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# READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND PENNSYLVANIA CODE

#### Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

## Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania* 

*Bulletin* before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must repropose.

#### Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

#### Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

#### **How to Find Documents**

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva-nia Code*.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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#### **Printing Format**

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [ ] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

#### **Fiscal Notes**

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 et seq. Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

## **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

#### Title 31—INSURANCE

## INSURANCE DEPARTMENT [31 PA. CODE CH. 86]

#### **Premium and Retirement Deposit Funds**

The Insurance Department (Department) amends Chapter 86 (relating to premium and retirement deposit funds). The Department is publishing the amendments as a final-form rulemaking.

#### Statutory Authority

The Department is amending Chapter 86 under the authority of sections 206, 506, 1501 and 1502 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. §§ 66, 186, 411 and 412) and sections 202 and 354 of The Insurance Company Law of 1921 (40 P. S. §§ 382 and 477b).

#### Comments and Response

A notice of proposed rulemaking was published at 30 Pa.B. 886 (February 19, 2000) with a 30-day comment period ending January 31, 2000. During the 30-day comment period, comments were received from the Insurance Federation of Pennsylvania, Inc. (IFP) in favor of the proposal.

During its regulatory review, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) did not submit comments to the Department.

#### Affected Parties

The rulemaking applies to insurers and fraternal benefit societies marketing life insurance policies and who are licensed to do the business of life insurance in this Commonwealth.

#### Fiscal Impact

#### State Government

There is no anticipated increase in cost to the Department resulting from the recognition within the modified chapter of flexible premium life insurance and annuity products. The establishment of limits for each type of premium payment contract should not substantially increase compliance monitoring by the Department.

#### General Public

There will be no adverse fiscal impact on consumers who purchase life insurance policies and annuity contracts and place money in the premium deposit funds or retirement deposit funds of the policies or contracts.

#### Political Subdivisions

The final-form rulemaking will have no fiscal impact on political subdivisions.

#### Private Sector

It is anticipated that the final-form rulemaking will have a fiscal impact on insurance companies and fraternal benefit societies to the extent that there will be, in contrast to prior practice, a clear limit on the amount of money that may be held by insurers under a premium deposit fund of a flexible premium life insurance policy. The Department believes it unlikely that this new limit will result in insurers collecting substantially less money in connection with life insurance policies.

#### Paperwork

The adoption of this final-form rulemaking will not impose additional paperwork on the Department or the insurance industry. Although the final-form rulemaking imposes additional deposit limits on premium deposit funds and retirement deposit funds, it does not impose additional requirements resulting in additional paperwork.

#### Effectiveness/Sunset Date

This final-form rulemaking becomes effective upon final publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. No sunset date has been assigned.

#### Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5(a)), on February 9, 2000, the Department submitted a copy of the notice of proposed rulemaking, published at 30 Pa.B. 886, to IRRC and to the Chairpersons of the House and Senate Committees for review and comment.

Under section 5(c) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC and the Committees were provided with copies of the comments received during the public comment period, as well as other documents when requested. In preparing these final-form regulations, the Department has considered all comments from IRRC, the Committees and the public.

Under section 5.1(d) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5a(d)), on May 31, 2000, these final-form regulations were deemed approved by the House and Senate Committees. Under section 5.1(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC met on June 8, 2000, and approved the final-form regulations.

#### **Findings**

#### The Commissioner finds that:

- (1) Public notice of intention to adopt this rulemaking as amended by this order has been given under sections 201 and 202 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P. L. 769, No. 240) (45 P. S. §§ 1201 and 1202) and the regulations thereunder, 1 Pa. Code §§ 7.1 and 7.2.
- (2) The adoption of this rulemaking in the manner provided in this order is necessary and appropriate for the administration and enforcement of the authorizing statutes.

#### Order

The Commissioner, acting under the authorizing statutes, orders that:

- (1) The regulations of the Department, 31 Pa. Code Chapter 86, are amended by amending §§ 86.2—86.4 and 86.10 to read as set forth at 30 Pa.B. 886.
- (2) The Commissioner shall submit this order and 30 Pa.B. 886 to the Office of General Counsel and Office of

Attorney General for approval as to form and legality as required by law.

- (3) The Commissioner shall certify this order and 30 Pa.B. 886 and deposit them with the Legislative Reference Bureau as required by law.
- (4) The order shall take effect upon final publication in the  $Pennsylvania\ Bulletin.$

### PROPOSED RULEMAKING

## DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

[7 PA. CODE CH. 21] Dog Shelters

The Department of Agriculture (Department), under the specific authority conferred by section 207(b) of the Dog Law (act) (3 P. S. § 459-207(b)), proposes to amend § 21.24 (relating to shelters). Section 101 of the act (3 P. S. § 459-101) states this is an act "... relating to dogs, regulating the keeping of dogs; providing for the licensing of ... kennels ..." and "... providing for the protection of dogs. ..." The Department has a duty to assure the proper and humane care of dogs kept in captivity. Section 207(b) of the act confers upon the Department the power to promulgate regulations regarding the maintenance of kennels. It states, "(A)ll kennels shall be maintained in a sanitary and humane condition in accordance with standards and sanitary codes promulgated by the secretary."

