READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published every week and includes a table of contents. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. First, it is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Further, agencies proposing changes to the codified text do so in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Second, the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes: Governor's Executive Orders; State Contract Notices; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or repeal regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Notice of Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. An adopted proposal must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before it can take effect. If the agency

wishes to adopt changes to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes as soon as they occur. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code*, § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government. Title 1 *Pennsylvania Code* lists every agency and its corresponding *Code* title location.

How to Find Documents

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacode.com.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes, not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylva-nia Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* also publishes a quarterly List of Pennsylvania Code Sections Affected which lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is available at www.pabulletin.com.

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Printing Format

Material proposed to be added to an existing rule or regulation is printed in **bold face** and material proposed to be deleted from a rule or regulation is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**. Asterisks indicate ellipsis of *Pennsylvania Code* text retained without change. Proposed new or additional regulations are printed in ordinary style face.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires that the Office of Budget prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions or authorities receiving money from the State Treasury stating whether the proposed action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions; that the fiscal note be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the proposed change is advertised. A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The required information is published in the foregoing order immediately following the proposed change to which it relates; the omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years; in that order, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years, in that order. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of Budget is published with the fiscal note. See 4 Pa. Code § 7.231 et seq. Where "no fiscal impact" is published, the statement means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended.

TITLE 231. RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE PART I. GENERAL

CHAPTER 200. BUSINESS OF COURTS

Rule 241. Motion for Award of Counsel Fees. Timing of Filing.

- (a) A claim for an award of counsel fees authorized pursuant to Section 2503 of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. § 2503, shall be made by motion filed within 30 days of:
- (1) a discontinuance as to all claims and all parties pursuant to Rule 229,
 - (2) the entry of a final order, or
- (3) the entry of judgment following trial in the trial court.
 - (b) The motion shall state:

- (1) the grounds in Section 2503 entitling the moving party to the award of counsel fees, and
 - (2) the amount sought or a good faith estimate of it.

Official Note: See Rules 208.1 et seq. for the procedure governing motions practice.

Explanatory Comment

The Civil Procedural Rules Committee is proposing the adoption of new Rule 241 governing the time for filing a motion for an award of counsel fees authorized pursuant to Section 2503 of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. § 2503. In Ness v. York Township Board of Commissioners, 123 A.3d 1166 (Pa.Cmwlth. 2015), the Commonwealth Court recognized that the Rules of Civil Procedure are silent as to when a motion for an award of counsel fees must be filed or adjudicated, and concluded that the trial court does not retain jurisdiction to act on a claim when it is filed more than 30 days after the entry of final judgment. However, as noted by the Ness court, under Samuel-Bassett v. Kia Motors America, Inc., 34 A.3d 1 (Pa. 2011), the Supreme Court has held that a trial court retains jurisdiction to adjudicate a motion for an award of counsel fees during the pendency of an appeal.

Subdivision (a) of the new rule requires a party to file a motion for an award of counsel fees within 30 days after a discontinuance as to all claims and all parties pursuant to Rule 229, the entry of a final order, or the entry of judgment following trial in the trial court. As minimum requirements for the content of the motion, subdivision (b) requires the designation of the subsection of Section 2503 that is the basis for the grant of the award of counsel fees, as well as the amount sought or, if not precisely known, a good faith estimate of the amount sought. This rule applies to counsel fees that may be awarded pursuant to Section 2503 only. While the rule imposes a timeline for filing motions for an award of counsel fees, the trial court retains discretion regarding when such motions will be adjudicated: either at the time of the filing of the motion or after an appeal of the case has been concluded.

TITLE 246. MINOR COURT CIVIL RULES PART I. GENERAL

CHAPTER 500. ACTIONS FOR THE RECOVERY OF POSSESSION OF REAL PROPERTY

Rule 501. Definition.

[A.] As used in this chapter[,]:

["action"] (1) "Action" means an action by a landlord against a tenant for the recovery of possession of real property brought before a magisterial district judge.

- [B. As used in this chapter, "complaint"] (2) "Complaint" shall include, where applicable, the attached and completed Recovery of Real Property Hearing Notice form.
- (3) "Victim of domestic violence" means a person who has obtained a protection from abuse order against another individual or can provide other evidence of abuse.

Official Note: Distress for rent will not be covered in rules of civil procedure for magisterial district judges, for it is not an action or proceeding before a magisterial district judge and any constable carrying out the "landlord's warrant" is acting as an agent of the landlord and not as an officer serving process of a magisterial district judge. See § 302 of [the] The Landlord and Tenant Act of 1951, 68 P.S. § 250.302. Actions for rent (§ 301 of the Act, 68 P.S. § 250.301) and to defalcate (§ 307 of the Act, 68 P.S. § 250.307) are not included in this chapter, for these are actions of assumpsit. See also § 572 of the Act, added by Act of May 3, 1968, P.L. 107, No. 56, § 1, 68 P.S.

§ 250.512. A number of trespass actions are also detailed in **[the] The** Landlord and Tenant Act of 1951 (see §§ 311—313, 68 P.S. §§ 250.311—250.313), and these would be brought under the rules pertaining to trespass actions. Consequently, this chapter will be concerned only with the action for the recovery of possession of real property. But see Rules 503C(8) and 508 as to joinder of actions and cross-complaints.

The definition of a victim of domestic violence is derived from 68 P.S. § 250.513. For additional definitions related to victims of domestic violence and abuse, *see* Rule 1202.

Rule 514. Judgment; Notice of Judgment or Dismissal and the Right to Appeal.

- A. If it appears at the hearing that the complaint has been proven, the magisterial district judge shall enter judgment against the defendant that the real property be delivered up to the plaintiff and shall enter judgment by separate entries:
 - (1) for the amount of rent, if any, which remains due,
- (2) for the amount of damages, if any, for unjust detention,
- (3) for the physical damages, if any, to the leasehold premises, and
 - (4) for the costs of the proceeding;

less any amount found due the defendant on any cross-complaint filed by the defendant.

In addition, the magisterial district judge shall make an entry identifying the sum of money found by the magisterial district judge to constitute the monthly rental for the leasehold premises.

- B. A money judgment may be rendered for the defendant on a cross-complaint filed by the defendant if the amount found due thereon exceeds any amount found due the plaintiff on the plaintiff's complaint.
- C.(1) Judgment shall be given at the conclusion of the hearing or within three days thereafter.
- (2) Upon the entry of the judgment, the magisterial district **[court] judge** shall promptly give or mail to the parties written notice of judgment or dismissal.
- D. The written notice of judgment or dismissal shall contain:
- (1) notice of the right of the parties to appeal, the time within which the appeal must be taken, and that the appeal is to the court of common pleas,
- (2) notice that a defendant in a residential lease action who is a victim of domestic violence may appeal the judgment within 20 days of the date of entry of judgment, as well as filing instructions for asserting such an appeal,
- [(2)] (3) notice that, except as otherwise provided in the rules, if the judgment holder elects to enter the judgment in the court of common pleas, all further process must come from the court of common pleas and no further process may be issued by the magisterial district judge, and
- [(3)] (4) notice that unless the judgment is entered in the court of common pleas anyone interested in the judgment may file a request for entry of satisfaction with

the magisterial district judge if the debtor pays in full, settles, or otherwise complies with the judgment.

Official Note: Paragraph A of this rule requires that the plaintiff appear and give testimony to prove the complaint before the magisterial district judge can enter judgment against the defendant, even when the defendant fails to appear for the hearing. The magisterial district judge may not enter a default judgment in a possessory action, including a judgment for money only. See Rule 512A and Note. The various issues that the magisterial district judge must determine at the hearing include: whether notice to quit was given to the defendant in accordance with law or that no notice was required under the terms of the lease; the amount or rent due, if any; damages to the leasehold premises, if any; the amount found to constitute the monthly rental [, and;]; and, the amount of the security deposit held by the landlord, if any.

As to the notice to quit requirement, see Section 501 of The Landlord and Tenant Act of 1951, 68 P.S. § 250.501. See also Patrycia Bros., Inc. v. McKeefrey, 38 Pa. D. & C.2d 149 (Delaware County C.P. 1966).

The separate entries provided in paragraph A are made necessary as a result of the rental deposit provisions for appeal or *certiorari* contained in Rules 1008B and 1013B, as well as the wage attachment provisions contained in Section 8127 of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. § 8127.

[Subdivision] Paragraph B of this rule makes provision for a money judgment for the defendant if the defendant prevails in a greater amount on the defendant's cross-complaint.

