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READER'S GUIDE TO THE *PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN* **AND PENNSYLVANIA CODE**

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances where the agency may omit the proposal step; they still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania* *Bulletin* before it can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, they must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number and page number. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa.Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code.

The *Pennsylvania Code* contains, as Finding Aids, subject indexes for the complete *Code* and for each individual title, a list of Statutes Used As Authority for Adopting Rules and a list of annotated cases. Source Notes give you the history of the documents. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from such a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised; and that the fiscal note shall provide the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the five succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 *et seq.* Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

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Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

(c) It Is Further Ordered that within ten days after receipt of the notice of appeal, petition for review or complaint, the appellant, petitioner or plaintiff shall file with the Chief Clerk the required docketing statement on a form provided by the Court at the time of the notice of appeal, petition for review or complaint is filed. The appellant, petitioner or plaintiff shall also file a Statement of Issues with the docketing statement. The Statement of Issues shall be no more than two pages in length and shall set forth a brief summary of the issues and a summary of the case necessary for an understanding of the nature of the appeal, petition for review or complaint. Service of the [Statement of Issues] docketing statement and any attachments shall be made on all parties, and an original and [five copies] one copy shall be filed with the Chief Clerk's Office along with a proof of service.

DELAWARE COUNTY

Public Access Policy of The Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania: Official Case Records of the Magisterial District Court; No. 08-2750

And Now, this 1st day of March, 2011, the Order heretofore issued by this Court on the 6th day of May, 2010, effective July 1, 2010, *Is Hereby Amended In Toto* and in place and stead substituted the following:

And Now, this 1st day of March, 2011, in accordance with the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. § 4301(b), and pursu-

ant to the Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania: Official Case Records of the Magisterial District Courts adopted by the Pennsylvania Supreme Court effective July 1, 2010, *It Is Hereby Ordered* that the following procedures shall be utilized to ensure a policy is in place to govern public access to the records of the Magisterial District Courts within the 32nd Judicial District.

1. Fee Schedule

(a) Copying per page—\$.25

(b) Preparing, copying and re-filing complex or voluminous requests will be Paid at the rate of \$8.00 per 1/4 hour. (The definition of complex or voluminous requests may vary from Court to Court depending on factors such as Court resources and caseload).

(c) No fee shall be charged for the initial 15 minutes of staff time required to respond to a Public Access Request.

(d) Fees may be waived if the Court determines a requestor is indigent.

(e) When fees are estimated at more than \$100.00, then prepayment is required.

(f) Fees paid for services rendered are nonrefundable.

2. All denials for records shall be governed by Section 4.00(C) of the Supreme Court Public Access Policy and requestor can appeal such a denial to the Administrator of the Administrative Office for Magisterial District Judges, 100 West Front Street, Media, Pennsylvania 19063-3208

It Is Further Ordered that seven (7) certified copies of this Order shall be filed with the Administrative Office of the Pennsylvania Courts; that two (2) certified copies and one (1) diskette shall be filed with the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*; that one (1) certified copy shall be filed with the Civil Procedural Rules Committee of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania; one (1) copy to the *Delaware County Legal Journal* for publication, and that one (1) copy shall be filed with the Office of Judicial Support—Civil—of the Court of Common Pleas of Delaware County.

The effective date of this Order shall be March 30, 2011.

Administrative Order; 29 AD 2010; 5 CV 2010; A.R.D. in Summary Cases

Order

And Now, this 28th day of December, 2010, pursuant to Pa.R.Crim.P. 300-302, the Court adopts the following local procedure for an Accelerated Rehabilitation Program (now known as A.R.D.) in summary cases:

It Is Further Ordered that one (1) certified copy of this Order shall be filed with the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts; that two (2) certified copies and one (1) diskette shall be filed with the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin; that one (1) certified copy shall be filed with the Criminal Procedural Rules Committee of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania; that this local rule be published on the Unified Judicial System's web site at http:// ujsportal.pacourts.us/localrules/ruleselection.aspx; one copy to the Monroe County Legal Reporter for publication, and that one copy shall be filed with the Clerk of Courts—Criminal of the Court of Common Pleas of Monroe County.

1. Defendants charged with summary offenses shall be eligible for A.R.D. to be supervised by the Magisterial District Judge (hereinafter MDJ), pursuant to Pa.R.Crim.P. 300-302 and 42 Pa.C.S.A. § 1520 et al.

2. Admission shall be requested within ten (10) days of receipt of the citation or summons. Extensions of the application period may be granted by the MDJ for good cause. The MDJ shall determine eligibility for summary A.R.D. within seventy-two (72) hours of the submission of the application.

a. The MDJ shall notify the Deputy Administrator Special Courts when a defendant is placed in A.R.D. for a summary matter.

b. The Deputy Administrator Special Courts shall maintain a list of all defendants placed in A.R.D. in a summary matter.

c. No defendant previously admitted to A.R.D. in any summary matter before an MDJ in Monroe County shall be admitted to a subsequent summary A.R.D.

d. A defendant who applied for A.R.D. in a summary matter shall execute the following:

AFFIDAVIT

I have not previously been placed in an A.R.D. program at the Magisterial District Judge level in Monroe County. I make this statement subject to the penalties of 18 Pa.C.S.A. § 4904, relating to unsworn falsification to authorities.

e. Prior to placing a defendant in A.R.D., the MDJ shall determine that the defendant has not previously been placed in A.R.D. in a summary matter in Monroe County by contacting the Deputy Administrator Special Courts.