Background

The current provisions in § 21.24, relating to shelters for dogs, became effective April 12, 1996. They require kennels that house dogs in a primary enclosure with wire flooring to provide a solid draft free resting surface to allow the dogs to rest comfortably. Section 21.24 was originally enacted to protect the health and safety of dogs, assure their humane treatment and to bring the Department into closer compliance with the Federal regulations regarding the sheltering of dogs in kennels.

The Department vigorously enforced the regulations and all kennels with wire or mesh flooring were brought into compliance with the rest board requirements. However, the Department soon began receiving complaints concerning the health of dogs deteriorating due to fecal matter and urine collecting on the rest boards. It was impossible for kennel owners to keep the rest boards sanitized at all times, thus creating unsanitary conditions for the dogs. Concerns were voiced and written complaints were filed by licensed veterinarians, the Pennsylvania Pet Breeders Association and owners of pet store kennels. The complaints stated that illness and disease was occurring at a higher rate with rest boards in place than had occurred prior to the enactment of the regulations requiring rest boards. In addition, the Federal regulations were changed, setting aside the rest board requirement.

The proposed amendment will allow for the removal of rest boards, which will address the safety and health issues that have arisen subsequent to their use. At the same time, the proposed amendment addresses the comfort, safety and humane treatment of the dogs by requiring that, "(A) dog may be sheltered in a primary enclosure having wire flooring provided the wire is coated with a vinyl type coating. The coated wire flooring must be kept in good repair and shall be made of mesh construction that does not allow the dog's feet to pass through any opening in the floor and does not otherwise cause injury to the dog. The coated wire shall be constructed of sufficient diameter (gauge) to provide a rigid floor area sufficient to support the weight of dogs housed in the enclosure so that the wire floor does not bend or sag from

the weight of the dogs." The proposed amendment requires a kennel owner to install vinyl coated wire before removing any rest boards. Kennel owners may keep rest boards in place, but will still be required to install vinyl coated wire flooring meeting the standards of these regulations and will be required to keep the rest boards sanitized. The ability to remove the rest boards and the added language concerning vinyl coated wire has been agreed to by a representative for pet store kennels, a representative of the Pennsylvania Legislative Animal Network, and representatives for the Pet Breeders Association and various dog clubs.

The proposed amendment is intended to update the Department's policy regarding the sheltering of dogs in kennels. The proposed amendment is consistent with the Department's duties under the act and brings the Department into closer compliance with Federal regulations regarding the sheltering of dogs in kennels.

In the interest of continuing to carry out the policy of the act, to assure the health, safety and humane treatment of dogs, the Department proposes to amend § 21.24 to effectuate the changes referred to previously.

Summary of Proposed Change

Section 21.24.(d). This section will be changed by eliminating the language requiring that a "solid resting surface" be provided for dogs being housed in a primary enclosure having wire flooring. Language will be added to require that the wire flooring in primary enclosures must be "vinyl coated" and be "constructed of sufficient diameter (gauge) to provide a rigid floor area sufficient to support the weight of dogs housed in the enclosure so that the wire floor does not bend or sag from the weight of the dogs." All other requirements, such as a draft free area and wire constructed in a manner which does not allow the dog's feet to pass through any opening in the floor, shall remain unchanged. Kennel owners will be required to install vinyl coated wire flooring before removing any rest boards. Kennel owners may keep rest boards in place, but will still be required to install vinyl coated wire flooring meeting the standards of these regulations and will be required to keep the rest boards sanitized.

Fiscal Impact

#### Commonwealth

The proposed amendment will impose minimal costs and have minimal fiscal impact upon the Commonwealth. The proposed change will not increase or decrease the regulatory workload. The Department already inspects kennels on a regular basis and the proposed change will not affect inspection schedules or the time required to inspect a kennel.

#### Political Subdivisions

The proposed amendment will impose no costs and have no fiscal impact upon political subdivisions.

#### Private Sector

The proposed amendment will impose minimal costs on private sector organizations and individuals. There will not be an increased cost to the regulated community. The regulated community will have an increase in costs initially, because it will be required to replace current wire flooring with a vinyl coated wire flooring. However,

the regulated community has requested the proposed change. The regulated community believes the change will decrease the health problems associated with the rest board requirement and thereby decrease veterinary and health care costs. In addition, the elimination of rest boards will decrease the sanitary expenses by reducing the man-hours required to clean the kennels.

#### General Public

The proposed amendment will impose no costs and have no fiscal impact on the general public. The general public should benefit through reduced costs to the industry.