For procedure for entry of satisfaction of money judgments, see Rule 341.

Paragraph D of this rule provides for certain notices the magisterial district court shall include in the written notice of judgment or dismissal.

Subparagraph D(2) reflects the 20-day appeal period for a victim of domestic violence in a case arising out of a residential lease. See Rule 1002C. The 20-day appeal period for victims of domestic violence is derived from Section 513 of The Landlord and Tenant Act of 1951 (Act No. 1995-33, approved July 6, 1995) (Act No. 1995-33 was suspended by the Pennsylvania Supreme Court on March 28, 1996 by Order of Court insofar as the Act is inconsistent with the rules governing proceedings in magisterial district courts); 68 P.S. § 250.513. The appeal period for victims of domestic violence is 20 days (rather than the 30-day period in Section 513) to streamline the appeal process and avoid conflicts with other procedural rules regarding service and execution of an order of possession. See Rules 515, 519. Implementing a 20-day appeal period and requiring all notices to be filed with the prothonotary ensures that a victim of domestic violence will be able to initiate the appeal process before a plaintiff can enforce an order for possession.

As to paragraph [D(2)] D(3), see Rule 402D and Note. As to paragraph [D(3)] D(4), see Rule 341.

Rule 515. Request for Order for Possession.

A. If the magisterial district judge has rendered a judgment arising out of a non-residential lease that the real property be delivered up to the plaintiff, the plaintiff may, after the 15th day following the date of the entry of

the judgment, file with the magisterial district judge a request for an order for possession. The request shall include a statement of the judgment amount, return, and all other matters required by these rules.

- B.(1) Except as otherwise provided in subparagraph [(2)] B(2), if the magisterial district judge has rendered a judgment arising out of a residential lease that the real property be delivered up to the plaintiff, the plaintiff may after the 10th day but within 120 days following the date of the entry of the judgment, file with the magisterial district judge a request for an order for possession. The request shall include a statement of the judgment amount, return, and all other matters required by these rules.
- (2) In a case arising out of a residential lease, if before the plaintiff requests an order for possession,
- (a) an appeal or writ of certiorari operates as a supersedeas; or
- (b) proceedings in the matter are stayed pursuant to a bankruptcy proceeding; and
- (c) the *supersedeas* or bankruptcy stay is subsequently stricken, dismissed, lifted, or otherwise terminated so as to allow the plaintiff to proceed to request an order for possession,

the plaintiff may request an order for possession only within 120 days of the date the *supersedeas* or bankruptcy stay is stricken, dismissed, lifted, or otherwise terminated.

Official Note: The [fifteen days in subdivision] 15 days in paragraph A of this rule, when added to the [16 day] 16-day period provided for in Rule 519A, will give the defendant time to obtain a supersedeas within the appeal period. See Rules 1002, 1008, 1009, and 1013.

The 1995 amendment to section 513 of The Landlord and Tenant Act of 1951, 68 P.S. § 250.513, established a ten day 10-day appeal period from a judgment for possession of real estate arising out of a residential lease ; therefore]. Rule 1002 provides for a 20-day appeal period for defendants who are victims of domestic violence. In most cases, the filing of the request for **an** order for possession in subparagraph B(1) is not permitted will not occur until after the appeal period has expired. If the defendant is a victim of domestic violence, it is possible that the filing of the request for an order of possession may occur prior to the expiration of the 20-day appeal period. However, in that scenario, the order for possession cannot be executed prior to the expiration of the 20-day appeal period. In cases arising out of a residential lease, the request for an order for possession generally must be filed within 120 days of the date of the entry of the judgment.

Subparagraph B(2) provides that in a case arising out of a residential lease, if a *supersedeas* (resulting from an appeal or writ of *certiorari*) or bankruptcy stay is stricken, dismissed, lifted, or otherwise terminated, thus allowing the plaintiff to proceed with requesting an order for possession, the request may be filed only within 120 days of the date the *supersedeas* or bankruptcy stay is stricken, dismissed, lifted, or otherwise terminated.

The time limits in which the plaintiff must request an order for possession imposed in [subdivision] paragraph B apply only in cases arising out of residential

leases and in no way affect the plaintiff's ability to execute on the money judgment. See Rule 516, Note, and Rule 521A.

At the time the plaintiff files the request for an order for possession, the magisterial district [judge] court should collect server fees for all actions through delivery of possession. Thereafter, if the order for possession is satisfied 48 hours or more prior to a scheduled delivery of possession, a portion of the server costs may be refundable. See Rules 516 through 520 and [Section 2950(d) of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. § 2950(d)] 44 Pa.C.S. § 7161(d).

CHAPTER 1000. APPEALS

APPELLATE PROCEEDINGS WITH RESPECT TO JUDGMENTS AND OTHER DECISIONS OF MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT JUDGES IN CIVIL MATTERS

Rule 1001. Definitions.

As used in this chapter:

- [(1) "Judgment" means a judgment rendered by a magisterial district judge under Rule 319, 322 or 514.
- (2) "Appeal" means an appeal from a judgment to the court of common pleas.
- (3) "Certiorari" means an examination by the court of common pleas of the record of proceedings before a magisterial district judge to determine questions raised under Rule 1009A.
- (4) "Supersedeas" means a prohibition against any further execution processes on the judgment affected thereby.
- (5) "Court of common pleas" means the court of common pleas of the judicial district in which is located the magisterial district wherein the questioned action of the magisterial district judge took place.
- (6) "Claimant" includes a defendant with respect to a defendant's cross-complaint or supplementary action filed pursuant to Rule 342 in the action before the magisterial district judge.
- (7) "Defendant" includes a plaintiff with respect to the defendant's cross-complaint or supplementary action filed pursuant to Rule 342 in the action before the magisterial district judge.
- (1) "Appeal" means an appeal from a judgment to the court of common pleas.
- (2) "Certiorari" means an examination by the court of common pleas of the record of proceedings before a magisterial district judge to determine questions raised under Rule 1009A.
- (3) "Claimant" includes a defendant with respect to a defendant's cross-complaint or supplementary action filed pursuant to Rule 342 in the action before the magisterial district judge.
- (4) "Court of common pleas" means the court of common pleas of the judicial district in which is located the magisterial district wherein the questioned action of the magisterial district judge took place.

(5) "Defendant" includes a plaintiff with respect to the defendant's cross-complaint or supplementary action filed pursuant to Rule 342 in the action before the magisterial district judge.

- (6) "Judgment" means a judgment rendered by a magisterial district judge under Rules 319, 322 or 514.
- (7) "Proof of service" means a verified written statement that service was made by personal service or by certified or registered mail, with the sender's receipt for certified or registered mail attached thereto if service was made by mail.
- (8) Service "by certified or registered mail" means the mailing of properly addressed certified or registered mail.
- (9) "Supersedeas" means a prohibition against any further execution processes on the judgment affected thereby.
- (10) "Victim of domestic violence" means a person who has obtained a protection from abuse order against another individual or can provide other evidence of abuse.

Official Note: Although one of the purposes of the definitions in this rule is to avoid needless repetition throughout these appellate rules, some of the definitions are intended to state or clarify the law as well.

In connection with the definition of "appeal" in [subdivision (2)] paragraph (1), see also Rule 1007 and the [note] Note thereto.

Under | **subdivision** (3) | **paragraph** (2), certiorari is restricted to an examination of the record of the proceedings before the magisterial district judge, which will appear on the complaint forms prescribed by the State Court Administrator. See Flaherty v. Atkins, 189 **Pa.Super. 550,**] 152 A.2d 280 (**Pa. Super.** 1959). This is a narrow form of certiorari, both with respect to procedure and the matters which can be considered under Rule 1009A. Since an aggrieved party will be entitled to a broad form of appeal de novo under these rules, there seems to be no justification for providing also for a broad form of certiorari. These restrictions on the writ of certiorari are authorized by § 26 of the Schedule to Article V of the 1968 Constitution. The writ of error, which at common law was probably available only to review the proceedings of a court of record (see Beale v. Dougherty, 3 Binn. 432 (1811)), is not a form of appellate process permitted by these rules. See also County of Carbon v. Leibensperger, [439 Pa. 138,] 266 A.2d 632 (Pa. 1970) (court of common pleas cannot issue writ of prohibition).

[The definition of "supersedeas" in subdivision (4) points out the proper office and limited nature of a supersedeas. See also Rules 1008 and 1013 and the notes thereto.]

