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Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva-nia Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacode.com.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylva-nia Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

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Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the [Legislative Reference] Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

- (a) General Requirement.
- 1. Every active lawyer shall annually complete, during the compliance period to which he or she is assigned; the CLE required by the Board pursuant to these Rules and established in Board regulations.
 - 2. CLE shall be on the subjects of:
 - (i) substantive law, practice and procedure,
 - (ii) lawyer ethics and the rules of professional conduct,
 - (iii) professionalism,
- (iv) substance abuse as it affects lawyers and the practice of law.
- 3. The minimum annual CLE requirement shall be nine (9) hours, effective September 1, 1994, and twelve (12) hours, effective September 1, 1995.
- (b) Fulfillment Requirements. The CLE requirement shall be fulfilled by attending the required number of CLE courses by providers or completing a CLE activity approved by the Board as sufficient to meet the CLE general requirement.
- (c) Every newly admitted attorney shall attend the Bridge The Gap program, of at least four (4) hours, sponsored by an approved Bridge the Gap CLE provider prior to his or her first compliance deadline.

(d) Lawyers with an Emeritus license shall complete an annual CLE requirement of eight (8) hours pursuant to these rules and established in Board regulations.

CHAPTER 83. PENNSYLVANIA RULES OF DISCIPLINARY ENFORCEMENT

Subchapter D. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS Rule 403. Emeritus Status.

- (a) *Qualifications*. An attorney admitted in Pennsylvania who is registered as retired and who seeks to provide pro bono services under this rule shall transfer to emeritus status by complying with the requirements listed below.
- (b) Application Procedure. Prior to the representation described in (d), an attorney shall complete and submit to the Attorney Registration Office an Application for Emeritus Status which shall include the following:
- (1) The name, attorney identification number, telephone number, current email and residence address of the attorney, the latter of which shall be an actual street address, a rural route box number, or a post office box number. Upon an attorney's written request submitted to the Attorney Registration Office and for good cause shown, the contact information will be nonpublic information and will not be published on the Board's website or otherwise disclosed:

- (2) A list of all courts (except courts of this Commonwealth) and jurisdictions in which the attorney has been licensed to practice law, with the current status thereof;
 - (3) Prior disciplinary record in other jurisdictions;
- (4) The list of approved Continuing Legal Education courses that the attorney has completed during the 12-month period immediately preceding the submission of the Application for Emeritus Status, totaling no fewer than 6 credit hours, 5 of which shall be in the substantive area of law and 1 of which shall be in ethics;
- (5) Verification that the attorney is authorized solely to provide pro bono services to eligible legal aid organizations:
- (6) Verification that the attorney is not permitted to handle client funds;
- (7) Verification that the attorney will neither ask for nor receive compensation of any kind for the legal services authorized under this rule;
 - (8) A registration fee of \$35.00.
- (c) Transfer to Emeritus Status. Upon review of the completed form, verification of the information and approval by the Attorney Registration Office, the application shall be processed by the Attorney Registration Office and the attorney's status as retired shall be changed to emeritus.
- (d) *Limitation of Practice*. An emeritus attorney is authorized solely to provide pro bono legal services under the auspices of an eligible legal aid organization and without charge or an expectation of fee by the attorney.
- (e) Eligible Legal Aid Organization. An "eligible legal aid organization" for the purposes of this rule is a not-for-profit organization that provides legal services.
- (f) Approval of Eligible Legal Aid Organization. Prior to the commencement of services described in (d), the emeritus attorney shall submit an Eligible Legal Aid Organization Form to the Secretary of the Board for approval. The emeritus attorney shall submit a separate form for each eligible legal aid organization for which the attorney expects to perform pro bono services. The form shall include the following:
- (1) The name and address of the Eligible Legal Aid Organization and the name of the supervising attorney;
- (2) A description of the legal services performed by the organization and the nature of the duties expected to be performed by the emeritus attorney;
- (3) Verification of the existence and extent of the malpractice insurance that will cover the emeritus attorney;
- (4) Verification that the organization will provide training and support to the emeritus attorney.
- (g) Renewal of Emeritus Status. An emeritus attorney who is registered to provide services under this rule may renew the status on an annual basis.
- (1) On or before January 1 of each year, the Attorney Registration Office shall transmit to all emeritus attorneys a notice to register by January 31.
- (2) On or before January 31 of each year, emeritus attorneys who seek to renew the status shall pay an annual fee of \$35.00 and shall file with the Attorney Registration Office a form prescribed by the Office which shall include the following:
- (i) The name, attorney identification number, telephone number, current email and residence address of the attorney, the latter of which shall be an actual street

address, a rural route box number, or a post office box number. Upon an attorney's written request submitted to the Attorney Registration Office and for good cause shown, the contact information provided by the attorney will be nonpublic information and will not be published on the Board's website or otherwise disclosed;

- (ii) A list of all courts (except courts of this Commonwealth) and jurisdictions in which the attorney has been licensed to practice law, with the current status thereof;
 - (iii) Prior disciplinary record in other jurisdictions;
- (iv) Verification that the attorney is authorized solely to provide pro bono services to eligible legal aid organizations:
- (v) Verification that the attorney is not permitted to handle client funds:
- (vi) Verification that the attorney will neither ask for nor receive compensation of any kind for the legal services authorized under this rule;
- (3) Failure to file the annual fee form and pay the annual fee by January 31 shall result in the transfer to retired status.
- (h) An emeritus attorney seeking to resume active status should refer to the procedures provided for in Enforcement Rule 218(d) and (h).
- (i) Continuing Legal Education Requirements. An emeritus attorney shall be subject to the annual CLE requirement. See Pa.R.C.L.E. 105(d).

And Now, this 10th day of May, 2018, in light of the March 28, 2018 order of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania (Judicial Administration Docket No. 496) which amended the Case Records Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania effective July 1, 2018, it is *Ordered* and *Decreed* that:

- 1) Philadelphia Rules of Judicial Administration No. *401, *402 and *403 are amended, as follows, effective July 1, 2018; and
- 2) The First Judicial District's Public Access Fee Schedule is amended, as follows, effective July 1, 2018.

This Order is issued in accordance with Pa.R.J.A. 103 and shall be filed with the following rules with the Office of Judicial Records (formerly the Prothonotary, Clerk of Courts and Clerk of Quarter Sessions) in a docket maintained for Orders issued by the First Judicial District of Pennsylvania. As required by Pa.R.J.A. 103(d)(5)(ii), two certified copies of this Order and rules shall be distributed to the Legislative Reference Bureau, together with a copy on a computer diskette, for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. As required by Pa.R.J.A. 103(d)(6) one certified copy of this Order and rules shall be filed with the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, shall be published on the website of the First Judicial District at http://www.courts.phila.gov, and shall be incorporated in the compiled set of Philadelphia local rules no later than 30 days following publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. Copies of the Order and rules shall also be published in The Legal Intelligencer and will be submitted to American Lawyer Media, Jenkins Memorial Law Library, and the Law Library for the First Judicial District.

PHILADELPHIA RULES OF JUDICAL ADMINISTRATION

- Rule *401. Policy Concerning Access to Case Records of the Court of Common Pleas and Philadelphia Municipal Court [Civil and Criminal Divisions], in Conjunction with the Case Records Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania[: Case Records of the Appellate and Trial Courts ("UJS] Case Records Policy[")] of the UJS.
- (a) Confidential Information. When a document (including exhibits) contains any of the confidential information listed in Section 7.0 of the [UJS] Case Records Policy of the UJS, the filer shall file a Redacted Version and an Unredacted Version of the document, as provided below.
- (1) Redacted Version. The Redacted Version of the document shall not include any of the confidential information listed in Section 7.0(A), and must be redacted in a manner that is visibly evident to the reader. The Redacted Version of the document shall be accessible by the public.

- (2) Unredacted Version. The Unredacted Version of the document shall contain all information, including the confidential information listed in Section 7.0(A). The Unredacted Version of the document shall not be accessible by the public.
- (3) A *Redacted Version* of a document which contains confidential information does not need to be filed for case types that are sealed or exempt from public access pursuant to applicable authority.

(b) Confidential Documents.

The documents listed in Section 8.0(A) of the **[UJS]** Case Records Policy of the **UJS** shall be filed together with the Confidential Document Form. When a document is filed using the First Judicial District's Electronic Filing System, the Confidential Document Form will be generated by the Electronic Filing System upon entry of the requisite information by the filer. All confidential documents filed in connection with each filing can be uploaded at the same time. A Confidential Document Form need not be used for case types that are sealed or exempt from public access pursuant to applicable authority. Confidential documents filed together with the Confidential Document Form are not accessible by the public; however, the Confidential Document Form is accessible by the public.

(c) Access to Case Records at a Court Facility

The information described in Section 9.0 of the **[UJS]** Case Records Policy of the **UJS** is not accessible by the public at any First Judicial District court facility.

- (d) Remote Access.
- (1) By the Parties. Counsel of record or unrepresented parties shall continue to have remote access to documents and other legal papers filed in their case(s) only.
- (2) By the Public. Before providing remote access to Case Records or dockets to the public, each Court or Division of the First Judicial District must insure that the information and documents listed and described in Section 10.0 are not remotely accessible by the public.
- (e) Fee Schedules. The First Judicial District shall adopt a Fee Schedule, as provided in Section 6.0 of the **[UJS]** Case Records Policy of the UJS, which shall be posted on the court's website at www.courts.phila.gov and posted in each court facility's filing office in an area accessible to the public.
- Rule *402. Electronic Case Records. Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County and Philadelphia Municipal Court [Civil and Criminal Divisions].
- (a) Electronic case record information maintained by the First Judicial District is available as provided in this rule to the extent its release is authorized or restricted by law, state and local rules, and applicable policies of the Unified Judicial System.
- (b) Requests for electronic case record information shall be made on forms provided by the First Judicial District from time to time.
- (c) Standard reports will be made available to Requesters upon payment of the requisite fee. Requests for combined electronic case records ("bulk records") shall be reviewed and approved on a case-by-case basis. Any request for bulk records that can be compiled using an existing report format shall be granted. Any request for bulk records or data which cannot be compiled using an existing report format will be granted if the request is not onerous, and the First Judicial District has available personnel and resources needed to compile the informa-

tion requested without adversely impacting the operations of the First Judicial District or otherwise disrupting its orderly and efficient case flow.

