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READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylvania Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in **underscored bold face**. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

CHESTER COUNTY

Adoption of Amended Court of Common Pleas Family Court Rules; Administrative Order No. 12-2023

And Now, this 8th day of December, 2023, the following amended Chester County Court of Common Pleas Family Court Rules (“Amended Family Court Rules”) are adopted in their entirety. In accordance with Pennsylvania Rules of Judicial Administration 103(d), these proposed Amended Family Court Rules were submitted to and approved by the Domestic Relations Procedural Rules Committee.

Effective Date

These Amended Family Court Rules shall become effective thirty (30) days from the date of their publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Procedural Compliance

In conformity with Pa.R.J.A. 103(d)(5)(ii-iii) and (6), the Chester County Court Administrator shall do the following:

- 1) Distribute two (2) paper copies of the Amended Family Court Rules to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, along with a copy of the Amended Family Court Rules in an agreed upon format which complies with the requirements of 1 Pa. Code § 13.11.
- 2) File one copy of the Amended Family Court Rules with the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts.
- 3) Publish a copy of the Amended Family Court Rules on the Chester County website.
- 4) Incorporate the Amended Family Court Rules in the complete set of the published Chester County Court Rules no later than thirty (30) days following publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

AMENDMENTS TO CHESTER COUNTY FAMILY COURT LOCAL RULES

Rule 1910.12.A. Office Conference Hearing. Record. Exceptions. Order. Interpreter.

(a) Whenever possible, all matters dealing with the same parties shall be scheduled for office conference/hearing at the same time.

(b) Continuances of office conferences and matters before Hearing Officers may be granted by agreement of all counsel or counsel and unrepresented parties. All other continuances shall be governed by Pa.R.Civ.P. 216 and C.C.R.C.P. 216.1.

(c)(1) Should a petitioner fail to appear at the office conference or hearing, as scheduled, the petition may be dismissed.

(2) Should a respondent fail to appear at the office conference or hearing, as scheduled, an order may be entered in his/her absence or a bench warrant for his/her appearance may issue.

(d) Recommendations on the matters set forth in Pa.R.Civ.P. 1910.11(d) and 1910.19 shall be made initially by the conference officer.

(e) At the Domestic Relations Office conference, the plaintiff may request the entry of a temporary order in all cases in which there has been filed:

- (1) A complaint for the support of minor children;
- (2) A complaint for the support of spouse and entitlement is not challenged;
- (3) A petition for alimony pendente lite; or
- (4) A complaint for the support of spouse and minor children and entitlement is not challenged as to spouse. If entitlement is challenged, a temporary order may be requested for the minor children and a spouse who is a party to a Chester County divorce proceeding pursuant to C.C.R.C.P. 1910.11.A.

(f) When a temporary order is requested at a Domestic Relations Office conference, as above, the Domestic Relations Office shall submit a recommendation to the Court as to the amount of the requested order. The recommendation shall be based on the Pennsylvania Support Guidelines in accordance with Pa.R.Civ.P. 1910.16-2.

(g) If the dependent spouse is not employed, no earning capacity will be assigned to him/her for the purpose of entering the temporary order. The parties shall be informed by the domestic relations conference officer that earning capacity will be taken into consideration at the hearing before the Hearing Officer.

(h) When a complaint or petition is scheduled for hearing before a Domestic Relations Hearing Officer and the parties reach an agreement that resolves the outstanding issues prior to the scheduled hearing, the parties shall immediately notify the Domestic Relations Office in writing and within thirty (30) days after the date set for hearing:

(1) File a stipulation and order outlining the terms of their agreement. The Court may, sua sponte, direct the parties to file a stipulation and order within a reasonable time or direct the Domestic Relations Office to schedule a new hearing date.

(2) If the parties fail to comply with the terms set forth in part (1) of this rule, the Court may, sua sponte, dismiss the outstanding complaint or petition without prejudice.

(i) *Separate Listings*

(1) The request for a long day listing shall be in the following form:

SEE FORMS INDEX (# 8)

(2)(i) Requests for separate listings shall be filed no later than five (5) business days prior to the scheduled hearing before the Support Hearing Officer.

(ii) Objections to requests for separate listings shall be filed within ten (10) business days of the filing of the request for separate listing.

(3) In all matters where a motion for a separate listing has been filed:

(i) *Preliminary Conference*

(a) The Hearing Officer shall hold a preliminary conference within thirty (30) days after being appointed to determine the scope of the issues raised.

(b) At the time of the Preliminary Conference, the parties shall submit a brief statement of the facts and matters complained of.

(ii) *Discovery*

(a) Counsel may prepare and submit to the assigned Hearing Officer and opposing counsel a list of requested discovery at the preliminary conference.

(b) A Hearing Officer may recommend to the Court the entry of orders for discovery. Including by not limited to, the filing of an income and expense statement. Said discovery orders may include discovery deadlines upon the request of either party or at the direction of the Hearing Officer.

(c) In any support matter in which a Hearing Officer has been appointed, all discovery motions, which do not involve a non-party, filed pursuant to Pa.R.Civ.P. 1930.5 and Pa.R.Civ.P. 4001, et seq., shall be heard by the Hearing Officer.

(d) An argument regarding discovery, if requested by either party, shall be scheduled before the Hearing Officer. At the conclusion of the argument or within a reasonable time, the Hearing Officer may make a recommendation and advise the parties they have ten (10) days in which to request an argument before the Court. At the conclusion of the ten (10) days, if no objections have been filed, the recommendation shall become an order of the Court. In the event objections are filed, the matter shall be listed, in the normal course of business for argument before the Court. Argument shall be limited to the issues raised by the pleadings.

(e) All Objections to the discovery order shall be in writing and filed within ten (10) business days of the recommendation. A copy shall be served upon the Family Court Administrator who shall schedule the case for argument before the Court and promptly notify all counsel and unrepresented parties in the case.

Comment: Nothing in this rule with respect to discovery in complex support matters is intended to require a party to seek a court order for discovery as that issue is addressed in Pa.R.Civ.P. 1930.5(b) but outlines the procedure for a court order for discovery when a hearing officer has been appointed.

(iii) *Settlement Conference*

(a) The Hearing Officer shall conduct a settlement conference at which both parties shall submit a statement, which:

(b) Gives biographical information of each party, including but not limited to, age, education, occupation, income, health and children;

(c) Identifies any and all legal or factual disputes or issue.

(iv) *Certification of Trial Readiness*

(a) At the conclusion of the settlement conference, if all discovery has been completed and, the deadline for discovery has passed, the case has not settled the parties may file a Certification of Trial Readiness.

(b) A time-stamped copy of the completed Certification of Trial Readiness shall be served upon the assigned Hearing Officer and proof thereof, shall be filed with Domestic Relations Office. Any certificate that fails to include an estimated time of trial will be rejected by the Hearing Officer and not placed on the Hearing Officer's trial list.

(c) Upon receipt of the Certification of Trial Readiness by the Hearing Officer, the matter shall be placed on the assigned Hearing Officer's trial list in accordance with the filing date as indicated by Domestic Relations time-stamp.

(d) All certifications of trial readiness shall be filed on blue paper with the Domestic Relations Office.

(j) *Hearing:*

(a) Each party shall submit to the Court and opposing counsel at least five (5) days before the scheduled hearing date a Pre-Trial Statement not exceeding three (3) pages setting forth:

(1) a brief statement of the claim(s) being made by the moving party or the defense(s) being made by the responding party;

(2) a concise statement of the facts;

(3) a concise statement of the factual or legal issues involved including citations to the applicable statutes or case law, if any;

(4) a list showing the names and addresses of all witnesses each party intends to call at trial;

(5) copies of all exhibits to be offered at trial intended to be admitted during your case in chief.