Paperwork Requirements

The proposed amendment will not result in an appreciable increase of paperwork. The Department has already developed the appropriate forms and procedures to administer kennel inspections. Only small changes will be required.

Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5(a)) on July 10, 2000, the Department submitted a copy of the proposed amendment to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and to the Chairpersons of the House Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee and the Senate Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee. In addition to submitting the proposed amendment, the Department has provided IRRC and the Committees with a copy of a detailed Regulatory Analysis Form prepared by the Department in compliance with Executive Order 1996-1 "Regulatory Review and Promulgation." A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, if IRRC has objections to any portion of the proposed amendment it will notify the Department within 10 days after the close of the Committee's review period. The notification shall specify the regulatory review criteria which have not been met by that portion of the proposed amendment to which an objection is made. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review, prior to final publication of the amendment, by the Department, the General Assembly and the Governor of objections raised.

Public Comment Period

The public comment period for this proposal shall be 30 days from the date of publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

#### TITLE 7. AGRICULTURE

PART II. DOG LAW ENFORCEMENT BUREAU

CHAPTER 21. GENERAL PROVISIONS; KENNELS; LICENSURE: DOG-CAUSED DAMAGES

**KENNELS—PRIMARY ENCLOSURES** 

§ 21.24. Shelters.

(d) A dog may be sheltered in a primary enclosure having wire flooring [if] provided the wire flooring is coated with a vinyl type coating. The coated wire flooring shall be kept in good repair[, is] and shall be made of mesh [or slatted] construction that does not allow the dog's feet to pass through any opening in the floor and does not otherwise cause injury to the dog. The coated wire shall be constructed of sufficient diameter (gauge) to provide a rigid floor area sufficient to support the weight of the dogs housed in the enclosure so that the wire floor does not after the effective date of adoption of this proposal.). Coated wire flooring shall be installed prior to the removal of a solid resting surface. If a solid resting surface is provided, the solid resting surface shall be constructed of impervious material. A dog being housed in a primary enclosure with wire flooring shall be provided with a draft free solid resting surface that, in the aggregate, area that is large enough to hold all the occupants of the primary

## ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY BOARD

[25 PA. CODE CH. 240]

Radon Certification; Continuing Education

The Environmental Quality Board (Board) proposes to amend § 240.306 (relating to continuing education program). The amendment is being proposed to modify the requirements for a continuing education program by certified persons performing radon-related work in this Commonwealth outlined in § 240.306 to read as set forth in Appex A

This proposal was adopted by the Board at its meeting of June 20, 2000.

A. Effective Date

This proposed amendment will go into effect upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* as final rule-making.

#### C. Statutory Authority

This proposed rulemaking is being made under the authority of section 13 of the Pennsylvania Radon Certification Act (63 P. S.  $\S$  2013) and section 1920-A of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S.  $\S$  510-21).

#### D. Background and Purpose

The Department is responsible for maintaining a certification program for persons conducting radon-related work in this Commonwealth, and a component of that certification program is a continuing education program. Currently § 240.306 requires that a certified person conducting radon-related activities in this Commonwealth participate in a continuing education program consisting of a minimum of 16 hours of Department-approved courses or seminars on radon testing or mitigation each year. The proposed amendment would reduce this minimum continuing education requirement to 8 hours each year.

The purpose of this proposed reduction in the required number of continuing education hours is to conform this Commonwealth's regulations with the recommendations of National bodies which set standards in this area, as well as with the requirements for continuing education in neighboring states with active radon certification programs, and provide relief to the radon regulated community of this Commonwealth from a regulation that is unnecessarily burdensome.

The National Environmental Health Association (NEHA), and the National Radon Safety Board (NRSB), both of which have standards for continuing education by persons conducting radon-related activities, recommend a minimum of 8 hours of continuing education each year. Likewise, the neighboring states of New Jersey and Ohio have active radon certification programs and require a minimum of 8 hours of continuing education each year.

The radon regulated community of this Commonwealth participated in a series of eight radon regulatory workshops in 1996. At that time, the regulated community and members of organizations involved with the radon issue represented at these workshops recommended that the minimum continuing education requirement for certified persons performing radon-related work in this Commonwealth be reduced from 16 hours each year to 8 hours each year. The participants believed that the 16-hour minimum requirement is unnecessarily burdensome. In February 2000, staff from the Department's Radon Division surveyed the workshop participants to confirm their views on this amendment. The results of this survey indicate that participants continue to support this reduction of hours.

#### E. Benefits, Costs and Compliance

Executive Order 1996-1 requires a cost/benefit analysis of the proposed amendment.

Benefits

This proposed rulemaking would benefit about 200 certified radon laboratory, testing and mitigation persons who take continuing education courses to fulfill the requirements of § 240.306. By reducing the minimum number of required continuing education hours from 16 hours each year to 8 hours each year, the estimated savings per certified person per year is expected to be \$150. Thus, the total savings to the community of certified radon laboratory, testing and mitigation persons is estimated to be about \$30,000 per year.

