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Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania*

Bulletin before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva-nia Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 et seq. Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

Reproduction, Dissemination or Publication of Information

Third parties may not take information from the *Pennsylvania Code* and *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and reproduce, disseminate or publish such information except as provided by 1 Pa. Code § 3.44. 1 Pa. Code § 3.44 reads as follows:

§ 3.44. General permission to reproduce content of Code and Bulletin.

Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

Local Custody Rules; No. 12063 of 1999

Order

And Now, this 22nd day of December, 1999, all Local Custody Rules heretofore adopted are rescinded effective the date the new Rules are effective. The new Local Custody Rules, which follow hereto, are hereby adopted.

This Order and the new Local Custody Rules shall be effective thirty (30) days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The Court Administrator of Beaver County shall submit seven (7) certified copies of this Order and the attachments to the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, two (2) certified copies to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, one (1) certified copy to the Civil Procedural Rules Committee of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court and one (1) copy to the Prothonotary of Beaver County to be kept for public inspection and copying.

Local Rule 1915.26

- 1. When a claim for custody, partial custody or visitation is made in a Complaint or a subsequent Petition (including Petition(s) for Contempt of a prior Order) or Counterclaim, such pleading shall be substantially in the form provided by The Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure. Said pleading shall also have attached thereto an Order of Court referring the claim to a Child Custody Conference Officer for a Conciliation Conference. The moving party shall:
- a. First secure a date and time for the Conciliation Conference from the Court Administrator's Office;
- b. Secure the signature of the Judge on the scheduling Order of Court before the close of Court on the same day the date and time are secured from the Court Administrator's Office:
- c. File the original pleading and Order in the Prothonotary's Office;
- d. Deposit a clocked copy of the pleading and Order with the Court Administrator's Office, who shall forward the same to the Child Custody Conference Officer, and
- e. Serve a clocked copy of the pleading and Order on counsel of record and/or unrepresented parties, with proof of service to be filed in the Prothonotary's Office, and a copy of the proof of service to be provided to the Child Custody Conference Officer at or prior to the time set for the Conference.
- 2. The Child Custody Conference Officer will convene a Conciliation Conference, as scheduled by the Court, which Conference shall be attended by the parties and their legal counsel, if any. Before counsel appears before the Child Custody Conference Officer, counsel must enter his/her Appearance on the record in the Prothonotary's Office, provide notice to all opposing counsel or party(ies)

and have proof of entry of Appearance available at the Conference. Counsel for the parties, or the parties themselves if unrepresented, are to provide true and correct copies of any exhibits to be shown to the Child Custody Conference Officer at the Conference, to counsel for the opposing party or to the opposing party if unrepresented, at least five (5) days prior to the scheduled Conference. Failure to comply may, at the discretion of the Child Custody Conference Officer, result in the exclusion of the exhibit from consideration, the rescheduling of the Conference to allow the opposing party an opportunity to respond or other action deemed appropriate by the Child Custody Conference Officer, keeping in mind the Officer's need to evaluate the best interest of the child(ren). The parties, counsel and the Child Custody Conference Officer, as mediator or conciliator, shall make a good-faith effort to resolve the issues and reach agreement on custody, partial custody and/or visitation. The Child Custody Conference Officer shall conduct the Conciliation Conference as an informational and conciliatory proceeding rather than confrontational or adversarial.

No scheduled Custody Conference shall be rescheduled by any party or counsel without the prior expressed consent of the opposing party or counsel or Order of Court issued after appropriate notice to the opposing party or counsel.