(b) Any and all reports of any experts intended to be called and a form of proposed Order setting forth the requested disposition and supporting calculations shall be attached to the Pre-Trial statement.

(k) *Exceptions:*

(1) *Dismissal*—Exceptions shall be dismissed in any case in which the notes or tape recording of testimony have not been ordered, and paid for if required, within five (5) days of the filing of exceptions.

(2) *Briefs:*

(i) No less than thirty (30) days before the date set for oral argument, the excepting party or parties shall file a brief with the Domestic Relations Office, shall serve copies of the Brief upon all counsel, unrepresented parties and the Judge assigned to hear the exceptions, and shall file a Certification that service has been made.

(ii) No less than fourteen (14) days before the date set for oral argument, the responding party shall file a Brief and Certification of Service in the manner prescribed above.

(iii) In the event both parties file exceptions, each party shall be treated as an excepting party for the purposes of the briefing schedule as set forth above.

(iv) *Argument*—If either party fails to file a brief within the time prescribed by these rules, or within the time as extended, the non-filing party will not be heard at oral argument except by permission of the Court.

(3) A time-stamped copy of any exceptions filed shall be served upon the assigned Hearing Officer.

(4) *Oral Argument*—Argument before the Court shall be made only on the basis of the record made before the Hearing Officer. The parties may, by agreement, supplement the record by depositions or stipulations prior to argument, but no live testimony will be heard by the Court, unless the Court shall permit same for cause shown.

(1) *Interpreters:*

(1) Requests for interpreters in accordance with C.C.R.C.P. 233.3 shall be made no less than twenty-four (24) hours in advance of the proceeding when an interpreter will be needed.

(2) Requests for interpreters shall be made by going to <http://www.chesco.org/formcenter/Courts-39/interpreter-request-form-166>, completing the template and submitting the request, or e-mailing intrpcalcta@chesco.org. If the cancellation is less than forty-eight (48) hours before the scheduled hearing, the party shall call the Court in addition to e-mail.

Comments

Any motion to dismiss may be made at any time prior to commencement of oral argument and is not subject to the requirements of C.C.R.C.P. 206.1.

Rule 1915.3.A. Commencement of Action. Complaint, Order. Parenting Class.(a) *Initial Contact with the Court.*

(1) Notice of a custody action and conciliation conference shall include the date and time for each party to attend parenting class, the name of the assigned mediator with instructions to contact the mediator within three (3) days and the date and time for custody conciliation.

(2) All complaints for custody and petitions for modification shall be scheduled for mediation orientation within thirty (30) days of filing with the Office of the Prothonotary unless there is or was an Order under the Protection From Abuse Act. Failure to attend the Mediation Orientation session may result in a recommendation by the custody conciliator that sanctions be entered including but not limited to a fine of up to \$100.00.

(3) All parties shall attend parenting classes within thirty (30) days of filing the initial Complaint or Petition for Modification with the Office of the Prothonotary. Upon good cause shown, a party may request permission in writing to the Family Court Administrator to attend an approved alternate program. Should the Court grant permission to attend an alternate program proof of attendance must be produced. Any party attending the Court approved program within one (1) calendar year may be excused from attendance. Failure to attend the Parenting Program as directed may result in a finding of Contempt and/or the issuance of sanctions.

Comment: It is the party's responsibility to provide the Court with the certificate of completion of the current court approved program. Information about the currently approved the program can be found on chesco.org.

Rule 1915.4.A. Prompt Disposition of Custody Cases. Custody Conciliation. Relocation. Pre-Trial Status Conference and Statement. Trial.*I. Custody Conciliation*

(a) The Court shall appoint appropriate persons as custody conciliators.

(b) The custody conciliator:

(1) shall conduct conciliation conferences in order to assist the parties to resolve custody;

(2) may hear contempt cases filed with the Court;

(3) may recommend to the court that interim custody orders be entered; and

(4) may recommend the appointment of counsel and/or a guardian ad litem for the child.

(c) All custody matters shall be accompanied by a Notice and Order to Appear (see Form # 11) scheduled for conference before the custody conciliator no sooner than ten (10) days after filing. All parties shall be present at such conference. Absent good cause, failure of a party to appear at the conference may result in the entry of a temporary or final order in the absence of such party.

(d) An appearance by counsel before the custody conciliator shall be deemed an entry of appearance on behalf of the party represented.

(e) To facilitate the conciliation process and encourage frank, open and meaningful exchanges between the parties and their respective counsel all statements, except agreements made by the parties, shall not be the subject of direct or cross examination at a later hearing before the court.

(f) The custody conciliator shall not be subject to subpoena as a witness.

(g)(1) All agreed orders shall promptly be sent to the Court for signature.

(2) If the parties are unable to reach a resolution, the Court may enter an interim order, but shall issue an order scheduling a pretrial status conference at which time all unrepresented parties and counsel shall be present.

(3) All orders for custody shall include the following language:

NOTICE: NEITHER PARTY SHALL RELOCATE THE CHILDREN WITHOUT PROPER CONSENT AND/OR COURT APPROVAL AS REQUIRED BY 23 Pa.C.S. § 5337. STRICT COMPLIANCE WITH 23 Pa.C.S. § 5337 (related to relocation) IS REQUIRED.

II. Pretrial Status Conference and Trial

(a) A brief pretrial status conference shall be promptly scheduled consistent with the Court's calendar when there is no agreement reached at the custody conciliation.

(b) Counsel and unrepresented parties shall appear for the conference, at which time possible resolution, pretrial matters and scheduling will be discussed.

(c) If the matter will proceed to trial, Counsel and/or a Self-Representing Party shall fill out the Certificate of Trial Readiness at the pretrial status conference and shall file and serve on the Family Court Administrator. All parties shall leave with a copy of the Certificate of Trial Readiness. See Form 12.

(d) A Pretrial Statement, (see Form 13) not to exceed three (3) pages in length, shall be filed by each party five days prior to the Pretrial Conference containing the following information:

(1) a brief statement of the claim(s) being made by the moving party or the defense(s) made by the responding party;

(2) a concise statement of the facts;

(3) a concise statement of the factual or legal issues involved, if any, including citations to applicable statutes or case law, if any;

(4) a list showing the names and addresses of all witnesses each party intends to call at trial;

(5) a schedule of all exhibits to be offered at trial;

(6) Any expert report;

(7) a proposed Final Order/Parenting Plan; and

(8) updated Custody Crimes Affidavit.

(e) Failure to comply with the timely filing of a pre-trial statement may result in the imposition of sanctions including but not limited to exclusion of evidence at trial, fines and costs.

The form Certificate of Trial Readiness as required by C.C.R.C.P. 1915.4.A.(III)(c) shall be substantially in the form found at Form 12.

Rule 1915.11-1.A. Parenting Coordination.

(a) *Parenting Coordinator Appointment/Appointment of a Parenting Coordinator.*

(1) Either party may file the appropriate pleading pursuant to Pa.R.Civ.P. 1915.22, seeking the appointment of a Parenting Coordinator. If the parties agree to the appointment of a Parenting Coordinator and to the Parenting Coordinator, the appropriate pleading is required but may be accompanied by a stipulation and order appointing a Parenting Coordinator in accordance with Pa.R.Civ.P. 1915.22.

Comment: In a contested appointment for a parenting coordinator, the appropriate pleading is a petition; in an agreed to appointment, the appropriate pleading is a motion with a Praeceptum for Determination.

(2) If the Court deems a Parenting Coordinator necessary, an order shall be entered in accordance with Pa.R.Civ.P. 1915.22. If the parties cannot agree on the selection of a Parenting Coordinator, the Court shall require each party to identify his/her choice(s) along with the hourly rate of each to all parties. If the parties cannot agree, the Court will select a Parenting Coordinator. The roster of the Court's approved Parenting Coordinators and their stated hourly rates shall be posted at <http://www.chesco.org>.