3. Costs of supervision and restitution, if any, must be paid before completion of the A.R.D. program. These costs include court costs incident to a non-traffic summary offense and any costs incident to the program.

4. The defendant shall be notified in writing of acceptance or rejection from A.R.D.

a. If accepted, defendant shall appear at a time designated by the MDJ for completion of all documentation incident to admission to A.R.D.

b. The MDJ shall schedule and notify the defendant at the time of admission to A.R.D. of a hearing date to determine if all A.R.D. requirements have been met within ninety (90) days of the entry into A.R.D.

5. If rejected, the MDJ shall notify defendant that he has ten (10) days to enter his plea and the case shall

proceed in accord with Chapter 4 of the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure.

6. Requests for continuance of said hearing shall be denied, except in compelling circumstances. No continuance shall be for more than seven (7) days.

7. A defendant accepted into A.R.D. shall be referred to the following programs:

a. Juvenile Retail Theft Program

b. Certified Underage Drinking Program

c. N-O-T Program (Not on Tobacco-Underage Smoking Cessation Program)

d. Anger Management Program

8. The MDJ shall require the defendant to complete a minimum of 10 hours of service work to non-profit groups, government entities, churches, or other agencies as authorized by the Magisterial District Judge.

9. Each MDJ shall file a report on a monthly basis with the Deputy Administrator Special Courts setting forth the disposition. If a defendant eligible for A.R.D. is not admitted, the MDJ shall include the reasons therefore in the report. Upon successful completion of all requirements, the defendant's case shall be dismissed and the defendant discharged. Also upon successful completion of all requirements the MDJ will present a Petition for Expungement to the Deputy Administrator Special Courts who in turn will submit an Order to Expunge to the Court for signature.

10. If defendant declines A.R.D. or fails to successfully complete the program requirements, the case shall proceed in accord with Chapter 4 of the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure.

11. No summary case shall remain 'active' for purposes of A.R.D. supervision in excess of ninety (90) days.

12. The following shall be displayed in each MDJ office:

NOTICE TO THOSE CHARGED WITH CERTAIN SUMMARY OFFENSES—

You may be eligible to participate in a program (A.R.D.) which will result in dismissal of the charge against you. The A.R.D. program is available for defendants who have not previously been placed into a summary A.R.D. program in Monroe County.

You must pay all costs and restitution before completion of the program. You will be required to attend a counseling program for up to ninety (90) days. If you successfully complete the program, the charge against you will be dismissed. If you want to apply for the A.R.D. program, notify the Magisterial District Judge immediately.

13. This Administrative Order shall become effective 60 days after publication in The *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Corrective Amendments to 25 Pa. Code §§ 250.306, 250.307 and 250.605 and Appendix A, Tables 3b, 4a, 5a and 5b

The Department of Environmental Protection has discovered discrepancies between the agency text of 25 Pa. Code §§ 250.306, 250.307 and 250.605 and Appendix A, Tables 3b, 4a, 5a and 5b, as deposited with the Legislative Reference Bureau, and published at 41 Pa.B. 230 (January 8, 2011) and the official text published in the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter* (Master Transmittal Sheet No. 436, March 2011). Amendments to 25 Pa. Code §§ 250.306, 250.307 and 250.605 and Appendix A, Tables 3b, 4a, 5a and 5b published at 41 Pa.B. 230 (were incorrectly codified.

Therefore, under 45 Pa.C.S. § 901: The Department of Environmental Protection has deposited with the Legislative Reference Bureau a corrective amendment to 25 Pa. Code §§ 250.306, 250.307 and 250.605 and Appendix A, Tables 3b, 4a, 5a and 5b. The corrective amendment to 25 Pa. Code §§ 250.306, 250.307 and 250.605 and Appendix A, Tables 3b, 4a, 5a and 5b is effective as of March 5, 2011, the date the defective official text was announced in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The correct versions of 25 Pa. Code §§ 250.306, 250.307 and 250.605 and Appendix A, Tables 3b, 4a, 5a and 5b appear in Annex A, with ellipses referring to the existing text.

§ 250.605. Sources of toxicity information.

(a) For site-specific standards, the person shall use appropriate reference doses, reference concentrations, cancer slope factors and unit risk factors identified in Subchapter C (relating to Statewide health standards), unless the person can demonstrate that published data, available from one of the following sources, provides more current reference doses, reference concentrations, cancer slope factors or unit risk factors:

(1) Integrated Risk Information System (IRIS).

(2) United States Environmental Protection Agency, National Center for Environmental Assessment (NCEA) Provisional Peer-Reviewed Toxicity Values (PPRTV).