- (d) Requests for electronic case records will be subject to fees and costs adopted by the First Judicial District from time to time. The First Judicial District must assess, charge and collect the fees and other charges that are required by law and other legal authority. See, e.g. 42 Pa.C.S. § 1725, 42 P.S. § 21015 et seq., and 42 P.S. § 21081.
- (1) The First Judicial District shall adopt a Public Access Fee Schedule which shall be posted on the court's website at www.courts.phila.gov and posted in each court facility's filing office in an area accessible to the public.
- (2) The Public Access Fee Schedule may be amended from time to time by the First Judicial District.
- (3) Requesters may be required to pay the estimated cost of any report before release of the approved electronic case information.
- Rule *403. Financial Records of the Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County and Philadelphia Municipal Court [Civil and Criminal Divisions].
- (a) Pennsylvania Rule of Judicial Administration No. 509 implements Section 304 of The Right to Know Law which requires Judicial Agencies to provide financial records. See Act 3 of 2008, 65 P.S. § 67.304. Financial Records maintained by the First Judicial District are presumed to be open to any member of the public for inspection or copying during established business hours as provided in Pennsylvania Rule of Judicial Administration No. 509 and this rule.
- (1) Information regarding First Judicial District Contracts and Purchase Orders of \$5,000 or more issued after July 1, 2008 is available through the UJS Web Portal, https://ujsportal.pacourts.us/DocumentPostings/Search.aspx, by selecting "Philadelphia" in the "Judicial Office" field.
- (2) Financial records may also be requested by competing the First Judicial District Financial Records Request Form, which is available on the First Judicial District's website at www.courts.phila.gov.
- (b) The First Judicial District shall designate an Open-Records Officer and Appeals Officer, as required by 65 P.S. \S 67.502 and 65 P.S. \S 67.503.
- (c) The First Judicial District shall adopt a Fee Schedule, which shall be available on the First Judicial District's website at www.courts.phila.gov. The Fee Schedule may be amended from time to time. Pre-payment will be required if expected compliance costs exceed \$100.

1) Copies of Official Case Records and Financial Records. Unless otherwise provided by applicable authority¹, \$0.25 shall be charged per page for [Official] Case Records and Financial Records provided in a paper or

electronic format, whether duplicated by photocopying or printing from electronic media.

- 2) Historical Electronic Case Records Data File. A file consisting of agreed upon electronic data fields spanning a five (5) year period, as follows:
- (a) \$25,000 for electronic data maintained by the below Courts/Divisions:
 - (i) Court of Common Pleas, Trial Division, Civil
 - (ii) Court of Common Pleas, Orphans' Division
 - (iii) Municipal Court, Civil **Division**²

(iv) Philadelphia Municipal Court Traffic Division²

- (b) \$10,000 for each Court or Division for electronic data maintained by that Court or Division:
 - (i) Court of Common Pleas, Trial Division, Civil
 - (ii) Court of Common Pleas, Orphans' Division
 - (iii) Municipal Court, Civil **Division**²

(iv) Philadelphia Municipal Court Traffic Division²

- (c) \$3,000 for each report type (e.g. "Case Record" or "Judgment File") for each of the following Courts or Divisions:
 - (i) Court of Common Pleas, Trial Division, Civil
 - (ii) Court of Common Pleas, Orphans' Division
 - (iii) Municipal Court, Civil Division²

GAME COMMISSION [58 PA. CODE CH. 135]

Lands and Buildings; Archery Ranges

To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Game Commission (Commission), at its April 24, 2018, meeting, added § 135.183 (relating to archery ranges) to authorize the manners of usage of archery ranges established by the Commission.

This final-form rulemaking will not have an adverse impact on the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.

The authority for this final-form rulemaking is 34 Pa.C.S. (relating to Game and Wildlife Code) (code).

Notice of proposed rulemaking was published at 48 Pa.B. 1688 (March 24, 2018).

1. Purpose and Authority

The Commission adds § 135.183 to authorize the manners of usage of archery ranges established by the Commission. These changes do not include a requirement that individuals using archery ranges acquire a range permit, hunting or trapping license, or meet other exemption criteria.

Section 721(a) of the code (relating to control of property) provides "[t]he administration of all lands or waters owned, leased or otherwise controlled by the commission shall be under the sole control of the director, and the commission shall promulgate regulations...for its use and protection as necessary to properly manage these lands or waters." The addition of § 135.183 is adopted under this authority.

2. Regulatory Requirements

This final-form rulemaking adds § 135.183 to authorize the manners of usage of archery ranges established by the Commission.

3. Persons Affected

Persons wishing to use State game lands archery ranges will be affected by this final-form rulemaking.

GAME COMMISSION [58 PA. CODE CH. 139] Seasons and Bag Limits

To effectively manage the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth, the Game Commission (Commission), at its April 24, 2018, meeting, amended § 139.4 (relating to seasons and bag limits for the license year) to provide updated seasons and bag limits for the 2018-2019 hunting/trapping license year.

This final-form rulemaking will not have an adverse impact on the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.

The authority for this final-form rulemaking is 34 Pa.C.S. (relating to Game and Wildlife Code) (code).

Notice of proposed rulemaking was published at 48 Pa.B. 1689 (March 24, 2018).

1. Purpose and Authority

To effectively manage the wildlife resources and provide hunting and trapping opportunities in this Commonwealth during the upcoming license year, the Commission amends § 139.4 to provide updated seasons and bag limits for the 2018-2019 license year. The 2018-2019 seasons and bag limits are amended to reflect current available scientific data, population and harvest records, field surveys and professional staff observations, as well as recommendations received from staff, organized sport-

ing groups, members of the agricultural community and others interested in the management of the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.

In regard to small game seasons, the Commission eliminates the hen pheasant restriction in wildlife management units (WMU) 2A, 2C, 4C and 5B. Commission staff has determined that allowing harvest of male and female pheasants in these WMUs is appropriate because they do not contain wild pheasant recovery areas, there is no evidence that these units are capable of sustaining huntable populations of wild pheasants under current landscape habitat conditions, and either-sex hunting would provide additional hunting opportunity (especially for youth hunters) and allow for more efficient use and distribution of game farm pheasants. The male-only restriction would continue in WMUs 4E and 5A, which contain active wild pheasant recovery areas.

In regard to black bear seasons, the Commission creates a new 4-day extended firearms seasons in WMUs 4A and 5A and an increase (from 4 to 6 days) in the length of the extended firearms season in WMU 3A. These changes are intended to prevent increases in bear populations and bear-human conflicts within these WMUs.

In regard to white-tail deer seasons, the Commission extends the early deer archery season in WMUs 1A, 1B, 2A, 2C, 2D, 2E, 2F, 2G, 2H, 3A, 3B, 3C, 3D, 4A, 4B, 4D, 4E, 5A and 5B for 2 additional days during the November rut.

In regard to furbearer seasons, the Commission opens WMUs 4B and 4C to fisher trapping. Commission staff has determined that fisher population indices within these WMUs are comparable to those in other units where fisher harvest is occurring sustainably, and staff and constituents have recommended this expansion of harvest opportunity.

There are no changes to turkey or elk seasons.

Section 322(c)(1) of the code (relating to powers and duties of commission) specifically empowers the Commission to "fix seasons, daily shooting or taking hours, and any modification thereof, and daily, season and possession limits for any species of game or wildlife." Section 2102(b)(1) of the code (relating to regulations) authorizes the Commission to "promulgate regulations relating to seasons and bag limits for hunting or furtaking." The amendments to § 139.4 are adopted under this authority.

2. Regulatory Requirements

This final-form rulemaking amends § 139.4 to provide updated seasons and bag limits for the 2018-2019 hunting/trapping license year.

3. Persons Affected

Persons wishing to hunt or trap game or wildlife in this Commonwealth during the 2018-2019 hunting/trapping license year will be affected by this final-form rule-making.

4. Comment and Response Summary

The Commission received 68 official comments concerning this final-form rulemaking. The comments received concerned the following subtopics:

Deer seasons: A total of 11 comments were received concerning this subtopic: 1 supported an active duty military only deer season; 3 supported concurrent antlered/antlerless deer seasons; 1 supported opening regular firearms deer season for the entire month of December; 1 supported keeping the opening day of regular firearms deer season the Monday after Thanksgiving;

1 supported an earlier opening day for regular firearms deer season on private land; 3 supported extending archery deer season 1 week more during the rut; and 1 supported extending archery deer season to include Veterans Day.

Elk seasons: One comment was received concerning this subtopic in support of creating an archery elk season.

Bear seasons: One comment was received concerning this subtopic in support of expanding the muzzleloader bear Statewide.

Turkey seasons: Two comments were received concerning this subtopic: one supported keeping the fall turkey season open until November 16th; and one supported allowing hunters with disabilities to hunt turkey 1 week earlier than everyone else.

Small game seasons: A total of 61 comments were received concerning this subtopic: 58 supported and 3 opposed the changes to grouse season.

Furbearer seasons: Three comments were received concerning this subtopic: one supported opening otter season in Erie, Crawford and Venango Counties; one supported extending fisher season; and one supported opening bobcat season in WMU 2D.

5. Cost and Paperwork Requirements

This final-form rulemaking should not result in additional cost or paperwork.

6. Effective Date

This final-form rulemaking will be effective July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019.

The Commission amends Appendix G to replace the current hunting hours table and migratory bird hunting hours table to accurately reflect the dates and hours of legal hunting for the 2018-2019 hunting license year. The Commission also amends § 141.4 by eliminating the hunting hours closure of mourning dove season prior to noon during the first mourning dove season. The Commission has progressively expanded the length of the first mourning dove season over the past few years and has determined that a simplified hunting hours standard is preferred over a split hunting hours structure or an extension of the restricted hunting hours period during the now longer first mourning dove season. The deletion of this text will cause hunting hours for mourning dove hunting to default to the hunting hours standard for migratory birds—1/2 hour before sunrise until sunset.

Population surveys show that current wild pheasant numbers in this WPRA are very low, and much lower than the initial population at the conclusion of releases. Commission staff have concluded that due to habitat conditions, weather severity or a combination of these factors, a huntable wild pheasant population is not achievable or sustainable in this WPRA and that in

keeping with guidelines established in the Pennsylvania Ring-necked Pheasant Management Plan for unsuccessful WPRAs, the Somerset WPRA should be dissolved and the area should be reopened to either-sex pheasant hunting and to the stocking of game farm pheasants. The Commission amends § 141.28 by eliminating the Somerset WPRA

The Commission also amended § 147.317 to exempt additional individuals from the pheasant permit requirement, including individuals currently exempted from licensure by statute, individuals hunting and taking privately acquired propagated pheasants on private lands, and senior lifetime license holders that acquired their licenses before May 13, 2017, the effective date of the pheasant permit program.

This final-form rulemaking will not have an adverse impact on the wildlife resources of this Commonwealth.

The authority for this final-form rulemaking is 34 Pa.C.S. (relating to Game and Wildlife Code) (code).

Notice of proposed rulemaking was published at 48 Pa.B. 1695 (March 24, 2018).

1. Purpose and Authority

The Commission amends §§ 147.316 and 147.317 to require junior hunters to obtain a free pheasant permit to hunt pheasants in this Commonwealth. This change will allow the Commission to track junior hunter participation in the pheasant hunting program. This change will also allow the Commission to accept Wildlife Restoration Act (16 U.S.C.A. §§ 669—669k) grant funds for each permit issued to a junior hunter.

The Commission also amends § 147.317 to exempt additional individuals from the pheasant permit requirement, including individuals currently exempted from licensure by statute, individuals hunting and taking privately acquired propagated pheasants on private lands, and senior lifetime license holders that acquired their licenses before May 13, 2017, the effective date of the pheasant permit program. The first exempted group includes persons hunting pheasants on commercial and noncommercial regulated hunting grounds or special retriever training areas, as well as persons engaged in dog training activities under a dog training area, special retriever area, field dog trial or field dog trial for retrievers permit.

The second group will allow privately acquired pheasants to be hunted and killed on private property without

requirement of a pheasant permit or its associated fee. This exemption does not apply to wild pheasants or on private lands designated by agreement as cooperative access lands. This exemption will also require that any pheasants hunted, taken or possessed under this paragraph shall be banded, tagged, marked or receipted in accordance with section 2930 of the code (relating to propagating permits).