Costs

There are no additional costs to the Commonwealth, its citizens or regulated community associated with this proposal.

Compliance Costs

The proposed amendment is not expected to impose any additional compliance costs on the regulated community.

F. Pollution Prevention

Not applicable.

#### G. Sunset Review

This regulation will be reviewed in accordance with the sunset review schedule published by the Department to determine whether the regulation effectively fulfills the goals for which it was intended.

#### H. Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5(a)), on July 11, 2000, the Department submitted a copy of this proposed amendment to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and the Chairpersons of the House and Senate Environmental Resources and Energy Committees. In addition to submitting the proposed amendment, the Department has provided IRRC and the Committees with a detailed regulatory analysis form prepared by the Department in compliance with Executive Order 1996-1, "Regulatory Review and Promulgation." A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, if IRRC has objections to any portion of the proposed amendment, it will notify the Department within 10 days of the close of the Committees' review period. The notification shall specify the regulatory review criteria which have not been met by the portion of the proposed amendment to which an objection has been made. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review by the General Assembly and the Governor of objections raised by IRRC prior to final publication of the amendment by the Department.

## ARTICLE V. RADIOLOGICAL HEALTH CHAPTER 240. RADON CERTIFICATION

#### § 240.306. Continuing education program.

A person conducting radon-related activities shall have a radon education program to assure that the applicant and all employes have a minimum of 4 hours initial training, and the certified person [ will ] shall participate in a continuing education program consisting of a minimum of [16] 8 hours of Department-approved courses or seminars on radon testing or mitigation each year.

Meetings and Public Hearing

The Delaware River Basin Commission (Commission) will hold an informal conference followed by a public hearing on Wednesday, July 26, 2000. The hearing will be part of the Commission's regular business meeting. Both the conference session and business meeting are open to the public and will be held at the Commission offices at 25 State Police Drive, West Trenton, NJ.

The conference among the Commissioners and staff will begin at 10:30 a.m. It will include a presentation by Delaware Water Coordinator Gerald Kauffman on an integrated resource plan to address water supply problems in New Castle County, DE. Summaries of the following four meetings also will be offered: June 26 meeting on the Estuary PCB Monitoring Plan; July 13 meeting of the Water Management Advisory Committee; and July 20 meetings of the Toxics Advisory Committee and Flow Management Technical Advisory Committee. A brief account of briefings on the Christina River TMDL also will be provided.

The subjects of the public hearing to be held during the 1:30 p.m. business meeting will include, in addition to the dockets listed below, a proposed Resolution concerning the control of certain toxic substances, including PCBs, in the Delaware Estuary.

The dockets scheduled for public hearing are as follows:

- 1. Village of Deposit D-99-64 CP. An application for approval of a groundwater withdrawal project to supply up to 5.4 million gallons (mg)/30 days of water to the applicant's distribution system from new Well No. 5 in the West Branch Delaware River watershed, and to increase the existing withdrawal limit from all wells from 15 mg/30 days to 30 mg/30 days. The project is located in the Village of Deposit, Delaware County, New York.
- 2. Borough of Dublin D-2000-11 CP. An application for approval of an increase in groundwater withdrawal allocation from 4.36 mg/30 days to 6.9 mg/30 days for the applicant's public water distribution system from existing Wells Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 5 in the mixed zone of the Lockatong and Brunswick Formations. The project is located in Dublin Borough, Bucks County in the Southeastern Pennsylvania Groundwater Protected Area.
- 3. Little Washington Treatment Company D-2000-24. An application to upgrade and expand the applicant's Willistown Woods (formerly Chesterdale) sewage treatment plant (STP) from 0.12 million gallons per day (mgd) advanced secondary treatment to 0.225 mgd tertiary treatment. The STP is located just south of State Route 3 in Willistown Township at its border with Westtown Township, both in Chester County, PA, and will continue to serve portions of Willistown and Westtown Townships. Treated effluent will continue to discharge to a tributary of Hunters Run in the Ridley Creek watershed.
- 4. Dennis C. Christman D-2000-42. An application to construct a 0.08 mgd STP to replace failing onlot septic systems at the applicant's Christman Lake development located off Christman Road (Township Route 771) in Windsor Township, Berks County, PA. The proposed plant is designed to provide secondary treatment by the se-

quencing batch reactor process. Treated effluent will discharge to a marsh area that flows 120 feet directly to an unnamed tributary of Maiden Creek in the Schuylkill River watershed.

In addition to the public hearing, the Commission will address the following at its 1:30 p.m. business meeting: minutes of the June 16, 2000 business meeting; announcements; report on hydrologic conditions in the basin; and reports of the Executive Director and General Counsel.

## DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

Temporary Order Designating Chronic Wasting Disease a Dangerous Transmissible Disease

The Department of Agriculture (Department) hereby designates Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) a "dangerous transmissible disease," under authority of section 2322(d) of the Agriculture Code (code) (3 Pa.C.S.A. § 2322(d)). This designation will facilitate the Department's efforts to detect and contain CWD and will assist Pennsylvania's deer and elk industry in developing control programs for the disease.

CWD is a disease of deer, elk and other cerividae and is a member of the group of diseases known as transmissible spongiform encephalopathies (TSEs). Other more well known TSEs are scrapie and bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) or "mad cow" disease. All are thought to be caused by a prion protein that has converted to an abnormal infectious prion protein. There is some evidence, in the case of BSE, that humans may become infected through consumption of meat products containing central nervous system tissues, thus there is a significant public health interest concerning all TSEs.

Recently, several western states instituted import regulations that require deer or elk entering those states be from herds that are participating in a surveillance program and that the state of origin have authority to take action in the event that CWD is diagnosed. To support our deer and elk industry and to keep these markets

open, it will be necessary for the Department to assist in the development and oversight of a surveillance program and to take action in the event that a case of CWD is diagnosed. The authority to do so will depend on the designation of CWD as a "dangerous transmissible" dis-

The Department has authority under the Domestic Animal Law provisions of the code (3 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 2301—2389) to regularly monitor the domestic animal population of this Commonwealth to determine the prevalence, incidence and location of transmissible diseases. The Department has authority under this act to declare a particular disease not contained in the original act to be a "dangerous transmissible" disease through issuance of a temporary order.

This order is a temporary order, as required under section 2322(d) of the code. This order shall take effect as

of July 15, 2000, and shall remain in effect until no later than July 14, 2001. This Department may: (1) Reissue this temporary order to extend the designation beyond July 14, 2000; (2) Allow this temporary order to expire on July 14, 2000; (3) Supplant this temporary order with a formal regulation designating CWD a "dangerous transmissible disease"; or (4) Modify this temporary order.

#### Maximum Lawful Rate of Interest for Residential Mortgages for the Month of August 2000

The Department of Banking of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, under the authority contained in section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P. L. 13, No. 6) (41 P. S. § 301), hereby determines that the maximum lawful rate of interest for residential mortgages for the month of August 2000, is 8 3/4%.

The interest rate limitations under the State's usury statute were preempted to a great extent by Federal law, the Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (Pub. L. 96-221). Further preemption was instituted with the signing of Pub. L. 96-399, which overrode State interest rate limitations on an individual who finances the sale or exchange of residential real property which the individual owns and which the individual occupies or has occupied as his principal residence.

Each month the Department of Banking is required by State law to compute and announce the ceiling rate on residential mortgages in Pennsylvania. This maximum rate is determined by adding 2.50 percentage points to the yield rate on long-term government bonds as published by the Federal Reserve Board and/or the United States Treasury. The latest yield rate on long-term government securities is 6.23 to which was added 2.50 percentage points for a total of 8.73 that by law is rounded off to the nearest quarter at 8 3/4%.

This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. Laboratories Approved to Determine Analyses of Blood and/or Serum for Controlled Substances Under the Clinical Laboratory Act, the Vehicle Code, the Fish and Boat Code, and the Game and Wildlife Code

The following laboratories are licensed by the Department of Health under the Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P. S. §§ 2151—2165) and/or the Federal Clinical Laboratory Improvement Act of 1967 (42 U.S.C.A. § 263a) and are currently approved by the Department under 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) to perform analyses of blood and/or serum for the determination of controlled substances. This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in tests conducted by the Bureau of Laboratories of the Department of Health. These laboratories are also approved and designated for purposes of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S. §§ 1547 and 3755 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance;

reports by emergency room personnel), the Fish and Boat Code, 30 Pa.C.S. § 5125 (relating to chemical testing to determine amount of alcohol or controlled substance) and the Game and Wildlife Code, 34 Pa.C.S. § 2502 (relating to hunting or furtaking under the influence of alcohol or controlled substance), as qualified to perform the types of services which will reflect the presence of controlled substances or their biotransformation products in blood and/or serum.

Depending upon their capability and performance in proficiency surveys, laboratories are approved to perform screening and/or confirmatory analyses on blood and/or serum. Laboratories approved to perform screening analyses are designated on the approval list by an "S" followed by the letters "B" for blood and/or "Se" for serum. Laboratories approved to screen both blood and serum would therefore have "SBSe" listed after their laboratory name. Laboratories approved to offer confirmatory analyses will be designated on the approval list by a "C" followed by the letters "B" for blood and/or "Se" for serum. Laboratories approved to perform confirmatory analyses on both serum and blood would therefore have "CBSe" listed after the name of their laboratory.

Screening analyses provide a presumptive indication that a controlled substance is present. Confirmatory testing is used to substantiate screening results.

