READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylvania Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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Printing Format

Text proposed to be added is printed in **underscored bold face**. Text proposed to be deleted is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and sections are printed in regular type to enhance readability. Final rulemakings and statements of policy are printed in regular type.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in **underscored bold face**. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

Title 255—LOCAL COURT RULES

LACKAWANNA COUNTY

Adoption of Local Rule of Criminal Procedure; 2021 MD 228

Order

And Now, this 9th day of July 2021, *It Is Hereby Ordered and Decreed* as follows:

1. The following Lackawanna County Local Rule is *Hereby Adopted* pursuant to Pa.R.Crim.P. 576.1 effective August 23, 2021.

2. The adopted Local Rule shall be disseminated and published in the following manner:

One (1) certified paper copy of the adopted Local Rule shall be filed with the Administrative Office of the Pennsylvania Courts;

The adopted Local Rule shall be distributed to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*;

A copy of the adopted Local Rule shall be published on the Unified Judicial System's website through the Pennsylvania Judiciary's Web Application Portal;

The adopted Local Rule shall be kept continuously available for the public inspection and copying in the Office of the Clerk of Judicial Records, Criminal Division, and upon request and payment of reasonable costs of reproduction and mailing, the Clerk of Judicial Records shall furnish to any requesting person a copy of the requested Local Rule; and

The adopted Local Rule shall be distributed to the Lackawanna Bar Association for publication on the website of the Lackawanna Bar Association.

The adopted Local Rule shall be published on the website of the Lackawanna County Court of Common Pleas.

By the Court

Rule 576.1. Electronic Filing and Service of Legal Papers.

(A) *General Scope and Purpose of this Rule.*

In agreement with the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, the electronic filing of legal papers in Lackawanna County Court of Common Pleas, 45th Judicial District, is hereby authorized in accordance with Pa.R.Crim.P. 576.1 and this Rule. The applicable general rules of court and court policies that implement the rules shall continue to apply to all filings regardless of the method of filing.

(B) *Legal Papers Defined.* The legal papers which shall be filed electronically shall encompass all written motions, written answers and any notices or documents for which filings are required or permitted, including orders, exhibits and attachments except for the following:

1. Legal papers filed or authorized to be filed under seal;
2. Applications for a search warrant;
3. Applications for an arrest warrant;
4. Grand jury materials;

5. Subpoenas;

6. Wiretap Act, cell phone, tracker and Internet petitions.

(C) All attorneys shall establish a PACFile account using the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania Web Portal at <https://ujportal.pacourts.us/MyServices.aspx> and participation is permissive. Parties who are proceeding without counsel are not required to establish a PACFile account and are not required to file legal papers using the electronic PACFile system.

(D) Applicable filing fees shall be paid electronically through procedures established by the Clerk of Court and at the same time and in the same amount as required by statute, court rule or order, or established by a published fee schedule.

(E) *Service.*

1. Upon submission of a legal paper for electronic filing, the PACFile system shall provide an electronic notification to other parties and attorneys to the case who are participating in electronic filing that the legal paper has been submitted. This notification upon submission shall satisfy the service requirements of Rules 114(B) and 576(B) on any attorney or party who has established a system account.

2. Service of electronic filings on any attorney or party who has not established a UJS web portal account or who is unable to file or receive legal papers electronically or otherwise unable to access the system shall be made by the procedures provided under Rules 114(b) and 576(B).

3. Attorneys or self-represented parties who are unable or unwilling to participate in electronic filing of documents are permitted to file and serve the legal papers in a physical paper format.

4. Where an electronic filing cannot be submitted to no fault of the filing party, traditional filing shall be accepted.

(F) *Legal Papers Filed in a Paper Format.* Any legal paper submitted for filing to the Clerk of Courts in a paper (or "hard-copy") format shall be accepted by the Clerk of Courts in that format and shall be retained by the Clerk of Courts as may be required by rules of Court and record retention policies. The Clerk of Courts shall convert such hard-copy legal paper to PDF and add it to the system, except those legal papers excluded from electronic filing pursuant to Pa.R.Crim.P. 576.1(C). Once converted to PDF, the PDF version of the legal paper shall be deemed and treated as the original legal paper and may be used by the parties and the Court for all purposes, including but not limited to, court hearings and trials.