The third and final group will allow individuals that previously acquired a senior lifetime resident hunting license or senior lifetime resident combination hunting and furtaking license, as defined under section 2705 of the code (relating to classes of licenses), prior to May 13, 2017, to hunt without acquiring a pheasant permit. This addition was made to accommodate concerns submitted by lifetime license holders that obtained their lifetime license status prior to the effective date of the initial pheasant permit program.

Section 2901(b) of the code (relating to authority to issue permits) provides "the commission may, as deemed necessary to properly manage the game or wildlife resources, promulgate regulations for the issuance of any permit and promulgate regulations to control the activities which may be performed under authority of any permit issued." The amendments to §§ 147.316 and 147.317 are adopted under this authority.

2. Regulatory Requirements

This final-form rulemaking amends §§ 147.316 and 147.317 to require junior hunters to obtain a free pheasant permit to hunt pheasants in this Commonwealth. The Commission also amends § 147.317 to exempt additional individuals from the pheasant permit requirement, including individuals currently exempted from licensure by statute, individuals hunting and taking privately acquired propagated pheasants on private lands, and senior lifetime license holders that acquired their licenses before May 13, 2017, the effective date of the pheasant permit program.

3. Persons Affected

Persons wishing to hunt or take pheasants in this Commonwealth may be affected by this final-form rule-making.

4. Comment and Response Summary

The Commission received eight comments regarding this final-form rulemaking. Two comments requested the Commission to exempt senior lifetime license holders from the pheasant permit requirement. These comments and related oral testimony convinced the Commission to incorporate this exemption in this final-form rulemaking. Two comments requested that senior license holders be exempted from the pheasant permit requirement, except when hunting with a dog. This exemption was not adopted. Four comments requested that the Commission set differing fee structures based upon residency, junior hunter status or whether a person is hunting pheasants with or without a dog. These changes were not adopted.

5. Cost and Paperwork Requirements

This final-form rulemaking will result in the creation of a new class of permit that will be required for junior hunters. The Commission anticipates that this free permit will be made available through the Pennsylvania Automated License System, therefore additional paperwork requirements to the general public will be nominal. The Commission has determined that there will be limited personnel and administrative costs associated with the implementation of this new permit class. However, the Commission anticipates that these costs will be accommodated through existing staffing and existing budgets. This final-form rulemaking will also result in a reduction in cost and paperwork requirements for the additional individuals that are now exempted from the pheasant hunting permit requirement.

6. Effective Date

This final-form rulemaking will be effective upon finalform publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and will remain in effect until changed by the Commission.

Findings

- (2) The adoption of the amendments of the Commission in the manner provided in this order is necessary and appropriate for the administration and enforcement of the authorizing statute.

Order

The Commission, acting under the authorizing statute, orders that:

- (a) The regulations of the Commission, 58 Pa. Code Chapter 147, are amended by amending $\S\S$ 147.316 and 147.317 to read as set forth in Annex A.
- (b) The Executive Director of the Commission shall certify this order and Annex A and deposit them with the Legislative Reference Bureau as required by law.
- (c) This order shall become effective upon final-form publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Annex A

TITLE 58. RECREATION PART III. GAME COMMISSION CHAPTER 147. SPECIAL PERMITS Subchapter Q. PHEASANT PERMIT

§ 147.316. Application.

(a) Form and content. Applications for pheasant hunting permits issued under this subchapter shall be made through the Commission or any of its authorized licenseissuing agents on the appropriate form designated by the Commission for this purpose. Each application must include the applicant's name, address, date of birth, Commission-issued Customer Identification Number and any other information required by the Commission.

(b) Eligibility.

(1) Adult pheasant hunting permit applications are available for submission by applicants in possession of a valid resident or nonresident adult or senior hunting license, or a valid mentored adult hunting permit. The fee

for an adult pheasant hunting permit is \$25, plus any applicable transactional and issuing agent fees.

(2) Junior pheasant hunting permit applications are available for submission by applicants in possession of a valid resident or nonresident junior hunting license. There is not a fee for a junior pheasant hunting permit.

§ 147.317. Permit.

- (a) A pheasant hunting permit is required for any person to hunt or take pheasants by any means or manner or device, including the use of dogs, in this Commonwealth.
- (b) A pheasant hunting permit shall be signed and carried on person when hunting or taking pheasants in this Commonwealth.
- (c) This section and subchapter may not be construed to require a permit for individuals engaged in:
- (1) Lawful pheasant hunting activities under a valid commercial or noncommercial regulated hunting grounds or special retriever training area permit issued under

- sections 2928 and 2942 of the act (relating to regulated hunting grounds permits; and special retriever training areas).
- (2) Lawful dog training activities under a valid dog training area, special retriever area, field dog trial or field dog trial for retrievers permit issued under sections 2941—2944 of the act.
- (3) Lawful hunting of pheasants they have acquired and released on private lands not otherwise designated as cooperative access lands under sections 709 and 729 of the act (relating to cooperative agreements relating to land; and public access projects). Any pheasants hunted, taken or possessed under this paragraph shall be banded, tagged, marked or receipted in accordance with section 2930 of the act (relating to propagating permits).
- (4) Lawful hunting of pheasants by persons that previously acquired a senior lifetime resident hunting license or senior lifetime resident combination hunting and furtaking license, as defined under 2705 of the act (relating to classes of licenses), prior to May 13, 2017.

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

Order of Quarantine and Treatment; Spotted Lanternfly

Recitals

- A. This order rescinds and replaces all previous orders and addendums thereto.
- B. Spotted lanternfly, Lycorma delicatula, is a new pest to the United States and has been detected in the Commonwealth. This is a dangerous insect to forests, ornamental trees, orchards and grapes and is not native to the Commonwealth or the United States. It is not yet widely prevalent or distributed within or throughout the Commonwealth but it has been found in numerous counties since its first appearance in the Commonwealth.
- C. The plant pest *Lycorma delicatula* (Spotted lanternfly) has been determined by the Department to be dangerous and destructive to the agriculture, horticulture and forests of this Commonwealth and is hereby declared a "public nuisance."
- D. The Plant Pest Act (Act) (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162) (3 P.S. §§ 258.1—258.27) empowers The Department of Agriculture (Department) to take various measures to detect, contain and eradicate plant pests. These powers include the authority to establish quarantines to prevent the spread of plant pests within this Commonwealth, to make surveys to determine the existence, distribution and damage caused by the plant pest, to collect samples and to prescribe treatment for control of the plant pest (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, §§ 18, 19 and 21) (3 P.S. §§ 258.18, 258.19 and 258.21)
- E. Under the authority of section 258.20 of the Act (related to pests declared public nuisance) (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, § 20) (3 P.S. § 258.20) the Department may declare a plant pest to be a public nuisance when the Department determines a plant pest to be dangerous or destructive to the agriculture, horticulture or forests of this Commonwealth. For the reasons set forth in Paragraphs B and C above, the Department declared and continues to declare *Lycorma delicatula* (Spotted lanternfly) to be a public nuisance.
- F. Once a plant pest is declared a nuisance, "It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to permit any plant pest so declared to exist on his premises or to sell, offer for sale, give away or move any plants, plant products or other material capable of harboring the pest." (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, § 20) (3 P.S. § 258.20)
- G. When a pest or pests that have the potential to cause serious damage to agriculture are found in any geographic area, the area and any adjacent areas as the Department deems necessary shall be quarantined. (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, § 20) (3 P.S. § 258.21(a))
- H. The areas or zone of the Commonwealth in which the plant pest, *Lycorma delicatula* (Spotted lanternfly), has been detected or confirmed and adjacent areas that are quarantined are set forth in Article 1, Paragraph 1 (related to Establishment of Quarantine) of this Order of Quarantine. Any new place or area of the Commonwealth in which the plant pest, *Lycorma delicatula* (Spotted

lanternfly), is later detected or confirmed and adjacent areas shall be added to this Order of Quarantine through an addendum delineating the areas or zone to be added to this Order of Quarantine. As is this Order, such an addendum shall be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and enforcement of this Order of Quarantine with regard to that area or zone shall become effective immediately upon such publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Order

Article I. General Provisions

Under authority of section 21 of the Act (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, § 21) (3 P.S. § 258.21), and with the Recitals previously listed incorporated into this Order of Quarantine and Treatment by reference, the Department hereby Orders the following:

- 1) Establishment of Quarantine. A quarantine is hereby established for the plant pest Lycorma delicatula (Spotted lanternfly), which has been declared a public nuisance. The areas or zone of the Commonwealth covered by this Order of Quarantine are the following: Berks, Bucks, Carbon, Chester, Delaware, Lancaster, Lebanon, Lehigh, Monroe, Montgomery, Northampton, Philadelphia, and Schuylkill Counties and any other area or zone delineated in an addendum to this Order of Quarantine as set forth in Paragraph H. of the "Recitals" to this Order of Quarantine.
- 2) Purpose of Quarantine. The purpose of this Order of Quarantine and Treatment is as follows:
- a) To establish provisions to control and eradicate the plant pest *Lycorma delicatula* (Spotted lanternfly).
- b) To establish requirements and parameters under which individuals and persons may move regulated articles within and from the areas and zone covered by this Order of Quarantine, and any future addendum hereto.
- c) To establish treatment provisions for all properties within the areas and zone subject to this Order of Quarantine and any future addendum hereto.
 - 3) Definitions.
- a) Agent, inspector or deputy. A representative of the Department of Agriculture duly appointed by the Secretary of Agriculture to carry out the provisions of the Plant Pest Act.
- b) *Control*. The reduction of the population of a plant pest to an acceptable level as determined by the Secretary of Agriculture or his agents.
- c) ${\it Department}.$ The Department of Agriculture of the Commonwealth.
- d) *Eradication*. The elimination or removal of a pest from a defined geographic area.
- e) *Person*. An individual, partnership, association, firm, corporation, limited liability corporation, state agency, municipality or other governmental unit or agency or any other legal entity.
- f) Plant pest. An organism, including other plants, causing or capable of causing injury or damage to plants or plant products. In this case, specifically Lycorma delicatula (Spotted lanternfly).
- g) Secretary. The Secretary of Agriculture of the Commonwealth.

