir allow a more flexible release schedule and make it feasible to reserve additional storage for thermal stress release when needed. The Neversink Reservoir is located in Sullivan County and the Cannonsville and Pepacton Reservoirs are located in Delaware County, all in New York State.

2. *Merrill Creek Owners Group (MCOG) D-77-110 CP (Amendment No. 10).* An application for inclusion of PECO Energy Company's Fairless Hills Generating Station (a 72 megawatt combustion turbine facility formerly owned by U. S. Steel and approved for operation by PECO via Docket No. D-96-63 on January 22, 1997) as a Designated Unit to Table A (Revised) of the Merrill Creek Reservoir project. This action will allow releases from the reservoir to make up consumptive water use of the plant during drought periods. MCOG expects the Fairless Hills Generating Station to have maximum monthly consumptive water uses of 385,000 gallons per day (gpd) during winter, 124,000 gpd during summer, and 324,000 gpd during spring and fall. The plant is located at the existing U. S. Steel Fairless Hills plant site in Falls Township, Bucks County, PA.

3. *Pennsylvania-American Water Company D-85-86 CP Renewal 2.* An application for the renewal of a groundwater withdrawal project, previously approved under the ownership of Pocono Farms East Water Company, to supply up to 4.68 million gallons (mg)/30 days of water to the applicant's Whispering Glen and Hickory Glen systems from well nos. 2E, 3E and 4E. Commission approval on April 24, 1991 was limited to 5 years. The applicant requests that the total withdrawal from all wells remain limited to 4.68 mg/30 days. The project is located in Coolbaugh Township, Monroe County, PA.

4. *Crystal Water Supply Company, Inc. D-86-22 CP Renewal 2.* An application for the renewal of a groundwater withdrawal project to supply up to 11.23 mg/30 days of water to the applicant's distribution system from well nos. A, B and 1. Commission approval on December 11, 1991 was limited to 5 years. The applicant requests that the total withdrawal from all wells remain limited to 11.23 mg/30 days. The project is located in the Town of Thompson, Sullivan County, NY.

5. *Lake Wynonah Municipal Authority D-91-20 CP Renewal.* An application for the renewal of a groundwater withdrawal project to supply up to 12 mg/30 days of water to the applicant's distribution system from well nos. 1, 2, 3 and 6. Commission approval on August 14, 1991 was limited to 5 years. The applicant requests that the total withdrawal from all wells remain limited to 12 mg/30 days. The project is located in South Manheim and Wayne Townships, Schuylkill County, PA.

6. *City of Coatesville Authority D-96-16 CP.* An application to amend the City of Coatesville Authority (CCA) Docket by extension of the time for compliance with Docket DECISION II.e. which requires the CCA to submit an Operating Plan for conjunctive use of its West Branch Brandywine Creek withdrawal with its multiple-source water supply system including the Rock Run and Hibernia (renamed Chambers Lake) Reservoirs. The project withdrawal is located in West Caln Township, Chester County, PA.

7. *Borough of West Grove D-96-26 CP.* An application to replace the withdrawal of water from well nos. 1 and 6 in the applicant's water supply system which has been contaminated by leakage of gasoline from an underground storage tank. The applicant requests that the withdrawal from replacement well no. 4 (Harmony Road) be limited to 4.5 mg/30 days, and that the total withdrawal from all wells remain limited to 10.8 mg/30 days. The project is located in West Grove Borough, Chester County, PA.

8. *Paunacussing Founders, Inc. D-96-42.* An application for approval of a groundwater withdrawal project to supply up to 6.0 mg/30 days of water to the applicant's Look-A-Way Golf Club from new well nos. 2 and 3, and to limit the withdrawal from all wells to 6.0 mg/30 days. The project is located in Buckingham Township, Bucks County in the Southeastern Pennsylvania Ground Water Protected Area.

9. *Fox Valley Community Services, Inc. D-96-60.* A project to modify and rerate the applicant's existing sewage treatment plant (STP) from 0.056 million gallons/day (mgd) to 0.074 mgd. The STP will continue to provide secondary biological treatment via the extended aeration activated sludge process; after modification to equalize flow (and other minor modifications), the STP will be able to increase its capacity to 0.074 mgd. The STP will continue to serve the Fox Valley residential development

in Concord Township, Delaware County, PA. The project is located in Concord Township just south of U. S. Route 1 and north of the West Branch Chester Creek to which it will continue to discharge.

10. *Simpson Paper Company D-97-3*. An application for approval of an existing combined groundwater and surface water withdrawal project to supply up to 60 mg/30 days of water to the applicant's paper mill from existing well nos. 1 and 2 and Bubbling Springs, and to limit the withdrawal from the wells to 42 mg/30 days, and from Bubbling Springs to 60 mg/30 days. The project withdrawals are located in Whitmarsh Township, Montgomery County in the Southeastern Pennsylvania Ground Water Protected Area. Bubbling Springs is situated on

Spring Mill Run, a tributary of the Schuylkill River.