Persons seeking forensic blood and/or serum analysis services from any of the listed laboratories should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for the medicolegal purposes. They should also determine that the director of the facility is agreeable to performing analyses for forensic purposes. Persons seeking the analyses are responsible for specifying the extent to which the presence of a controlled substance is to be verified. That specification should be predicated upon the purpose for which the analysis is being sought.

The list of approved laboratories will be revised semiannually and published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Questions regarding this list should be directed to M. # Laboratories Approved to Perform Blood Lead and/or Erythrocyte Protoporphyrin Determinations Under the Clinical Laboratory Act

The following laboratories are licensed in accordance with the Clinical Laboratory Act (35 P. S. §§ 2151—2165) and/or the Federal Clinical Laboratory Improvement Act of 1967 (42 U.S.C.A. § 263a), and are currently approved under 28 Pa. Code § 5.50 (relating to approval to provide special analytical services) to perform analyses of blood for lead or erythrocyte protoporphyrin content. This approval is based on demonstrated proficiency in periodic evaluations conducted by the Bureau of Laboratories (Bureau) of the Department of Health (Department).

Lead poisoning is a reportable noncommunicable disease. Approved laboratories which offer blood lead or erythrocyte protoporphyrin testing services are required to inform the Department of actual or possible incidents of this condition in accordance with 28 Pa. Code § 27.4 (relating to reportable noncommunicable diseases and conditions). In addition, the Department requests laboratories to submit reports on children under 6 years of age and pregnant women, on whom laboratory tests confirm venous blood lead concentrations of 15 micrograms per deciliter or higher. The Department's collection and review of these latter reports would be consistent with the most recent revision of the guideline titled, *Preventing Lead Poisoning in Young Children*, which was published in 1991 by the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Public Health Service, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and is available from them.

All reports must be sent to the Department of Health, Division of Environmental Health, P.O. Box 90, Harrisburg, PA 17108. Report forms are available on request from the Division of Environmental Health.

Erythrocyte protoporphyrin determinations may be performed as an adjunct determination to substantiate blood lead levels of 25 micrograms per deciliter or higher. Since erythrocyte protoporphyrin concentrations may not increase as a result of low level exposures to lead, direct blood lead analysis is the only reliable method for identifying individuals with blood lead concentrations below 25 micrograms per deciliter.

Persons seeking blood lead or erythrocyte protoporphyrin analyses should determine that the laboratory employs techniques and procedures acceptable for the purpose for which the analyses are sought. Laboratories offering blood lead analysis only are designated with the letter "L" following the name of the laboratory. Those offering erythrocyte protoporphyrin analysis only are designated with the letter "P". Laboratories offering both services are designated with the letters "LP."

Blood lead analyses performed for occupational safety and health purposes must be conducted by a laboratory which also meets the requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration of the United States Department of Labor as specified in 29 CFR 1910.1025(j)(2)(iii).

The list of approved laboratories will be reviewed semiannually and if there are any changes to the list, a notice to that effect will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at that time.

The Department's blood lead proficiency testing program is approved by the United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) in accordance with the requirements contained in the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (42 CFR 493.901 and 493.937) which are administered by the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA). Participation in these programs may therefore be used to demonstrate acceptable performance for approval purposes under both Federal and Commonwealth statutes.

Securities Commission (PSC) must respond to these Comments when it submits the final-form regulation. If the final-form regulation is not delivered by June 5, 2002, the regulation will be deemed withdrawn.

#### 1. Section 303.012. Investment adviser registration procedure.—Clarity.

Subsection (a) Registration depository

This subsection requires forms to be filed with the PSC or with a central repository designated by order of the PSC. There are similar requirements in sections 303.014, 303.015 and 306.061. The comments of the Investment Council Association of America, Inc. (ICAA) indicated the phrase "central registration depository" could be confused with the Central Registration Depository. The PSC should explain what repository will be designated by order of the PSC, and how notice will be given to the affected parties.

Subsection (b) Audited balance sheet

The Investment Company Institute (ICI) and the Financial Planning Association (FPA) commented the \$500 threshold to file an audited balance sheet in paragraph (1) should be \$1,200 to be consistent with changes made by the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). The PSC should increase the threshold to \$1,200 or explain why the \$500 threshold is appropriate.

Paragraph (1) requires an applicant to include an audited balance sheet under certain conditions. The ICI and FPA suggest allowing out-of-State investment advisers to file copies of their home state audited balance sheet. Where out-of-State filing requirements are the same as Pennsylvania's requirements, the PSC should consider allowing copies.

Paragraph (2) appears to have a typographical error. It should state "... as of a date...."

#### 2. Section 303.014. Investment adviser representative registration procedures.—Need; Clarity.

Subsections (a) and (b) Federally covered advisers

The ICI commented these subsections should also apply to Federally covered advisers. The PSC should amend the regulation to clarify the scope of these subsections.