- h) *Treatment order*. A written document specifying certain measures to be taken to control or eradicate a plant pest, including destruction of appropriate plants or plants products.
- 4) Regulated Articles and Limitations Imposed. The plant pest established by this Order of Quarantine—Lycorma delicatula (Spotted lanternfly)—along with any material or object that may carry or spread the plant pest (the plant pest and its eggs and nymphs can exist on and be spread through conveyance of any object to which it may attach) are considered regulated articles under this Order of Quarantine and may not be moved out of or within the quarantined area unless done in accordance with Articles II through IV of this Order of Quarantine. The following list provides examples of regulated articles but is not an all-inclusive list. Any object capable of carrying the plant pest—Lycorma delicatula (Spotted lanternfly)—shall be considered a regulated article under this Order of Quarantine.
- a) Any living life stage of the Spotted lanternfly, Lycorma delicatula.
- b) All plants and plant parts. This shall include, but is not limited to, all live or dead trees, nursery stock, budwood, green lumber, firewood, logs, perennial plants, garden plants and produce, stumps, roots, branches, mulch, and composted and uncomposted chips, bark, and vard waste.
- c) Outdoor industrial and construction materials and equipment, concrete barriers or structures, stone, quarry material, ornamental stone or concrete, construction, landscaping and remodeling waste.
 - d) Packing materials, such as wood crates or boxes.
- e) Outdoor household articles including recreational vehicles, lawn tractors and mowers, mower decks, grills, grill and furniture covers, tarps, mobile homes, tile, stone, deck boards, mobile fire pits, any equipment, trucks or vehicles not stored indoors.
- f) Conveyances of any type, whether utilized for movement of the materials previously listed or personal use, and any trailers, wagons or other equipment attached thereto.
- g) Any other article, materials or means of conveyance when it is determined by an inspector to present a risk of spread of any life stage of Spotted lanternfly, *Lycorma delicatula*.
- 5) Authority of Department. As authorized by sections 18 and 19 of the Plant Pest Act, (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, §§ 18, 19(a)) (3 P.S. §§ 258.18 and 258.19(a)) the Department of Agriculture or its agents may enter onto any premises within the areas or zone established in this Order of Quarantine and Treatment, or any subsequent addendums hereto, to survey, collect samples, investigate, determine compliance and carry out eradication or control measures where necessary.
- Article II. Requirements for Movement of Regulated Articles Within or From a Quarantined Area
- 1) Compliance Checklist required for individuals not conducting business. A regulated article, including any vehicle or conveyance, delineated in Article I Paragraph 4 of this Order of Quarantine, may only be moved within or from the Quarantine Zone with a valid checklist certificate issued by the Department. The valid signed checklist certificate shall move with the regulated article(s). The

checklist certificate is a form available in blank from the Department's website and is to be completed by the individual.

- 2) Compliance Agreements Required. Compliance Agreements are only required under the following conditions:
- a. Required by Other States or Countries. To the extent required by another State or Country for the shipment of goods, the Department will require such persons to enter into a Compliance Agreement.
- b. Compliance Agreement in Place. Any person having a Compliance Agreement in place with the Department at the time of issuance of this Quarantine Order shall continue to operate under the parameters of that Compliance Agreement until such time as that person has been issued a Permit under the conditions of this Quarantine Order.
- 3) Permit required for persons conducting business requiring the movement of any regulated article within or from the Quarantine Zone.
- a. *Permit Required*. Any person conducting business requiring the movement of any regulated article within or from the Quarantine Zone, shall be required to obtain a Permit from the Department in the manner set forth herein.
- b. Movement of Regulated Articles Without a Permit Prohibited. A person conducting business may not move any regulated article within or from the Quarantine Zone without a permit.
- c. *Permit Process and Requirements*. A Person required to obtain a Permit for movement of regulated articles within or from the Quarantine Zone shall comply with the following:
- i. The owner, manager, supervisor or other person(s) with authority to bind the entity and train other employees (hereinafter "designated employee(s)") shall take training provided by the Department, Penn State Cooperative Extension or others, who have participated in a Train the Trainer course approved by the Department and shall have passed an examination, administered by an employee or agent of the Department, demonstrating they have an understanding and knowledge of the pest and of the procedures necessary to prevent the spread of the pest.
- ii. Upon successful completion of the training and passing the required test, the designated employee(s) shall be responsible for training other employees of that entity and documenting such training.
- iii. In conjunction with taking the examination, the designated employee(s) shall record, preserve, maintain and provide to the Department as needed, at a minimum, the following information:
- 1. The name, telephone number, and e-mail address of the designated employee taking the required test.
- 2. The legal name, address, business telephone number and e-mail address of the primary business location of the permit holder.
- 3. The number of vehicles and conveyances utilized and for which a Permit certificate is needed.
- 4. An attestation that the permit holder shall comply with all requirements of this Order of Quarantine and of the permit.

- iv. *Additional Information*. The Secretary may request, in writing, additional information, if necessary, from the permit holder, for the purpose of evaluating the potential risk to the Commonwealth.
- v. Any employee responsible for driving any vehicle or conveyance, or handling, shipping, packaging or loading any regulated article shall be trained by a designated employee who has taken the training, passed the permit exam and been issued a permit. Multiple employees in a business may take the permit training and examination if the business deems that necessary to build sufficient training capacity within their organization.
- vi. All regulated articles, including conveyances and vehicles, shall be inspected and all egg masses and other life stages of the Spotted lanternfly shall be removed and destroyed prior to being moved within or out of the Quarantine Zone. A record of such inspection shall be kept and recorded as set forth in Article IV of this Quarantine Order.
- vii. Regulated articles, other than the vehicles and conveyances themselves, shall be packaged and safe-guarded sufficiently, such as within a closed container, shrink wrap, tight tarp or similar covering, to maintain isolation from the domestic environment during storage or transportation.
- d. Issuance of Permit. Upon receipt of all required information as outlined in section c.(iii) above, and the successful completion of the training and testing requirements of this Quarantine Order, the Department will:
- i. Issue Permits to the person that has successfully completed the testing and training, with sufficient copies to display in each business location and vehicle.
- ii. Authorize any designated employee compliant with section c.(i), and issued a permit in accordance with the provisions of this Quarantine Order, to train other employees of the business or entity.
 - e. Maintenance of Permit
- i. *Term of Permit*. Permits shall be valid for one year from the date of issuance, with extensions permissible upon notice by the Department. A Permit shall be required until such time as the Quarantine Order is rescinded by the Department.
- ii. Change of Information. A Permit holder shall, prior to or immediately upon a change of information, provide the Department with notice of and describe any change to Permit information previously submitted.
- f. Display of Permit and Certificate. The Permit issued to the person, business or other entity, shall be displayed, in a visible and conspicuous place, at each business, entity or individual location to which it was issued and a permit issued by the Department shall be placed in each vehicle or conveyance when being operated.
- g. Subcontractors and Agents. A person required to have a Permit shall assure any subcontractor or agent of that person has also obtained the proper Permit(s) as applicable, prior to subcontracting with that person or allowing that person to act as a subcontractor or an agent, for activity within the Quarantine Zone.

Article III. Other Movement Provisions for Business

1) Movement of a regulated article through a Quarantine Zone without a Permit. A regulated article, including any vehicle or conveyance, may be shipped through the Quarantine Zone without a Permit or compliance agreement if the regulated article and the vehicle and convey-

- ance originates outside the Quarantine Zone and all of the following criteria are met:
- a. The points of origin and destination are outside of the Quarantine Zone established by this Order of Quarantine and Treatment and are indicated on a waybill accompanying the regulated article.
- b. No point of origin is within an area of the Commonwealth or other State, Commonwealth or District where the presence of the plant pest Spotted Lanternfly, *Lycorma delicatula*, has been confirmed by a federal, state or other regulatory agency.
- c. If moving during the period of April through December, the regulated article is moved into the Quarantine Zone in an enclosed vehicle or conveyance or is completely covered, such as by a tarp or full shrink wrapping, to prevent exposure to the plant pest Spotted lanternfly, Lycorma delicatula. The covering must be kept on the regulated article until leaving the Quarantine Zone and thereafter be inspected, decontaminated, or destroyed.
- d. The regulated article, including the vehicle and conveyance, is moved directly through the Quarantine Zone without stopping (except for refueling or for traffic control devices or conditions) and has been stored, packed or handled only at locations outside the Quarantine Zone.
- 2) Federal Requirements for Interstate Movement of Articles. This Order of Quarantine is distinct from, and in addition to, any Federal statute, regulation or quarantine order addressing the movement of articles from the quarantined area or this Commonwealth.
- 3) Movement of Articles from other areas where Spotted lanternfly is known to be established. If any other area inside or outside of this Commonwealth is determined by a federal, state or other regulatory agency to have the plant pest Spotted lanternfly, Lycorma delicatula, present, movement from that area into the Commonwealth shall require a Permit issued under the provisions of this Order of Quarantine and Treatment or a Department approved Permitting process or other Program carried out by the State, Commonwealth or District of origin.

Article IV. Recordkeeping

- 1) General Documentation and Recordkeeping. Documentation of proper and required inspections, such as those set forth at Article II, paragraph 3.c.vi. of this Order of Quarantine and Treatment and compliance measures taken when shipping regulated articles, including vehicles and conveyances within or from the Quarantine Zone, shall be kept by each permitted individual, employee or person conducting activity within the Quarantine Zone. These inspection records shall include recording of any living life stage finds and method utilized for destruction of the pest.
- 2) Specific Documentation and Recordkeeping for Business.
- a. The Permittee shall allow the Department during normal business hours to inspect records and protocols relevant to Permittee's adherence to the Permit requirements and this Quarantine Order.
- b. Documentation shall be kept listing each individual trained by the Permit holder's designated employee(s) as per Article II, section 3).c.
- c. Incoming and outgoing shipment records are to detail the kind and quantity of regulated article shipped, shipper name, date of shipment, source or destination information, and corresponding inspection treatment and mitigation records.

- d. Inspection, treatment and mitigation records, including dates and outcomes, shall be kept in accordance with applicable state and federal requirements.
- e. Records required under the Permit and this Quarantine Order are to be maintained for a minimum of two (2) years with copies provided to the Department upon request.

Article V. No Preclusion of Powers

- 1) This Quarantine Order does not affect, preclude or prevent the Department from enforcement of all statutory and regulatory authority.
- 2) This Quarantine Order shall not preclude the routine inspection, sampling, and testing of regulated articles by the Department or by the proper authorities in other States and Commonwealths, such as State Departments of Agriculture or similar authority, where the regulated articles may be shipped, nor does it preclude rejection, stop-sale or other regulatory action as a result of any positive samplings, tests or findings.
- 3) A person holding a Permit or subject to a Compliance Agreement shall allow the Department to enter Participant's premises during normal business hours for the purpose of: conducting inspections and collecting samples to test for the presence of Spotted lanternfly; inspecting records related to this Quarantine Order; and interviewing employees to inquire about training on Spotted lanternfly practices or compliance with this Order or any part thereof.
- 4) In cooperation with the Department, a person holding a Permit or subject to a Compliance Agreement shall undertake treatment and mitigation procedures, as the Department determines to be necessary based on available science and research, in order to slow the spread or eradicate Spotted lanternfly from the Participant's premises in a manner which minimizes the risk of spreading Spotted lanternfly in accordance with the standards established below.

Article VI. Surveys, Order of Treatment and Monitoring

- 1) Surveys. The Plant Pest Act (Act) (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162) (3 P.S. §§ 258.1—258.27) empowers the Department to take various measures to detect, contain and eradicate plant pests. These powers include the authority, under section 18 of the Act, to conduct surveys to determine the existence, distribution and severity of damage caused by a plant pest. (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, § 18) (3 P.S. § 258.18). Pursuant to that authority the Department has been conducting and will continue to conduct surveys within the Commonwealth for the plant pest, Spotted lanternfly, Lycorma delicatula.
- 2) Treatment Requirements. As set forth in the Recitals to this Order of Quarantine and Treatment the plant pest Spotted Lanternfly, Lycorma delicatula has been declared a public nuisance. Once a plant pest is declared a nuisance, "It shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to permit any plant pest so declared to exist on his premises..." (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, § 20) (3 P.S. § 258.20) Furthermore, under section 19 of the Plant Pest Act, "If the secretary determines that a serious pest situation exists in any part of this Commonwealth, any necessary eradication or control measures may be taken. Prior to carrying out any treatment procedure, the department shall notify the property owner in writing. Any agent of the department is authorized to enter the premises during reasonable hours to carry out the eradication or control measures." (act of

December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, § 19(a)) (3 P.S. § 258.19(a)) Pursuant thereto, the Department issues this Order of Treatment as written notice of the Department's requirement that property owners, within the areas and zone established in this Order of Quarantine and Treatment and any future addendums hereto, are required to take the following treatment actions.