- 3. If the parties reach agreement, the Child Custody Conference Officer shall submit an Agreed Order to the Court bearing the written consents, evidenced by signatures of the parties and their counsel, if any. Neither the parties nor counsel need to appear before the Court for the Court's approval of the Agreed Order.
- 4. If, for any reason, the parties do not reach agreement, the Child Custody Conference Officer shall file a written report with the Court within five (5) business days, unless otherwise extended by agreement of counsel, or the parties if unrepresented. The report shall be in a narrative form and shall include the positions of the parties, proposed settlements of the parties, if any, and the recommendation of the Child Custody Conference Officer, together with reasoning for the recommendations and either a Proposed Order or a proposed Temporary Order. Upon receipt and review of the report, the Court shall issue a Proposed Order or a Temporary Order and promptly provide a copy thereof, together with a copy of the Child Custody Conference Officer's report, except for that portion of the report relating to comments from the minor child(ren), to counsel for the parties, or the parties themselves if not represented by counsel.
- 5. A Proposed Order shall be entered as a Final Order unless Exceptions thereto are filed by either party within twenty (20) days after the effective date set forth in the Proposed Order. Exceptions may also be filed to a Temporary Order at any time during the existence of the Temporary Order, but the Court will decide whether the Exceptions will be remanded back to the Child Custody Conference Officer for further proceedings and recommendation or set down by the court for a Pre-Hearing Conference as provided for herein. The Court may Order, in any given case, that should Exceptions be filed, the Proposed Order shall be effective as a Temporary Order pending further Order of Court.
- 6. Exceptions to the Proposed Order or Temporary Order must be in writing and must state, with particularity, the portion(s) of the Order objected to. The Exceptions

must be filed with the Prothonotary, and copies thereof must be delivered forthwith to the Presiding Judge's Chambers, as well as to all counsel and/or unrepresented parties of record.

- 7. Simultaneously with the Exceptions, a Certificate of Readiness for Trial shall be filed with the Prothonotary and a copy thereof delivered to the Presiding Judge's Chambers, as well as to all counsel and/or unrepresented parties of record. The Certificate of Readiness for Trial shall contain an estimate of trial time.
- 8. Upon receipt of the Exceptions and the Certificate of Readiness for Trial, the Court will schedule a Pre-Hearing Conference to be attended by all counsel and parties, whether represented by counsel or not. A Pre-Hearing Conference with the Court will be scheduled in every case and will be waived only with the consent of the Court.
- 9. No later than five (5) days prior to the date scheduled for Pre-Hearing Conference, each attorney and each party not represented by counsel must file a completed Pre-Hearing Information Statement, on or in a form approved by the Court, at the Presiding Judge's Chambers, with copies provided to opposing counsel and/or unrepresented parties of record.
- 10. Failure of any party, having primary physical custody of a child, to appear at a scheduled Child Custody Conference or Pre-Hearing Conference will result in the scheduling of the matter for a Hearing before the Court and may result in imposition of sanctions by the Court.
- 11. Failure of any party, not having primary physical custody of a child, to appear at a scheduled Child Custody Conference or Pre-Hearing Conference will result in the Court's entry of a Proposed Final Order or a Temporary Order, as the Court determines to be warranted under the circumstances found to be present.
- 12. Any party applying to the Court for special relief must comply with Rule 1915.13 Pa.R.C.P. and with Rule L206B of the Local Rules of Civil Procedure.
- 13. Any party filing Preliminary Objections raising issues of jurisdiction or venue of the court to act, shall, concurrently with filing the same with the Prothonotary, deliver a true and correct copy of the Preliminary Objections to the Judge assigned to handle Custody matters and to opposing counsel and/or to any party not represented by counsel. The Judge will schedule the matter for Argument on a priority schedule to dispose of the issues as expeditiously as possible.
- 14. In order to facilitate compliance with the requirements of the Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction Act, a party shall provide the Court with all known information concerning a Custody proceeding pending in another state which involves the same parties or children.

Note

In particular, the Court should be informed of the following: (1) the name and address of the Court in which such case is pending; (2) the caption of such case; (3) the name, address and telephone number of the Judge to whom the case might have been assigned, and (4) any Orders entered in such case. Information provided under this Rule should be submitted in writing and attached to the Complaint/Petition.

Local Rule 1915.27

Any individual who is referred under Neighborhood Legal Services Association's Pro Bono or Reduced-Fee Programs to a participating member of the Beaver County Bar Association for representation as a litigant in a Custody Action and who is certified by NLSA to be income eligible under Legal Services regulations, shall be granted leave to proceed In Forma Pauperis. Counsel representing these individuals shall present to the Prothonotary a Praecipe for Permission to Proceed In Forma Pauperis, which shall be endorsed by counsel, and which shall have attached to it a Certificate of Eligibility prepared by NLSA. The Praecipe shall substantially conform to the attached sample.