Under [subdivision (9)] paragraph (7), there is no requirement that the sender's receipt for certified mail be postmarked. There is no return receipt requirement for certified or registered mail. It is no longer necessary that the proof of service be under oath or affirmation; however, the statement is now made subject to the penalties of 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904 relating to unsworn falsification to authorities.

The definition of "supersedeas" in paragraph (9) points out the limited nature of a supersedeas. See also Rules 1008 and 1013 and the Notes thereto.

Under paragraph (10), the definition of a victim of domestic violence is derived from 68 P.S. § 250.513. For additional definitions related to victims of domestic violence and abuse, see Rule 1202.

APPEAL

Rule 1002. Time and Method of Appeal.

A. A party aggrieved by a judgment for money, or a judgment affecting the delivery of possession of real property arising out of a nonresidential lease, may appeal therefrom within [thirty (30)] 30 days after the date of the entry of the judgment by filing with the prothonotary of the court of common pleas a notice of appeal on a form [which] that shall be prescribed by the State Court Administrator together with a copy of the Notice of Judgment issued by the magisterial district judge. The prothonotary shall not accept an appeal from an aggrieved party [which] that is presented for filing more than [thirty (30)] 30 days after the date of entry of the judgment without leave of court and upon good cause shown

B. [A] Except as otherwise provided in paragraph C, a party aggrieved by a judgment for the delivery of possession of real property arising out of a residential lease may appeal therefrom within [ten (10)] 10 days after the date of the entry of judgment by filing with the prothonotary of the court of common pleas a notice of appeal on a form [which] that shall be prescribed by the State Court Administrator, together with a copy of the Notice of Judgment issued by the magisterial district judge. The prothonotary shall not accept an appeal from an aggrieved party [which] that is presented for filing more than [ten (10)] 10 days after the date of entry of judgment without leave of court and upon good cause shown.

C.(1) A defendant in a residential lease action who is a victim of domestic violence may appeal from a judgment for the delivery of possession of real property by filing a notice of appeal and a domestic violence affidavit with the prothonotary within 20 days of the date of entry of the judgment.

(2)(a) The domestic violence affidavit shall be on a form prescribed by the State Court Administrator, and affirm that the defendant is a victim of domestic violence.

(b) The domestic violence affidavit shall contain the name of the victim, the name of the perpetrator, and the perpetrator's relationship to the victim, as well as a verification by the defendant.

(c) The domestic violence affidavit is a confidential document, and shall not be publically accessible.

Official Note: The [thirty day] 30-day limitation in [subdivision] paragraph A of this rule is the same as that found in the Judicial Code § 5571(b), 42 Pa.C.S. § 5571(b), as amended by § 10(67) of the Judiciary Act Repealer Act, Act of April 28, 1978, P.L. 202, No. 53. The [ten day limitation in subdivision B of this rule] 10-day limitation in subparagraph B(1) of this rule, as well as the 20-day limitation in paragraph C, is

designed to implement the time for appeal set forth in § 513 of [the] The Landlord and Tenant Act of 1951 (Act No. 1995-33, approved July 6, 1995) (Act No. 1995-33 was suspended by the Pa. Supreme Court on March 28, 1996 by Order of Court insofar as the Act is inconsistent with Rules of Civil Procedure Governing Actions and Proceedings Before Magisterial District Judges, as adopted by that Order.) [The two subdivisions of this rule are 1 This rule is intended to clarify that where the right of possession of residential real estate is at issue, and the tenant is not a victim of domestic violence, the shorter, [ten day] 10-day period for appeal applies; where the appeal is taken from any judgment for money, or a judgment affecting a nonresidential lease, under these rules, the [thirty day] 30-day period of time for appeal applies. Where the appeal is taken from a judgment affecting a residential lease and the defendant is a victim of domestic violence, the 20-day appeal period applies. A party may appeal the money portion of a judgment only within the [thirty day] 30-day appeal period specified in [subsection] paragraph A of this rule. It is the intent of this rule that no supersedeas under [Pa.R.C.P.M.D.J. No.] Rule 1008 shall be issued by the [Prothonotary after the ten (10) day prothonotary after the 10-day period for filing an appeal, unless a tenant who is a victim of domestic violence files an appeal within 20 days of the date of entry of judgment or by order of court.

The appeal period for victims of domestic violence in paragraph C is 20 days (rather than the 30-day period in 68 P.S. § 250.513) to streamline the appeal process and avoid conflicts with other procedural rules regarding service and execution of an order of possession. See Rules 515, 519. Implementing a 20-day appeal period and requiring all notices to be filed with the prothonotary ensures that a victim of domestic violence will be able to initiate the appeal process before a plaintiff can enforce an order for possession.

The method of appeal is by filing with the prothonotary a "notice of appeal" on a form to be prescribed by the State Court Administrator. Copies of this same form will be used for service under [Pa.R.C.P.M.D.J. No.] Rule 1005. This permits use of the same form for filing and service. No useful purpose would be served by having two forms, one called an "appeal" for filing and another called a "notice of appeal" for service.

The domestic violence affidavit set forth in Paragraph C shall be on a form to be prescribed by the State Court Administrator. The domestic violence affidavit shall contain the name of the victim, the name of the perpetrator, and the perpetrator's relationship to the victim. The affidavit shall contain the defendant's verification that the statements made in the affidavit are true and correct to the best of the defendant's knowledge, information, and belief, and that any false statements are made subject to the penalties of 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904, relating to unsworn falsification to authorities. Any subsequent action by a plaintiff to strike a domestic violence affidavit shall be conducted in accordance with the relevant Rules of Civil Procedure.

The domestic violence affidavit is a confidential document because of the sensitive nature of the information contained in it, and it shall not be THE COURTS 7681

publically accessible. See Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania: Official Case Records of the Magisterial District Courts, Section 6.0(a)(3).

The 1990 amendment is intended to encourage the complete utilization of the hearing process available before the magisterial district judge.

A copy of the Notice of Judgment must be filed since it will contain the separate entries required by [Pa.R.C.P.M.D.J. No. 514.A] Rule 514A and will be needed by the [Prothonotary] prothonotary.

Rule 1005. Service of Notice of Appeal and Other Papers.

A. The appellant shall by personal service or by certified or registered mail serve a copy of [his] the notice of appeal upon the appellee and upon the magisterial district judge in whose office the judgment was rendered. If required by Rule 1004B to request a rule upon the appellee to file a complaint, [he] the appellant shall also serve the rule by personal service or by certified or registered mail upon the appellee. The address of the appellee for the purpose of service shall be [his] the address as listed on the complaint form filed in the office of the magisterial district judge or as otherwise appearing in the records of that office. If the appellee has an attorney of record named in the complaint form filed in the office of the magisterial district judge, the service upon the appellee may be made upon the attorney of record instead of upon the appellee personally.

B. The appellant shall file with the prothonotary proof of service of copies of [his] the notice of appeal, and proof of service of a rule upon the appellee to file a complaint if required to request such a rule by Rule 1004B, within [ten (10)] 10 days after filing the notice of appeal.

C. In lieu of service and proof of service pursuant to [subparagraphs A. and B. of this Rule] paragraphs A and B of this rule, the court of common pleas may, by local rule, permit or require that the appellant file with the notice of appeal a stamped envelope pre-addressed to the appellee at [his] the address as listed on the complaint form filed in the office of the magisterial district judge or as otherwise appearing in the records of that office, or the attorney of record, if any, of the appellee, and a stamped envelope pre-addressed to the magisterial district judge in whose office the judgment was rendered. Copies of the notice of appeal, and Rule pursuant to 1004B, if applicable, shall thereupon be mailed by the prothonotary or court by first class mail, with such service and any return being noted on the court's docket.

D. The party filing a complaint under Rule 1004 shall forthwith serve it upon the opposite party in the appeal by leaving a copy for or mailing a copy to [him at his] the address as shown in the magisterial district court records mentioned in [subdivision] paragraph A of this rule. If the opposite party has an attorney of record either in the magisterial district court or court of common pleas proceeding, service upon the opposite party may be made upon the attorney of record instead of upon the opposite party personally.

E. Service and proof of service may be made by attorney or other agent.

Official Note: [Subdivision] Paragraph A requires service of a copy of the notice of appeal upon the magisterial district judge as well as upon the appellee, or [his] the appellee's attorney of record. The notice of appeal includes all documents filed with the prothonotary, including a domestic violence affidavit, if applicable. This copy, when received by the magisterial district judge, may operate as a supersedeas under Rule 1008. As to [subdivision] paragraph B, there is no return receipt requirement for service by certified or registered mail and consequently no such receipt need be filed with the prothonotary, although if service is by certified or registered mail the sender's receipt must be attached to the proof of service. See Rule [1001(9)] 1001(7) and the last paragraph of the [note] Note to Rule 1001. The notice of appeal and the proof of service may be filed simultaneously. See also Rule 1006 and its [note] Note. [Subdivision] Paragraph C prescribes a pleading type service of the complaint, which may be made by ordinary mail, upon the opposite party in the appeal or [his] the party's attorney of record.