(3) Any party seeking a pro bono appointment must file with Prothonotary a Petition to Proceed In Forma Pauperis for the appointment of a Parenting Coordinator within three (3) days of the appointment order absent good cause shown. The In Forma Pauperis form can be found at <http://www.chesco.org>.

(b) *Roster of Approved Parenting Coordinators.*

An attorney or mental health professional seeking to be included on the Chester County Court's roster of qualified individuals to serve as a Parenting Coordinator shall submit an affidavit to the Administrative Family Court Judge or his/her designee together with the following:

(1) An affidavit attesting the applicant has qualifications found in Pa.R.Civ.P. 1915.11-1;

(2) An acknowledgment the applicant has read the Association of Family and Conciliation Courts (AFCC) Parenting Coordinator guidelines and the American Psychological Association (APA) Parenting Coordinator Guidelines. AFCC Parenting Coordinator guidelines are posted at <https://www.afccnet.org/Portals/0/AFCCGuidelinesforParentingcoordinationnew.pdf> and the APA Parenting Coordinator Guidelines are posted at <https://www.apa.org/pubs/journals/features/parenting-coordination.pdf>; and

(3) An acknowledgment that for every 2 fee generating Parenting Coordination assignments, he or she must accept one pro bono assignment (up to 12 hours per pro bono case).

(4) The application to be considered for appointment as a Parenting Coordinator for Chester County and Affidavit as required by C.C.R.C.P. 1915.11-1.A(b)(1) can be found at Forms # 16, for attorneys and Form # 17 for mental health professionals.

(c) *Parenting Coordinator Recommendations*

(1) Parenting Coordinator shall serve counsel, the parties and the Family Court Legal Liaison or Court Administrator with their Summary and Recommendation(s), accompanied by a Praeceptum for Determination, within two (2) days after the last communication with the parties on the issues in accordance with Pa.R.Civ.P. 1915.11-1(f)(2). This service may be accomplished by email to the parties and Family Court at the designated email address (fconfernces@chesco.org). The Parenting Coordinator shall file their Summary and Recommendation(s) and a Praeceptum for Determination within (5) days of service.

(2) *Objections to Parenting Coordinator's Recommendation(s) and Petition for a Record Hearing.*

i. A party objecting to the Recommendation(s) must present Objection(s) to the Recommendation of the Parenting Coordinator and a Request for a Record Hearing within five days of service of the Summary and Recommendation(s) along with a hearing notice to Family Court for scheduling before the Family Court Judge who appointed the Parenting Coordinator, or other judge if the appointing judge no longer sits in Family Court. The documents shall then be filed with the Prothonotary and the party objecting shall serve a time-stamped copy of the Objection(s) and the hearing notice on the opposing party and the Parenting Coordinator.

ii. The Recommendation of the Parenting Coordinator is binding pending Hearing.

iii. Following an evidentiary hearing, the objecting party shall serve the resulting Order of Court on the Objection(s) to the Recommendation of the Parenting Coordinator on the parties and the Parenting Coordinator.

(3) *Court Review of Parenting Coordinator's Recommendations.*

If no objections to the Parenting Coordinator's Recommendation(s) are filed with the Prothonotary within five days of service of the Summary and Recommendation(s), the Prothonotary shall transmit the file to the Court Administrator's Office to be assigned to the appointing Judge, if available within a reasonable time, otherwise to any Family Court Judge for review of the Recommendation in accordance with Pa.R.Civ.P. 1915.11-1(f)(4). The Prothonotary shall serve the Order on counsel of record and/or self-represented litigants. Counsel for the parties shall serve the Parenting Coordinator.

(d) *FEES*

(1) Parties who request the appointment of a Parenting Coordinator or who are identified by the Court as benefiting from the appointment of a Parenting Coordinator shall pay the Parenting Coordinator as follows:

i. His or her hourly rate, which may be up to \$350.00 an hour; provided, however, if the parties combined monthly net income exceeds the mandatory minimum set forth in the Support Guidelines at 1910.16-2(e)(2) (currently \$30,000 per month), the Court may adjust the hourly rate;

ii. Absent good cause, each party shall pay up to \$750 as an initial retainer (\$1,500.00 total) which may be reallocated as deemed appropriate by the Parenting Coordinator or the Court. See Pa.R.C.P. 1915.22(8).

iii. If a party is granted In Forma Pauperis status by the Court specifically for the appointment of a Parenting Coordinator, the Parenting Coordinator so appointed shall serve on a pro bono (no fee) basis, up to 12 hours.

iv. A Parenting Coordinator must accept one pro bono appointment for every two fee generating appointments.

Rule 1915.13.A. Special Relief.

(a) Petitions seeking a stay or other immediate, substantive relief may be presented to the court at any time.

(1) Petitions involving a change in legal custody or the physical custody schedule due to an exigency will be scheduled before the Court.

(2) Matters that may include a temporary variation in custody for a specific circumstance may be scheduled before a custody conciliator.

Comment: The matter will be scheduled within the court's discretion before the appropriate forum. A matter involving a limited issue may include but is not limited to a vacation/holiday schedule issue, an issue about the issuance of a passport, an issue requesting a clarification or interpretation of the order, for example.

Rule 1915.17.A. Relocation.

(1) All petitions seeking relocation shall include a Notice and Order to Appear: Relocation (see Form # 19), a Pre-trial Statement (see Form # 12) and a copy of the Notice of Relocation and Objection to Relocation (see Rule 1915.17).

(2) All relocation petitions will be scheduled promptly before the Court.

(3) If no objection to a proposed relocation is filed pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S. § 5337(d), the relocating party shall file, prior to relocating, in addition to the affidavit, proof of notice and petition to confirm the relocation as required by 23 Pa.C.S. § 5337(e):

(a) A Praeceptum for Determination consistent with C.C.R.C.P. 206.6;

(b) A proposed order for custody;

(c) A copy of the original proposal for a revised custody schedule provided to the respondent with the Notice of Relocation.

Note: The proposed order for custody shall be consistent with the proposal for a revised custody schedule provided to the respondent with the Notice of Relocation pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S. § 5337(c)(3)(viii).

Rule 1920.16.A. Severance of Actions and Claims. Bifurcation. Interim Distribution.

(a) Upon petition of either party/or upon consent of the parties and after a record proceeding Hearing Officer may recommend bifurcation of the divorce proceedings and issuance of a divorce decree, prior to a determination of other matters raised, by written report in accordance with Pa.R.Civ.P. 1920.53. The court shall permit bifurcation for good cause shown. In such event, this decree shall be indexed in the judgment docket to give notice of the divorced spouse's equitable interest in the property of the other.

(b) The decree of divorce in such circumstances shall be substantially in the form as prescribed by Pa.R.Civ.P. 1920.76.

(c) A copy of the Petition for Bifurcation shall be served upon the appointed Hearing Officer.

(d)(1) Requests for Interim Distribution where equitable distribution has been raised by the pleadings and grounds have been met shall be referred to the appointed Hearing Officer for disposition.

(2) Claims for Interim Distribution shall be raised by the filing of a verified petition with a rule returnable. No hearing will be assigned at the time of filing.

(3) In those cases where a Hearing Officer has not been appointed, the moving party shall motion for the appointment of an equitable distribution Hearing Officer and pay the appropriate fee.

(4) The assigned Hearing Officer shall schedule a preliminary conference and ultimately a hearing, if necessary. At the conclusion of the hearing, a report shall issue.

(5) Objections to a recommendation for Interim Distribution shall be made by the filing of exceptions.