Any participating member of the Beaver County Bar Association who provides representation to a Custody litigant on a Motion for Special Relief or at a Child Custody Conference pursuant to a referral from NLSA's Pro Bono or Reduced-Fee Programs, shall be permitted to enter a Limited Appearance. The Praecipe for Entry of Limited Appearance shall substantially conform to the attached sample.

Upon completion of the representation under the above-described referral programs, the attorney shall file a Praecipe for Withdrawal of Limited Appearance. This Praecipe shall be filed without leave of Court, and it shall not be required to, but may, contain information about another attorney who may be entering his/her Appearance at the same time. This Praecipe shall direct the Prothonotary to send all future notices directly to the client and shall set forth the client's last-known address. The Praecipe for Withdrawal of Limited Appearance shall substantially conform to the attached sample.

Local Rule 1915.28

Educational Seminary Pertaining to Children of Divorcing Parents

All parties to Custody Actions filed on or after June 1, 1994 where the interests of children under the age of eighteen (18) years are involved, shall, unless excused by the Court, complete a program which we have entitled the Educational Seminar Pertaining to Children of Divorcing Parents (the "Seminar").

All parties shall register for the first available Seminar after the date the Defendant has been served with process. Counsel for the Plaintiff shall require the Plaintiff to register for the Seminar and shall have a copy of the attached Notice and Registration Form served on the Defendant at the same time as the Complaint.

Failure of a party to successfully complete the Seminar will result in sanctions by the Court, including Contempt.

Every Complaint in Custody shall set forth in a separate attached statement, the names, addresses and telephone numbers of the parties, and the names and ages of all children under the age of eighteen (18) years. This Rule shall become effective not less than thirty (30) days after the date of publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Title 31—INSURANCE DEPARTMENT

INSURANCE DEPARTMENT
[31 PA CODE CH. 113]
Consent to Rate Filings

The Insurance Department (Department) hereby deletes Chapter 113, Subchapter A (relating to consent to rate filings) to read as set forth in Annex A.

Statutory Authority

The final-form rulemaking is adopted under the authority of sections 206, 506, 1501 and 1502 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. §§ 66, 186, 411 and 412) and the Property and Casualty Filing Reform Act (40 P. S. §§ 710-1—710-19).

Comments and Response

Notice of proposed rulemaking was published at 29 Pa.B. 4446 (August 21, 1999) with a 30-day comment period. During the 30-day comment period, no comments were received. During its regulatory review, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) did not submit comments to the Department.

Affected Parties

The deletion of these sections will affect all insurers who are licensed to sell property and casualty insurance in this Commonwealth.

Fiscal Impact

State Government

There will be no increase in cost to the Department due to the deletion of Chapter 113.

General Public

There will be no fiscal impact to the public.

Political Subdivisions

The rulemaking will not impose additional costs on political subdivisions.

Private Sector

Insurance companies that do business in this Commonwealth and write property and casualty insurance policies using the consent to rate provision will not be required to submit the consent to rate form to the Department; thereby, saving the companies expenses associated with preparing and filing the consent to rate form.

Paperwork

The deletion of these sections is expected to decrease paperwork requirements for the affected parties because the deletion eliminates unnecessary reporting requirements for the insurance industry.

Effectiveness/Sunset Date

The rulemaking will become effective upon final publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Because the rulemaking proposes to delete obsolete regulations, no sunset date has been assigned.

Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5(a)), on August 10, 1999, the Department submitted a copy of the rulemaking published at 29 Pa.B. 4446 to IRRC and to the Chairpersons of the Senate Banking and Insurance Committee and the House Insurance Committee for review and comment. In addition to the submitted rulemaking, the Department has provided IRRC and the Committees with a copy of a detailed Regulatory Analysis Form prepared by the Department in compliance with Executive Order 1996-1, "Regulatory Review and Promulgation." A copy of that material is available to the public upon request.