(G) *Confidential Information.* Counsel and unrepresented parties must adhere to the Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania and refrain from including confidential information in legal papers filed with the Clerk of Courts or the Court whether filed electronically or in paper format. Counsel and unrepresented parties must include confidential information relevant to the case on the approved AOPC Confidential Information Form. The Confidential Information shall be served on and made available to the parties to the case, the Court and appropriate Court staff, as provided in the Public Access Policy.

This Rule shall be effective thirty (30) days from date of publication.

L.1915.11-2. Admissibility of Guardian Ad Litem Reports and Testimony.

Guardian Ad Litem Reports and recommendations of necessity may be based on interviews of persons and reviews of records. Guardian Ad Litem Reports must be filed twenty (20) days prior to trial. Any objections to the admissibility of the Guardian Ad Litem's Report or Testimony must be filed within ten (10) days of the filing of the Guardian Ad Litem Report. Any party, on their own initiative and at their own expense, may subpoena any witness interviewed by the Guardian Ad Litem or subpoena the production of any document relied upon by the Guardian Ad Litem in forming his/her opinion. No objec-

tion to the admissibility of the Guardian Ad Litem's Report or Testimony at trial will be considered unless the objection was filed within ten (10) days of the filing of the Guardian Ad Litem's Report.

Order of Court

And Now, this 9th day of July, 2021, in compliance with Rule 576.1 of the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure, it is *Hereby Ordered* that the Court adopts the following Rule of Criminal Procedure Rule 112 regarding Electronic Filing and Service of Legal Papers which becomes effective July 19, 2021.

The District Court Administrator is *Hereby Ordered* to:

1. File one certified copy of this Order with the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts to adminrules@pacourts.us;
2. Submit two paper copies of this Order to the Legislative Reference Bureau and one electronic copy in Microsoft Word format only to bulletin@palrb.us for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*;
3. Provide one copy of this Order to the members of the Lebanon County Bar Association;
4. Incorporate the Rule into the set of Local Rules within thirty (30) days of publication of the Local Rule in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and publish the rules on the Court's website at www.lebcounty.org.
5. File this Order in the Prothonotary's Office of Lebanon County.

Rule of Criminal Procedure 576.1. Electronic Filing and Service of Legal Papers.

A. Pursuant to Pa.R.Crim.P. 576.1, the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts and the 52nd Judicial District have agreed upon an implementation plan for electronic filing of criminal legal papers through the statewide system known as PACFile.

B. All parties are authorized to electronically file legal papers through PACFile with the Clerk of Courts in cases in the Lebanon County Court of Common Pleas, 52nd Judicial District.

C. Any party may, but is not required to, utilize PACFile for any document except the following:

1. applications for search warrants,
2. applications for arrest warrants,
3. any grand jury materials, except the indicting grand jury indictment or the investigating grand jury presentment,
4. submissions filed ex parte as authorized by law, and
5. submissions filed or authorized to be filed under seal.

D. Any party who is unable or declines to participate in PACFile may file legal papers in a physical paper format with the clerk of courts, and shall be served legal papers in a physical paper format by the Clerk of Courts and other parties to the case. However, pursuant to Pa.R.Crim.P. 576.1(D)(2), establishment of a PACFile account shall constitute consent to participate in electronic filing, including acceptance of service electronically of any document filed in PACFile.

E. Parties utilizing PACFile shall serve physical paper format copies on all parties to the case who do not utilize PACFile, pursuant to Pa.R.Crim.P. 576.

F. The Clerk of Courts is authorized to maintain electronic files only, without a corresponding physical paper file. Legal papers that are not permitted to be electronically filed pursuant to paragraph (C) shall be maintained in a physical paper format only.