APPLICATIONS

The following parties have applied for an NPDES permit to discharge controlled wastewaters into the surface waters of this Commonwealth. Unless otherwise indicated on the basis of preliminary review and application of lawful standard and regulations, the Department of Environmental Protection proposes to issue a permit to discharge, subject to certain effluent limitations and special conditions. These proposed determinations are tentative.

Where indicated, the EPA, Region III, Regional Administrator has waived the right to review or object to this proposed permit action under the waiver provision 40 CFR 123.6E.

Persons wishing to comment on the proposed permit are invited to submit a statement to the office noted above the application within 30 days from the date of this public notice. Comments received within this 30-day period will be considered in the formulation of the final determinations regarding this application. Responses should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based. A public hearing may be held if the responsible office considers the public response significant.

Following the 30-day comment period, the Water Management Program Manager will make a final determination regarding the proposed permit. Notice of this determination will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at which time this determination may be appealed to the Environmental Hearing Board.

The application and related documents, proposed effluent limitations and special conditions, comments received and other information are on file and may be inspected and arrangements made for copying at the office indicated above the application.

Municipalities awarded grants will receive a base award of \$5 for each approved ton of eligible recyclable materials marketed, and a bonus award of \$1 per approved ton for each percentage of municipal waste calculated by DEP to be diverted from disposal. The weight of eligible materials allowable from nonresidential (commercial and institutional) sources will be limited to no more than the weight

of approved eligible materials from residential sources. The Department will not award grants calculated to be less than \$10.

Eligible materials include postconsumer: clear glass, colored glass, aluminum, steel and bimetallic cans, high-grade office paper, newsprint, corrugated paper, other marketable grades of paper, and plastics. Grants will be awarded only for properly documented, eligible materials that were actually marketed on or after January 1, 1996, to and including December 31, 1996. Grant funds will not be awarded for residues, materials not listed as eligible including, but not limited to, leaf and yard wastes, or any materials which cannot be documented as being recycled into a new product or use.

Documentation to support all claims that eligible recyclable materials were generated within the municipality and marketed must be retained at the offices of the municipal applicant for 4 years from the end date of the year the application covers. The supporting documentation is not required to be submitted with the application.

Acceptable Supporting Documentation: Weight slips or receipts verifying that the materials were recycled or marketed are required as supporting documentation for the grant application. The documentation must include: 1) the date the materials were recycled/

marketed; and, 2) the type of material recycled/marketed; and 3) the name of the municipality where the material was generated; and, 4) the weight, stated in pounds or tons, of the material recycled/marketed. Documentation supporting materials source separated from municipal waste by commercial/institutional establishments and recycled/marketed must bear the name of the establishment and the municipality where the establishment is located. This information must be contained on one of the following: 1) a weight/market receipt; or, 2) a report submitted by the hauler or market vendor on its company letterhead; or, 3) a signed report submitted by the hauler or market vendor, which clearly indicates the name of the company who collected the material or the name of the market vendor, as well as the name, title and signature of the company official who completed the report. Reports may be submitted on annual, monthly, weekly or other time period format. All information must be legible.

Estimates of weight will not be accepted except in cases where: 1) the material is packaged in uniform bales and the average weight of a bale can be demonstrated and supported by weight receipts, and a record of the number of bales was provided by the market vendors; or when, 2) multiple generators contribute to a known quantity of marketed material, and the hauler or market estimates the quantities attributable to any individual establishment or municipality, and verifies the estimate with a signature.

Supporting documentation must be available for review by representatives of the Department of Environmental Protection, the Office of the Attorney General and the Office of the Treasurer. Although the supporting documentation is not required to be submitted with the grant application, any documentation provided must conform to the above requirements or the materials claimed will not be credited toward the grant award.

Grant applications must be on forms provided by the Department for calendar year 1996. Grant applications must be delivered by 3 p.m., September 30, 1997, or postmarked on or before that day. Applications received by the Department after the deadline will be returned to the applicant. Individual Permits for Sewage Sludge Land Application Under Chapter 275

On January 25, 1997, new regulations relating to the land application of sewage sludge and the beneficial use of municipal waste were published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* as final.

The new regulations allow the Department to issue general permits immediately for the beneficial use of

municipal waste other than sewage sludge. The new sewage sludge general permit authority will be effective on May 27, 1997. This allows the Department time to finalize the sewage sludge land application general permits, which are now available in draft for comment.

The Department may continue to issue individual permits for sewage sludge land application under Chapter 275 regulations, under May 27, 1997. After May 27, 1997, the Department will be able to issue individual permits under Chapter 271, Subchapter J of the recently revised regulations published at 27 Pa.B. 521 (January 25, 1997). Please contact the appropriate Regional Office to determine the best way to proceed with an application during the transition period to provide sufficient time for technical review and public comment.