REPORT

Proposed Amendment of Pa.R.C.P.M.D.J. Nos. 501, 514-515, 1001-1002 and 1005

Appeals by Victims of Domestic Violence in Residential Lease Actions

I. Introduction

The Minor Court Rules Committee ("Committee") is planning to propose to the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania the amendment of Pa.R.C.P.M.D.J. Nos. 501, 514-515, 1001-1002 and 1005. These rules will provide a 20-day appeal period in residential lease actions for tenants who are victims of domestic violence.

II. Discussion

The Committee continues its work on the procedural rules governing appeals from judgments of magisterial district courts in an effort to provide additional time for appeal to victims of domestic violence when a judgment arises out of a residential lease and contains an award of possession. The Committee has sought to incorporate certain provisions of the Landlord and Tenant Act of 1951 ("Act"), Act of April 6, 1951, P.L. 69, as amended, 68 P.S. § 250.513(b), into the rules. This section specifically provides that "within thirty days after a judgment by a lower court arising out of a nonresidential lease or a residential lease involving a victim of domestic violence, either party may appeal to the court of common pleas..." 68 P.S. § 250.513(b) (emphasis added). Provisions to incorporate a 30-day appeal period for victims of domestic violence in residential lease actions were included in prior proposed rules that the Committee published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin in 2012 and 2014. See 42 Pa.B. 7525 (December 15, 2012); 44 Pa.B. 4342 (July 12, 2014). These publications also addressed other aspects of the appeals process that are no longer under consideration. However, the Committee has continued working on a proposal to extend the appeal period for victims of domestic violence in residential lease actions, and most recently published a third proposal earlier this year. See 47 Pa.B. 2324 (April 22, 2017).

The Committee's approach in the April 2017 publication was to permit a victim of domestic violence to file a newly-created domestic violence affidavit with the magisterial district court within 10 days after the date of the

entry of judgment so as to prohibit the issuance of an order for possession during the 30-day appeal period. Prohibiting the issuance of the order for possession would permit the defendant who filed the domestic violence affidavit to appeal the magisterial district court judgment within the allowed 30-day period without the risk of eviction. If the defendant did not file the affidavit with the magisterial district court within the 10-day period after the date of the entry of judgment, any further filings by the defendant to assert the 30-day appeal period due to domestic violence status would be made with the prothonotary, including requests for $nunc\ pro\ tunc$ relief. Additionally, any challenges by the plaintiff to the domestic violence affidavit would have to be made to the court of common pleas. The Committee's goal with this approach was to create a mechanism for the defendant to put the magisterial district court and the plaintiff on notice that the defendant is asserting the 30-day appeal period due to domestic violence status.

The Committee received feedback on the proposal that led it to reevaluate its approach. First, the Committee reconsidered the content of the domestic violence affidavit, and agreed to take a more restrictive approach to the affidavit, eliminating the requirement that the defendant provide the dates, locations and descriptions of domestic violence, and any protection from abuse orders sought or obtained against the perpetrator. The affidavit will now request only the name of the perpetrator and the perpetrator's relationship to the victim. The domestic violence affidavit will still require verification by the defendant. The domestic violence affidavit has been designated as a confidential document, and will not be publically accessible. See Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania: Official Case Records of the Magisterial District Courts, Section 6.0(a)(3). The Committee hopes this reduction in the amount and type of information collected, as well as the designation of the affidavit as a confidential document, will be seen as less intrusive for defendants, while still providing plaintiffs with adequate information on which to determine any further action.

The Committee also reconsidered its approach to the 30-day appeal period for domestic violence victims. Part of the difficulty in crafting an extended appeal period has been that unless the defendant asserts domestic violence status early in the 30-day appeal period, the plaintiff is able to seek an order for possession on the 11th day after entry of the judgment, and regain possession of the property on the 11th day after service of the order for possession, i.e., as soon as the 22nd day after the entry of the judgment. See Rules 515, 519. Practically speaking, without a notice mechanism to a court, the defendant could lose possession of the property before the extended 30-day appeal period has run, or could be required to pursue emergency relief at the court of common pleas to stay the eviction. Currently, § 513 of the Landlord and Tenant Act of 1951 (Act No. 1995-33, approved July 6, 1995) is suspended insofar as the Act is inconsistent with the rules, by the Court's Order of March 28, 1996. With the 30-day appeal period suspended for inconsistency with the rules, the Committee is considering if an alternative 20-day appeal period for victims of domestic violence will create a simpler and more streamlined process.

Changing the appeal period for victims of domestic violence from 10 days to 20 days will give defendants who are victims of domestic violence an additional 10 days in which to appeal a judgment for possession, and will

require only one filing to the prothonotary, rather than the two-step approach set forth in the earlier publication. Even if the defendant does not file the appeal until the 20th day after the entry of the judgment, he or she is not at risk of immediate eviction because the order for possession cannot be executed upon until the 11th day after service of the order for possession, *i.e.*, no earlier than the 22nd day after the entry of the judgment. A 20-day appeal period will also eliminate the need for multiple filings, as there will be no need for the affidavit mechanism to protect against evictions in the case of appeals made between the 22nd and 30th days after entry of the judgment.

As reflected in the three publications over the last five years, the Committee has labored with crafting procedures to give domestic violence victims the full benefit of the 30-day appeal period enacted by the General Assembly in 1995. However, existing procedural hurdles continue to make implementing the 30-day appeal period difficult. The Committee hopes that using a 20-day, one-step appeal with a simplified affidavit form will provide relief to defendants who are victims of domestic violence.

III. Proposed Changes

Rule 501: The definition of "victim of domestic violence" has been added to Rule 501, as well as a reference in the note to 68 P.S. § 250.513 and Rule 1202. The Committee also proposes stylistic changes to Rule 501.

Rule 514: A provision is added to Rule 514D to require the magisterial district judge to provide notice of the 20-day appeal period for domestic violence victims on the written notice of judgment, as well as instructions for properly making such an appeal. The Committee also proposes stylistic changes to Rule 514.

Rule 515: A reference to the 20-day appeal period for victims of domestic violence is added to the note. The statutory citation regarding constable fees has been updated. The Committee also proposes stylistic changes to Rule 515.

Rule 1001: The definitions have been alphabetized with corresponding changes to references in the note. A definition of "victim of domestic violence" has been added. The Committee also proposes stylistic changes to Rule 1001.

Rule 1002: New paragraph C provides that a defendant who is a victim of domestic violence shall appeal the judgment within 20 days after the date of entry of the judgment by filing the notice of appeal and the domestic violence affidavit with the prothonotary. The note sets forth the content for the domestic violence affidavit, and designates the affidavit as a confidential document. The Committee also proposes stylistic changes to Rule 1002.

Rule 1005: An updated citation to a definition is made in the note, as well as stylistic changes. The note provides that the notice of appeal includes all documents filed with the prothonotary, including the domestic violence affidavit if applicable.

Rule of Judicial Administration L-100. Access to Case Records, Confidential Information Forms, and Confidential Document Forms. Public Access Policy for the Butler County Court of Common Pleas.

The Court hereby adopts for use in the 50th Judicial District the Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania: Case Records of the Appellate and Trial Courts.

Pursuant to Section 3, the preferred method of viewing case records is through the public terminals that are available in each of the custodian's offices. In the event public terminals are not available, the custodian will ensure that the information sought is made available to the requestor.

Pursuant to Section 7, Confidential Information Forms, as provided by the AOPC, shall accompany any document filed containing confidential information as delineated in section 7.0 of the UJS's public access policy. Parties and their attorneys shall place the Confidential Information Form(s) into an unsealed, letter-sized, No. 10 envelope.

Pursuant to Section 8, Confidential Document Forms, as provided by the AOPC, shall accompany any confidential document filed as delineated in section 8.0 of the UJS's public access policy. Parties and their attorneys shall place the Confidential Documents into an unsealed, letter-sized manila (or equivalent) envelope.

Parties are expressly prohibited from filing two versions of any document, i.e., a redacted version and an un-redacted version.

MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Discharge rates for surface mining activities are precipitation driven. Discharge rates for proposed discharges associated with underground mining are noted in the permit description.

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES draft permit should submit a written statement to the Department at the address of the district mining office indicated before each draft permit within 30 days of this public notice. Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. Comments must include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests or petitions for a public hearing on NPDES permit applications, as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82(d). The request or petition for a public hearing shall be filed within 30 days of this public notice and contain the name, address, telephone number and the interest of the party filing the request, and state the reasons why a hearing is warranted. A public hearing may be held if the Department considers the public interest significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing on the NPDES permit application will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. When a public hearing is held, the Department will consider comments from the public hearing in the final determination on the NPDES permit application.

This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create a right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decisional law.

MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act(33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

The BAT limits for coal mining activities, as provided in 40 CFR Part 434 and 25 Pa. Code Chapters 87—90 are as follows:

In addition, the Department imposes a technology-based aluminum limit of 2.0 mg/l (30 day average) to protect stream uses.

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 362-0600-001, NPDES Program Implementation—Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Concerning Water Quality Management, NPDES Program Implementation, and Related Matters. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Discharge rates for surface mining activities are precipitation driven. Discharge rates for proposed discharges associated with underground mining are noted in the permit description.

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES draft permit should submit a written statement to the Department at the address of the district mining office indicated before each draft permit within 30 days of this public notice. Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. Comments must include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests or petitions for a public hearing on NPDES permit applications, as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82(d). The request or petition for a public hearing shall be filed within 30 days of this public notice and contain the name, address, telephone number and the interest of the party filing the request, and state the reasons why a hearing is warranted. A public hearing may be held if the Department considers the public interest significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing on the NPDES permit application will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. When a public hearing is held, the Department will consider comments from the public hearing in the final determination on the NPDES permit application.

Approval of a Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT II) plan for **Jeraco Enterprises, Inc.** located in Milton Borough, **Northumberland County**.

In accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 129.96—129.100, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has made a preliminary determination to approve a RACT II plan and an amendment to the State Implementation Plan (SIP) for the Milton Plant owned and operated by Jeraco Enterprises, Inc. in Milton Borough, Northumberland County.

The proposed SIP revision does not adopt any new regulations. It incorporates the provisions and requirements contained in the amended RACT II approval for the facility, which are intended to satisfy the requirements for the 1997 National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) and the 2008 NAAQS for ozone.

The proposed amendments to the RACT II determination, if finally approved, will be incorporated into a revised operating permit (49-00014) for the facility. The relevant RACT II requirements will be submitted to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a revision to Pennsylvania's State Implementation Plan and will remain in effect until replaced pursuant to 40 CFR 51 and approval by the EPA. Requirements that are not part of the RACT II determination will be excluded from the SIP submittal this includes the provisions of the Department's presumptive Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT II) requirements in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 129.97, as they apply to existing sources at this facility.

The following is a summary of the proposed amendments to the RACT II determination for this operation that will be submitted to the EPA as a SIP revision:

RACT II Requirements

All clear coatings (transparent top coats) used in Source 102A shall contain no more than 4.5 pounds of volatile organic compounds per gallon of coating, less water and exempt compounds, as applied; all primer coating materials used in Source 102A shall contain no more than 4.8 pounds of volatile organic compounds per gallon of coating, less water and exempt compounds, as applied; all basecoat coating materials used in Source 102A shall contain no more than 5.0 pounds of volatile organic compounds per gallon of coating, less water and exempt compounds, as applied; the only cleanup solvent to be used for spray line

flushing and spray equipment cleanup activities associated with Source 102A shall be acetone, unless Department approval is granted for the use of an alternative cleanup solvent; all surface coatings shall be applied using a high volume, low pressure (HVLP) spray system, or equivalent or better spray system, as determined by the Department; all solvents used for spray line cleaning shall be flushed into closed containers; under no circumstances shall cleanup solvent be removed from spray lines by spraying through a spray gun. All containers of solvent and waste solvent shall be kept closed when not in actual use and all solvent-wet rags shall be stored in closed containers when not in actual use. Under no circumstances shall waste solvent be disposed of or solvent-wet rags, etc. be treated or pre-treated prior to disposal or reuse by subjecting them to air drying or any other means of solvent removal which would cause solvent to be evaporated into the air; store all VOC-containing coatings, thinners or coating-related waste materials and VOC-containing cleaning materials and used shop towels in closed containers; ensure that mixing and storage containers used for VOC-containing coatings, thinners or coating-related waste materials and VOC-containing cleaning materials are kept closed at all times, except when depositing or removing these materials; minimize spills of VOC-containing coatings, thinners or coating-related waste materials and VOC-containing cleaning materials and clean up spills immediately; convey VOC-containing coatings, thinners or coating-related waste materials and VOC-containing cleaning materials from one location to another in closed containers or pipes.

Opening of New Grant Round for Recycling Program Development and Implementation Grants under Section 902 of Act 101, the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act of 1988

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) announces the opening of a new Section 902 grant round to support the development of municipal recycling

programs under section 902 of the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act (Act 101) (53 P.S. § 4000.902). Municipalities eligible for recycling grants include counties, cities, boroughs, incorporated towns, townships, home rule municipalities, councils of governments, consortiums or similar entities established by two or more municipalities under 53 Pa.C.S. Chapter 23, Subchapter A (relating to intergovernmental cooperation). The application deadline is April 7, 2018.

Application Requirements

All municipalities are eligible to apply for funding during this solicitation period. Applicants must be in compliance with Act 101 and the implementing regulations, the Department's Guidelines for Proper Management of Recyclable Materials and any previous grant contract provisions to be eligible to receive grant funding. County applicants should be in compliance with planning and other county-related provisions of Act 101. Applicants who are not in compliance with Act 101 and annual reporting requirements or the program performance recycling grant requirements of the act of November 9, 2006 (P.L. 1347, No. 140) will not be considered. Programs must operate in compliance with their municipality's land use plan when applicable.

Municipalities are eligible for 90% funding of approved recycling program costs. Municipalities considered financially distressed by the Department of Community and Economic Development under the Municipalities Financial Recovery Act (53 P.S. §§ 11701.101—11701.712), known as the Financially Distressed Municipalities Act, are eligible for 100% of approved costs. An application requesting more than \$350,000 in grant funding will not be accepted.

All applicants are required to complete the Sustainability Plan portion of the application that includes definitive actions and strategies for optimizing program self-sufficiency. The plan shall include, at a minimum, strategies for reducing costs and generating revenues, provisions for establishing incentives associated with waste reduction and recycling, mechanisms for public outreach and stakeholder input, and tracking mechanisms to document progress toward sustainability milestones until optimum sustainability is realized. The Department's technical report on Building Financially Sustainable Recycling Programs can provide assistance in developing the methods and strategies which can be found on the Department's web site at http://files.dep. state.pa.us/Waste/Recycling/lib/landrecwaste/recycling/ documents/fin_sust_rec.pdf. Applicants that fail to complete the Sustainability Plan portion of the application will not be considered for funding.

The following elements will receive priority for funding:

- Development and implementation incentive-based pricing and collection programs designed to increase the quantities and types of recyclable materials and reduce the quantity of waste collected.
- Development and implementation of multimunicipal collection, processing and/or a materials marketing program where capital costs are reduced and/or recycling marketability is enhanced due to intergovernmental cooperation.
- Development and implementation of collection methods that will provide greater marketability and value to collected recyclable materials.

In addition, communities whose existing recycling programs contain the following components will receive additional consideration:

- Publicly provided or municipally contracted waste and recycling services.
- The collection of six or more of the following materials: newsprint, office paper, corrugated paper, other marketable grades of paper, aluminum cans, steel or bimetallic cans, colored glass containers, clear glass containers and plastics.
- Incentive-based pricing and collection programs designed to increase the quantities and types of recyclable materials and reduce the quantity of waste collected.

Eligibility Requirements

Only those projects involving municipalities that have a mandatory trash collection program or projects seeking support for a residential recycling program that have a corresponding commercial recycling program will be considered for funding. Applicants seeking funds to replace curbside collection containers or collection vehicles, or both, will need to demonstrate that the new equipment will increase collection efficiencies and tonnage of materials.

Eligibility Costs

Eligible recycling program development costs include: recycling program design costs, recycling market investigations, development of recycling market commitments, development of recycling program ordinances, development of recycling public education programs, and the costs of developing contracts for procuring equipment or services necessary for the operation of the recycling program.