- a) Property Owner Responsibilities and Requirements:
- i) The property owner shall be responsible for controlling or eliminating any life stage of the plant pest *Lycorma delicatula* (Spotted lanternfly) on the property.
- ii) Control procedures may include tree banding, pesticide application, or removal of *Ailanthus altissima* trees, or any combination thereof, to reduce the available host of the Spotted lanternfly and to decrease the population of Spotted lanternfly. All control procedures will conform with methods approved by the Department, in addition to all applicable federal, state, and municipal laws and ordinances.
- iii) Control work may be done by the property owner or by a contractor hired by the property owner. Where a contractor is hired, the contractor shall be fully insured and properly licensed, including pesticide applicator licensing.
- iv) At the discretion of the Department and subject to availability of the necessary resources, the Department may request and the property owner may consent to the Department carrying out the necessary control measures on the owner's property.
- b) Continuing Obligation: The obligation of the property owner to control the plant pest Spotted lanternfly, Lycorma delicatula, shall continue so long as the plant pest Spotted lanternfly, Lycorma delicatula, exists on the property and such obligation shall continue until the Department has rescinded this or any subsequent Order of Quarantine and Treatment.
- 3) Monitoring by the Department. The Department will continue to survey and monitor all properties within the areas and zone of Quarantine or areas identified as having Spotted lanternfly, including any added hereto by Addendum, until such time as the Order of Quarantine and Treatment for an area or zone is rescinded. During such time, as authorized by sections 18 and 19 of the Plant Pest Act, (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, §§ 18, 19(a)) (3 P.S. §§ 258.18 and 258.19(a)) the Department of Agriculture or its agents may enter onto any premises within the areas or zone established in this Order of Quarantine and Treatment, or any subsequent addendums hereto, to survey, collect samples, investigate, determine compliance and carry out eradication or control measures where necessary.
- 4) Noncompliance. If the property owner or person in charge does not comply with the treatment provisions of this Order, the Department may carry out the control measures, and all expenses associated with the treatment shall be paid to the Department by the person failing to comply. (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, § 19) (3 P.S. § 258.19)

Article VII. Penalties, Cooperation, Effective Date

- 1) Violations. In accordance with the provisions of section 258.22 of the Act (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, \S 22) (3 P.S. \S 258.22) it shall be unlawful to violate or fail to comply with any provision of the Act, regulations or this Order of Quarantine.
- 2) Criminal and Civil Penalties. In accordance with the provisions of the Act, at sections 258.23 and 258.24 (act of

December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, §§ 258.23, 258.24) (3 P.S. §§ 258.23 and 258.24), a person who violates this Order of Quarantine may face summary criminal citation, which may carry a fine of up to \$300 per violation. In addition, a person who violates this Order of Quarantine may be assessed a civil penalty of up to \$20,000 with respect to each violation.

- 3) Revocation. Revocation of a Permit or Compliance Agreement. Any Permit or any Compliance Agreement may be canceled orally or in writing by the Department whenever the Department determines that the holder of the Permit or Compliance Agreement has not complied with a provision of the Act, regulations, Permit, Compliance Agreement or this Order of Quarantine. If the cancellation is oral, the cancellation will become effective immediately, and the cancellation and the reasons for the cancellation will be confirmed in writing as soon as circumstances allow.
- 4) Unauthorized duplication/production of Permit or Compliance Agreement. Any duplication or reproduction of any Permit or Compliance Agreement issued by the Department or of a Department approved Permit or other

program document issued by another State, Commonwealth or District, is a violation of this Order of Quarantine and will be subject to the penalties established in this Article VII.

- 5) Cooperation with other agencies. As authorized by section 258.26 of the Act (act of December 16, 1992, P.L. 1228, No. 162, § 258.26) (3 P.S. § 258.26), the Department will consult with other State agencies, Federal agencies, The Pennsylvania State University, and the Pennsylvania State University Cooperative Extension with respect to the most efficacious measures to survey for and detect Spotted lanternfly, Lycorma delicatula to slow the spread or eradicate these plant pests.
- 6) Effective Date. This quarantine is effective upon signature and shall be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and shall remain in effect until rescinded by subsequent order.

LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

UNDER ACT 2, 1995 PREAMBLE 1

Acknowledgment of Notices of Intent to Remediate Submitted under the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (35 P.S. §§ 6026.101—6026.907).

Sections 302-305 of the Land Recycling and Environmental Remediation Standards Act (act) (35 P.S. §§ 6026.302—6026.305) require the Department to publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin an acknowledgment noting receipt of Notices of Intent to Remediate. An acknowledgment of the receipt of a Notice of Intent to Remediate is used to identify a site where a person proposes to, or has been required to, respond to a release of a regulated substance at a site. A person intending to use the background standard, Statewide health standard, the site-specific standard or intend to remediate a site as a special industrial area shall file a Notice of Intent to Remediate with the Department. A Notice of Intent to Remediate filed with the Department provides a brief description of the location of the site, a list of known or suspected contaminants at the site, the proposed remediation measures for the site and a description of the intended future use of the site. A person who demonstrates attainment of one or a combination of cleanup standards or receives approval of a special industrial area remediation identified under the act will be relieved of further liability for the remediation of the site for contamination identified in reports submitted to and approved by the Department. Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the Notice of Intent to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following site, proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remedia-

tion and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30 days of the date specified as follows. During this comment period, the municipality may request that the person identified as the remediator of the site develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved and comments should be directed to the remediator of the site.

MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

A settleable solids instantaneous maximum limit of 0.5 ml/l applies to: surface runoff (resulting from a precipitation event of less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from active mining areas; active areas disturbed by coal refuse disposal activities; mined areas backfilled and revegetated; and all other discharges and drainage (resulting from a precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

In accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 129.96—129.100, the Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has made a preliminary determination to approve a RACT II plan and an amendment to the State Implementation Plan (SIP) for their Expanded Polystyrene (EPS) & Polyurethane foam manufacturing processes at the facility located in Upper Macungie Township, Lehigh County.

The proposed SIP revision does not adopt any new regulations. It incorporates the provisions and requirements contained in the amended RACT II approval for the facility, which are intended to satisfy the requirements for the 1997 National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) and the 2008 NAAQS for ozone.

The proposed amendments to the RACT II determination, if finally approved, will be incorporated into a revised operating permit (39-00040) for the facility. The relevant RACT II requirements will be submitted to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a revision to Pennsylvania's State Implementation Plan and will remain in effect until replaced pursuant to 40 CFR 51 and approval by the EPA. Requirements that are not part of the RACT II determination will be excluded from the SIP submittal.

The following is a summary of the proposed amendments to the RACT II determination for this operation that will be submitted to the EPA as a SIP revision:

Source

Expanded Polystyrene (EPS) manufacturing process, Source Id 101

Polyurethane foam manufacturing process, Source Id 102 New RACT Limit Proposed for VOC emissions

- 1. VOC emissions shall not exceed 88.8 tons/year based on 12-month rolling sum.
- 2. The facility shall achieve at least 99% destruction efficiency for the VOC emissions in the control device (C33); and
- 3. The company shall ensure that the capture system and control device (C33) area operated at all times the source (101) is in operation. The boiler must be operating within the parameters established in the CAM plan whenever the EPS process is operating.
- 1. VOC emissions shall not exceed 20.0 tons/year based on 12-month rolling sum.
- 2. All clean up solvent operations must comply with Best Available Technology to minimize VOC emissions. All cleaning operations must store new and used cleaning solvents in closed containers; and
- 3. The company shall use only a non-traditional blowing agent (for example, carbon dioxide) in the process. VOC blowing agents are prohibited from being used.

Request for comments on the Total Maximum Daily Load Developed for Halfmoon Creek, Centre County, PA

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) will accept comments as of May 26, 2018, for the proposed Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) developed to address aquatic life use impairments in Halfmoon Creek, as noted in 2016 Pennsylvania Integrated Water Quality Monitoring and Assessment Report (Integrated List), initially listed in 1998. Halfmoon Creek is a tributary of Spruce Creek and the greater Little Juniata River basin, Centre County. The watershed lies near Halfmoon and Ferguson Townships, Centre County. Biological impairments were originally noted during bioassessments in the watershed (NCRO, 2007). The source of degradation is related to agricultural activities, which effect the High Quality (HQ) attributes of Halfmoon Creek, most significantly in benthic inundation. The Commonwealth does not currently have water quality criteria for excess siltation, so a sediment TMDL endpoint was identified using a reference watershed approach. Based on a comparison to a similar watershed in land use, yet biologically nonimpaired HQ watershed, the maximum sediment loading should still allow water quality objectives to be met. Adjacent to the east, Beaver Branch, chosen for comparison and is also a tributary of Spruce Creek and the greater Little Juniata River, Centre County.

This proposed TMDL sets allowable sediment loadings within the specifically impaired stream segments of the Halfmoon Creek watershed. The loading was allocated among the land uses of cropland, hay/pasture land, and associated stream banks present in the watershed. Data used in these TMDLs was generated using a watershed analysis model (Mapshed-E-GWLF) designed by the Penn State University. The following table shows the estimated components of the TMDL:

Load allocations were distributed to nonpoint sources, specifically all land use sources other than National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permitted point source discharges with 10% of the TMDL reserved explicitly as a margin of safety (MOS). A search of the Department's online, GIS database, EMAP, identified two, point source discharges within the Halfmoon Creek watershed. 1% of the TMDL was incorporated into the WLA as a bulk reserve to take in account future permit activity. Loads not reduced (LNR) are the portion of the LA associated with nonpoint sources other than agricultural (croplands, hay/pasture), and associated stream banks. It is equal to the sum of modeled loading on forested land use, wetlands, open space and development. The adjusted load allocation (ALA) represents the remaining portion of the LA distributed among agricultural land and associated stream banks. The TMDL developed for the impaired stream segments within the Halfmoon Creek watershed to establish a reduction in the overall, sediment loading to 51.9% (56.6% for Cropland and 44.2% for Hay/Pasture and Stream Banks (equal % reduction, for example, the ALA divided by the summation of the baselines). Request for comments on the Total Maximum Daily Load Developed for Markee Creek, Juniata County, PA

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) will accept comments as of May 26, 2018, for the proposed Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) for sediment and total phosphorus (nutrients) developed to address impairments in the Markee Creek as noted in the 2016 Pennsylvania's Integrated Water Quality Monitoring and Assessment Report (Integrated List), initially listed in 2002. A separate TMDL was calculated for sediment and another for total phosphorus to address the nutrient impairment sources. Markee Creek is a tributary of East Licking Creek and the greater Juniata River, Juniata County. The impairments were documented during biological surveys of the aquatic life present in the watershed (1999 and 2004). Excessive siltation and nutrient loading from agriculture has been identified as the cause of these impairments to the Coldwater Fishery (CWF) aquatic life uses in Markee Creek. Because this Commonwealth does not currently have water quality criteria for excess siltation or nutrients, a TMDL endpoint for sediment and total phosphorus (nutrients) was identified using a reference watershed approach. Based on a comparison of a similar, unimpaired CWF, McKinley Run (tributary to Tuscarora Creek), the maximum sediment loading that should still allow water quality objectives to be met in the impaired segments of Markee Creek.