Subsection (b) Filing of forms

In this subsection, the ICI doesn't believe both the investment adviser and the investment adviser representative should have to file amendments to Form U-4. The ICI believes "or" should be used to eliminate duplicative filings. The PSC should explain why both filings are needed.

#### 3. Section 303.015. Notice filing for Federally covered advisers.—Economic Impact; Need; Clarity.

Subsection (b) Annual filings

The ICI commented the Investment Adviser Registration Depository (IARD) does not require a full filing each year. Only Items 2(A) and 5(F) of Part 1A of Form ADV are required. The PSC should amend the regulation to be consistent with IARD or explain the need for a full filing each year.

# 4. Section 303.021. Registration and notice filing procedures for successors to a broker-dealer, investment adviser or Federally covered adviser.—Reasonableness.

Subsection (c) Registered investment advisers

The ICI commented that registered investment advisers should be added to this subsection. The PSC should add them or explain why registered investment advisers were not included.

 Section 303.032. Examination requirements for investment advisers and investment adviser representatives.—Economic Impact; Need; Reasonableness; Clarity.

Subsection (a) Out-of-State registrants

The ICI and the FPA commented paragraphs (1) and (2) will require out-of-State registrants to re-take examinations after 2 years, which is inconsistent with the North American Securities Administrators Association, Inc. (NASAA) Model Rule. They suggest rewording the regulation to clarify how the 2-year limit applies to out-of-State registrants. The PSC should explain the intent of paragraphs (1) and (2).

Subsection (c) Waivers of examination requirements

The FPA commented that Certified Public Accountants (CPA) and attorneys should not qualify for waiver from examination requirements under subsection (c). The FPA believes the CPA and the bar examinations do not test the same information as the Series 65 examination. The PSC should explain why CPAs and attorneys qualify for waivers.

The Certified Financial Planners Board of Standards commented the NASAA model rule has been updated, and the appropriate board in section (c)(1)(ii)(A) is the Certified Financial Planner Board of Standards, Inc. The PSC should review section (c)(1)(ii)(A) for consistency with the NASAA model rule.

#### 6. Section 303.042. Investment adviser capital requirements.—Reasonableness.

Subsection (a)(5) Net worth requirements

This subsection requires an investment adviser who meets certain conditions to maintain a positive net worth at all times. This provision applies when:

- The adviser's principal place of business is in Pennsylvania; and
- The adviser accepts prepayment of advisory fees more than 6 months in advance and in an amount of more the \$500 per client.

This provision is consistent with the NASAA Model Rule on Capital and Bonding Requirements of Investment Advisers. However, the ICI and the FPA commented that the Federal SEC is proposing to increase the \$500 threshold to \$1200 for Federally registered advisers. The PSC should increase the threshold to \$1,200 or explain why the \$500 threshold is appropriate.

Subsection (d) Appraisal of assets

Under this subsection, the PSC "may" require an appraisal to determine the net worth of an asset under the net worth formulation. The conditions which would trigger the appraisal requirement are not included in the regulation. We request the PSC explain when an appraisal would be required.

#### 7. Section 303.051. Surety bonds.—Reasonableness; Clarity.

Subsection (a)(1) Bonding requirement

This subsection provides that an investment adviser who does not meet the minimum net worth requirements "may" be required to maintain a surety bond to cover the net worth deficiency. Section 202(e)-1(a)(2) of the NASAA model rule on "Bonding Requirements for Certain Investment Advisers" states that the investment advisers who

do not meet the minimum net worth requirements "shall" be bonded. We request the PSC explain why the requirements in the proposed regulation and the model rule are different and under what circumstances a bond would not be necessary.

Subsection (c) Evidence

Under this subsection, a broker-dealer or investment adviser "shall provide evidence of the existence of a surety bond" at the PSC's request. Under what circumstances would the PSC make this request?

#### 8. Section 304.012. Investment adviser required records.—Consistency with the statute; Clarity.

Subsection (a) Recordkeeping

Subsection (a) contains an extensive list of recordkeeping requirements. In its comments, the ICI pointed out that subsection (j) lists the instances in which the recordkeeping requirements do not apply. The ICI suggested that the exemptions in subsection (j) be referenced in subsection (a). For improved clarity, the PSC should add this reference to subsection (a).

Subsections (a)(12)(iv) and (a)(13)(v) both contain definitions of "investment adviser representative." Although these definitions are consistent with the NASSA Model Rule, they are inconsistent with the definition of "investment adviser representative" in the Pennsylvania Securities Act (70 P. S. § 1-102(j.1)). We object to a definition that is inconsistent with the statutory definition. If the PSC does not reference the statutory definition of this term in the final regulation, it should justify any changes made to the definition.

#### Section 304.052. Investment adviser compensation.—Clarity.

Disclosure of charges

This section requires investment advisers to "adequately" disclose their charges for providing investment advice in writing to each client. For improved clarity, the PSC should specify what constitutes "adequate" disclosure.