Eligible recycling program implementation costs include: purchasing or leasing vehicles used to collect recyclables (including automated and single-stream collection vehicles), transporting recyclables to processing facilities or markets, and vehicles used in the operation of a materials recovery facility; reusable containers for the collection or storage of recyclable materials; acquiring or renovating buildings, or both, for the processing or storage of recovered materials; equipment used to process or manufacture recyclable materials into usable products; improvements to land needed to operate a recycling facility or yard waste composting facility authorized under 25 Pa. Code § 271.103(h) (relating to permit-by-rule for municipal processing facilities other than for regulated medical or chemotherapeutic waste; qualifying facilities; general requirements); and the costs associated with educating the public on recycling program requirements. Under this grant solicitation, promotional items, glass crushing equipment (unless specific marketing arrangements have been identified), vehicles equipped with compaction units (except for the sole collection of yard waste, paper fiber or single-stream collection, or both, where a facility equipped to process this material has been identified), backyard composting units and public recycling containers for parks and streetscapes will not be considered eligible for funding. Other eligible and noneligible costs are listed in the grant application packet. Composting projects and programs will be considered to be recycling projects or programs accordingly.

A municipality must retain sole ownership of equipment or facilities funded by the grant. Funding for equipment or facilities purchased for the recycling program used for recycling and other purposes will be

pro-rated according to its recycling use (no equipment used for recycling less than 50% of the time will be eligible for funding). Funding for certain leaf and yard waste collection equipment may be limited according to its seasonal use. Funding for wood chipping equipment will be approved only when the equipment is part of an approved yard waste composting facility operating under the Department's guidelines and where the material is collected curbside from residents. Funding of street sweepers for the purpose of leaf collection will not be considered.

Funding may be restricted in situations where equipment or services requested through a grant application may be available from the public or private sector within the county of the applicant. Public notices may be required before the grant application may be submitted depending upon the nature of the funding request. When the municipality submits the recycling grant application to the Department, it must include proof of compliance with the notification requirements, a description of any responses received to the notice and an explanation of why the municipality has concluded the mechanical processing equipment is not available to the program from the private sector.

Requirement for Pre-application Conferences

Potential applicants must contact the appropriate Department regional planning and recycling coordinator to schedule a pre-application conference to discuss application requirements and program particulars. Applications will be returned to municipalities that fail to schedule a pre-application conference. Additional Class of Disproportionate Share Payments to Burn Centers

The Department of Human Services (Department) is announcing its intent to allocate funds for Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-2018 disproportionate share hospital (DSH) payments to qualifying Medical Assistance enrolled acute care general hospital burn centers. The Department does not intend to otherwise change the qualifying criteria or payment methodology for these payments.

All payment limitations are applicable, including those limitations that the Commonwealth may not exceed its aggregate annual DSH allotment, and that no hospital may receive DSH payments in excess of its hospital-specific limit.

Fiscal Impact

The FY 2017-2018 impact, as a result of the funding allocation for these payments, is \$7.850 million (\$3.782 million in State general funds and \$4.068 million in Federal funds) upon approval by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services.

Public Comment

Payments to Nonpublic and County Nursing Facilities; Final Rates for State Fiscal Year 2017-2018

This notice announces the Department of Human Services (Department) final annual case-mix per diem payment rates for State Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-2018 for nonpublic and county nursing facilities that participate in the Medical Assistance (MA) Program.

Nonpublic Nursing Facility Per Diem Rates

As required by the case-mix payment methodology in 55 Pa. Code Chapter 1187, Subchapter G (relating to rate setting), the Department sets an annual MA per diem rate for each nonpublic nursing facility provider. Each facility's annual per diem rate is comprised of four components: resident care; other resident related; administrative; and capital. For each quarter of FY 2017-2018, the Department will adjust the resident care component of each facility's rate by multiplying the resident care component by the facility's MA case-mix index for the appropriate picture date.

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) approved State Plan Amendment (SPA) 17-0011 on September 15, 2017, which includes the budget adjustment factor (BAF) formula the Department will use for nonpublic nursing facilities in FY 2017-2018. SPA 17-0011 provides that the BAF will limit the estimated Statewide day-weighted average payment rate for MA nursing facility services for county and nonpublic nursing facilities so that the average payment rate in effect for the fiscal year is limited to the amount permitted by the funds appropriated by the General Appropriations Act for the fiscal year. For FY 2017-2018, the Department calculated a BAF for

nonpublic nursing facilities for each rate quarter. The formula the Department used to determine the quarterly BAF equals the annual target rate divided by the weighted average quarterly rate at 100%. If the quarterly BAF as calculated is greater than 1.0, the quarterly BAF will equal 1.0. The quarterly BAF for each calendar quarter will be in the rate file that will be posted on the Department's web site.

County Nursing Facility Per Diem Rates

As required by the rate methodology in 55 Pa. Code Chapter 1189, Subchapter D (relating to rate setting), the Department sets an annual MA per diem rate for each county nursing facility provider. As stated in 55 Pa. Code § 1189.91(b) (relating to per diem rates for county nursing facilities), for each rate year beginning on or after July 1, 2007, the per diem rate paid to a county nursing facility for a rate year will be the facility's prior rate year per diem multiplied by a BAF.

In addition, as required by 55 Pa. Code § 1189.91(d), the Department used the formula set forth in the Commonwealth's approved State Plan to determine that the BAF for FY 2017-2018 for county nursing facilities is 1.0. CMS approved SPA 16-0033 on November 8, 2016, which includes the BAF formula the Department will use for county nursing facilities in FY 2017-2018.

SPA 16-0033 provides that for rate setting year 2017-2018, the BAF shall limit the estimated Statewide day-weighted average payment rate for MA nursing facility services for county and nonpublic nursing facilities so that the average payment rate is limited to the amount permitted by the funds appropriated by the General Appropriations Act. The BAF as it applies to county nursing facilities is 1.0.

The final annual per diem rates for FY 2017-2018 rate year are available on the Department's web site at http://www.dhs.pa.gov/provider/longtermcarecasemixinformation/index.htm and at local county assistance offices (CAO) throughout this Commonwealth or by contacting Marilyn Yocum, Department of Human Services, Office of Long-Term Living at (717) 772-2549. As they become available, the adjusted quarterly rates will be accessible on the Department's web site, at CAOs or by contacting Marilyn Yocum.

To establish the database for the calculation of peer group medians and prices, the Department used each nursing facility's three most recent audited cost reports that were issued by the Department on or before March 31, 2017, and indexed the costs for each report forward to the common date of December 31, 2017, using the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services' Nursing Home

Without Capital Market Basket Index. The following is a listing, by group, of the number of nursing facilities with a particular year-end and the inflation factor used to roll the costs of each facility forward to the common date of December 31, 2017.

After the database was inflated using the inflation values, the Department grouped the facilities in the correct geographic and bed size groupings. In accordance with 55 Pa. Code § 1187.94 (relating to peer grouping for price setting), to establish peer groups, the Department used the Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA) group classification published in the Federal Office of Management and Budget Bulletin No. 99-04, regarding revised statistical definitions of Metropolitan Areas and guidance on uses of Metropolitan Area definitions, to classify each nursing facility into one of three MSA groups or one non-MSA group. The Department then used the bed complement of the nursing facility on the final day of the reporting period of the most recent audited MA-11 used in the Nursing Information System database to classify nursing facilities into one of three bed complement

groups. These groups are 3—119 beds, 120—269 beds, and 270 beds and over. Peer groups 7 and 10 have been collapsed in accordance with 55 Pa. Code § 1187.94(1)(iv). Peer group 13 is designated for SRFs only and peer group 14 is designated for hospital-based nursing facilities only, regardless of geographic location or bed-size.

After the database was established and the peer groups determined, the Department calculated the medians and prices for each peer group. For peer group 13, the Department arrayed the SRFs classified on or before July 1, 2000, to set the peer group median and prices for those facilities. The Department arrayed any SRFs classified after July 1, 2000, with all other SRFs to set their peer group medians and prices.

To calculate the resident care cost medians, the Department divided the inflated audited allowable resident care costs for each cost report by the total facility case-mix index from the available February 1 picture date closest to the midpoint of the cost report period to obtain case-mix neutral total resident care cost for the cost report year. The Department then divided the case-mix neutral total resident care cost for each cost report by the total audited actual resident days for the cost report year to obtain the case-mix neutral resident care cost per diem for the cost report year. The Department calculated the 3-year arithmetic mean of the case-mix neutral resident care cost per diem for each nursing facility to obtain the average case-mix neutral resident care cost per diem of each facility. The Department arrayed the average casemix neutral resident care cost per diem for each nursing facility within the respective peer groups and determined a median for each peer group.