Maximum Lawful Rate of Interest for Residential Mortgages for the Month of April 2011

The Department of Banking (Department), under the authority contained in section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P. L. 13, No. 6) (41 P. S. 301), determines that the maximum lawful rate of interest for residential mortgages for the month of April, 2011, is 6 1/2%.

The interest rate limitations under the State's usury statute were preempted to a great extent by Federal law, the Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (Pub. L. 96-221). Further preemption was instituted with the signing of Pub. L. 96-399, which overrode State interest rate limitations on any individual who finances the sale or exchange of residential real property which the individual owns and which the individual occupies or has occupied as his principal residence.

Each month the Department is required by State law to compute and announce the ceiling rate on residential mortgages in this Commonwealth. This maximum rate is determined by adding 2.50 percentage points to the yield rate on long-term government bonds as published by the Federal Reserve Board and/or the United States Treasury. The latest yield rate on long-term government securities is 4.00 to which was added 2.50 percentage points for a total of 6.50 that by law is rounded off to the nearest quarter at 6 1/2%.

APPLICATIONS

THE CLEAN STREAMS LAW AND THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT APPLICATIONS FOR NATIONAL POLLUTION DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (NPDES) PERMITS AND WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT (WQM) PERMITS

This notice provides information about persons who have applied for a new, amended or renewed NPDES or WQM permit, a permit waiver for certain stormwater discharges or submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) for coverage under a General Permit. The applications concern, but are not limited to, discharges regarding industrial, animal or sewage waste, discharges to groundwater, discharges associated with municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4), stormwater associated with construction activities or concentrated animal feeding operations (CAFO). This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

For NPDES renewal applications in Section I, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has made a tentative determination to reissue these permits for 5 years subject to effluent limitations and monitoring and reporting requirements in their current permits, with appropriate and necessary updated requirements to reflect new and changed regulations and other requirements.

For applications for new NPDES permits and renewal applications with major changes in Section II, as well as applications for MS4 Individual Permits and Individual Stormwater Construction Permits in Sections IV and VI, the Department, based upon preliminary reviews, has made tentative determinations of proposed effluent limitations and other terms and conditions for the permit applications. These determinations are published as proposed actions for comments prior to taking final actions.

Unless indicated otherwise, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region III Administrator has waived the right to review or object to proposed NPDES permit actions under the waiver provision in 40 CFR 123.24(d).

Persons wishing to comment on NPDES applications are invited to submit statements to the contact office noted before the application within 30 days from the date of this public notice. Persons wishing to comment on WQM permit applications are invited to submit statements to the office noted before the application within 15 days from the date of this public notice. Comments received within the respective comment periods will be considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. A comment submittal should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests for public hearings on applications. A public hearing may be held if the responsible office considers the public response significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing will be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. The Department will postpone its final determination until after a public hearing is held.

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P.S. §§ 6026.101-6026.907)

Sections 302-305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) (35 P.S. §§ 6026.302-6026.305) require the Department to publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin an acknowledgment noting receipt of Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one or a combination of cleanup standards or receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following site, proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified as follows. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified as the remediator of the site develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

Clean Air Interstate Rule; 2011 Allocation of 2010 Vintage NOx Allowances Set Aside to Offset SO₂ Emissions

In accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 145.212(f)(2) (relating to CAIR NOx allowance allocations), the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is providing notice of the issuance of 2010 vintage Clean Air Interstate Rule (CAIR) nitrogen oxides (NOx) allowances to owners or operators of certain CAIR sulfur dioxide (SO₂) units for the purpose of offsetting SO₂ emissions. These units were exempted under the Federal Acid Rain Program provisions in section 405(g)(6)(A) of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C.A. § 7651d(g)(6)(A) and therefore did not receive SO_2 allowances, yet are subject to the CAIR SO_2 Trading Program. The Department allocated the CAIR NOx allowances identified in this notice on a ratio of 1 CAIR NOx allowance to every 8 tons of SO_2 emitted in 2010 in response to written requests submitted to the Department by January 31, 2011. Up to 1.3% of this Commonwealth's CAIR NOx Annual Trading Program budget is available for allocation to these units, as described in 25 Pa. Code § 145.212(f)(2) and (4).

The Commonwealth's CAIR NOx Annual Trading Program budget contained 99,049 CAIR NOx allowances for 2010; 97,761 CAIR NOx allowances were allocated at 40 Pa.B. 297 (January 9, 2010). The remaining 1,288 CAIR NOx allowances, 1.3% of the CAIR NOx Annual Trading Program budget, were set aside for this allocation. The Department received two requests by January 31, 2011, for additional CAIR NOx allowances. Under the State Lottery Law (72 P. S. §§ 3761-101— 3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. Name: The name of the game is Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{\text{TM}}$.

2. Price: The price of a Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{TM}$ instant lottery game ticket is \$5.

3. *Play Symbols*: Each Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM instant game ticket will contain one play area featuring a "PHILLIES® NUMBERS" area and a "YOUR NUMBERS" area. The play symbols and their captions located in the "PHILLIES® NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRTY). The play symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRTY), a Baseball (BASBL) symbol and a Bat (BAT) symbol.

4. Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: $5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL), $10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL), $20^{.00}$ (TWENTY), $40^{.00}$ (FORTY), $50^{.00}$ (FIFTY), 100 (ONE HUN), 400 (FOR HUN), 100 (ONE THO), 50,000 (FTY THO) and 100,000 (ONEHUNTHO).

5. *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$5, \$10, \$20, \$40, \$50, \$100, \$400, \$1,000, \$50,000 and \$100,000. A player can win up to 10 times on a ticket.

6. Second-Chance Drawings: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct five second-chance drawings for non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM instant game tickets as provided for in section 11.

7. Approximate Number of Tickets Printed For the Game: Approximately 3,240,000 tickets will be printed for the Pennsylvania Lottery's PhilliesTM instant game.

8. Determination of Prize Winners:

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Bat (BAT) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears under the Bat (BAT) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "PHILLIES® NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$400 (FOR HUN) appears under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Baseball (BASBL) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$400 (FOR HUN) appears under the Baseball (BASBL) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Bat (BAT) symbol, and a prize symbol of 40^{00} (FORTY) appears under the Bat (BAT) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 400.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "PHILLIES® NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Baseball (BASBL) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears under the Baseball (BASBL) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Bat (BAT) symbol, and a prize symbol of $$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears under the Bat (BAT) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "PHILLIES® NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of 50^{-00} (FIFTY) appears under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 50.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Baseball (BASBL) symbol, and a prize symbol of $50^{.00}$ (FIFTY) appears under the Baseball (BASBL) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 50.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Bat (BAT) symbol, and a prize symbol of $5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL) appears under the Bat (BAT) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "PHILLIES® NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$40^{.00} (FORTY) appears under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Baseball (BASBL) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$40^{.00} (FORTY) appears under the Baseball (BASBL) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "PHILLIES® NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of 20^{00} (TWENTY) appears under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Baseball (BASBL) symbol, and a prize symbol of $$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears under the Baseball (BASBL) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(s) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "PHILLIES® NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(t) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Baseball (BASBL) symbol, and a prize symbol of 10^{00} (TEN DOL) appears under the Baseball (BASBL) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 10.

(u) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "PHILLIES® NUMBERS" play symbols matches any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL) appears under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which any one of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols is a Baseball (BASBL) symbol, and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears under the Baseball (BASBL) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

10. Pennsylvania Lottery's PhilliesTM Second-Chance Drawing Requirements for entry by mail or entry by way of the Lottery's website:

(a) To enter by mail, players must mail exactly three (3) non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{TM}$ (PA-0870) instant lottery tickets in an envelope no larger than 4 1/8 inches by 9 1/2 inches addressed to Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{TM}$ Second-Chance Drawings, P. O. Box 2600, Middletown, PA 17057-2600. The player shall affix proper postage to the entry.

(1) Envelopes containing less than or more than three (3) non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{TM}$ instant lottery tickets shall be disqualified.

(2) Non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM instant lottery tickets received in an envelope larger than 4 1/8 inches by 9 1/2 inches shall be disqualified. The only exception is for non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM instant lottery tickets received in a United States Post Office "damaged-in-mail-process" envelope.

(3) Winning Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM instant lottery tickets submitted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's

 $Phillies^{\text{TM}}$ Second-Chance Drawings' address will not be paid or honored. Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{\text{TM}}$ Second-Chance Drawing entries containing winning Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{\text{TM}}$ instant lottery tickets will be disqualified.

(4) The back of each non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM instant lottery ticket entered in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawings must be completed by the same player in a legible manner, including the player's name, street address, city, state, zip code, telephone number and signature. Only one claimant per ticket or entry allowed. Claimant must be 18 years of age or older. Incomplete tickets shall be disqualified.

(b) To enter via the Lottery's website, players must go to the Pennsylvania Lottery's website (http://www.palottery.com), follow the *Phillies*TM promotional link and follow the instructions to establish an entry account and enter the identifying information from three (3) non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM instant lottery tickets.

(1) Players must be members of the Pennsylvania Lottery VIP Players Club to submit entries by way of the Lottery's website. (2) The contents of the entry account must be accurate and complete and shall include the player's name, street address, city, state, zip code, telephone number and acknowledgment or signature. Incomplete entry accounts cannot be submitted.

(3) Only one claimant per entry allowed. Claimant must be 18 years of age or older.

(4) Entries submitted via the Lottery's website must be submitted from a computer within Pennsylvania.

(5) Winners will be required to produce the three actual tickets used to create an entry selected to win a prize in one of the Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{TM}$ Second-Chance Drawings in order to claim that prize.

(c) Non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM instant lottery tickets submitted by mail are not eligible to be submitted via the Lottery's website and non-winning tickets submitted via the Lottery's website are not eligible to be submitted by mail. Violation of this provision will result in the disqualification of the entry.

11. Second-Chance Drawing Procedures:

(a) The Lottery will conduct five Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawings. All Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawings' entries received at Lottery Headquarters on or before 4:00 p.m. October 27, 2011, or received via the Lottery's website on or before 4:00 p.m. October 27, 2011, will be eligible to participate in one of the five Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawings. All time references in this section are Eastern Standard Time.