The loading was allocated among the land uses of cropland, hay/pasture land, and associated stream banks present in the watershed. Data used in these TMDLs was generated using a watershed analysis model (Mapshed-E-GWLF) designed by the Penn State University. Components of the sediment TMDL and total phosphorus (nutrients) TMDL are summarized as follows:

The Markee Creek TMDL is allocated to nonpoint sources, with 10% of the TMDL reserved explicitly as a margin of safety (MOS). The waste load allocation (WLA) is that portion of the total load assigned to National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permitted point source discharges. A search of the Department's online, GIS database, EMAP identified no known point source discharges within Markee Creek. Despite this, an allocation of 1% of the TMDL was incorporated into the WLA as a bulk reserve to take in account the dynamic nature of future permit activity. The load allocation (LA) is that portion of the total load assigned to nonpoint sources, all sources other than NPDES permitted point sources. Loads not reduced (LNR) are the portion of the LA associated with nonpoint sources other than agricultural (croplands, hay/pasture), associated stream banks, and farm animal contributions and is equal to the sum of forested, wetland and low intensity development loadings. The adjusted load allocation (ALA) represents the remaining portion of the LA to be distributed among agricultural and associated, stream bank, and coal mines using receiving load reductions. The TMDL developed for Markee Creek established a reduction in the current sediment loading to 49.4% and a 26.0% reduction in the current total phosphorus loading (or the equal % reduction, for example, the ALA divided by the summation of the baselines). The data and all supporting documentation used to develop the proposed TMDLs are available from the Department. The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) will accept comments as of May 26, 2018, for the proposed Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) developed to address aquatic life use impairments in the Poplar Run watershed, as noted in Pennsylvania's 2016 Integrated Water Quality Monitoring and Assessment Report (Integrated List), initially listed 2002. The metals impairment, originating from Abandoned Mine Drainage (1996 and 2002), will not be addressed in this TMDL; metals reductions, related to AMD, are calculated through a different methodology. Poplar Run is a Coldwater Fishery (CWF) and a tributary of Indian Creek, the Youghiogheny River, and the greater Monongahela River Basin, Fayette County. The impairments were documented during biological surveys of the aquatic life present in the watershed (1998 and 2002). Excessive siltation has been identified as the cause of benthic habitat impairment. This nonpoint source pollution was described in the 1998 bioassessment as influenced by land developed namely, but this TMDL will address loading from other land uses such as agricultural activities within the watershed.

Because this Commonwealth does not currently have water quality criteria for excessive siltation, a TMDL endpoint for sediment loading was identified using a reference watershed approach. Based on a comparison to similar, yet nonimpaired CWF watershed, such as Laurel Run (tributary to Indian Creek), the maximum sediment loading that should still allow water quality objectives to be met in the impaired segments of Poplar Run. Data used in these TMDLs was generated using a watershed analysis model (Mapshed-E-GWLF) designed by the Penn State University. The following table shows the estimated components of the TMDL:

Loads not reduced (LNR) are the portion of the LA associated with nonpoint sources other than agricultural (croplands, hay/pasture), adjacent stream banks, and specifically, land development as noted in the original bioassessment, and is equal to the sum of forest and bare rock coverage. The adjusted load allocation (ALA) represents the remaining portion of the LA to be distributed among these sources using receiving load reductions. The TMDL developed for the sediment-impaired segments of Poplar Run established a 77.6% reduction in the current sediment loading in Poplar Run (the equal percent reduction, for example, the ALA divided by the summation of the baselines). The impairments were noted during bioassessments in the watershed (2005 and 2010) and excessive siltation due to grazing-related agriculture was identified as causing impairment to the designated aquatic life use of a High Quality—Cold Water Fish(ery), (HQ-CWF), in Ross Run. Because this Commonwealth does not currently have water quality criteria for sediment, a TMDL endpoint was identified using a reference watershed approach. Based on a comparison to the similar, nonimpaired watershed, the Mudlick Run, another HQ-CWF, was chosen for comparison and is a tributary to Little Mahoning Creek and the larger Mahoning Creek and Allegheny River basin, Indiana County, a 25.8% reduction in sediment loading will allow water quality to be met in the impaired Ross Run.

Agricultural activities have been identified as the cause of biological impairment to the High Quality Cold Water Fishery (HQ-CWF) sustainment in the SBSF Pine Creek. Because this Commonwealth does not currently have water quality criteria for either sediment or total phosphorus (nutrient), a TMDL endpoint was identified using a reference watershed approach. Based on a comparison to a similar watershed in land use, yet biologically nonimpaired, the maximum sediment and total phosphorus loading should still allow water quality objectives to be met. Mudlick Run, another HQ-CWF, was chosen for comparison and is a tributary to Little Mahoning Creek and the larger Mahoning Creek and Allegheny River basin, Indiana County. This proposed TMDL sets allowable loadings within the specifically impaired stream segments of the SBSF Pine Creek watershed. The loading was allocated among the land uses of cropland, hay/pasture land, and associated stream banks present in the watershed. Data used in these TMDLs was generated using a watershed analysis model (Mapshed-E-GWLF) designed by the Penn State University. Components of the sediment TMDL and total phosphorus (nutrients) TMDL are summarized as follows:

Income Limits and Co-payments for the Subsidized Child Care Program

This notice increases the income limits codified at 55 Pa. Code Chapter 3041, Appendix B (relating to copayment chart family co-payment scale (based on the 2018 Federal Poverty Income Guidelines)) under 55 Pa. Code § 3041.107(b) (relating to availability and use of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines). This increase is effective May 7, 2018.

Section 3041.107(b) of 55 Pa. Code requires the Department of Human Services to update the co-payment schedule in 55 Pa. Code Chapter 3041, Appendix B to reflect changes in the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines (FPIG). Effective May 7, 2018, the income guidelines for the subsidized child care program are being raised due to increases in the FPIG. Under section 408.3 of the Human Services Code (62 P.S. § 408.3), the co-payment schedule is adjusted to reflect the increases. Chapter 3041, Appendix B of 55 Pa. Code also establishes the family co-payment levels according to the family's computed annual income and lists the weekly family co-payment based on the annual family income.

Department of Transportation Regulation # 18-479 (IRRC # 3200)

Access to and Occupancy of Highways by Driveways and Local Roads

May 16, 2018

We submit for your consideration the following comments on the proposed rulemaking published in the March 17, 2018 *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Our comments are based on criteria in Section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (RRA) (71 P.S. § 745.5b). Section 5.1(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5a(a)) directs the Department of Transportation (Department) to respond to all comments received from us or any other source.

1. Determination of whether the regulation is in the public interest; Clarity, feasibility and reasonableness of the regulation; Implementation procedures; Whether the regulation represents a policy decision of such a substantial nature that it requires legislative review; and Possible conflict with statutes.

Preamble and the Regulatory Analysis Form (RAF)

Section 5.2 of the RRA (71 P.S. § 745.5b) directs the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) to determine whether a regulation is in the public interest. When making this determination, IRRC considers criteria such as the clarity, feasibility and reasonableness of the regulation. To make that determination, IRRC must analyze the text of the Preamble and the proposed regulation and the reasons for the new or amended language. IRRC also considers the information a promulgating agency is required to provide under Section 5(a) of the RRA (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)) in the Regulatory Analysis Form (RAF).

The explanation in the Preamble and the information contained in the RAF are not sufficient to allow the Commission to determine if the regulation is in the public interest. In the Preamble to the proposed regulation, the Department summarizes significant amendments. However, it does not provide an explanation for the proposed changes and new language. Without a detailed description of the regulation and its impact, it is difficult to determine whether the requirements in the rulemaking are reasonable or feasible. We ask the Department to provide a more detailed explanation of the amendments in the final rulemaking submittal.

The Department identifies persons or entities affected by the proposed regulation as owners of legal interests in property, such as easement holders and mineral estate holders, as well as fee title holders. The Department's responses to RAF # 10, # 12, # 15, # 17 and # 18 do not address the impact of the proposed amendments on fee title holders. For instance:

- In RAF # 10, the Department states that the compelling public interest that justifies the regulation is to prevent the Commonwealth taxpayers from being responsible for the attendant costs of de facto taking claims that may arise if the Department is prohibited from issuing Highway Occupancy Permits (HOPs) to non-fee title holders. It does not include, however, the potential burden on Commonwealth taxpayers for costs of litigation if a fee title holder withholds consent to a Department-issued HOP.
- In response to RAF # 12, the Department states "Pennsylvania will be at a competitive advantage, especially for out-of-state persons or entities seeking permits. Moreover, the proposed amendments will avoid unnecessary delay and potential litigation where an applicant has a clear legal right to access but is not the underlying fee owner." A significant amendment to the Department's regulations includes a required written notice by the applicant to the fee title holder regarding the application. What are other states' policies regarding fee title holder notification? We ask the Department to include this information in the RAF to the final-form regulation.
- In RAF # 15, the Department concludes that the rulemaking should not have any adverse effects on HOP permittees. However, it does not address how fee title holders may be affected by the proposed changes. The Department should revise its response to RAF # 15 to address any adverse effects the proposal may have on fee title holders.
- In RAF # 17, it is unclear who will benefit from the positive financial, economic and social impacts that the Department anticipates as a result of the implementation of the regulation. What are the financial, economic and social impacts?
- Similarly, the Department's response to RAF # 18 does not speak to the benefits of the proposal outweighing any cost and adverse effects for fee title holders. The Department should include in the final rulemaking a description of any benefits that outweigh costs and adverse effects for fee title holders.

In estimating the costs and or savings to the regulated community and state government, the Department explains that establishing a clear definition of "owner" should reduce legal costs incurred in litigating matters related to interests in property, the number of administrative challenges and a reduction in collected filing fees. (RAF # 19 and # 21) It is uncertain from the proposed regulation's Preamble or RAF how many administrative challenges or litigations occur with the HOP application process each year. Neither the Preamble nor the RAF illustrate the scope of the situation that is to be addressed by the proposal.

The Department reports that approximately 3,000 HOPs are issued each year and about 40 percent of those are applied for and issued to non-fee title holders of property. (RAF # 19) Of the approximately 1,200 HOPs

issued to non-fee title holders of property, how many were issued with fee title holder consent? How many protests or administrative challenges are filed each year? In order for this Commission to determine whether the regulation is in the public interest, the Department should provide this information as part of the final-form regulation submittal.