(e) Any requests for Interim Distribution where equitable distribution has been raised by the pleadings and grounds have not been met and a Hearing Officer not appointed may be raised by filing a Petition for Special Relief.

Note: Exceptions to the recommendation for Interim Distribution are deemed to be interlocutory. Oral argument, as necessary, will be scheduled when the final report and recommendation is filed.

Rule 1920.51.A. Hearing by the Court. Appointment of Hearing Officer. Presumed Consent Notice of Hearing. Applicable Hearing Officers' Fees.

(a) In actions where ancillary claims have been raised and are at issue, or a petition for Interim Distribution has been filed, on the motion of either party, a Hearing Officer shall be appointed by the court to hear testimony and prepare a report and recommendation.

(b) *Motion for Appointment of a Hearing Officer*—A motion for the appointment of a Hearing Officer may be filed at any time after the filing of a complaint in divorce and shall state specifically what claims are at issue, what claims have been settled by agreement and whether any such agreement is to be entered as a court order. The moving party must be in compliance with Pa.R.Civ.P. 1920.31 and 1920.33. The motion shall include a certification that the completed inventory has been filed and served on the other party. The motion and order shall be in the form prescribed by Pa.R.Civ.P. 1920.74(a) and (b).

(1) *Certification of Service*—The movant shall file, along with the motion for appointment of a Hearing Officer, a certification that opposing counsel or any unrepresented party has been served with a copy of the motion and all other documents required pursuant to subsection (b) hereof.

(2) The motion for the appointment of a Hearing Officer shall aver whether any acting Hearing Officer is disqualified from acting as a Hearing Officer in the action and the basis for disqualification.

(c) Objections to the Motion for the Appointment of a Hearing Officer shall be filed within ten (10) days of the filing of the motion and shall be in accordance with C.C.R.C.P. 206.2 and 206.6 except that no brief shall be required.

(d) *Cover Sheet*—Any motion for appointment of a Hearing Officer shall be filed in the office of the Prothonotary and shall be accompanied by a cover sheet, available at the office of the Prothonotary.

(e) *Appointment of Hearing Officer*—Upon filing of the motion for the appointment of a Hearing Officer, in the form prescribed by Pa.R.Civ.P. 1920.74, the required cover sheet and the posting of the required fee, the Office of the Prothonotary shall forward the motion to the Hearing

Officer's Unit for the scheduling of a preliminary conference. When a party files a motion for the appointment of a Hearing Officer, the moving party shall pay the Prothonotary the applicable fee pursuant to this Rule. No Hearing Officer shall be appointed without such payment.

(f) *Applicable Fee*—The party filing for the appointment of a Hearing Officer shall specify on the cover sheet the matters sought to be heard by the Hearing Officer, which shall determine the applicable fee. In addition to posting the requisite fee, the moving party shall pay a filing fee with the Prothonotary.

(1) The fee for the appointment of a Hearing Officer to hear only marital dissolutions issues shall be one hundred forty-one dollars and fifty cents (\$141.50), unless changed to a different amount.

(2) The fee for the appointment of a Hearing Officer to hear interim issues of counsel fees/and or litigation expenses shall be one hundred eleven dollars and fifty cents (\$111.50), unless changed to a different amount.

(3) Whenever a party moves for the appointment of a Hearing Officer to hear equitable distribution of marital property, whether or not there are other claims to be heard by the Hearing Officer, the moving party shall deposit five hundred eleven dollars and fifty cents (\$511.50), unless changed to a different amount, for the Hearing Officer's fee.

(g) The above fees are non-refundable.

Note: All fees include the current Prothonotary filing fee of ten dollars and eighty-five cents (\$10.85), which may be changed to a different amount.

Comment: All fees herein are subject to change consistent with the Prothonotary's published fee schedule which may be found at www.chesco.org.

**AMENDED CHESTER COUNTY RULES OF

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Title 31—INSURANCE

INSURANCE DEPARTMENT

[31 PA. CODE CH. 89]

Preparation of Forms

The Insurance Department (Department) amends Chapter 89 (relating to approval of life, accident and health insurance) to read as set forth in Annex A. This final-form rulemaking is made under the Department's general rulemaking authority as set forth in sections 206, 506, 1501 and 1502 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. §§ 66, 186, 411 and 412), section 314 of the Accident and Health Filing Reform Act (40 P.S. § 3801.314) and the Department's rulemaking authority under the Unfair Insurance Practices Act (40 P.S. §§ 1171.1—1171.15). See *PALU v. Insurance Department*, 371 A.2d 564 (Pa. Cmwlth. 1977) (further explaining the Insurance Commissioner's authority to promulgate regulations under the Unfair Insurance Practices Act).

Purpose

This final-form rulemaking, as set forth in Annex A, will allow for the voluntary collection of demographic data, including questions related to race and ethnicity when certain criteria are met. Specifically, this amendment to § 89.12 (relating to application forms) will allow insurers to collect data that will help them develop better tools to address inequities in life, accident and health insurance coverage. Moreover, this amendment will be consistent with Federal and State efforts to address equity issues across society generally. For example, at the Federal level, the 2023 Notice of Benefit and Payment Parameters takes significant steps toward requiring health insurers to collect race and ethnicity data; beginning with the 2025 benefit year, health insurers will be required to collect it. Amending § 89.12(e) will allow the Commonwealth's health insurers to comply with this upcoming Federal requirement and remove an inconsistency between Federal and State provisions.

The provision, as currently written in § 89.12(e), addresses the inequities that were the focus of the landmark Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. §§ 2000a—2000h-6), which prohibited “discrimination or segregation on the ground of race, color, religion or national origin.” Following that National precedent, on July 1, 1969, the Department issued § 89.12 for application forms, including: “Questions as to race or color are not permitted on the application.” See § 89.12(e).

In the 54 years since the 1969 issuance, society has continued to grapple with racial and ethnic equity issues. More recently, society has recognized that inequities can only be addressed if they are adequately identified. To identify those issues and measure improvement in addressing them, data is necessary. This final-form rulemaking will allow insurers to collect that data, if they choose, while continuing to prohibit insurers from using that data in an unfairly discriminatory manner. This is consistent with ongoing Federal initiatives outlined in the 2023 Notice of Benefit and Payment Parameters and will allow the Commonwealth's regulations to remain consistent with Federal law.

Comments and Responses

Notice of proposed rulemaking was published at 53 Pa.B. 2046 (April 15, 2023), with a 30-day comment

period. The Insurance Federation of Pennsylvania (IFP), Independence Blue Cross (IBC) and Oscar Health, Inc. (Oscar) submitted comments during the public comment period. These comments were taken into consideration.

The IFP expressed support for the proposed rulemaking without any additional comments.

IBC expressed support for the proposed rulemaking without additional comments.

Oscar expressed support for the proposed rulemaking without additional comments.

The Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) expressed no objections, comments or recommendations on the proposed rulemaking. In consideration of the support received, the Department made no changes to Annex A from the proposed rulemaking to this final-form rulemaking.

Affected Parties

This final-form rulemaking will affect foreign and domestic health and life insurers that hold a certificate of authority to write health and life insurance contracts in this Commonwealth.

Fiscal Impact

State government

This final-form rulemaking will have no fiscal impact upon the Department.

General public

This final-form rulemaking will have no fiscal impact upon the general public.

Political subdivisions

This final-form rulemaking will have no fiscal impact upon political subdivisions.

Private sector

This final-form rulemaking will have no fiscal impact upon the private sector, except for a possible minimal impact to the regulated entities who choose to collect the data.

Paperwork

This final-form rulemaking would impose minimal additional paperwork on the Department because it would review attestations and related information submitted by insurers choosing to collect the demographic data. The Department does not anticipate that this additional review will materially impact its regulatory activities.