(1) All Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{\text{TM}}$ Second-Chance Drawing entries received at Lottery Headquarters on or before 4:00 p.m. April 28, 2011, or received via the Lottery's website on or before 4:00 p.m. April 28, 2011, will be eligible to participate in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawing which will be held at Lottery Headquarters the week of May 2, 2011.

(2) All Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawing entries received at Lottery Headquarters after 4:00 p.m. April 28, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. June 9, 2011, or received via the Lottery's website after 4:00 p.m. April 28, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. June 9, 2011, will be eligible to participate in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawing which will be held at Lottery Headquarters the week of June 13, 2011.

(3) All Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawing entries received at Lottery Headquarters after 4:00 p.m. June 9, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. July 21, 2011, or received via the Lottery's website after 4:00 p.m. June 9, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. July 21, 2011, will be eligible to participate in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawing which will be held at Lottery Headquarters the week of July 25, 2011.

(4) All Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{\text{TM}}$ Second-Chance Drawing entries received at Lottery Headquarters after 4:00 p.m. July 21, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. September 8, 2011, or received via the Lottery's website after 4:00 p.m. July 21, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. September 8, 2011, will be eligible to participate in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawing which will be held at Lottery Headquarters the week of September 12, 2011.

(5) All Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*[™] Second-Chance Drawing entries received at Lottery Headquarters after 4:00 p.m. September 8, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. October 27, 2011, or received via the Lottery's website after 4:00 p.m. September 8, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. October 27, 2011, will be eligible to participate in the final Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawing which will be held at Lottery Headquarters the week of October 31, 2011.

(6) The odds of an entry being selected in a Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for that drawing.

(b) To be eligible to participate in a particular Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawing, entries sent via the mail must have complied with the requirements of section 10(a). To be eligible to participate in a particular Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawing, entries submitted via the Lottery's website must have complied with the requirements of section 10(b).

(1) The Lottery assumes no responsibility for a lost or misplaced entry not entered into one of the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawings.

(2) A Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{TM}$ Second-Chance Drawing entry is eligible for only one Second-Chance Drawing. An entry that is not eligible in one group, may, at the discretion of the Secretary, remain eligible for a subsequent Second-Chance Drawing.

(3) If a Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{TM}$ Second-Chance Drawing entry is rejected during or following a Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{TM}$ Second-Chance Drawing, the sole remedy is to select another entry to replace the rejected entry in accordance with Lottery procedure.

(c) A player may only win the prize for which they are first selected in each of the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawings. Subsequent entries, from the same player, selected in the same Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawing will be disqualified and a replacement entry will be selected.

(d) Manner of conducting the Pennsylvania Lottery's $Phillies^{TM}$ Second-Chance Drawings.

(1) All entries will be placed in numbered containers. All entries received by mail will be placed in numbered physical containers, each containing approximately 500 envelopes. All entries received via the Lottery's website will be placed in numbered virtual containers, each containing approximately 500 entries.

(2) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the numbered containers from which the winners will be selected. The randomizer will not differentiate between physical and virtual containers. Winning entries can be selected from both physical and virtual containers. The randomizer will not be programmed to eliminate the possibility of the same container being selected more than once.

(3) If the numbered container selected is a physical container, one envelope will be randomly drawn from the container. As each entry envelope is selected, its contents will be qualified according to the requirements of section 10 (a). If the entry does not meet the requirements of section 10 (a), another entry will be selected from that container; and so on, until a qualified entry has been chosen. Once a qualified entry has been selected, further validation will take place by verifying the status of the tickets contained in the entry envelope drawn by entering the ticket information into the computerized instant ticket database. The first qualified and validated entry from each of the designated containers will entitle its owner to a prize as described in section 12.

(4) If the numbered container selected is a virtual container, a computer-generated randomizer will be used to randomly select one entry from the container. The player who submitted the entry will be entitled to the prize described in section 12.

(i) The submission of an entry via the Lottery's website which is selected to win a prize in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance drawing will require the player who submitted the entry to submit the three tickets used to create the submission.

(ii) The back of each non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM instant lottery ticket entered in a Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawing via the Lottery's web-site and selected to win a prize must be completed by the same player who created the entry account in a legible manner, including the player's name, street address, city, state, zip code, telephone number and signature.

(5) Determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(e) The payment of a prize awarded in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Phillies*TM Second-Chance Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

12. Description of Second-Chance Drawings Prizes:

(4) *Phillies*[®] Fantasy Camp Dream Prize Package. Two (2) 2012 or 2013 *Philadelphia Phillies*[®] Fantasy Camp packages for two (2) persons. Package includes airfare for two and one first class hotel room for the duration of the camp.

(3) *Phillies*[®] Asymmetrical Nylon Duffel. Officially licensed by *MLB Properties* and made by Athalon, this duffel has light-reflective piping, detachable shoulder strap, and tons of organized pockets. Only weighing 4 pounds, this bag comes complete with nylon interior lining, and front embroidered team logo.