Legislative Comments

The Department is proposing to delete the term "own" and replace it with an expanded definition of "owner" which includes not only the person holding fee title to the property, but others with legal or equitable interests in the property. (§ 441.1 relating to Definitions) The proposal also establishes an application procedure and permit application requirements for applicants other than the fee title holder. These requirements include proof of property owner consent or proof that the applicant has provided written notice regarding the submission of the application and administrative rights to the fee title holder. (§ 441.3 relating to Permit application procedure)

Representative Brett Miller believes the issue at hand is access and who has the authority to grant it, rather than clarification of ownership. He is concerned that the Department's proposed amendments relating to "own" and "owner" ignore a longstanding tradition of fee title holder property rights. He states that "Dramatically altering the historic understanding and usage of who owns property is not a compelling public interest."

He also feels the Department's proposed process for non-fee title holders suggests a preference for those with a legal interest in the property and not the fee title holder. In the event where a fee title owner has not agreed to sign an application to allow another entity onto his/her property, Representative Miller asserts that the "Department should not arbitrarily assume that the applicant's position is automatically correct, nor should PennDOT insert itself into what is a private contractual discussion between two entities. By granting the permit to the one, PennDOT has cut off negotiations and essentially taken away negotiating rights from the fee title holder."

Like Representative Miller, we also question whether it is appropriate and reasonable for the Department to determine what right of reasonable access is. In situations where the fee title holder withholds consent, the Department should not interfere with private negotiations unrelated to the Department's function. Implementation of this rulemaking would allow the Department to make such determinations that are usually made by the courts. We believe issuing HOPs without fee title holder consent represents a policy decision of such a substantial nature that it should be reviewed by the General Assembly.

Representative Miller also raises other questions regarding whether certain provisions conflict with the state's Eminent Domain law. § 441.3(e)(7)(ii) and (iii). We will review the Department's response to Representative Miller's concerns as part of our consideration of whether the final regulation is in the public interest.

2. Economic or fiscal impacts of the regulation; and the nature and estimated cost of legal, consulting or accounting services which the public or private sector may incur.

In the Preamble, the Department states that no fiscal impacts to the regulated community are anticipated because the changes are consistent with current practices that have been in place since 2002.

Comments received from a private citizen suggest that fee title holders who exercise their rights to protest an application will incur administrative fees and possibly costs for legal or consulting services to navigate the appeal process. The Department, in its responses to RAF # 17, # 18, and # 19, does not take into account these potential fees or costs to the fee title holder. The Department should revise its responses when it prepares the final rulemaking to include any potential fees or costs to the fee title holder.

3. Section 441.1. Definitions. Clarity.

"Owner" is defined as "A person holding: (i) fee title to property, (ii) an estate or other legal interest in property, such as an easement, a lease, a license, or subsurface rights, or (iii) an equitable interest in property under a sales agreement or an option to purchase; provided that such estate or other legal or equitable interest in property includes the use requested in the permit." (Emphasis added.)

Subparagraph (iii)

We have the following questions:

- How will the Department determine whether the interest in a property has risen to the level of ownership?
- The definition includes the proviso that the "legal or equitable interest in property includes the use requested in the permit." How can the permit include the use requested if the permit has not yet been granted? If the intent of the Department is to include the requested use in the permit application, the provision should be included in the section for application procedures.

We ask the Department to explain its intent and the reason for including Subparagraph (iii) in the definition of "owner."

4. Section 441.3. Permit application procedure.— Reasonableness of requirements, implementation procedures and timetables for compliance by the public and private sectors.

In the Preamble to the proposed regulation, the Department states the purpose of the regulation is "to clarify the provisions relating to who may apply for a permit to construct or alter driveways; local roads; drainage facilities; structures; means of ingress, egress and access; and other property within the state highway right-of-way, and set forth application requirements that *strike a careful balance between the interested parties' property rights*." (Emphasis added.)

New Section 441.3(e)(7)(i)(A) and (B) establishes the permit application process and required information for applicants that are non-fee title holders. Applicants must provide to the Department proof of either the fee title holder's consent or that the applicant has notified the fee title holder of the submission the HOP application and their administrative rights through a written notice. The new section also presumably affords the fee title holder 30 days to review/acknowledge the application before the Department grants or denies the application.

We have several questions regarding this new section: How does the Department define "written notice?" How will the applicant demonstrate to the Department that the fee title holder received written notice about the HOP application and administrative rights? What if the fee title holder objects/protests to the application? How did

the Department determine that 30 days was a reasonable and fair amount of time for the fee title holder to acknowledge, accept or protest the application? Does the timeline for the Department's granting or denying of an HOP change when there is a notice of protest?

Since the sections referenced under 1 Pa. Code §§ 35.23, 35.24 and 35.27—35.32 do not clearly delineate the protest process or timeline, how will a fee title holder that wishes to object to an application know what steps to take? We ask the Department to explain how it will implement the permit process and the permit process when there is a protest by a fee title holder to the application.

We note that the permitting process, as proposed, assumes there are only two "owners"—the fee title holder and the applicant. However, there can be multiple ownership interests and easements agreements in play. We recommend the Department amend this section to require disclosure of all ownership interests in a property and provide notice to all owners.

Section 441.3(e)(7)(ii) requires applicants other than fee title holders to submit a written statement that indemnifies the Commonwealth against any actions by the fee title holder of the property as a result of granting the HOP to the applicant. We suggest the Department revise this subparagraph to protect the Department from any action that may be taken by the fee title holder and also by any ownership interests in the property.

5. Miscellaneous

- The Department should revise its response to RAF # 29 regarding the timeline for delivery of the final-form regulation;
- The Department's website contains several HOP-related forms. It should provide an electronic link for these forms in its response to RAF # 22b;
- The Department's response to RAF # 12 includes a survey of several states' laws and policies regarding applicants and permittees. We ask the Department to reach out to other states to determine how other ownership interests are addressed and to share how the implementation of this regulation compares to other states' handling of similar situations; and
- We recommend that the Department delete the last paragraph beginning with "As a significant percentage (approximately 40 percent)..." in its response to RAF # 14 as it does not pertain to the question.

Project Description: This is phase one of what is envisioned to be a three-phase project. This phase of the project will result in the construction of a new sewage collection system within Study Area 1 located in the northwest corner of Shenango Township. It will result in the installation of approximately 27,510 feet of 8-inch diameter gravity sewer main, 3 sewage pump stations, 18 onlot grinder pumps and 14,399 feet of 2-inch and 4-inch diameter forcemain. The wasteflow will be treated at Shenango Township Municipal Authority's existing wastewater treatment plant (WWTP).

Problem Description: This Phase 1 project addresses an area with a high rate of onlot septic system malfunctions and includes extending sewers to the Oak Tree Land Company. The area to be served includes 156 households. In addition, the Oak Tree Land Company has 62 residential units and 8 commercial units within their system. Both the Shenango Township Municipal Authority and the Oak Tree Land Company are under separate Consent Order and Agreements (CO&A) with the Department. A sanitary survey of this phase's area revealed a 53% confirmed onlot malfunction rate. These systems leach untreated and partially treated wastewater onto the ground surface and into the waters of the Common-

wealth. This project will eliminate the malfunctioning sewage systems thereby improving the area's water quality. Additionally, this phase of the project will allow Oak Tree Land Company to comply with their CO&A to abandon their existing WWTP and become part of Shenango Township Municipal Authority's new sewer system.

Project Description: The New Liberty area in Decatur Township consists of 58 equivalent dwelling units (EDU) that will be served by public sewer with final treatment and disposal at the Moshannon Valley Joint Sewer Authority's sewage treatment plant. The project proposes the installation of 12,300 feet of gravity sewer, a pump station along Crago Lane and 4,800 feet of forcemain to convey the sewage to the existing sewerage system.

Problem Description: The New Liberty area in Decatur Township consists of 58 EDUs. A sanitary survey was completed of all 58 EDUs which identified 2 confirmed malfunctions and 24 wildcat (direct discharge) systems. An additional 19 EDUs had suspected malfunctions.

Project Description: The project is an expansion of the WWTP to increase the permitted hydraulic loading from 3.0 million gallons per day (MGD) to 3.342 MGD with a conventional, single-stage activated sludge process preceded by primary clarification. Two new 60-foot diameter primary clarifiers will be constructed preceding the existing first and second stage activated sludge bioreactors. The existing first-stage activated sludge bioreactors will be repurposed as conventional, single-stage activated sludge bioreactors. A new 64-foot diameter primary anaerobic digester will be constructed. The existing 40-foot diameter primary digester will be repurposed as a secondary digester, and the existing 30-foot diameter secondary digester will be demolished.

Problem Description: The capacity of the Borough of Grove City's WWTP will be exceeded in the near future due to the needs of the tributary municipalities. In addition, it is organically overloaded and projected to continue to be organically overloaded in the next 5 years. The expansion of the WWTP will eliminate the potential hydraulic overload and the existing organic overload condition.

Project Description: This project consists of replacing approximately 185,000 lineal feet of 2-inch to 8-inch PVC and polyethylene waterline as well as related appurte-

nances along with the replacement of 1,200 service lines and construction of 1,200 meter pits.

Problem Description: The project intends to replace an aging water infrastructure system with new water supply and service lines. The project will increase the size of the lines within the distribution system to provide additional supply in times of need and increase the overall reliability of the system. The replacement of service connections and construction of meter pits will serve to address the multicommunity system's unaccounted-for water loss.

Project Description: The Pine Grove Public Water System (PWS) serves a population of 2,862 people by means of 1,500 service connections with 1 large industrial user. The industrial customer currently utilizes over half the water pumped in a day by the system and has huge unpredictable daily swings in demand. This customer also anticipates an increase of 7% in water usage in the next few years, which is taxing for the water system, especially the control for the disinfection facilities. Additional water storage (1.0 million gallon storage tank) is proposed to address the storage issue. Corrosion control treatment (pH adjustment by means of 50% NaOH) is needed to address high copper levels (2.1 mg/l) in the system which are above the action level of 1.3 mg/l per the Lead and Copper Rule. Installation of an automatic flow control valve on their gas chlorination system to enhance operational control of chlorine residuals due to significant flow fluctuations is also proposed. The system is also faced with aging and leaking distribution system facilities (tank and waterlines) which need repair and rehabilitation. Additional finished water storage, rehabilitation of the existing 1.5 million gallon storage tank, and new/ rehabilitated distribution system facilities (waterlines, hydrants, and the like) to adequately serve the existing residential and commercial customers of the PWS system are proposed.

Problem Description: The Pine Grove PWS is in need of additional storage capacity, is experiencing leaking and aging distribution system mains, has a storage tank in need of rehabilitation, requires corrosion control treatment per the Lead and Copper Rule and requires automatic control modifications to their gas disinfection system for better chlorine residual control due to demand fluctuations. The Pine Grove PWS is also faced with aging and leaking distribution system facilities (tank and waterlines) which are in need of repair and rehabilitation. Unaccounted-for water loss is high, greater than 20%. Pressure at certain nodes in the system during peak demand periods were reported to be less than the required minimum of 20 psi. The project will serve the existing residential and commercial customers with uninterrupted potable water at sufficient pressure.

In support of its Complaint, I&E respectfully represents the following:

Parties and Jurisdiction

- 1. The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, with a mailing address of P.O. Box 3265, Harrisburg, PA 17105-3265, is a duly constituted agency of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania empowered to regulate public utilities within the Commonwealth pursuant to the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 101, et seq.