Effective Date / Sunset Date

This final-form rulemaking will become effective immediately upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The Department continues to monitor the effectiveness of regulations on a triennial basis; therefore, no sunset date has been assigned.

Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)), on April 4, 2023, the Department submitted a copy of the proposed rulemaking, published at 53 Pa.B. 2046, and a copy of a Regulatory Analysis Form to IRRC and the chairperson of the Banking and Insurance Committee of the Senate and to the chairperson of the Insurance Committee of the House of Representatives for comment.

Under section 5(c) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(c)), IRRC and the Banking and Insurance Committee of the Senate and the Insurance Committee of the House of Representatives were provided copies of comments received as well as other documents when requested. In preparing the final-form rulemaking, the Department has considered all comments from IRRC and the public.

Under section 5.1(j.2) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5a(j.2)), on November 15, 2023, this final-form rulemaking was deemed approved by the Banking and Insurance Committee of the Senate and the Insurance Committee of the House of Representatives. Under section 5.1(e) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5a(e)), IRRC met on November 16, 2023, and approved the final-form rulemaking.

Findings

The Commissioner finds that:

(1) Public notice of the proposed rulemaking was given under sections 201 and 202 of the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L. 769, No. 240) (45 P.S. §§ 1201 and 1202), referred to as the Commonwealth Documents Law, and the regulations thereunder, 1 Pa. Code §§ 7.1 and 7.2 (relating to notice of proposed rulemaking required; and adoption of regulations).

(2) A public comment period was provided as required by law and all comments were considered.

(3) This final-form rulemaking does not enlarge the purpose of the proposed rulemaking published at 53 Pa.B. 2046.

(4) This final-form rulemaking adopted by this order is necessary and appropriate for the administration and enforcement of the authorizing statutes.

Order

The Commissioner, acting under the authorizing statutes, orders that:

(a) The regulations of the Department, 31 Pa. Code Chapter 89, are amended by amending § 89.12 to read as set forth in Annex A.

(b) The Department shall submit this final-form rulemaking to IRRC and the Banking and Insurance Committee of the Senate and the Insurance Committee of the House of Representatives, as required by law.

(c) The Department shall submit this final-form rulemaking to the Office of General Counsel and the Office of Attorney General for approval as to legality and form, as required by law.

(d) The Department shall certify this final-form rulemaking, as approved for legality and form, and deposit them with the Legislative Reference Bureau, as required by law.

(e) This final-form rulemaking shall take effect immediately upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

TITLE 31. INSURANCE

PART IV. LIFE INSURANCE

CHAPTER 89. APPROVAL OF LIFE, ACCIDENT AND HEALTH INSURANCE

Subchapter A. REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL POLICIES AND FORMS

PREPARATION OF FORMS

§ 89.12. Application forms.

(a) When submitting a policy form to which a copy of the application will be attached when the policy is issued, a copy of the application shall be attached to the policy form. If the form of the application has already been approved, the form number and date of approval shall be shown either on the form or in the transmittal letter.

(b) If it is the practice of the insurer to attach a reduced size reproduction of the application to a form when issued, the application should be attached to each copy of the form submitted. The application should be legibly reproduced in the size to be used in the contract.

(c) An application which includes a provision for home office endorsements or corrections may not be approved for use unless it is specifically stipulated therein that a change may not be made in the amount of insurance, the age at issue, the plan of insurance or benefits applied for by the endorsements or corrections. This subsection does not apply to group applications.

(d) Applications shall contain clear and direct questions by the insurer permitting answers by the applicant only in the form of direct statements of known facts. Applications may not contain questions or representations based on indefinite or ambiguous terms or which are inconsistent with policy provisions and may not require the making of warranties by the applicant.

(e) An insurer may include questions as to demographic factors, including race and ethnicity, on an application subject to all of the following:

(1) The application clearly states that the disclosure of the data is voluntary.

(2) Questions as to the data include the following answer options verbatim:

(i) Prefer Not to Answer.

(ii) Other.

(3) At the time of application or when the data is collected, the insurer provides to the insured a written statement that contains the following information:

(i) The data will be maintained as private.

(ii) The data may not be used by the insurer for eligibility determinations, underwriting or rating purposes.

(iii) The insurer may not deny an application based on the applicant's refusal to answer the questions related to demographic data on the application.

(4) At the time of application or when the data is collected, the insurer provides a written explanation to the insured regarding all of the following:

- (i) Why the data is being requested by the insurer.
- (ii) How the data will support efforts to provide equitable coverage.
- (5) The insurer provides a written attestation to the Department that the insurer's application, collection and use of data meets Federal and State law regarding unfair discrimination, including all of the following:

- (i) The insured's data is maintained as private.
- (ii) The insured's data may not be used by the insurer for eligibility determinations, underwriting or rating purposes.

(iii) The insurer may not deny an application based on the applicant's refusal to answer the questions related to demographic data on the application.

(6) The insurer shall provide the written attestation in paragraph (5) for each product by the following dates:

- (i) June 20, 2024, for products in existence as of the effective date of this regulation.
- (ii) The date the product is filed.
- (iii) The date that there is a material change to the application or data collection process, even if not required to be filed.

(f) Nothing in this section may be construed to require an insurer to collect demographic information, including race and ethnicity data, at the time of application or otherwise.

Proposed Policy Statement Order

By the Commission:

On May 18, 2023, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) entered an order, at Docket No. P-2022-3030743, approving ChargeEVC-PA's petition to initiate a proceeding that is intended to result in the issuance of a policy statement on electric utility rate design for electric vehicle (EV) charging in Pennsylvania. With this Order, the Commission continues its review of this subject by entering, for comment, a Proposed Policy Statement in Annex A to identify factors to be considered in determining just and reasonable distribution and default service rates that promote the implementation of proper EV rate design.

Background

On February 4, 2022, ChargeEVC-PA filed a Petition under 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 510, 1301, 1330, 1501 and 2807(f), and 52 Pa. Code § 5.41, requesting that the Commission initiate a proceeding that would result in the issuance of a Policy Statement on electric utility rate design for EV charging in Pennsylvania.

ChargeEVC-PA is a coalition formed to serve as a resource for research and information on, and as an advocate for, advanced EV adoption and market development in Pennsylvania. ChargeEVC-PA consists of the following members: Electrification Coalition, Greenlots, Keystone Energy Alliance, Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC), Plug In America, Sierra Club and Adams Electric Cooperative. ChargeEVC-PA Petition at 1.

The Commission received comments regarding ChargeEVC-PA's Petition from AEE;¹ Alliance for Transportation Electrification (ATE); CAUSE-PA;² ChargePoint, Electrify America, EVgo, and Tesla (collectively ChargePoint, et al.); Citizens' Electric Company of Lewisburg, PA, and Wellsboro Electric Company (collectively Citizens' Electric); Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and Pennsylvania Department of Trans-

portation (PennDOT); Duquesne Light Company (Duquesne Light); Electrification Coalition; Metropolitan Edison Company, Pennsylvania Electric Company, Pennsylvania Power Company, and West Penn Power Company (collectively FirstEnergy); NRDC and Sierra Club; NRG Energy, Inc., Interstate Gas Supply, Inc. d/b/a IGS Energy and Vistra Corp (collectively EGS Coalition); the Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA); PECO Energy Company (PECO); UGI Utilities, Inc.—Electric Division (UGI Electric); and PPL Electric Utilities Corporation (PPL Electric). The Commission also received reply comments from ChargeEVC-PA, ChargePoint, et al., and CAUSE-PA.