This document meets the criteria of 45 Pa.C.S. § 702(7) (relating to contents of Pennsylvania Code) as a document general and permanent in nature which shall be codified in the Pennsylvania Code.)

This manual provides a complete listing of issuances, specified in Title 4 of the *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.2, from the Governor’s Office and from agencies under the Governor’s jurisdiction, except proclamations and press releases, that are intended for distribution to two or more agencies following the procedures for publication of issuances in Management Directive 210.01, Directives Management System.

The manual will be amended to reflect the latest issuances, and published annually in Title 4 of the *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.4 at the end of each fiscal year.

This amendment updates the index for all executive orders, management directives, and manuals issued, amended, and rescinded between July 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021. Changes are indicated by marginal dots.

- All documents preceded by the letter “M” are manuals. All documents preceded by the letter “MD” are management directives.
- Documents with a strike-through have been rescinded.
- Amendments are presented as complete documents that incorporate all changes since the last issuance.
- Revisions which generally affect older issuances are pen and ink changes or replacement pages and affect only those parts of an issuance being changed. Therefore, the issuance changed by a revision will be in more than one document because there will be original issuance and any revision.

Maximum Lawful Rate of Interest for Residential Mortgages for the Month of August 2021

The Department of Banking and Securities (Department), under the authority contained in section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P.L. 13, No. 6) (41 P.S. § 301), determines that the maximum lawful rate of interest for residential mortgages for the month of August 2021, is 4 1/2%.

The interest rate limitations under the Commonwealth's usury statute were pre-empted to a great extent by Federal law, the Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (Pub.L. No. 96-221). Further pre-emption was instituted with the signing of Pub.L. No. 96-399, which overrode State interest rate limitations on any individual who finances the sale or exchange of residential real property which the individual owns and which the individual occupies or has occupied as his principal residence.

Each month the Department is required by State law to compute and announce the ceiling rate on residential mortgages in this Commonwealth. This maximum rate is determined by adding 2.50 percentage points to the yield rate on long-term government bonds as published by the Federal Reserve Board or the United States Treasury, or both. The latest yield rate on long-term government securities is 1.93 to which was added 2.50 percentage

points for a total of 4.43 that by law is rounded off to the nearest quarter at 4 1/2%.

Furthermore, the person shall not be subject to citizen suits or other contribution actions brought by responsible persons not participating in the remediation.

Under Sections 304(n)(1)(ii) and 305(c)(2) of the Act, there is a 30-day public and municipal comment period for sites proposed for remediation using a site-specific standard, in whole or in part, and for sites remediated as a special industrial area. This period begins when a summary of the NOI to Remediate is published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the site. For the following identified site(s), proposed for remediation to a site-specific standard or as a special industrial area, the municipality, within which the site is located, may request to be involved in the development of the remediation and reuse plans for the site if the request is made within 30-days of the following specified date. During this comment period the municipality may request that the following identified person, as the remediator of the site, develop and implement a public involvement plan. Requests to be involved, and comments, should be directed to the remediator of the site.

MINING ACTIVITY NPDES DRAFT PERMITS

This notice provides information about applications for a new, amended or renewed NPDES permits associated with mining activity (coal or noncoal) permits. The applications concern industrial waste (mining) discharges to surface water and discharges of stormwater associated with mining activities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing provisions of The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251—1376).

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) has prepared a draft NPDES permit and made a tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit in conjunction with the associated mining activity permit.

Effluent Limits for Coal Mining Activities

For coal mining activities, NPDES permits, when issued, will contain effluent limits that are the more stringent of technology-based (BAT) effluent limitations or Water Quality Based Effluent Limits (WQBEL).

The BAT limits for coal mining activities, as provided in 40 CFR Part 434 and 25 Pa. Code Chapters 87—90 are as follows:

precipitation event of greater than 1-year 24-hour to less than or equal to a 10-year 24-hour event) from coal refuse disposal piles. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Exceptions to BAT effluent limits may be applicable in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 87.102, 88.92, 88.187, 88.292, 89.52 and 90.102.