In preparing this final-form rulemaking, the Department considered all comments received from IRRC, the Committees and the public. This final-form rulemaking was deemed approved by the House and Senate Committees on December 13, 1999. In accordance with section 5.1(d) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5a(d)), IRRC met on December 16, 1999, and the rulemaking was deemed approved in accordance with section 5.1(e) of the Regulatory Review Act.

Findings

The Commissioner finds that:

- (1) Public notice of intention to adopt this rulemaking as amended by this order has been given under sections 201 and 202 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P. L. 769, No. 240) (45 P. S. §§ 1201 and 1202) and the regulations thereunder, 1 Pa. Code §§ 7.1 and 7.2.
- (2) The adoption of this rulemaking in the manner provided in this order is necessary and appropriate for the administration and enforcement of the authorizing statutes.

Order

The Commissioner, acting under the authorizing statutes, orders that:

- (a) The regulations of the Department, 31 Pa. Code, Chapter 113, are amended by deleting §§ 113.1—113.9 to read as set forth at 29 Pa.B. 4446.
- (b) The Commissioner shall submit this order and 29 Pa.B. 4446 to the Office of General Counsel and Office of Attorney General for approval as to form and legality as required by law.
- (c) The Commissioner shall certify this order and 29 Pa.B. 4446 and deposit them with the Legislative Reference Bureau as required by law.

(d) The order shall take effect upon final publication in the $\ensuremath{\textit{Pennsylvania Bulletin}}.$

PART IV. LIFE INSURANCE

CHAPTER 84C. VALUATION OF LIFE INSURANCE POLICIES

§ 84c.4. Segmented and unitary reserve methods.

(b) *Contract segmentation method*. The contract segmentation method is the method of dividing the period from issue to mandatory expiration of a policy into successive segments. The segments shall be calculated as

follows:

Year 2000 Dog Control Facility Bill Reimbursement Grant Program

The Department of Agriculture (Department) gives notice of the guidelines and conditions under which it will award up to \$100,000 in grants under its Year 2000 Dog Control Facility Bill Reimbursement Program (Program). The Program will award bill reimbursement grants of up to \$7,500-per-recipient to humane societies or associations for the prevention of cruelty to animals that meet the guidelines and conditions of this Program. The Program will be funded from the Dog Law Restricted Account, from funds which are surplus funds for the limited purposes set forth in the Dog Law (3 P. S. § 459-1002(b)).

A proposed version of these guidelines and conditions was published at 29 Pa.B. 6028 (November 27, 1999). The Department invited public and legislative review of these proposed guidelines and conditions, in accordance with the regulation at 7 Pa. Code § 23.4 (relating to guidelines and conditions). Comments were received from the Pennsylvania Legislative Animal Network (PLAN), the Humane Society of Harrisburg Area, Inc., the Pennsylvania Federation of Dog Clubs, Inc., the Bucks County Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals and the Clearfield County SPCA. The comments and the Department's responses are summarized as follows:

PLAN and the Humane Society of Harrisburg Area, Inc., recommended the definition of "Humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals" in section 1 (relating to definitions) be revised by deleting the word "otherwise." The Department declines to implement this recommendation. The definition addresses the possibility the statutory definition of "Humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals" could be amended while the Program is in effect. If that occurs, the revised statutory definition—rather than the definition set forth in these guidelines and conditions—shall apply.

The Humane Society of Harrisburg Area, Inc., noted that the eligibility requirements set forth in section 2 would disqualify a humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals from consideration for a grant under the Program if that organization has an annual budget of over \$150,000. The commentator stated that dog control facilities with annual budgets of over \$150,000 might have as much need of grant funds as facilities with annual budgets of less than \$150,000. The commentator also explained that the closure of one of these larger-budget facilities would have more of an adverse impact upon the Department's dog control efforts than would the closure of a smaller-budget facility. The Department declines to revise the eligibility criteria for grants under the Program. The Program is intended to target grant funds to those smaller dog control facilities that make a contribution to the Department's dog control efforts and are in greatest need of grant funds. The Department believes the \$150,000 annual budget cap is a reasonable distinction by which to determine eligibility for Program grant funds.