# 10. Section 305.011. Supervision of agents, investment adviser representatives and employes.—Clarity.

Subsection (a) Supervision requirements

In paragraph (1) the term "timely" is used to require broker-dealers and investment advisers to "timely detect and prevent any violations of statutes, rules regulations or orders...." The term "timely" is vague. The PSC should consider establishing a specific period of time.

Subsection (c) Out-of-State investment advisers

This subsection establishes the requirements for written procedures. In its comments, the ICI expressed concern regarding imposing recordkeeping requirements on out-of-State investment advisers when the investment advisers are registered in the state where they maintain a place of business. For improved clarity, the PSC should add language that clarifies what requirements apply to out-of-State investment advisers.

Subsection (c) Recordkeeping

Subsections (c)(9) and (c)(10)(iii) require written records to be maintained. However, the requirements do not specify the amount of time that the records should be kept. The PSC should clarify in these two subsections how long the written records must be maintained.

#### 11. Section 305.061. Withdrawal of registration or notice filing.—Clarity.

Form filing

Subsection (c) provides that a Federally covered adviser is to file Form ADV-W to withdraw a notice filing. In its comments, the ICAA suggests that the PSC amend the language to allow for the electronic version of the form to be filed. To avoid confusion, the regulation should list the acceptable methods by which the forms may be submitted.

## 12. Section 404.011. Investment adviser brochure disclosure. and Section 404.012. Wrap fee brochure disclosure.—Clarity.

Disclosure

These sections establish the disclosure that investment advisers must provide to their clients. In its comments, the ICI recommends that the PSC incorporate the proposed changes to the Federal rules which govern an adviser's disclosure obligations. To avoid potential confusion and to avoid the final regulation being inconsistent with Federal rules, we suggest the PSC monitor the SEC action on this issue, and if the SEC rules are finalized, amend the final regulation to be consistent with Federal rule changes.

**Personal Income Tax**

We submit for consideration the following objections and recommendations regarding this regulation. Each objection or recommendation includes a reference to the criteria in the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5a(h) and (i)) which has not been met. The Department of Revenue (Department) must respond to these Comments when it submits the final-form regulation. If the final-form regulation is not delivered by June 5, 2002, the regulation will be deemed withdrawn.

#### 1. Section 101.1 Definitions.—Consistency with statute; Clarity.

Supplemental unemployment benefit plan

The definition includes the phrase "established or maintained by an employer or by an employe organization, or by both." Section 7301(d)(vi) of the act (72 P. S. \$ 7301(d)(vi)) uses the phrase "payments made by employers or labor unions." The Department should explain how the phrase in the definition is consistent with 72 P. S. \$ 7301(d)(vi).

Subparagraphs (i) and (ii)

In subparagraphs (i) and (ii), why is the phrase "Under the plan" needed, since the definition states these are attributes of the plan? In subparagraphs (i) and (ii) what is meant by the phrase, "or subject in any manner to anticipation, assignment or pledge by"? Finally, why is the phrase "(whether or not the separation is temporary)" needed in subparagraph (i)? The Department should delete these phrases or explain why they are necessary.

Subparagraph (i)(A)

Clause (A) references a "permanent" reduction in work force. The Department should explain how "permanent" is determined, and how "permanent" relates to the phrase "(whether or not the separation is temporary)" in subparagraph (i).

Subparagraphs (i)(E) and (ii)(B)

Subparagraphs (i)(E) and (ii)(B)(III) use the phrases "similar circumstances" and "similar acts." What criteria will the Department use to determine similarity?

#### 2. Section 101.6 Compensation.—Duplication; Clarity.

In subsection (c) "supplemental unemployment benefits" is referenced and included in existing paragraph (6). Under the proposed amendments, supplemental unemployment benefits would also be listed in paragraph (9). For clarity, the Department should incorporate the provisions for supplemental unemployment benefits under one paragraph.

Given the definition of "supplemental unemployment benefit plan" in section 101.1, the Department should explain why the qualifying phrase "whether payable on a periodic basis or in the form of cash, services or property" is needed in section 101.6(c).

EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1985, A VENDOR'S FEDERAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NUMBER ASSIGNED WHEN FILING INCOME TAX DOCUMENTS) OR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER IF VENDOR IS AN INDIVIDUAL, MUST BE ON ALL CONTRACTS. DOCUMENTS AND INVOICES SUBMITTED TO THE COMMONWEALTH.

The business must include the following statement on every invoice submitted to the Commonwealth: "(name of business) is a qualified small business concern as defined in 4 Pa. Code 2.32."

A business is eligible for payments when the required payment is the latest of:

The payment date specified in the contract.

30 days after the later of the receipt of a proper invoice or receipt of goods or services.

The net payment date stated on the business' invoice.

A 15-day grace period after the required payment date is provided to the Commonwealth by the Act.