Effluent Limits for Noncoal Mining Activities

The limits for noncoal mining activities as provided in 25 Pa. Code Chapter 77 are pH 6 to 9 and other parameters the Department may require.

Discharges from noncoal mines located in some geologic settings (for example, in the coal fields) may require additional water quality based effluent limits. If additional effluent limits are needed for an NPDES permit associated with a noncoal mining permit, then the permit description specifies the parameters.

In addition to BAT or WQBEL limits, coal and noncoal NPDES permits establish effluent limitations in the form of implemented Best Management Practices (BMPs) identified in the associated Erosion and Sedimentation Plan, the Reclamation Plan and the NPDES permit application. These BMPs restrict the rates and quantities of associated pollutants from being discharged into surface waters in this Commonwealth.

More restrictive effluent limitations, restrictions on discharge volume or restrictions on the extent of mining that may occur are incorporated into an NPDES permit when necessary for compliance with water quality standards and antidegradation requirements (in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91—96).

The procedures for determining the final effluent limits, using a mass-balance equation or model, are found in Technical Guidance Document 563-2112-115, Developing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permits for Mining Activities. Other specific factors to be considered include public comments and Total Maximum Daily Load(s). Additional discharge limitations may apply in the event that unexpected discharges occur.

Discharge rates for surface mining activities are precipitation driven. Discharge rates for proposed discharges associated with underground mining are noted in the permit description.

Persons wishing to comment on an NPDES draft permit should submit a written statement to the Department at the address of the district mining office indicated before each draft permit within 30-days of this public notice. Comments received within the comment period will be considered in the final determinations regarding the NPDES permit applications. Comments must include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform the Department of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

The Department will also accept requests or petitions for a public hearing on NPDES permit applications, as provided in 25 Pa. Code § 92a.82(d). The request or petition for a public hearing shall be filed within 30-days of this public notice and contain the name, address, telephone number and the interest of the party filing the request and state the reasons why a hearing is warranted. A public hearing may be held if the Department considers the public interest significant. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing on the NPDES permit application will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. When a public hearing is held, the Department will consider comments from the public hearing in the final determination on the NPDES permit application.

Natural resource protection projects are exempt from the minimum savings requirements. However, projects must quantify the sediment and nutrient diversion from the directly related receiving waterway to be eligible.

An eligible applicant's business must be Commonwealth-based, registered to do business in this Commonwealth and a for-profit small business with 100 or fewer full-time equivalent employees. The project to which the grant will apply must be undertaken in or on a facility located in this Commonwealth. Applicants should not have current environmental violations or obligations due to the Commonwealth.

Draft Revised Water Quality Assessment Methodologies; Available for Public Comment

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is requesting public comment for draft revisions in the Assessment and Listing Methodology (assessment methodology) for the 2022 Integrated Water Quality Monitoring and Assessment Report (Integrated Report). Sections 303(d), 305(b) and 314 of the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1313(d), 1315(b) and 1324) require states to report on the condition of all surface waters in the biennial Integrated Report. The methodologies referred to in this public notice will be used, when finalized, to assess the quality of the waters in this Commonwealth under this legal mandate.

The two drafts revised assessment methodologies are the Fish Tissue Consumption Assessment Method and the Assessment Determination and Delisting Methods. For the Fish Tissue Consumption Assessment Method, perfluorooctane sulfonic acid meal advisories were added. For the Assessment Determination and Delisting Methods, clarifying language was added to the delisting section to ensure assessments were being entered into the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Federal database consistently. For the 2022 Integrated Report, the assessment methodology is being updated to reflect this clarified methodology.

Unemployment Compensation; Records of and Reports by Employers; Qualifications Required to Secure Compensation and for Rate and Amount of Compensation; Determination of Compensation Appeals and for Decision of Referee and Further Appeals and Reviews; Shared-Work Participating Employer Responsibilities

The purpose of this notice is to announce the following amendments to the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp. Sess., 1937 P.L. 2897, No. 1), known as the Unemployment Compensation Law (UC Law) (43 P.S. §§ 751—919.10), as provided for under the act of June 30, 2021 (P.L. , No. 30).