Based on the comments received, the Commission entered an Order on December 1, 2022, directing the Bureau of Technical Utility Services (TUS) to convene an EV-charging rate design working group (working group) of interested parties to discuss EV rate design and to file the recommendations of the working group no later than March 31, 2023. The Commission further ordered that TUS, in conjunction with the Law Bureau, prepare an order considering ChargeEVC-PA's request for a Policy Statement and the working group's recommendations relative to EV rate design by June 1, 2023.

The Commission received informal comments from 23 informal working group participants: ATE; Advanced Energy United; CAUSE-PA; ChargeEVC-PA; Electrify America; FirstEnergy; Duquesne Light; OCA; PECO; joint comments by Pennsylvania Petroleum Association, GetGo Cafe + Market/Giant Eagle, Inc., Glassmere Fuel Service, Onvo, Sheetz, Inc., Wawa, Inc.; Pennsylvania Energy Consumer Alliance, Met-Ed Industrial Users Group, Penelec Industrial Customer Alliance, Philadelphia Area Industrial Energy Users Group, and PP&L Industrial Customer Alliance, West Penn Power Industrial Intervenor (collectively, Large Customer Groups); PPL Electric; UGI Electric; Joint comments by ChargePoint, et al.; WeaveGrid; the Natural Resources Defense Council, PennDOT, and CALSTART.

The informal working group filed its recommendations on March 30, 2023. The working group recommended:

1. That the Commission proceed with drafting a proposed Policy Statement concerning EV-charging rate design.
2. That the proposed Policy Statement consider the topics contained in the informally filed comments.
3. That Commission staff utilize the informal working group, as necessary, when drafting the proposed Policy Statement for Commission review.

On May 18, 2023, the Commission entered an Order, at Docket No. P-2022-3030743, agreeing with the working group's recommendation and approving ChargeEVC-PA's petition to initiate a proceeding that will result in the issuance of a Policy Statement on electric utility rate design for EV charging in Pennsylvania. In the Order, we noted that as the economic regulator of 11 EDCs in the Commonwealth serving over five million accounts, this Commission is charged by the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act³ (IIJA) with considering EDC rate design and default service rate design for EVs. See 16 U.S.C.

§ 2621(d)(21) (regarding elective vehicle charging programs). To that end, and to ensure that this Commission maintains a nimble posture ahead of this electrification transition, it is imperative that the Commission develop a Policy Statement that advances effective management of energy and infrastructure costs.

Discussion

With this Order, we are proposing the following Policy Statement as set forth in Annex A to this Order. The Commission recognizes that the utility landscape is evolving rapidly, none more rapidly than the electric industry. Increasing penetration of distributed energy resources and EVs presents both a challenge and an opportunity for regulators and utilities. From a challenging perspective, absent appropriate policies, the increased adoption of these technologies will likely work to decrease utilities' distribution system network capacity utilization—or the ratio of average demand to peak demand. This places significant headwinds on distribution rates. Further, this adoption could potentially strain electric generation prices and wholesale generation resource adequacy if EV charging load is added to hours of already existing peak demand. However, EDCs have an opportunity to utilize the portfolio of new technologies such as, but not limited to, advanced metering, advanced grid monitoring, energy efficiency, demand response, and smart thermostats to better accommodate the evolving demand profiles created by this new energy landscape.

It should be noted that the working group, formed at Docket No. P-2022-3030743, offered 25 recommendations regarding content to be included in an EV rate design policy statement. Careful consideration of these recommendations formed the basis for much of this proposed policy statement.

A. EV-charging Rate Tariffs

Many working group commenters supported the Commission either encouraging or requiring EDCs to file EV-charging rates in their tariffs. Some noted that since each EDC service territory has its own unique demographics and load characteristics, there needs to be flexibility when designing rates to accommodate those unique demographics and characteristics.

Specifically, DLC, First Energy, PPL, PECO, and CALSTART suggested that to allow for flexibility, an EV-charging rate design policy statement should refrain from setting artificial time-based deadlines or minimum filing requirements that are more prescriptive than those required for any other utility rate design proposal. They also proposed that an EV rate design policy statement provide a framework and general guidance to aid EDCs in developing EV-charging rate designs and tariffs. Informal Working Group Recommendation # 2.

PECO further stated that if Pennsylvania utilities are permitted to own and/or operate charging stations at some point in the future, EV-charging rate designs would necessarily have to include charging station ownership and maintenance as part of underlying costs. At present, based on existing state law, the Commission may not have the legal authority to approve any rate design tied to utility ownership of charging stations. The Commission should provide direction on this and other EV rate design options currently facing legal or regulatory barriers in Pennsylvania that prevent the Commission from authorizing them. Informal Working Group Recommendation # 24.

B. EV-charging Rate Design

The utility landscape is evolving rapidly, none more rapidly than the electric industry. Increased penetration of distributed energy resources and EVs presents both a challenge and an opportunity for regulators and utilities. From a challenge perspective, the increased adoption of these technologies will likely work to decrease utilities' capacity utilization—or the ratio of peak demand to average demand. This places significant headwinds on distribution rates and default service rates. However, the electricity industry has an opportunity to utilize the portfolio of new technologies such as advanced metering, advanced grid monitoring, energy efficiency, demand response, and smart thermostats to better accommodate the evolving demand profiles created by this new energy landscape.

OCA, ChargEVC-PA, CAUSE-PA, United, WeaveGrid, and PennDOT recommended that if time-of-use (TOU) rates are implemented in EV rate design, there needs to be reasonable on-peak, off-peak, and super off-peak periods. There should also be differentiated pricing between on-peak, off-peak, and super off-peak rates. They asserted that without reasonable time periods and price signals that encourage consumers to charge during off-peak and super off-peak periods, ratepayers are not likely to adjust their usage effectively and any benefit of TOU rates would be significantly limited. These time periods and rates would likely vary depending on the specific EDC. It should also be considered that even EV owners who sign up for a TOU rate might, at times, have no choice but to charge during peak periods. Some consideration should also be given to a "free pass" where brief periods of charging (20–30 minutes), even on-peak, could be treated as off-peak, or at least not be overly punitive.

Further comments suggested that any EV rate design policy statement should be specific to EV adopters and should clearly state that any utilization of residential TOU rates must be offered on a voluntary, opt-in basis for EV charging to protect vulnerable residential consumers who lack sufficient discretionary usage to shift usage to off-peak times. Informal Working Group Recommendation # 10.

PECO and DLC, are currently running pilot programs for EV charging, that are offered on a voluntary, opt-in basis. Both programs feature TOU rates, and offer three time periods: peak, off-peak, and super off-peak. The TOU rates vary, with higher rates for peak, lower rates for off-peak, and the lowest rates for super off-peak time periods. The rates apply year-round to the entire premises load.

OCA, CAUSE-PA, WeaveGrid, and PennDOT recommended that EDCs, stakeholders, and the Commission should consider if whole-house or separate meter TOU rates are appropriate. They commented that the EDC pilot programs should explore whole-house rates and EV-specific charging rates, with and without separate metering.

In addition, the Working Group suggested that the Commission explore the sub-metering options identified in several other EV rate programs. If a sub-metering option is created at some point, they propose that any costs involved in obtaining and connecting the separate metering equipment be at the sole expense of the EV owner. They note that any utilization of sub-metering for residential home EV charging must be narrowly tailored to EV applications and closely monitored to prevent consumer abuses. Further, they suggest that any EV rate

design policy statement include, at minimum, clear guidance regarding applying Chapter 14 of the Public Utility Code (relating to responsible utility customer protections) and the Commission's regulations at Chapter 56 (relating to billing standards for residential utility service) to sub-metered accounts, and a statement indicating that sub-metering proposals for EV charging must be limited to that purpose. Informal Working Group Recommendation # 11.