To calculate the other resident related cost medians, the Department first divided the inflated audited allowable other resident related costs for each cost report by the total audited actual resident days for the cost report year to obtain the other resident related cost per diem for the cost report year. The Department calculated the 3-year arithmetic mean of the other resident related cost for each nursing facility to obtain the average other resident related cost per diem of each facility. The Department arrayed the average other resident related cost per diem for each nursing facility within the respective peer groups and determined a median for each peer group.

To calculate the administrative cost medians, the Department adjusted, as appropriate, the total audited actual resident days for each cost report to a minimum 90% occupancy in accordance with 55 Pa. Code § 1187.23 (relating to nursing facility incentives and adjustments). The Department then divided the inflated audited allowable administrative cost for each cost report by the total audited actual resident days, adjusted to 90% occupancy, if applicable, to obtain the administrative cost per diem for the cost report year. The Department calculated the 3-year arithmetic mean of the administrative cost for each nursing facility to obtain the average administrative cost per diem of each facility. The Department arrayed the average administrative cost per diem for each nursing facility within the respective peer groups to determine a median for each peer group.

After the medians were determined for each peer group, the Department set prices using the medians. To set peer group prices, the Department multiplied the resident care cost median of each peer group by 1.17 to obtain the resident care cost peer group price; multiplied the other resident related cost median of each peer group by 1.12 to obtain the other resident related peer group price; and

multiplied the administrative cost median of each peer group by 1.04 to obtain the administrative cost peer group price.

The peer groups, peer group medians and peer group prices for nonpublic nursing facilities including hospital-based and SRFs for Year 23 are in the list of Medians and Prices for 2017-2018.

A Medical Assistance nursing facility provider may file an administrative appeal if the facility believes that the Department made any errors or the provider otherwise disagrees with the Year 23 peer group prices that the Department established for its peer group. A provider's appeal must be in writing and filed with the Department's Bureau of Hearings and Appeals, 2330 Vartan Way, Second Floor, Harrisburg, PA 17110-9721, within 30 days of the date of this notice. If a provider chooses to appeal, the provider will be afforded the opportunity for a de novo hearing before the Bureau of Hearings and Appeals. The peer group prices applied in setting the facility's rates may be changed as a result of the final adjudication of the facility's peer group price appeal. Facilities should refer to 67 Pa.C.S. Chapter 11 (relating to Medical Assistance hearings and appeals), and to the Department's regulations in 55 Pa. Code Chapter 41

(relating to Medical Assistance provider appeal procedures), for more detail regarding their appeal rights and the requirements related to their written appeals.

Consumer Price Index Adjustment of Base Amounts on Bids Effective January 1, 2018

Each year the Department of Labor and Industry (Department) is required by the following statutes to publish changes to the base amounts triggering the requirement for public bids, telephonic bids or separate bids, or both, for certain contracts. The Department is required to announce the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U): All Items for the United States City Average for the 12-month period ending September 30 of each year. The Department utilizes the most current nonseasonally adjusted series, as published by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), which at present uses 1982—1984 as the index base period (set equal to 100). The percent-

age change for the 12-month period ending September 30, 2017, is 2.2%.

The change to the base rate is determined as follows:

- 1) Calculate the percentage change in CPI-U (I) from September 2016 to September 2017. This is derived as I = $(CPI_{17} CPI_{16})/CPI_{16}$, where the subscripts refer to September 2017 and 2016 values of CPI-U. As reported by the BLS these values are (246.819 241.428)/241.428 = +5.391/241.428 = +2.2333%, which when rounded to 1 decimal place = 2.2%. (This was also reported as 2.2% in Table A of the BLS news release on the Consumer Price Index Summary for September 2017.)
- 2) The legislation puts a floor of 0 and a cap of 3% on the percentage change to be utilized in the calculations (technically these restrictions are on the Preliminary Adjusted Base (PAB), defined in step 4, however this is mathematically equivalent). The truncated value of the percentage change to be used in the adjustment formula is denoted as PC, resulting in:

- a) PC = I, for $0 \le I \le 3\%$,
- b) PC = 0, for I < 0 and
- c) PC = 3%, for I > 3%.
- 3) The base value (either original for new legislation or the prior year's PAB) is designated as B and the product of B and PC (determined previously) is P. (There are different values of the base depending on the entity and the type of bid, so technically B could be designated with two subscripts. For illustration purposes, the subscripts are omitted.) Then P = B*PC. A common value for the
- base amount in 2017 for a public bid is \$19,712.40. (The other two prior PABs, which are this year's bases for a variety of bid types, were \$10,655.35 and \$26,638.37.) For example, using B = \$19,712.40, results in P = \$19,712.40 * 2.2% = \$433.67.
- 4) Then the Preliminary Adjusted Base, PAB = P + B, which reduces to \$433.67 + \$19,712.40 = \$20,146.07.
- 5) The Final Adjusted Base Amount, FAA (which is used as the limit for the next year that is 2018), is the PAB rounded to the nearest 100. Therefore, the FAA = \$20,100.

Interest Rate Notice

Under sections 806 and 806.1 of The Fiscal Code (72 P.S. §§ 806 and 806.1), the Secretary of Revenue announces that, for the calendar year beginning January 1, 2018, all underpayments of tax which became due and payable to the Commonwealth shall bear interest at the rate of 4% per annum. All overpayments of the tax paid during this calendar year under Article III of the Tax Reform Code of 1971 (72 P.S. §§ 7301—7361) shall bear interest at the rate of 4% per annum. All other overpayments of tax paid during this calendar year shall bear interest at the rate of 2% per annum. These rates will remain constant until December 31, 2018. These rates will be codified under 61 Pa. Code § 4.2(a) (relating to rate of interest).

These rates have been established based upon the rate established by the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States under section 6621(a)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code (26 U.S.C.A. § 6621(a)(2)) to be effective January 1, 2018.

Although the Tax Reform Act of 1986 amended section 6621 of the Internal Revenue Code by requiring that the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States establish quarterly rates of interest to become effective for Federal purposes on the first month of each calendar quarter, these amendments do not affect Commonwealth law. The Fiscal Code, as previously cited, requires that the interest rate be established effective January 1 of each calendar year without regard to any change in the Federal interest rate during the calendar year.

Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 11. Unclaimed Prize Money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Be Mine, prize money from winning Be Mine instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Be Mine instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.
- 12. Governing Law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.
- 13. Termination of the Game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets

from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Be Mine or through normal communications methods.

A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which he qualifies on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 11. Unclaimed Prize Money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Golden Goose, prize money from winning Golden Goose instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Golden Goose instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.
- 12. Governing Law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

Interest Rate for HEMAP Loans Closed in 2018

Under section 406-C of the Housing Finance Agency Law (35 P.S. § 1680.406c), the Housing Finance Agency (Agency) is to determine prior to the end of each calendar year the rate of interest for Homeowner's Emergency Mortgage Assistance Program (HEMAP) loans closed in the next calendar year, which rate is not to exceed the rate of interest established by the Department of Banking and Securities under section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P.L. 13, No. 6) (41 P.S. § 301), referred to as the Loan Interest and Protection Law, and referred to commonly as the Usury Law.

The Agency has determined that the rate of interest for HEMAP loans closed during calendar year 2018 shall be 4.50%.

Attorneys' Fees and Costs Reimbursement Rate for HEMAP Loans Closed in 2018

Under 12 Pa. Code §§ 31.201—31.211 (relating to policy statement on Homeowner's Emergency Mortgage Assistance Program), the Agency shall reimburse lenders for reasonable attorneys' fees and reasonable and necessary costs, which are actually incurred by a mortgagee, in beginning or pursuing an action of mortgage foreclosure and which meet the requirements or limitations on the Agency's web site at www.phfa.org. The Agency will reimburse lenders based upon a reasonable hourly rate as may be established by the Agency annually and published by the Agency in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Appeals must be filed with the

Board within 30 days of publication of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Copies of the appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure may be obtained from the Board. The appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure are also available in Braille or on audiotape from the Secretary of the Board at (717) 787-3483. This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create any right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decision law.

Law Enforcement Officer Camera System Data Handling Requirements

The State Police, under 18 Pa.C.S. § 5706(b)(4) and (5) (relating to exceptions to prohibitions in possession, sale, distribution, manufacture or advertisement of electronic, mechanical or other devices), publishes this notice of the minimum standards to comply with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Criminal Justice Information Service (CJIS), Security Policy, Version 5.6 (CJIS Policy) and 18 Pa.C.S. §§ 9101—9183 (relating to Criminal History Record Information Act) (CHRIA).