*Article II. Administration of Act.***Section 206. Records of and Reports by Employers.**

Section 206(a) of the UC Law (43 P.S. § 766) is amended to require employers, whether or not liable for the payment of contributions under the UC Law, to keep accurate employment records containing the information as may be prescribed by the rules and regulations adopted by the Department of Labor and Industry (Department), for no more than 6 years after contributions relating to the records have been paid.

*Article IV. Compensation.***Section 401. Qualifications Required to Secure Compensation.**

Section 401(a)(2) of the UC Law (43 P.S. § 801(a)(2)) is amended to replace its reference to section 404(e)(1) and (2) (43 P.S. § 804(e)(1) and (2)) with section 404(e)(2)(v) (43 P.S. § 804(e)(2)(v)).

Section 404. Rate and Amount of Compensation.

The amendment to section 404(e)(2)(i)(B)(I) (43 P.S. § 804(e)(2)(i)(B)(I)) establishes procedures for the Department extending or contracting the Table Specified for the Determination of Rate and Amount of Benefits, found in section 401(e)(1) of the UC Law (43 P.S. § 804(e)(1)).

*Article V. Determination of Compensation; Appeals; Reviews; Procedure.***Section 501. Determinations of Compensation Appeals.**

The amendments to section 501(c)(4) and (5) and (e) of the UC Law (43 P.S. § 821(c)(4) and (5) and (e)) require that notice of an unemployment compensation determination be provided to a qualifying base-year employer or the claimant's last employer, no later than 21 days after the determination date provided on the notice. Subsection (f) is added to require that a notice or determination issued under section 501 be mailed to the last known post office address or transmitted electronically, as designated by the claimant or employer. 43 P.S. § 821(f).

Section 502. Decision of Referee; Further Appeals and Review.

Section 502 of the UC Law (43 P.S. § 822) is amended to extend the appeal period from 15 days to 21 days after the "decision date" provided on a referee decision or when the board acts on its own motion. Additionally, decisions shall be mailed to each relevant party's last known post office address or transmitted electronically, as designated by the party.

*Article XIII. Shared-Work Program.***Section 1307. Participating Employer Responsibilities.**

Section 1307 of the UC Law (43 P.S. § 916.7) amends the shared-work provisions by requiring the Department to establish a schedule, consistent with the rules and regulations of the shared-work plan, for participating employers to file claims for compensation.

Effective Date

Under section 6 of the act of June 30, 2021 (P.L. _____, No. 30), the previously-referenced amendments to the UC Law are effective upon publication of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

In the Municipal Election, the electors of Philadelphia County will elect nine Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County. Each elector will be entitled to vote for up to nine candidates, with the nine candidates receiving the largest number of valid votes being elected.

In the Municipal Primary held May 18, 2021, the electors of the Democratic Party nominated eight candidates for the office of Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County. No Republican candidates appeared on the ballot in the Republican Municipal Primary. By law, each of the certified Statewide political parties of the Commonwealth—the Democratic Party, the Republican Party, the Libertarian Party and the Green Party—will be permitted to nominate one additional candidate for Court of Common Pleas of Philadelphia County by submitting to the Acting Secretary, no later than September 13, 2021, a nomination certificate in the form prescribed by law and prepared in accordance with the applicable rules of the political party. See 25 P.S. §§ 2938.3, 2953 and 2954. Political bodies will be permitted to nominate a candidate by filing with the Acting Secretary, no later than September 13, 2021, nomination papers prepared and submitted in accordance with the requirements of the Pennsylvania Election Code (25 P.S. §§ 2600—3591).