PLAN suggested the eligibility requirements set forth in section 2 be revised to include " \dots shelters that have a

staggering debt, even though they may have an operating budget in excess of \$150,000." The Department believes that any eligibility criteria which would obligate the Department to verify or track the debt burden of an applicant would be too cumbersome to be workable.

The Pennsylvania Federation of Dog Clubs, Inc., noted that section 2(c) of the proposed guidelines and conditions (relating to eligibility) required an applicant facility to have accepted at least 100 stray dogs into the facility within the year preceding the application. The commentator further noted that the Dog Law (3 P. S. § 459-1201) provides that cities of the first class, second class and second class A are responsible for dog control within their respective borders, and further provides that cities of the third class have the option to assume this responsibility. Against this backdrop, the commentator suggested section 2(c) be revised to require an applicant facility to have accepted at least 100 stray dogs originating from localities other than cities of the first class, second class or second class A, or cities of the third class that have assumed dog control responsibilities under the Dog Law. The Department accepts this comment and has revised section 2(c) in the final guidelines and conditions accordingly.

PLAN, the Bucks County Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals and the Clearfield County SPCA recommended the maximum grant amount be raised from the \$5,000 amount set forth in section 3 (relating to use of grant funds) of the proposed guidelines and conditions. PLAN and the Bucks County Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals suggested this cap be raised to \$7,500, while the Clearfield County SPCA recommended a cap of \$10,000. The Department considered these comments and revised the final guidelines and conditions to increase the maximum grant amount to \$7,500.

PLAN recommended section 6(d) (relating to termination) be revised to clarify that termination of a grant agreement releases the parties from their respective contractual obligations under that agreement. The Department believes the language of section 6(d) is sufficiently specific in this regard, and declines to implement the commentator's recommendation.

The Department invites applications for grants under the Program, in accordance with the final guidelines and conditions which follow.

Guidelines and Conditions for the Year 2000 Dog Control Facility Bill Reimbursement Grant Program

1. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in these guidelines and conditions, have the following meanings:

Department—The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture.

Dog control—The apprehending, holding and disposing of stray or unwanted dogs, or as otherwise defined in the Dog Law (3 Pa.C.S. § 459-102).

Eligible Bill—A document seeking payment for materials, services or utilities from a grant recipient, setting forth the following:

- i. The date the document is issued.
- ii. The name and address of the humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals to which the bill is issued.

- iii. If for materials, a description of the materials and the date of delivery.
- iv. If for services, a description of the nature of the services and the dates upon which the services were rendered.
- v. If for utilities (such as electricity, water, sewer, waste disposal and similar purposes), a statement of the period for which the utility for which payment is sought was provided.
- vi. The name, address and telephone number of the entity issuing the document.

Humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals—A nonprofit society or association duly incorporated under 15 Pa.C.S. Ch. 53 Subch. A (relating to incorporation generally) for the purpose of prevention of cruelty to animals, or as otherwise defined in the Dog Law.

Program—The Year 2000 Dog Control Facility Bill Reimbursement Program.

2. Eligibility.

A humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals is eligible to apply to receive a grant under the Program if that humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals:

- a. Has been in operation for at least 1 year immediately preceding the application date.
- b. Has performed dog control functions for at least 1 year immediately preceding the application date.
- c. Has, in the performance of its dog control functions, accepted at least 100 stray or unwanted dogs into its facility within the year immediately preceding the application date, with at least 100 of these dogs originating from locations other than the following:
 - i. A city of the first class.
 - ii. A city of the second class.
 - iii. A city of the second class A.
- iv. A city of the third class that has adopted its own dog licensing ordinance and assumed responsibility enforcement under the Dog Law.
- d. Is not a party to a contract with the Department under which the Department pays that humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals for dog control activities performed in the year 2000.
- e. Agrees—as a condition of receiving any grant money under the Program—to continue to perform dog control activities through the year 2000.
- f. Has a total operating budget of \$150,000 or less for the 2000 calendar year or, if its budget is on a basis other than calendar year, has a total operating budget of \$150,000 or less for each fiscal year comprising any portion of calendar year 2000.