Camera systems used by criminal justice agencies in accordance with paragraph (2) of the definition of "oral communication" in 18 Pa.C.S. § 5702 (relating to definitions) have a high probability of capturing criminal justice information (CJI) and personally identifiable information. For these reasons, audio or video data, or both, (herein called "data") captured by these camera systems are considered CJI and shall be handled in accordance with the CJIS Policy, CHRIA and Commonwealth Law Enforcement Assistance Network (CLEAN) regulations. Reference: CJIS Policy; 18 Pa.C.S. § 9106(b)(3) (relating to information in central repository or automated systems); and the CLEAN regulations, State Police, CLEAN Administrative Section.

Criminal justice agencies shall request approval from the State Police, CLEAN Administrative Section, prior to storing any data onsite or offsite. This approval will ensure compliance with CJIS Policy requirements and CHRIA. In accordance with 18 Pa.C.S. § 5706(b)(5), the following are the minimum requirements that must be met for any storage of an audio recording made in accordance with 18 Pa.C.S. § 5706(b)(4), or any accompanying video recording:

A. Camera system

- 1. While worn by the officer, a camera system shall be considered a physically secure location.
- 2. Upon removal from the officer's body, the camera system shall be maintained in a physically secure location in accordance with CJIS Policy standards.
- 3. If a camera system is located in a criminal justice conveyance, it shall be considered located in a physically secure location. If the camera or hard drive is removed from the criminal justice conveyance, it shall conform with the CJIS Policy. A criminal justice conveyance is any enclosed mobile vehicle used for the purposes of criminal justice activities with the capability to comply, during operational periods. A physically secure location, as stated in section 5.9.1 of the CJIS Policy (relating to physically secure location) is as follows:
- A physically secure location is a facility, a criminal justice conveyance, or an area, room or a group of rooms within a facility, with both the physical and personnel security controls sufficient to protect CJI and associated information systems. The physically secure location is subject to criminal justice agency management control, State Identification Bureau control, FBI CJIS security addendum, or a combination thereof, and shall consist of the following:
- a. Security perimeter—area that is posted, separated and secured.
- b. Physical access authorizations—list of authorized personnel.

- c. Physical access control—control all physical access points (AP).
- d. Access control for transmission medium—control physical access to information systems, distribution and lines.
- e. Access control for display medium—not visible to unauthorized personnel.
- f. Monitoring physical access—monitor and respond to security incidents.
 - g. Visitor control—authenticate and escort visitors.
- h. The agency shall authorize and control information system-related items entering and exiting the physically secure location (delivery and removal).

B. Data transfer or downloading the data

1. If accomplished through a wireless connection, agencies shall meet the CJIS Policy requirements, as stated in section 5.13.1.1 (relating to 802.11 wireless protocols).

Note: Wired Equivalent Privacy and Wi-Fi Protected Access cryptographic algorithms, used by all pre-802.11i protocols, do not meet the requirements for Federal Information Processing Standard (FIPS) 140-2 and may not be used.

- 2. Agencies shall implement the following controls for all agency-managed wireless APs with access to an agency's network that processes unencrypted CJI:
- a. Perform validation testing to ensure rogue APs do not exist in the 802.11 wireless local area network and to fully understand the wireless network security posture.
- b. Maintain a complete inventory of all APs and 802.11 wireless devices.
- c. Place APs in secured areas to prevent unauthorized physical access and user manipulation.
- d. Test AP range boundaries to determine the precise extent of the wireless coverage and design the AP wireless coverage to limit the coverage area to only what is needed for operational purposes.
- e. Enable user authentication and encryption mechanisms for the management interface of the AP.
- f. Ensure that all APs have strong administrative passwords and ensure all passwords are changed in accordance with section 5.6.2.1 of the CJIS Policy (relating to standard authenticators), as follows:
- (1) Be a minimum length of eight characters on all systems.
 - (2) Not be a dictionary word or proper name.
 - (3) Not be the same as the user ID.
 - (4) Expire within a maximum of 90 calendar days.
 - (5) Not be identical to the previous ten passwords.
- (6) Not be transmitted in the clear, outside the secure location.
 - (7) Not be displayed when entered.
- g. Ensure the reset function on APs is used only when needed and is only invoked by authorized personnel. Restore the APs to the latest security settings, when the reset functions are used, to ensure the factory default settings are not utilized.
- h. Change the default service set identifier (SSID) in the APs. Disable the broadcast SSID feature so that the

- client SSID must match that of the AP. Validate that the SSID character string does not contain any agency identifiable information (division, department, street, and the like) or services.
- i. Enable all security features of the wireless product, including the cryptographic authentication, firewall and other available privacy features.
- j. Ensure that encryption key sizes are at least 128-bits and the default shared keys are replaced by unique keys.
 - k. Ensure that the ad-hoc mode has been disabled.
- l. Disable all nonessential management protocols on the APs.
- m. Ensure all management access and authentication occurs through FIPS-compliant secure protocols (for example, SFTP, HTTPS, SNMP over TLS, and the like). Disable non-FIPS-compliant secure access to the management interface.
- n. Enable logging (if supported) and review the logs on a recurring basis per local policy. At a minimum, logs shall be reviewed monthly.
- o. Insulate, virtually (for example, virtual local area network and access control lists) or physically (for example, firewalls), the wireless network from the operational wired infrastructure. Limit access between wireless networks and the wired network to only operational needs.
- p. When disposing of APs that will no longer be used by the agency, clear AP configuration to prevent disclosure of network configuration, keys, passwords, and the like.
- 3. If the data is manually downloaded by an individual or retained outside of a physically secure location, it will need to be encrypted at rest and in transit, per sections 5.10.1.2.1 and 5.10.1.2.2 of the CJIS Policy (relating to encryption for CJI in transit; and encryption for CJI at rest).

C. Storage of the data

Storage of data on location, if considered a physically secure location, shall be treated the same as all CJI at the location. Storage offsite, or in the cloud, shall meet all the requirements of the CJIS Policy for encryption while in transit and at rest, if applicable. If encryption is not used at rest, any person with access to the data or systems storing the data shall be properly vetted with a fingerprint-based background check and Security Awareness Training, and required agreements shall be maintained

- 1. As stated in section 5.10.1.2.1 of the CJIS Policy:
- When CJI is transmitted outside the boundary of the physically secure location, the data shall be immediately protected via encryption. When encryption is employed, the cryptographic module used shall be FIPS 140-2 certified and use a symmetric cipher key strength of at least 128 bit strength to protect CJI.
- 2. As stated in section 5.10.1.2.2 of the CJIS Policy:

When CJI is at rest (i.e. stored digitally) outside the boundary of the physically secure location, the data shall be protected via encryption. When encryption is employed, agencies shall either encrypt CJI in accordance with the standard in Section 5.10.1.2.1 above, or use a symmetric cipher that is FIPS 197 certified (AES) and at least 256 bit strength.

D. Reviewing and release of data

- 1. Data from the camera system shall only be reviewed by authorized personnel; that is, personnel that have been cleared through a fingerprint-based background check, have received Security Awareness Training and have signed the appropriate agreements, if applicable. If required, the Management Control Agreement for local government IT, or The Security Addendum for private contractors, shall be completed and on file.
- 2. Prior to the release of data from the camera system, the data shall be reviewed and any areas containing CJI shall be removed or rendered unintelligible. Any data received from CLEAN or the National Crime Information Center in either video or audio format, or both, shall be removed or rendered unintelligible prior to release to any unauthorized or unintended personnel.

E. Retention of data

Data shall be stored for 60 days unless needed for prosecution, courts, litigation, appeals or other operational needs.

F. Destruction of data

The data, or the data storage devices that are to be destroyed, shall be destroyed in compliance with the CJIS Policy, and a written destruction procedure that complies with the CJIS Policy shall be maintained at the agency. As stated in section 5.8.3 of the CJIS Policy (relating to digital media sanitization and disposal):

The agency shall sanitize, that is, overwrite at least three times or degauss digital media prior to disposal or release for reuse by unauthorized individuals. Inoperable digital media shall be destroyed (cut up, shredded, etc.). The agency shall maintain written documentation of the steps taken to sanitize or destroy electronic media. Agencies shall ensure the sanitization or destruction is witnessed or carried out by authorized personnel.