Whereas, Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease (RHD) is a rapidly spreading, fatal disease in lagomorphs and is considered a foreign animal disease in the United States; and

Whereas, The viruses causing RHD can be transmitted by direct contact with infected rabbits and hares, or indirectly through carcasses, food, water, and any contaminated materials, and are very resistant to extreme environmental conditions; and

Whereas, RHD has been designated a “dangerous transmissible disease” of animals by order of the Secretary of Agriculture under the provisions of the Domestic Animal Law (3 Pa.C.S. §§ 2301 et seq.) at 3 Pa.C.S. § 2321(d); and

Whereas, The Pennsylvania Game Commission (Commission) has determined that eastern cottontails (*Sylvilagus floridanus*), Appalachian cottontails (*Sylvilagus obscurus*), and snowshoe hares (*Lepus americanus*), members of the family Leporidae, are native and familiar species to the public and important prey and game species with impacts on the vegetation structure of their ecosystems; and

Whereas, Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus Serotype 2 (RHDV-2), a unique variant of RHD, has been detected in the United States in recent years and can infect all ages of a wide range of domestic and wild lagomorphs, including North American wild species of hares, jackrabbits, and cottontails; and

Whereas, RHDV-2 has not yet been detected in wild or domestic lagomorph populations within the Commonwealth; and

Whereas, The Commission desires to prevent the emergence of RHDV-2 within the Commonwealth; and

Whereas, RHDV-2 is of particular concern to the Commonwealth because of its potential to have a detrimental impact on both wild and domestic lagomorph populations; and

Whereas, The Commission has determined that importation of potentially infectious wild lagomorphs, their parts or products, or contaminated equipment, items, or materials from locations where RHDV-2 has been detected in wild or domestic lagomorph populations into the Commonwealth poses an unacceptable risk of introduction and spread of RHDV-2 to the Commonwealth; and

Whereas, The Game and Wildlife Code (34 Pa.C.S. §§ 101, et seq.) regulations promulgated thereunder (58 Pa. Code §§ 131.1, et seq.) collectively provide broad authority to the Commission to regulate activities relating to the protection, preservation, and management of all game and wildlife and their respective habitats (C.f. 34 Pa.C.S. §§ 322, 2101, and 2102); and

Whereas, Section 137.34 of the Code (58 Pa. Code § 137.34) provides specific emergency authority to the Executive Director of the Commission to mitigate risk factors and determine the prevalence and geographic distribution of transmissible wildlife diseases of wild birds and mammals, excluding those species under Federal jurisdiction, if the introduction or spread of such diseases poses a threat to human, domestic and wild animal, or environmental health and safety within or adjacent to this Commonwealth; and

Now Therefore, I, BRYAN J. BURHANS, Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Game Commission, pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Code and regulations promulgated thereunder, do hereby order and direct the following

1. The importation of any wild lagomorphs and their parts or products (meat, pelts, hides, carcasses, etc.) into the Commonwealth from any Commonwealth, State, Ter-

ritory, or Country where RHDV-2 has been detected in wild or domestic lagomorph populations in the 12 months prior to the importation is hereby prohibited.

2. This Order shall not be construed in any manner to limit the Commission’s authority to establish additional or further authorizations or limitations relating to the monitoring for RHD and mitigation of any risk factors associated with its introduction or spread.

3. This Order is effective immediately and shall remain in effect until rescinded or modified by subsequent order.

Regulation No. 125-230 (# 3262)*

On August 5, 2020, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board (Board). This rulemaking amends 58 Pa. Code by adding Chapters 1101a—1120a. The proposed regulation was published in the September 5, 2020 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a public comment period ending on October 5, 2020. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on April 27, 2021.

This rulemaking establishes permanent regulations for video gaming in the Commonwealth.

We have determined this regulation is consistent with the statutory authority of the Board (4 Pa.C.S. §§ 1202(b)(30) and 3302) and the intention of the General Assembly. Having considered all of the other criteria of the Regulatory Review Act, we find promulgation of this regulation is in the public interest.

Schedule of Civil Penalties—Crane Operators
Regulation No. 16A-7103 (# 3273)*

On October 8, 2020, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs (Bureau). This rulemaking amends 49 Pa. Code § 43b.28. The proposed regulation was published in the October 24, 2020 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a public comment period ending on November 30, 2020. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on April 26, 2021.