ChargEVC, Pennsylvania Petroleum Association, Electrify America, ChargePoint, EVgo, Tesla, Advanced Energy United, and ATE, recognize that traditional demand charges presently pose significant barriers to the deployment of direct current fast charging (DCFC) stations in Pennsylvania. They suggest that the Commission address the need for demand charge alternatives in a policy statement to facilitate the development of DCFC charging stations within the state. Therefore, they recommend that a policy statement on EV rate design recommend that the utilities file proposed tariffs that provide alternatives to demand charges for DCFC stations, with one stakeholder, ATE, asserting that a demand charge alternative should be provided on a temporary basis. Informal Working Group Recommendation # 19.

C. EV-charging Rate Equity

OCA, ChargEVC-PA, DLC, FirstEnergy, UGI, PECO, Large Customer Groups, United, WeaveGrid, and CAUSE-PA, commented that as each EDC service territory has its own unique demographics and load characteristics, a one-size-fits-all approach to EV rate design is unreasonable and inappropriate. They note that EV rate design should be utility-specific and designed specifically to address each utility's load and cost characteristics in every base rate case proceeding. Therefore, they assert that individual EDCs should have the freedom to design and implement rates based on the various factors unique to their respective operating areas. Further, they propose that EDCs wishing to implement EV-specific rates should propose specific tariff language to provide rate design options for EV charging for its residential, commercial, and industrial customers, including the host sites (utility customers) who either operate or lease public charging stations.

These stakeholders also believe that EV rates should be designed in a manner to avoid unreasonable cross-subsidization between customers. Some commenters expressed that ratepayers who do not own EVs should not be required to subsidize EV-charging rates. For example, a low-income ratepayer who does not own an EV should not have to pay the costs associated with a more affluent ratepayer's EV. They likewise assert that EV rates should follow established ratemaking principles to avoid cross-subsidization between rate classes (i.e., residential, commercial, industrial). Therefore, they recommend that EV rates be EDC specific, allow for regional flexibility and avoid cross-subsidization. Informal Working Group Recommendation # 1.

FirstEnergy, UGI, and Large Customer Groups commented that education is a critical component of EV-charging rate design and, more importantly, greater EV adoption. They accordingly support a public education program that targets the public, particularly those currently not participating in EV adoption, by presenting educational materials on various topics, e.g., rate designs related to EV charging and EV-charging ownership costs. As such, they propose that EDCs have the flexibility to develop education programs and be permitted cost recovery for these programs.

These stakeholders noted that the most reasonable source for funding EV education and outreach would be entities either seeking to expand EV use in Pennsylvania or entities that would benefit from increased EV use in Pennsylvania, such as EV manufacturers and retailers, and EDCs. If, however, the Commission finds that customers themselves should bear the costs of their education and outreach, then, given that each customer rate class is unique with its own usage characteristics, the costs should be proportionately distributed across each rate class. As a result, some customer classes may require additional education on EV-charging rates (e.g., understanding off-peak and on-peak rates) while other customer classes may be more familiar with those concepts. To ensure that no cross-customer class subsidization occurs for allocating and collecting the costs for the specific education and outreach required for each customer class, individual rate classes (e.g., residential, commercial, and industrial) should have separate budgets (with any education and outreach efforts tailored to the needs of each such class) to be collected only from the customers within that class. Informal Working Group Recommendation # 12.

OCA, ChargEVC-PA, United, and CAUSE-PA recommended that ratepayers who own EVs should receive the proper educational material related to their EV rates. They commented that ratepayers should be fully informed regarding any EV-charging rates and suggest that utilities should be responsible for distributing information to ratepayers about EV-charging rates. They encourage EDCs, stakeholders, and the Commission to evaluate any available resources to determine what has been most effective in other states, in terms of getting information to ratepayers, and in terms of making it as understandable as possible. Customer education and outreach strategies should also highlight different use cases, clarify eligibility requirements, allow for individualized rate comparison, and promote enrollment to take advantage of EV-specific rates. Informal Working Group Recommendation # 13.

ChargEVC-PA and CAUSE-PA recommended that a policy statement include a description of consumer protection and equity considerations for low-to-moderate-income customers. They commented that any EV rate design policy statement include an explicit declaration that EV-charging rate proposals must be equitable and, as such, must not include intra-class or inter-class rate subsidies that could increase electricity costs for low-income Pennsylvanians. Informal Working Group Recommendation # 17.

Disposition

A. § 69.3551. Purpose and Scope

We concur with the comments that the Commission should adopt a policy statement that addresses EV-charging rate structures. The Commission proposes that the purpose and scope of this policy statement to encourage EDCs to develop EV-charging distribution rates with cost-of-service principles that incentivize increased network capacity utilization of the distribution system. Further, the proposed Policy Statement encourages default service providers (DSP), as defined in 66 Pa.C.S. § 2803 (relating to definitions), presently a role occupied by EDCs, to develop EV-charging generation rates. The proposed scope also addresses fairness and equity principles that EDCs should consider in developing their distribution and default service generation EV-charging rates.

B. § 69.3552. *Electric Vehicle Charging Rate Tariffs*

We concur with the comments of the informal working group that encourage all EDCs to develop tariffs containing distribution and default service generation rates with the specific purpose of addressing EV-charging customers. We propose that these distribution and default service generation EV-charging tariffed rates should reflect the actual costs of providing charging infrastructure and services, including but not limited to the cost of electricity, maintenance, and any administrative expenses in a manner that avoids unreasonable cross-subsidization between customers. Accordingly, we propose a section that reflects these principles that EDCs should follow.

C. § 69.3553. *Electric Vehicle Charging Rate Design*

We concur with the comments of the informal working group that emphasize promoting the efficient use of EV-charging infrastructure to manage electric grid demand. We propose a section in the policy statement that encourages utilities to consider variable rates for EV-charging customers based on the time of day and the level of demand on the electric grid. This proposal advises that EDCs should charge higher rates for EV charging during peak demand hours and lower rates during off-peak hours. As such, we propose that EDCs develop EV-charging distribution rates with cost-of-service principles that incentivize increased network capacity utilization of the distribution system. Further, EDCs, as DSPs, should develop EV-charging default service generation rates that, at a minimum, properly reflect the cost of generation services during times of system stress. This may include, but is not limited to, use of on-peak and off-peak periods which appropriately incentivize the movement of charging consumption to off-peak periods or periods of less system stress. The Commission acknowledges that there is no single turnkey design for EV-charging distribution or default service generation rates that achieve these principles. EDCs are situated differently, with varying demographics, grid characteristics, and demand profiles. Accordingly, EDCs may consider tools such as time-of-use, real-time pricing, demand charges, rebates, automatic control devices, and others to properly effectuate the public interest in line with the Commission's proposed policy statement.

D. § 69.3554. *Electric Vehicle Charging Rate Equity*

We concur with the comments from the informal working group concerning EV rates promoting fairness and equity. As such, we propose a section in the policy statement that recommends that EDCs develop distribution and default service generation EV-charging rates that avoid unreasonable cross-subsidization between customers. Accordingly, the proposed Policy Statement addresses fairness and equity principles that EDCs should consider in developing EV-charging rates for distribution and default service generation rates. Such principles include, but are not limited to, impacts on low-income customers or disadvantaged communities. Finally, the Commission recognizes the importance of educating EDC and default service customers on the efficient and effective use of EV-charging infrastructure and available rates. As such, the Policy Statement proposes to encourage EDCs to prioritize customer education of efficient and effective use of EV charging and available distribution and default service generation rates.

Conclusion

The Commission is proposing this Policy Statement in accordance with its authority under Sections 501, 504, 505, 506, and 2806.1 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S.

§§ 501, 504, 505, 506, 1353, and 2806.1. Based on the foregoing discussion, we will propose this Policy Statement regarding EV Rate Design as set forth in Annex A.