3. Use of Grant Funds.

The Department will allocate a specific maximum grant amount to a successful grant applicant through a written grant agreement. This maximum grant amount will be specified in the grant agreement, and will not exceed \$7,500 with respect to an application. The maximum grant amount will be retained by the Department and used to reimburse the grant recipient for eligible bills the grant recipient has paid with respect to materials, services or utilities provided to the grant recipient from January 1, 2000 through December 31, 2000. The total

reimbursement the Department will pay a grant recipient will not exceed the maximum grant amount. Any money remaining in a grant allocation beyond the termination date of the grant agreement will lapse into the Dog Law Restricted Account. If a bill covers materials, services or utilities provided, in whole or in part, before January 1, 2000 or after December 31, 2000, that bill is not an eligible bill and will not be reimbursed by the Department under the Program.

4. Application Process.

- a. Application required. A humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals seeking a grant under the Program must complete a written application form and deliver it to the Department no later than February 14, 2000. Applications received by the Department beyond that date will not be considered.
- b. Obtaining an application form. The Department will provide grant application forms upon request. Requests for application forms should be directed to Richard Hess, Director, Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement, Department of Agriculture, 2301 North Cameron Street, Harrisburg, PA 17110-9408; telephone: (717) 787-4833, Fax: (717) 772-4352
- c. Contents of grant application form. A grant application form shall require the following information:
 - i. The name and address of the applicant.
- ii. Information to verify that the applicant is a humane society or association for the prevention of cruelty to animals and otherwise meets the eligibility requirements set forth in paragraph 2, above.
- iii. The maximum grant amount sought by the applicant—not to exceed \$7,500.
- iv. A description of the eligible bills for which the grant applicant intends to seek reimbursement, including a description (and copies, if available) of bills received by the applicant in 1999 for the same type of materials, services or utilities for which reimbursement will be sought under the grant agreement.
- v. Other information the Department might reasonably require.
 - 5. Review and approval of grant application.
- a. Review and notification. The Department will review each timely grant application and provide the applicant written notification of whether the Department awards the grant, denies the grant or awards a grant in some amount less than the applicant sought. This written notification will be mailed no later than February 29, 2000, to the address provided by the applicant on the grant application form. If an application is incomplete or the Department requires additional information or documentation to evaluate the grant request, it will so advise the applicant.
- b. *Review criteria*. The Department will consider the following, among other factors, in determining whether to award a grant application:
- i. The number of applications received and the availability of funds for the grants sought.
- ii. The relative contribution of the applicant to dog control activities in the area it serves.
- iii. The relative contribution of the applicant to dog control as compared to the relative contribution of other applicants.

- iv. The relative importance of the grant to the continued operation of the applicant's dog control facility.
- v. The expense or logistical difficulty the Department would encounter if the applicant's dog control facility was no longer in operation.
 - 6. Grant agreement.
- a. Grant agreement required. A successful grant applicant must execute a grant agreement with the Department, setting forth the terms and conditions under which the grant money will be used by the Department to reimburse the grant recipient for payment of eligible bills.
- b. Reimbursement requests. The grant agreement will set forth the exact procedure by which a grant recipient shall seek reimbursement from the Department for payment of eligible bills. The basic reimbursement request procedure will be as follows:
 - By May 15, 2000 the grant recipient will:
- (1) Deliver copies of the eligible bills it has paid between January 1 and April 30, 2000.
- (2) Verify that these bills have been paid and are eligible for reimbursement.
- (3) Provide a detailed report of the dog control activities performed by the successful applicant during the referenced 4-month period.
 - By September 15, 2000 the grant recipient will:
- (1) Deliver copies of the eligible bills it has paid between May 1 and August 31, 2000.