This regulation adopts a schedule of civil penalties for various violations of the Crane Operator Licensure Act (act) (63 P.S. §§ 2400.101–2400.2102). The Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs (Commissioner), in consultation with the State Board of Crane Operators (Board) states the purpose of this regulation is to deter violations of the statutory and regulatory requirements contained in the proposed schedule of civil penalties. It is also intended to streamline the disciplinary process to be more efficient and cost effective.

We find that this regulation does not meet the criteria of clarity and the protection of the public health, safety and welfare. 71 P.S. §§ 745.5b(b)(2) and (3). As explained below, there are two issues that we believe should be clarified and or revised for the protection of the public health, safety and welfare.

First, in the Preamble to the proposed regulation, the Commissioner and the Board state that “[o]perating a crane without a license is a serious infraction of both section 501(a) of the act (63 P.S. § 2400.501(a)) and the Board’s regulation at § 6.41(a) (relating to unlicensed crane operation). (49 Pa. Code § 6.41(a)) An unlicensed individual who has not been properly trained to operate a crane could cause extensive damage to property as well as cause bodily harm to individuals at a construction site.”

In our comments, we asked the Commissioner and the Board whether they considered qualifying the use of the Act 48 civil penalty section for offenses of operating a crane without a license or employing an unlicensed individual to operate a crane. We questioned whether an Act 48 civil penalty should even be available for consideration if the offenses mentioned result in bodily harm or substantial property damage. See Section 5(a) of the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L. 345, No. 48), 63 Pa.C.S. § 3108(a).

The Commissioner and the Board responded that the ability for agents of the Bureau to file a citation for violations of these sections does not foreclose the possibility of the filing of formal action if the facts and circumstances warrant a more serious penalty. The Commissioner and Board state that the option of issuance of a citation for these types of violations is discretionary, and

should be used in those situations where the violation occurs without aggravating circumstances such as bodily injury or property damage. While the Commissioner and Board seem to be in agreement with limiting the citation process to those offenses that do not involve bodily injury or substantial property damage, the final-form regulation was not amended in this regard. We believe the Board should amend the rulemaking to make clear that the citation process is available only for offenses not involving bodily harm or substantial property damage.

Second, a license to operate a crane is valid only in conjunction with certification if the licensee maintains a current certification in the specialty for which the crane operator is certified. 63 P.S. § 2400.501(f) and 49 Pa. Code § 6.12(a). Under the act and Board’s regulations, a licensee who has failed to maintain certification or submit evidence of re-certification is subject to disciplinary action. 63 P.S. § 2400.502(b) and 49 Pa. Code § 6.32(a)(2). Since certification is integral to licensure, we asked the Board if it considered and rejected establishing an Act 48 civil penalty for failure to maintain certification or provide evidence of certification renewal.

The Commissioner and the Board responded that they did not include the failure to maintain certification or submit evidence of recertification in the schedule of civil penalties because a licensee may choose not to recertify or maintain their certification for several reasons such as being no longer employed, no longer practicing in the profession, or the operator has retired. In these type of situations, the Board explains that “rather than going through the expense of recertification when a licensee is no longer practicing the profession, the licensee may let their certification expire and not engage in the practice of the profession, even though they have a *valid, current license to do so until it subsequently expires*. The Commissioner and the Board believe that the ability to discipline a licensee for failure to maintain certification does not arise until the licensee actually operates a crane after the crane operator’s certification has expired. As such, a violation of 63 P.S. §§ 2400.502(b) and 6.32(a)(2) would more appropriately be the *subject of formal disciplinary action*.” (Emphasis added.) The Commissioner and the Board’s position is completely contrary to the statutory mandate contained in 63 PS Section 2400.502(b) which explicitly states “Failure to maintain certification or submit evidence of renewal of certification shall subject the licensee to disciplinary action.” The statute is clear that failure to maintain certification is an offense in and of itself.