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) and Fairmont Products have agreed to an amendment of the settlement in the above matter. The original settlement agreement dated January 17, 1996 was approved by the Environmental Hearing Board by an order dated February 1, 1996. The original agreement required, among other things, that Fairmont Products would present to the Department a request for a thermal variance under 25 Pa. Code § 97.82 and section 316 of The Clean Water Act (33 U.C.S.A. § 1326). Fairmont would conduct a thermal profile of the receiving stream and a biological survey of the creek. On or before January 31, 1997, Fairmont would submit to the Department a final report concerning the proposed alternate effluent limits.

Additionally, Fairmont was obligated to evaluate its housekeeping practices and/or its management of its heat discharge at the Belleville facility, to identify and characterize problems in controlling and limiting any wide variations in its heat discharge. On or before January 31, 1997, Fairmont was obligated to submit to the Department, for the Department's approval, its recommendations, if any, concerning modifications to its housekeeping practices and/or its management of the facility's heat discharge.

Fairmont conducted thermal monitoring of the receiving stream in 1996, but because of high flow conditions in the receiving stream caused by winter precipitation, it was not able to complete a thermal profile. To enable the Department to determine whether Fairmont has successfully demonstrated that alternate thermal effluent limitations will not adversely impact the indigenous aquatic community in the receiving stream, the amendment provides that in 1997 Fairmont will conduct an additional thermal profile of the receiving stream, and in 1998 it will submit it as part of its report to the Department.

Fairmont conducted a review of its housekeeping practices and/or its thermal discharge in 1996, but intends to introduce a new product use this year. The parties believe that it would be beneficial for the proper management of the thermal discharge at the Belleville facility for Fairmont to evaluate its housekeeping practices and/or its management of its heat discharge at the Belleville facility in 1997, and to identify and characterize problems in controlling and limiting any wide variations in the heat discharge.

The parties have agreed to amend the settlement agreement. The major provisions of the amendment include:

1. From early August, 1997 until November, 1997, Fairmont shall implement the thermal profile sampling at each station of the receiving stream.

2. On or before January 31, 1998, Fairmont shall submit to the Department a final report concerning the proposed alternate thermal effluent limitations. The report shall contain the results of the thermal profile sampling and a biological assessment of the receiving stream.

3. Additionally, Fairmont shall evaluate its housekeeping practices and/or its management of its heat discharge at the Belleville facility, to identify and characterize problems in controlling and limiting any wide variations in its heat discharges.

4. On or before January 31, 1998, Fairmont shall also submit to the Department, for the Department's approval, its recommendations, if any, concerning modifications to its housekeeping practices and/or its management of the facility's heat discharge.

5. On or before March 31, 1998, the Department will notify Fairmont of the Department's determination whether Fairmont has successfully demonstrated that such alternate thermal effluent limitations will not adversely impact the indigenous aquatic community in the receiving stream.

Department of Transportation—Minimum Standards for Fixed Base Operations; Doc. No. 18-322

Order

On October 4, 1994, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Department of Transportation (Department). This rulemaking would create 67 Pa. Code Chapter 476, establishing minimum standards for fixed base operators (FBO) at state-owned airports. The authority for this regulation is contained in section 5103(a) of the Aviation Code (74 Pa.C.S. § 5103(a)). The proposed regulation was published in the October 15, 1994 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, with a 30-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on November 14, 1996. Because the standing committees of the General Assembly did not have their full 20 days to review the regulation prior to the *sine die*

adjournment, the Department was required to resubmit the final regulation on January 27, 1997, under section 5(c) of the Regulatory Review Act.

The regulation applies to FBOs at Harrisburg International Airport and Capital City Airport. The other State-owned airport, Grand Canyon Airport, is not covered by this regulation. According to the Department, the minimum standards established in this regulation do not apply to Grand Canyon because it is presently leased to one airport operator who meets all of the needs of current airport users.

The proposed regulation sets the minimum facility requirements for both Harrisburg International Airport and Capital City Airport. An FBO providing service at Harrisburg International shall provide a minimum of 50,000 square feet of aircraft parking and 10,000 square feet for automobile parking. An FBO at Capital City Airport shall provide a minimum of 40,000 square feet for aircraft parking and 10,000 square feet of automobile parking. An FBO at either airport must provide a building that contains a lounge, public restrooms, training and flight planning offices of at least 2,000 square feet, and a hangar of at least 10,000 square feet.

An FBO must provide aircraft fuel and oil dispensing services, aircraft parking services and hangar storage services. Additionally, an FBO must provide two of the following services: airframe and power plant service; radio and instrument service; air taxi and charter services; flight training services; or ground handling services.