- (2) Verify that these bills have been paid and are eligible for reimbursement.
- (3) Provide a detailed report of the dog control activities performed by the successful applicant during the referenced 4-month period.
 - By January 15, 2001 the grant recipient will:
- (1) Deliver copies of the eligible bills it has paid between September 1 and December 31, 2000.
- (2) Verify that these bills have been paid and are eligible for reimbursement.
- (3) Provide a detailed report of the dog control activities performed by the successful applicant during the referenced 4-month period.
- c. Payment by the Department. The Department will reimburse a grant recipient for eligible bills within 60 days of receiving a complete and timely reimbursement request.
- d. *Termination*. The Department may terminate a grant agreement at any time by providing the grant recipient written notice of termination at the address set forth on the grant application.

LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

Preamble 1

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P. S. §§ 6026.101—6026.908).

Sections 302, 303, 304 and 305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) require the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) to publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin an acknowledgment noting receipt of any Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. Persons intending to use the background standard, Statewide health standard, the site-specific standard, or who intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area, must file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site, and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one, or a combination of the cleanup standards, or who receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act, will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for any contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or

other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(l)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. Proposed Revision to the State Implementation Plan for Oxides of Nitrogen and Volatile Organic Compounds and Notice of Public Hearing

Approval of an amendment of a Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) plan for **Yorktowne**, **Inc.** in Mifflinburg Borough, **Union County**.

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has made a preliminary determination to approve an amendment of a RACT plan and an amendment to the State Implementation Plan (SIP) for a wood cabinet manufacturing facility owned and operated by Yorktowne, Inc. in Mifflinburg Borough, Union County.

The proposed SIP revision does not adopt any new regulations. It incorporates the provisions and requirements contained in the amendment of the RACT approval for the facility which are intended to comply with current regulations.

The preliminary RACT determination, if finally approved, will result in the revision of Operating Permit OP-60-0002 issued November 30, 1995, and will be

submitted to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a revision to Pennsylvania's SIP.

The following is a summary of the preliminary RACT determination which the Department proposes to incorporate into Operating Permit OP-60-0002, as a revision to that permit, for three 5 million BTU per hour wood-fired boilers, one 14.67 million BTU per hour No. 2 fuel oil-fired boiler, one .937 million BTU per hour No. 2 fuel oil-fired heater, two 1.269 million BTU per hour No. 2 fuel oil-fired heaters and 2 solvent cleaning sinks:

- The total combined potential to emit volatile organic compounds from each of the following two source categories shall never exceed 3 pounds per hour, 15 pounds per day or 2.7 tons per 12 consecutive month period.
- 1) No. 2 fuel oil-fired boiler and three No. 2 fuel oil-fired heaters $\,$
 - 2) Two solvent cleaning sinks
- The three wood-fired boilers shall be operated in accordance with manufacturer's specifications and good air pollution control practices. Additionally, the permittee shall perform an annual inspection and tune-up on each of the respective three boilers and the total combined volatile organic compound emissions from all three boilers shall never exceed 27.5 tons in any 12 consecutive month period.

One public hearing will be held for the purpose of receiving comments on the proposed operating permit revision and the proposed SIP revision. The hearing will be held on February 22, 2000 at 1 p.m. at the Northcentral Regional Office, 208 West Third Street, Suite 101, Williamsport, PA. The public is invited to comment on the proposal. 2000 Sunset Review Schedule

This schedule lists the Department of Environmental Protection's (Department) regulations, by chapter, that are anticipated to be reviewed in 2000. The sunset schedule is published annually and includes Title 25 Pennsylvania Code chapters that the Department plans to review. Review includes determining whether the regulations effectively fulfill the goals for which they were intended and remains consistent with the following principles contained in Executive Order 1996-1 (Regulatory Review and Promulgation):

- 1. Regulations shall address a compelling public interest.
- 2. Costs of regulations shall not outweigh their benefits.
- 3. Regulations shall be written in clear, concise and, when possible, nontechnical language.
- 4. Regulations shall address definable public health, safety, or environmental risks.
- 5. Where federal regulations exist, Pennsylvania's regulations shall not exceed Federal standards unless

justified by a compelling and articulable Pennsylvania interest or required by State law.