Complainant is the Commission's Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement and is the entity established by statute to prosecute complaints against public utilities pursuant to 66 Pa.C.S. § 308.2(a)(11). - 5. Respondent is a "public utility" as that term is defined at 66 Pa.C.S. § 102, as it is engaged in conveying or transmitting messages or communications by telephone in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for compensation.
- 6. The Commission issued Respondent a Certificate of Public Convenience on or about July 14, 2005, at A-311364, for interexchange carrier reseller authority.
- 7. Section 501(a) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 501(a), authorizes and obligates the Commission to execute and enforce the provisions of the Public Utility Code.
- 8. Section 701 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 701, authorizes the Commission to, inter alia, hear and determine complaints against public utilities for a violation of any law or regulation that the Commission has jurisdiction to administer.
- 9. Section 3301 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 3301, authorizes the Commission to impose civil penalties on any public utility, or any other person or corporation subject to the Commission's authority, for violation(s) of the Public Utility Code and/or Commission regulations. Section 3301(a)-(b) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 3301(a)-(b), allows for the imposition of a separate civil penalty for each violation and each day's continuance of such violation(s).
- 10. Respondent, in conveying or transmitting messages or communications by telephone, is subject to the power and authority of this Commission pursuant to Section 501(c) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 501(c), which requires a public utility to comply with Commission regulations.
- 11. Pursuant to the provisions of the applicable Commonwealth statutes and regulations, the Commission has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this complaint and the actions of Respondent related thereto.

Factual Background

PRIOR ASSESSMENT-RELATED COMPLAINT

- 12. On November 7, 2014, I&E filed a Complaint against Respondent at Docket No. C-2014-2451914, alleging that Respondent violated Section 510(c) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 510(c), by failing to satisfy its 2011-2012, 2012-2013, and 2013-2014 Fiscal Year Assessments totaling \$213. In addition to payment of the outstanding assessments, I&E sought payment of a civil penalty in the amount of \$19.
- 13. On November 18, 2014, I&E filed a Certificate of Satisfaction pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.24, noting that Respondent satisfied its outstanding assessments and the civil penalty sought in I&E's Complaint.

2016-2017 FISCAL YEAR

- 14. On or about February 14, 2016, the Commission mailed to Respondent an assessment report for Respondent to report its gross intrastate operating revenues for the 2015 calendar year.
- 15. The assessment report was accompanied by a letter, which notified Respondent that the report was to be completed and returned to the Commission on or before March 31, 2016.
- 16. Respondent failed to file an assessment report stating its 2015 calendar year revenues.

17. On or about September 7, 2016, the Commission mailed to Respondent, by first class mail, an assessment invoice for the July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017 Fiscal Year ("2016-2017 Fiscal Year") that was based, in part, on Respondent's estimated revenues for the 2015 calendar year. Respondent's assessment was \$35.

- 18. Accompanying the assessment invoice was a notice that informed Respondent that it was obligated to pay the amount listed on the assessment invoice within thirty (30) days or file objections within fifteen (15) days.
- 19. While there is no record that the assessment invoice and notice of assessment were returned in the mail to the Commission as being undeliverable, on October 27, 2016, the Commission re-mailed to Respondent, by certified mail, the assessment invoice and notice of assessment since Respondent did not pay the amount listed on the assessment invoice within thirty (30) days or file objections within fifteen (15) days.
- 20. The assessment invoice and notice of assessment were mailed to Respondent at 353 Sacramento Street, Suite 1500, San Francisco, CA 94111, which is the mailing address that Respondent provided to the Commission for assessment purposes.
- 21. On or about November 9, 2016, the assessment invoice and notice of assessment were returned to the Commission by the United States Postal Service with a forwarding address for Respondent at 1850 Howard Street, Unit C, Elk Grove Village, IL 60007.
- 22. On or about November 14, 2016, the Commission re-mailed the assessment invoice and notice of assessment, by certified mail, to Respondent at 1850 Howard Street, Unit C, Elk Grove Village, IL 60007.
- 23. On or about December 22, 2016, the assessment invoice and notice of assessment were returned to the Commission as undeliverable and with no forwarding address.
- 24. Respondent is obligated to promptly apprise the Commission of changes to its current address pursuant to Section 1.53(d) of the Commission's regulations, 52 Pa. Code § 1.53(d).
- 25. The Commission was unable to effectively serve the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year Assessment Invoice and notice of assessment upon Respondent due to Respondent's failure to provide the Commission with its current address or claim the certified mailing.
- 26. The Commission received no objections from Respondent to the assessment amount set forth in the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year Assessment Invoice.
- 27. Respondent failed to pay the amount of the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year Assessment Invoice.
- 28. The total outstanding assessment balance for Respondent is \$35.

Violations

COUNT 1

29. That Respondent failed to report its gross intrastate operating revenues for the 2015 calendar year in that it did not file an assessment report for that year. If proven, this is a violation of Section 510(b) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 510(b). The Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement's proposed civil penalty for this violation is \$500.1 This civil penalty, consistent with past

 $^{^{1}\,\}mathrm{I\&E}$ anticipates that this level of penalty will provide a sufficient deterrent against future violations by Respondent.

Commission decisions,2 is based on Respondent's unacceptable history of compliance with the Public Utility Code and Commission's regulations,³ the amount of Respondent's outstanding assessment balance related to the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year, and the need to deter future violations of the Public Utility Code and the Commission's regulations pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 69.1201.4

COUNT 2

30. That Respondent failed to satisfy its 2016-2017 Fiscal Year Assessment in that it did not pay the amount due within thirty (30) days of receipt of the invoice. If proven, this is a violation of Section 510(c) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 510(c). The Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement's proposed civil penalty for this violation is 25% of the outstanding assessment balance or a minimum of \$100, whichever is greater. Therefore, I&E's proposed civil penalty for this violation is \$100.⁵ This civil penalty, consistent with past Commission decisions,⁶ is based on Respondent's unacceptable history of compliance with the Public Utility Code and Commission's regulations, the amount of Respondent's outstanding assessment balance related to the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year, and the need to deter future violations of the Public Utility Code and the Commission's regulations pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 69.1201.

Wherefore, for all the foregoing reasons, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement respectfully requests that:

- (a) Respondent be ordered to pay a total of \$635, which consists of its outstanding assessment balance of \$35 and a total civil penalty of \$600 for the above described violations. Said payment should be made by certified check or money order, made payable to the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania" with the docket number of this proceeding listed, and mailed to the Secretary's Bureau of the Commission;
- (b) Respondent be directed to file assessment reports on a going-forward basis;
- (c) Respondent be directed to update its address with the Commission; and
- (d) If payment of the assessment and civil penalty is not made, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement requests that:
- (1) the Commission issue an Order to cancel the Certificate of Public Convenience issued to Respondent; and
- (2) this matter be referred to the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General for appropriate action.

See supra ¶¶ 12-13.

The Commission promulgated a Policy Statement at 52 Pa. Code § 69.1201 as a guideline that sets forth ten factors that are to be considered when evaluating whether and to what extent a civil penalty for violating a Commission order, regulation, or statute is warranted. Among these factors are the compliance history of the regulated entity that committed the violation, the amount of the civil penalty necessary to deter future violations, and past Commission decisions in similar situations. 52 Pa. Code \$\\$ 69.1201(e)(6), (8), (9).

5 L& anticipates that this level of penalty will provide a sufficient deterrent against future violations by Respondent.

Violations

COUNT 1

- All State, county, municipal and other government positions that meet the definition of "executive-level public employee" in 4 Pa.C.S. § 1103 (relating to definitions) or the definition of "public official" in 4 Pa.C.S. § 1512(b), regarding restrictions, requirements and penalties in 4 Pa.C.S. § 1512(a), (a.1), (a.2), (a.3) and (a.4).
- All positions within the Pennsylvania State Police, the Office of Attorney General and the Department of Revenue with duties that would subject the individuals in those positions to 4 Pa.C.S. § 1512.1(a), regarding postemployment restrictions.

In accordance with the requirements of 4 Pa.C.S. Part II (relating to Pennsylvania Race Horse Development and Gaming Act) (Gaming Act), the lists are being published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and on the web site of the Commission in the e-Library at http://www.ethics.state.pa.us.

The lists are based in part upon information provided to the Commission. The lists are subject to change and will be continually updated on the Commission's web site.

Status as an executive-level public employee or public official has significance under various provisions of the Gaming Act, including, but not limited to, 4 Pa.C.S. § 1512.

A person who is an executive-level public employee or public official as defined by the Gaming Act, or who is a member of this a person's immediate family (spouse, minor child or unemancipated child), is subject to significant restrictions and may be subject to penalties in 4 Pa.C.S. § 1512(a), (a.1), (a.2), (a.3) and (a.4).

Positions identified on the list within the Board, the Office of Attorney General, the Pennsylvania State Police and the Department of Revenue may be subject to specific post-employment restrictions in the Gaming Act.

Employees of independent contractors serving in identified positions are subject to certain employment restrictions following termination of a contract with the Board.

DEFINITIONS

The Gaming Act defines "executive level public employee" and "public official" as follows:

"Executive-level public employee." The term shall include the following:

- (1) Deputy Secretaries of the Commonwealth and the Governor's Office executive staff.
- (2) An employee of the executive branch whose duties substantially involve licensing or enforcement under this part, who has discretionary power which may affect or influence the outcome of a Commonwealth agency's action or decision or who is involved in the development of regulations or policies relating to a licensed entity. The term shall include an employee with law enforcement authority.
- (3) An employee of a county or municipality with discretionary powers which may affect or influence the outcome of the county's or municipality's action or decision related to this part or who is involved in the development of law, regulation or policy relating to matters regulated under this part. The term shall include an employee with law enforcement authority.
- (4) An employee of a department, agency, board, commission, authority or other governmental body not included in paragraph (1), (2) or (3) with discretionary power which may affect or influence the outcome of the governmental body's action or decision related to this part or who is involved in the development of regulation or policy relating to matters regulated under this part. The term shall include an employee with law enforcement authority.

"Law enforcement authority." The power to conduct investigations of or to make arrests for criminal offenses. 4 Pa.C.S. § 1103.


"Public official." The term shall include the following:

- (1) The Governor, Lieutenant Governor, a member of the Governor's cabinet, Treasurer, Auditor General and Attorney General of the Commonwealth.
- (2) A member of the Senate or House of Representatives of the Commonwealth.
- (3) An individual elected or appointed to any office of a county or municipality that directly receives a distribution of revenue under this part.
- (4) An individual elected or appointed to a department, agency, board, commission, authority or other governmental body not included in paragraph (1), (2) or (3) that directly receives a distribution of revenue under this part.
- (5) An individual elected or appointed to a department, agency, board, commission, authority, county, municipality or other governmental body not included in paragraph (1), (2) or (3) with discretionary power which may influence or affect the outcome of an action or decision and who is involved in the development of regulation or policy relating to a licensed entity or who is involved in other matters under this part.


The term does not include a member of a school board or an individual who held an uncompensated office with a governmental body prior to January 1, 2006, and who no longer holds the office as of January 1, 2006. The term includes a member of an advisory board or commission which makes recommendations relating to a licensed facility.