(4) *Phillies*[®] Windshirt. Officially licensed by *MLB Properties* and made by G-III, this sideline pullover features a side zip, microfiber body with rib knit trim on neck, cuffs, and bottom. Official team logo embroidered on the left chest. Prize winner selects size. Prize winner selects size S through XXL.

(5) *Phillies*[®] Polo Shirt. Officially Licensed by MLB and made by Cutter and BuckTM, this relaxed 100% cotton polo features a fine combed cotton piqué with details including a ribbed knit collar and cuffs and reinforced side vents. Tonal C&B pennant embroidery on left sleeve cuff and team logo on left chest. Prize winner selects men's or women's style and men's size M through XXL or women's size S through XL.

(6) *Phillies*[®] Watch and Wallet Set. Officially licensed by *MLB Properties* and made by Game Time, this genuine leather tri-fold wallet and watch set features official team logo. Prize winner selects men's or women's style.

(7) *Phillies*[®] Short Sleeve T-Shirt. The play symbols and their captions located in the "PIRATES® NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRTY). (4) The back of each non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM instant lottery ticket entered in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawings must be completed by the same player in a legible manner, including the player's name, street address, city, state, zip code, telephone number and signature. Only one claimant per ticket or entry allowed. Claimant must be 18 years of age or older. Incomplete tickets shall be disqualified.

(1) All Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing entries received at Lottery Headquarters on or before 4:00 p.m. April 28, 2011, or received via the Lottery's website on or before 4:00 p.m. April 28, 2011, will be eligible to participate in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing which will be held at Lottery Headquarters the week of May 2, 2011.

(2) All Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing entries received at Lottery Headquarters after 4:00 p.m. April 28, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. June 9, 2011, or received via the Lottery's website after 4:00 p.m. April 28, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. June 9, 2011, will be eligible to participate in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing which will be held at Lottery Headquarters the week of June 13, 2011.

(3) All Pennsylvania Lottery's $Pirates^{TM}$ Second-Chance Drawing entries received at Lottery Headquarters after 4:00 p.m. June 9, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. July 21, 2011, or received via the Lottery's website after 4:00 p.m. June 9, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. July 21, 2011, will be eligible to participate in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing which will be held at Lottery Headquarters the week of July 25, 2011.

(4) All Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing entries received at Lottery Headquarters after 4:00 p.m. July 21, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. September 8, 2011, or received via the Lottery's website after 4:00 p.m. July 21, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. September 8, 2011, will be eligible to participate in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing which will be held at Lottery Headquarters the week of September 12, 2011.

(5) All Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing entries received at Lottery Headquarters after 4:00 p.m. September 8, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. October 27, 2011, or received via the Lottery's website

after 4:00 p.m. September 8, 2011, through 4:00 p.m. October 27, 2011, will be eligible to participate in the final Pennsylvania Lottery's $Pirates^{TM}$ Second-Chance Drawing which will be held at Lottery Headquarters the week of October 31, 2011.

(6) The odds of an entry being selected in a Pennsylvania Lottery's $Pirates^{\text{TM}}$ Second-Chance Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for that drawing.

(b) To be eligible to participate in a particular Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing, entries sent via the mail must have complied with the requirements of section 10(a). To be eligible to participate in a particular Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing, entries submitted via the Lottery's website must have complied with the requirements of section 10(b).

(1) The Lottery assumes no responsibility for a lost or misplaced entry not entered into one of the Pennsylvania Lottery's $Pirates^{TM}$ Second-Chance Drawings.

(2) A Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing entry is eligible for only one Second-Chance Drawing. An entry that is not eligible in one group, may, at the discretion of the Secretary, remain eligible for a subsequent Second-Chance Drawing.

(3) If a Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing entry is rejected during or following a Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing, the sole remedy is to select another entry to replace the rejected entry in accordance with Lottery procedure.

(c) A player may only win the prize for which they are first selected in each of the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawings. Subsequent entries, from the same player, selected in the same Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing will be disqualified and a replacement entry will be selected.

(d) Manner of conducting the Pennsylvania Lottery's $Pirates^{\rm TM}$ Second-Chance Drawings.

(1) All entries will be placed in numbered containers. All entries received by mail will be placed in numbered physical containers, each containing approximately 500 envelopes. All entries received via the Lottery's website will be placed in numbered virtual containers, each containing approximately 500 entries.

(2) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the numbered containers from which the winners will be selected. The randomizer will not differentiate between physical and virtual containers. Winning entries can be selected from both physical and virtual containers. The randomizer will not be programmed to eliminate the possibility of the same container being selected more than once.

(3) If the numbered container selected is a physical container, one envelope will be randomly drawn from the container. As each entry envelope is selected, its contents will be qualified according to the requirements of section 10 (a). If the entry does not meet the requirements of section 10 (a), another entry will be selected from that container; and so on, until a qualified entry has been chosen. Once a qualified entry has been selected, further validation will take place by verifying the status of the tickets contained in the entry envelope drawn by entering the ticket information into the computerized instant ticket database. (i) The submission of an entry via the Lottery's website which is selected to win a prize in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance drawing will require the player who submitted the entry to submit the three tickets used to create the submission.