The act and the Board’s regulations require the application form for renewal of license to indicate when the certification expires. Licensees are required to submit evidence of certification renewal before their current certification expires. 63 P.S. § 200.504(a) and 49 Pa. Code § 6.32(a)(2). If the Board does not receive the necessary documentation from a licensee indicating that their certification has been renewed, does it notify the licensee that their license is no longer valid and of the penalty if they operate a crane without a current certification? Has the Board considered mandating that licenses for which the Board has not received proof of recertification be returned to the Board?

Our specific concern is that crane operators with expired certifications but “valid, current licenses” will only be held to account when there is an incident investigation or a complaint filed. Failure to maintain certification or to submit evidence of renewal of certification before the expiration date of certification is a violation of the

standards of conduct of a crane operator. 49 Pa. Code § 6.44(b)(5). As such, we question why it is necessary to wait until the licensee actually operates a crane before imposing discipline.

The current regulations were promulgated to “[p]rotect people from bodily harm by establishing standards of conduct applied to crane operators in order to restrict or remove from the occupation of crane operation those persons proved to have engaged in conduct, habits, behavior or judgment that has caused bodily harm or is reasonably likely to create an unreasonable risk of harm in the future.” 49 Pa. Code § 6.1(b)(2). Given the unique hazards and risk of harm arising from crane operation, we question whether the Board’s approach adequately protects the public from operator error or improper operation of a crane, conveys to the regulated community the seriousness of noncompliance and deters future violations.

We have determined this regulation is consistent with the statutory authority of the Bureau (63 Pa.C.S. § 3108(a)) and the intention of the General Assembly. However, after considering all of the other criteria of the Regulatory Review Act discussed above, we find promulgation of this regulation is not in the public interest.

By Order of the Commission:

This regulation is disapproved.

Notice of Minimum Wage Increase under Executive Order 2016-02 Amended, Establishing a Minimum Wage for Employees of the Commonwealth and of Organizations Receiving State Contracts

Executive Order 2016-02, Minimum Wage for Employees for the Commonwealth and of Organizations Receiving State Contracts, was signed by Governor Tom Wolf on March 7, 2016 (the Original Executive Order). The Original Executive Order raised the hourly minimum wage paid to employees of Commonwealth agencies under the Governor’s jurisdiction and paid by contractors to workers performing work on or in connection with covered State contracts, as described in the Original Executive Order, to \$10.15 per hour, beginning July 1, 2016; and beginning January 1, 2017, and annually thereafter, an amount determined in accordance with the methodology set forth in the Original Executive Order.

On June 28, 2018, Executive Order 2016-02 Amended, Minimum Wage for Employees of the Commonwealth and of Organizations Receiving State Contracts (the Amended Executive Order), was signed by Governor Tom Wolf. The Amended Executive Order raised the hourly minimum wage paid to employees of Commonwealth agencies under the Governor’s jurisdiction to \$12.00 per hour, beginning July 1, 2018, and paid by contractors to workers performing work on or in connection with covered State contracts, as described in the Amended Executive Order, to \$12.00

per hour, beginning on the effective date of the applicable contract or lease solicited or bilaterally modified on or after July 1, 2018; and beginning January 1, 2019, and annually thereafter, to an amount determined in accordance with the methodology set forth in the Amended Executive Order.

Under the Amended Executive Order, notice is hereby provided that beginning July 1, 2021, the minimum wage rate to be paid to employees of Commonwealth agencies under the jurisdiction of the Governor and workers performing work on or in connection with covered State contracts, as described in Section 2 of the Amended Executive Order, will increase to \$13.50 per hour.

In addition, the Original Executive Order continues to apply to workers performing work on or in connection with covered State contracts entered into after July 1, 2016 but prior to July 1, 2018, and these contracts have not been bilaterally modified to include the Amended Executive Order. Notice is hereby provided that beginning July 1, 2021, the minimum wage rate to be paid workers performing work on or in connection with covered State contracts, as described in Section 2 of the Original Executive Order, will increase to \$10.95 per hour.

This notice is effective on July 1, 2021.