The regulation requires any person desiring to provide fixed base operations to submit a written request to the Department indicating its interest in becoming an FBO. The Department, within 30 days, must respond to this request. Once a written request to conduct fixed base operations is granted by the Department, the FBO and the Department will enter into a written agreement in accordance with the requirements established in this rulemaking. Current agreements between FBOs and the Department are not affected by the requirements established in this chapter until the agreements terminate.

According to the Department, the regulation will not increase costs to either itself or any FBO. Instead, the regulation provides minimum standards for services provided to airport users. Establishing the minimum standards in regulation assures that all FBOs will meet the same requirements. The Department states that this should result in more competition among FBOs and should assure better, quality service.

There is currently only one FBO at both Harrisburg International Airport and Capital City Airport. Their current agreements will not be affected by this rulemaking. However, once their agreements expire, the FBOs must follow the procedures and meet the standards contained in the rulemaking in order to continue to operate.

Our major comment on the proposed rulemaking questioned the need for the regulation. We believed that the minimum standards contained in the regulation could be more appropriately contained in a request for proposal (RFP) since the standards only apply to an FBO that contracts with the Department to provide services. Regulations are more appropriate for situations which apply to multiple locations and govern multiple parties. In this rulemaking, the Department sets different standards for two of its airports and no standards at its third airport. The standards set for each airport would only apply to a

few entities since each airport may only need 2—5 FBOs. Therefore, we questioned the need for establishing the minimum standards by regulation and recommended the Department consider using the RFP process instead.

In response, the Department provided several reasons for the need to proceed with the regulation. First, the Department cited the Office of Budget's Manual for contracting services where it states that an RFP "will be used to obtain consultant, professional and other services when the work statement is detailed, the agency is seeking a contractor's solution to a management problem, and/or criteria, in addition to cost, will be used in evaluating proposals." Under this guidance, the Department believes it is inappropriate to use the RFP process since FBOs do not provide service to the Department. Instead, FBOs are tenants of the Department who provide services to airport users.

Second, the Department indicated that the RFP process would make it difficult to turn down applicants who wish to pick and choose the types of services they wish to provide. The ability of an FBO to provide a less capital intensive service, such as fueling, does not provide a level playing field with those FBOs who provide a full complement of services requiring more capital investment. In order to establish a level playing field, the Department believes it must require all FBOs to provide minimum services to assure that the more capital intensive services are provided. By establishing minimum standards in a regulation, the Department will have a binding norm that all potential applicants can review to determine if they may be eligible to provide services, as well as the process that will be used to make a decision on the application. In addition, the minimum standards also ensure that each FBO meets applicable safety standards.

Third, the Department observed that the regulation sets standards that are similar to the requirements at other airports, none of which utilize an RFP process to select FBOs. These airports include Reading Regional Airport, Johnstown-Cambria County Airport, Lancaster Airport, Hazleton Municipal Airport, Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Airport, and Northeast Philadelphia Airport.

Finally, the Department wrote to the FBOs at Capital City and at Harrisburg International Airport regarding the use of an RFP process instead of establishing a regulation. Both FBOs indicated that they supported using a regulation instead of the RFP process.

We still believe that the Department could have set these minimum standards via an RFP because it only deals with two locations and will only be used by a few FBOs. However, we believe that the Department has justified the use of a regulation to establish the standards and we defer to their judgment that a regulation will be administratively easier. However, we recommend that the Department carefully review the implementation of the regulation to ensure that it is an efficient process to establish FBO agreements at state-owned airports. If the regulation creates unnecessary barriers for FBO services at Commonwealth-operated airports, the Department should amend the regulation accordingly or again consider the use of an RFP process.

A second significant concern with the regulation arose when the Department initially submitted the final-form regulation in September of 1996. Upon our review of the regulation, we notified the Department we had a concern with the lack of specific criteria the Department would use to accept or reject an application. Specifically, the regulation merely provided that the Department could

establish internal review procedures to evaluate the applications and that the Department had the total discretion in the selection or rejection of the application. The regulation did not give any notice or indication as to what criteria would be employed. We believed the regulation should include the criteria used to review applications to provide notice to the affected parties and ensure consistent and fair review of the applications. The Department agreed that such language was necessary and withdrew the regulation to make the amendments.

The resubmitted final-form regulation contains the criteria that will be employed to review applications. We believe the inclusion of the criteria will insure a fair and consistent process for the evaluation of FBOs.

We have reviewed this regulation and find it to be in the public interest. The regulation will establish minimum standards for FBO services that will be easily understood and available to all potential FBOs. The establishment of the standards will also ensure that all FBOs are providing safe and adequate service at State-owned airports.

Therefore, It Is Ordered That:

1. Regulation No. 18-322 from the Department of Transportation, as submitted to the Commission on January 27, 1997, is approved; and
2. The Commission will transmit a copy of this Order to the Legislative Reference Bureau.