(ii) The back of each non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM instant lottery ticket entered in a Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing via the Lottery's web-site and selected to win a prize must be completed by the same player who created the entry account in a legible manner, including the player's name, street address, city, state, zip code, telephone number and signature.

(5) Determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(e) The payment of a prize awarded in the Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

12. Description of Second-Chance Drawings Prizes:

(a) The first winner selected in each of the five Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawings shall be entitled to a prize consisting of a *Pirates*[®] Dream Prize Package. The winner of a *Pirates*[®] Dream Prize Package shall select one of the following four *Pirates*[®] Dream Prize Packages:

(4) *Pirates*[®] Fantasy Camp Dream Prize Package. Two (2) 2012 or 2013 *Pittsburgh Pirates*[®] Fantasy Camp packages for two (2) persons. Package includes airfare for two and one first class hotel room for the duration of the camp.

(b) The second through the three-hundred and first winners selected in each of the five Pennsylvania Lottery's *Pirates*TM Second-Chance Drawings shall be entitled to a prize consisting of a *Pirates*[®] Merchandise Prize Pack. There is no cash equivalent for the *Pirates*[®] Merchandise Prize Packs. The winner of each of the *Pirates*[®] Merchandise Prize Packs will receive one of each of the follow items:

(1) *Pirates*[®] Jacket. Officially licensed by *MLB Properties* and made by G-III, this colorblock full zip jacket features a fabric collar, rib knit cuffs and bottom, and a fully lined polyfill for warmth. Two official team logos embroidered on the left chest and the left sleeve. Prize winner selects size S through XXL.

(2) *Pirates*[®] Replica Jersey. Officially licensed by *MLB Properties* and made by Majestic, this 100% polyester

button front jersey features a braid trim and front chest embroidered logo with tackle twill decoration. Prize winner selects jersey from among top three players. Prize winner selects men's or women's style and men's size M through XXL or women's size S through XL.

(3) *Pirates*[®] Asymmetrical Nylon Duffel Officially licensed by *MLB Properties* and made by Athalon, this duffel has light-reflective piping, detachable shoulder strap, and tons of organized pockets. Only weighing 4 pounds, this bag comes complete with nylon interior lining, and front embroidered team logo.

(4) *Pirates*[®] Windshirt. Officially licensed by *MLB Properties* and made by G-III, this sideline pullover features a side zip, microfiber body with rib knit trim on neck, cuffs, and bottom. Official team logo embroidered on the left chest. Prize winner selects size. Prize winner selects size S through XXL.

(5) *Pirates*[®] Polo Shirt. Officially licensed by *MLB Properties* and made by Cutter and BuckTM, this relaxed 100% cotton polo features a fine combed cotton piqufé with details including a ribbed knit collar and cuffs and reinforced side vents. The "MLB Entities" shall mean the Office of the Commissioner of Baseball, its Bureaus, Committees, Subcommittees and Councils, MLB Advanced Media, L.P., Major League Baseball Enterprises, Inc., Major League Baseball Properties, Inc., The MLB Network, LLC, the Major League Baseball Clubs, Tickets.com, Inc., SportsOnEarth, LLC and each of their respective subsidiaries or affiliated entities, any entity which, now or in the future, controls, is controlled by, or is under common control with the Major League Baseball Clubs or the Office of the Commissioner of Baseball, and the directors, officers, employees and agents of the above entities.

14. Retailer Incentive Awards: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Game for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Lottery's $Pirates^{TM}$ instant game tickets. The conduct of the game will be governed by 61 Pa. Code § 819.222 (relating to retailer bonuses and incentive).

If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Pennsylvania Lottery's PiratesTM instant game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute. 16. Governing Law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P. S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

17. Termination of the Game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the January 8, 2011 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P. S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board (Board) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

1. Determining whether the regulation is in the public interest; Need.

This proposed rulemaking will rescind a temporary regulation relating to table game equipment and establish a permanent regulation on the same subject matter. Both the temporary regulation and this proposed regulation are very detailed documents that set forth the minimum design standards for gaming chips, plaques, dice, cards, shufflers, Pai Gow tiles and Sic Bo shakers and address the requirements on the receipt, storage, distribution, inventory and destruction of the equipment.

We understand that the Board is charged with ensuring the integrity of gaming. However, neither the temporary regulation nor the proposed regulation adequately explains why such a descriptive rule is needed. For each of the 18 sections contained in the proposed rulemaking, we ask the Board to provide a more detailed description of the rulemaking, how it was developed or what it is based on, and why it is needed. This background information will assist this Commission in determining if the regulation is in the public interest.

2. Implementation procedures.

This proposed rulemaking includes references to regulations that have not been promulgated. The sections of this rulemaking that include the references are: §§ 603a.10 (g); 603a.16(d); 603a.17(c); and 603a.17(f). It is our understanding that the references are to other Board table game regulations that will be promulgated in the near future. We are concerned that this rulemaking will be finalized before the other regulations are finalized. If this occurs, it could lead to a confusing regulatory environment for those that must comply with the rulemaking. In the Preamble to the final version of this rulemaking, we ask the Board to explain its plan for promulgating all of these regulations in a manner that ensures all references are valid.