- 6. Compliance shall be the goal of all regulations.
- 7. Where viable nonregulatory alternatives exist, they shall be preferred over regulations.
- 8. Regulations shall be drafted and promulgated with early and meaningful input from the regulated community.
- 9. Regulations shall not hamper Pennsylvania's ability to compete effectively with other states.
- 10. All agency heads shall be held directly accountable for regulations promulgated by their respective agencies.

The chapters listed are anticipated to be reviewed by the Department in 2000. If regulatory amendments are proposed, those amendments will be reviewed by the appropriate advisory committees as outlined in the Department's Regulatory Agenda which is published semiannually in February and July.

Acceptance of Rulemaking Petitions for Study

At the December 21, 1999, meeting of the Environmental Quality Board (Board), the Board accepted two rule-making petitions for study under 25 Pa. Code, Chapter 23 (relating to Environmental Quality Board policy for processing petitions—statement of policy).

The petitions request changes to the designated uses for Crum Creek in Chester and Delaware Counties and Green Lick Run in Fayette County. The Crum Creek petition was submitted by the Willistown Conservation Trust and 11 copetitioners, and it requests a redesignation of the stream from Cold Water Fishes (CWF) and High Quality-Cold Water Fishes (HQ-CWF) to Exceptional Value Waters (EV). The Green Lick Run petition, submitted by the Rural Area Concerned Citizens (RACC), asks that the water body be upgraded from CWF to EV.

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is evaluating all available data to determine the scope of its stream assessments on the petitioned streams. Public notice will be given before the Department conducts the stream assessments. The public notice will provide an opportunity for persons to make technical data concerning the streams available to the Department. Changes that are recommended to the existing designations of these streams following the evaluations will be proposed for rulemaking with an opportunity for additional public comment. It should be noted that stream assessments are currently on hold until the Department

determines the impacts of the 1999 drought on the aquatic communities and when representative samples can be obtained.

Notice is hereby given that the Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority (PENNVEST) and the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) have prepared a combined Federal fiscal year 2000 and 2001 wastewater construction Project Priority List (PPL) and the fiscal year 2000 Intended Use Plan (IUP) list of municipal wastewater projects to be considered for a construction loan from funds Pennsylvania expects to receive from fiscal year 2000 funds approved by Congress to capitalize the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) program.

The projects included on the PPL have a project priority rating under DEP's regulations as set forth in Chapter 103 relating to project priority rating system, and as such, regulations have been approved by EPA for such purpose. The Clean Water Act stipulates that States must maintain a PPL of municipal wastewater projects from which to develop the annual CWSRF IUP list of projects to be funded.

Projects listed on the FY 2000 IUP list are on Pennsylvania's CWSRF PPL and are expected to proceed to construction in the near future. Other projects on the PPL are projects that are in development or will be developed for future construction loan consideration. Any project removed from an IUP is maintained on the PPL unless otherwise completed.

A project must appear on the approved IUP before it can receive a loan from the CWSRF. The CWSRF IUP was developed in accordance with the ranking criteria listed in Section 10(b) of the Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority Act (35 P. S. §§ 751.1—761.21). These ranking criteria differ somewhat from the DEP regulations set forth in Chapter 103 (relating to project priority rating system), as does the methodology used to evaluate projects. In addition, a project's readiness to proceed and the reasonable availability of alternative funds also have a bearing on project selection for the IUP. Consequently, the rank ordered list of projects on the PPL does not dictate the order in which they will be chosen for inclusion in the IUP.

The FY 2000 CWSRF IUP has 37 municipal wastewater construction projects listed with a total dollar value of approximately \$100 million. The CWSRF will be capitalized with approximately \$53.3 million of Federal FY 2000 funds from EPA and \$10.7 million of State funds. Some \$36 million of CWSRF loan repayments will be used to allow additional project funding opportunities on the FY 2000 IUP. Some \$2.1 million of the Federal FY 2000 funds will be set aside for program administration costs. A public hearing will be held, as described below. After the public hearing and assessment of the comments

received, the final FY 2000 CWSRF IUP will be completed; potentially, it may include other projects from the CWSRF PPL.

Federal guidance and regulations on development of the CWSRF PPL and Intended Use Plan direct that the lists be subject to public comment and review before being submitted to EPA.