3. Clarity and lack of ambiguity.

Throughout this proposed rulemaking, licensed facilities that hold a table game operation certificate (certificate holder) or manufacturers and suppliers may be required to obtain certain approvals or authorizations from the Board's Bureau of Gaming Operations (Bureau). For example, under § 603a.2(b)(1), a certificate holder must obtain Bureau approval of design specifications for gaming chips. Under § 603a.3(a), a certificate holder may issue value chips in denominations other than those specifically enumerated if those other denominations are approved by the Bureau. While we understand and appreciate the need for regulatory flexibility, we are concerned that the proposed rulemaking, in many in-stances, does not include the procedures for obtaining the necessary Bureau approvals. To assist the regulated community in understanding how to submit requests for certain approvals, we suggest that the final form regulation include the procedures or an appropriate cross-

4. Section 603a.1. Definitions.—Clarity.

The Board's temporary regulations provide a definition for the term "nonvalue chip." (See 58 Pa. Code § 523.1, relating to definitions.) The proposed regulation does not define the term "nonvalue chip" but does define the term "Roulette chip" as "a nonvalue chip which does not contain a denomination on either face which is used for wagering at the game of Roulette." A commentator has noted that the term "nonvalue chip" provides more regulatory flexibility than the term "Roulette chip." We note that the term "nonvalue chip" is also used in § 603.a.4(b)(4)(i) and suggest that a definition of this term would add clarity to the regulation.

5. Section 603a.3. Value chips; denominations and physical characteristics.—Clarity.

Subsection (k) requires value chips with a denomination of \$25 or more to contain at least three "anticounterfeiting measures." We suggest that the term "anticounterfeiting measure" be defined.

6. Section 603a.5. Roulette chips; permitted uses, inventory and impressment.—Clarity.

The term "impressment" is used throughout this section of the regulation. We recommend that it be defined.

7. Section 603a.8. Additional sets of gaming chips.— Clarity.

Subsections (c) through (f) of this section pertain to procedures that certificate holders must follow if counterfeit chips are discovered. To improve the clarity of the rulemaking, we suggest that these subsections be moved to a separate section pertaining to procedures that must be followed when counterfeit chips are discovered.

8. Section 603a.9. Plaques; issuance and use; denominations and physical characteristics.—Clarity.

The term "plaque" is used throughout this section and other sections of the regulation. We recommend that it be defined.

9. Section 603a.10. Exchange and redemption of gaming chips and plaques.—Need; Reasonable-ness; Implementation procedures.

Subsection (h) includes the following sentence: "A certificate holder shall have the right at any time to demand that a person in possession of a gaming chip or plaque surrender the gaming chip or plaque for redemption in accordance with subsection (i)." Why is this provision included in the regulation? Under what circumstances would a certificate holder demand that a patron redeem

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gaming chips or plaques? How will this provision be implemented if a patron does not comply with the certificate holder's request?

10. Section 603a.11. Receipt of gaming chips or plaques from a manufacturer or supplier; inventory, security, storage and destruction of chips and plaques.—Need.

Subsection (d) prohibits gaming chips or plaques from being stored in the same storage area as dice, cards, Pai Gow tiles or any other gaming equipment. What is the reason and need for this prohibition?

11. Section 603a.13. Dice; receipt, storage, inspection and removal from use.—Reasonableness; Implementation procedures.

Subsection (o) requires the destruction or cancellation of dice to occur within 72 hours of being collected. A commentator has suggested that 72 hours may not be enough time for a certificate holder to conduct investigations if cheating is suspected. We ask the Board to explain why a 72-hour time period is appropriate and why it was selected. We have a similar concern with § 603a.18(p), relating to the destruction or cancellation of Pai Gow tiles.

12. Section 603.15. Cards; physical characteristics.— Need; clarity.

We have two concerns with this section. First, under Subsection (g)(2), why must the label on the packaging of multiple decks of cards include the game for which cards are to be used?

Second, Subsection (i) pertains to additional requirements for cards used to play "Poker." Does the term "Poker" refer to all of the various types of Poker listed in the statutory definition of "table games" in Section 1103 of Pennsylvania Race Horse Development and Gaming Act (4 Pa.C.S. § 1103)? This should be clarified in the final-form regulation.

13. Section 603a.17. Dealing shoes; automated card shuffling devices.—Reasonableness.

Subsection (h) states that an automated shuffling device may not collect information or track cards that have been played. A commentator has stated that it produces a device that tracks cards for investigative purposes. Would a certificate holder be allowed to use a device that tracks certain information for investigative purposes only? If so, the regulation should specify under what conditions such a device can be used.

14. Section 603a.18. Pai Gow tiles; receipt, storage, inspection and removal from use.—Economic or fiscal impact; Reasonableness.

Under Subsection (g), if a certificate holder discovers that a tile is damaged, the entire set of tiles must be replaced. A commentator has stated that replacing all of the tiles is expensive and not needed. We ask the Board to quantify the cost of replacing one tile compared to replacing all the tiles. Would the integrity of gaming be jeopardized if only the damaged tile was replaced?