Again, these guidelines are not meant to be the only issues the Commission will consider in any applicable proceeding, or that they are to be considered above all other principles, but to identify these policy issues as important to the Commission. These guidelines are intended to encourage consideration of these issues to facilitate development of the most appropriate rates for the changing utility environment.

With this Order, the Commission is proposing guidance for EDCs and interested stakeholders on what is to be considered regarding electric utility rate design for EV charging. The Commission welcomes comments on all aspects of this proposed Policy Statement; *Therefore,*

It Is Ordered That:

1. The proposed Electric Vehicle Rate Design Policy Statement set forth in Annex A be issued for comment.

2. The Law Bureau shall submit this Order and Annex A to the Governor's Budget Office for review of fiscal impact.

3. Upon receipt of a fiscal note from the Governor's Budget Office, the Secretary shall certify this Order and Annex A and that the Law Bureau shall deposit them with the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

4. Interested parties shall have 30 days from the date of publication of this Order and Annex A setting forth the proposed policy statement in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* to file comments with the Secretary.

5. Interested parties shall have 60 days from the date of publication of this Order and Annex A setting forth the proposed policy statement in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* to file reply comments with the Secretary.

CHAPTER 69. GENERAL ORDERS, POLICY STATEMENTS AND GUIDELINES ON FIXED UTILITIES

(Editor's Note: Sections 69.3551—69.3554 are proposed to be added and are printed in regular type to enhance readability.)

ELECTRIC UTILITY RATE DESIGN FOR ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING

§ 69.3551. Purpose and scope.

Due to Federal and State policy initiatives to promote the proliferation of electric vehicles, as defined in 75 Pa.C.S. § 102 (relating to definitions), the Commission is encouraging development of rate structures for electric-vehicle charging customers. Electric-vehicle charging will increase demand on existing infrastructure, and it is imperative that electric distribution companies are prepared to address this increased demand with distribution and default service generation rate structures that properly signal to electric-vehicle charging customers to incentivize increased capacity utilization of the distribution system. The Commission's policy on electric-vehicle charging also encompasses fairness and equity principles that electric distribution companies are to consider in developing electric-vehicle charging rates.

§ 69.3552. Electric vehicle charging rate tariffs.

The Commission encourages electric distribution companies to develop tariffs with distribution and default service generation rates for the purpose of implementing rates specifically for electric-vehicle charging customers. These distribution and default service generation electric-vehicle charging tariffed rates should reflect the actual costs of providing charging infrastructure and services, including the cost of electricity, maintenance and administrative expenses, in a manner that avoids unreasonable cross-subsidization between customers.

§ 69.3553. Electric vehicle charging rate design.

(a) To promote efficient use of electric-vehicle charging infrastructure and to manage electric grid demand, public utilities should consider variable rates for electric-vehicle

customers based on the time of day and the level of demand on the electric grid. This means that electric-vehicle charging rates should be higher during peak demand hours and lower during off-peak hours. The Commission recommends that electric distribution companies develop electric-vehicle distribution rates with cost-of-service principles that incentivize increased network capacity utilization of the distribution system. Electric distribution companies should also take into consideration rates for direct current fast chargers, including demand charges, to manage electric grid stress during peak hours. The Commission also recommends that electric distribution companies develop electric-vehicle charging default service generation rates that, at a minimum, properly reflect the cost of generation services during times of system stress. These default service generation rates may include use of time-of-use rates that use on- and off-peak periods which appropriately incentivize the movement of charging consumption to off-peak periods or periods of less system stress.

(b) The Commission recommends that electric-vehicle charging distribution and default service generation rates should be flexible and adaptable to changing circumstances and technologies. As such, electric-vehicle charging distribution and default service generation rates should be periodically reviewed and adjusted, as necessary, to ensure that they remain fair, cost-effective and efficient.

§ 69.3554. Electric vehicle charging rate equity.

The Commission recommends that electric-vehicle charging distribution and default service generation rates be designed to promote fairness and equity. As such, the distribution and default service generation electric-vehicle charging rates should not discriminate against certain types of electric vehicles or drivers and should not create undue financial burdens for low-income customers or disadvantaged communities. The Commission recommends that electric distribution companies consider impacts on low-income customers due to the design of their distribution and default service generation electric-vehicle charging rates. Electric distribution companies may need to consider customer-specific and electric distribution company region-specific rates to best serve the needs of their communities. It is important that electric distribution companies prioritize customer education to encourage efficient and effective use of electric-vehicle charging infrastructure and proper knowledge of available distribution and default service generation rates.

This condition constitutes a case-by-case RACT 3 determination for the sources in this group:

A.) The permittee shall retrofit each rotary kiln (Sources 405 and 415) with enhanced air mixing technology for NO_x reduction and shall thereafter operate and maintain the kilns as thus modified.

B.) The sources in this group shall comply with their previously SIP-ed RACT 2 case-by-case requirements, which are as follows:

I. Rotary Kilns (Sources 405 and 415)

3. Fuel feed controls on each kiln shall be verified for proper calibration at least annually, with adjustments made as necessary.

4. Coal mill level controls on each kiln shall be verified for proper calibration at least annually, with adjustments made as necessary.

5. Thermocouples associated with the combustion control system on each rotary kiln shall be inspected and verified for proper calibration at least annually, with adjustments made or corrective actions taken as necessary.

6. The flame pattern on each kiln shall be visually inspected at least each week, with corrective actions taken as necessary.

7. The burner pipe on each kiln shall be inspected at least annually, with corrective actions taken as necessary.

c. The permitted shall keep records of the following for the Rotary Kilns:

1. Weekly oxygen and carbon monoxide analyzer inspections, plus records of any maintenance done in response to problems noted during the inspections

2. 6-month rotary kiln feed control calibration verifications, plus records of any adjustments made as a result of the verifications

3. Annual rotary kiln fuel feed control calibration verifications, plus records of any adjustments made as a result of the verifications

4. Annual rotary kiln coal mill level control calibration verifications, plus records of any adjustments made as a result of the verifications

5. Annual rotary kiln thermocouple inspections and calibration verifications are maintained, plus adjustments or maintenance performed as a result of the inspections or verifications

6. Weekly rotary kiln flame pattern inspections, plus records of any corrective actions taken as a result of each inspection.

7. Annual rotary kiln burner pipe inspections, plus records of any corrective actions taken as a result of each inspection.

d. NO_x emissions from each of Sources 405 and 415 shall be verified one time in each 5-year calendar period. This testing shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 139 of the Department's rules and regulations.

This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create a right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decisional law. Disproportionate Share Payments and Supplemental Payments to Qualifying Hospitals

The Department of Human Services (Department) is announcing its intent to allocate funds in Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-2024 for several classes of inpatient disproportionate share hospital (DSH) payments and supplemental payments to Medical Assistance (MA) enrolled, qualifying inpatient acute care general hospitals. The Department does not intend to otherwise change the qualifying criteria or payment methodology for these payments. The qualifying criteria and payment methodology for each payment are described in Pennsylvania's Medicaid State Plan.

Payment limitations are applicable, including those limitations that the Commonwealth may not exceed its aggregate annual DSH allotment and that no hospital may receive DSH payments in excess of its hospital-specific limit.

The allocation of the funds for DSH payments described as follows is contingent on the availability of Federal financial participation for these payments.

Allocation of Funds

The Department intends to allocate \$61.277 million in total funds for DSH payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals that provide enhanced access to multiple types of medical care in economically distressed areas of this Commonwealth, upon approval by Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

The Department intends to allocate \$1.308 million in total funds for DSH payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals to promote access to acute care services for MA eligible persons in less urban areas of this Commonwealth, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$18.867 million in total funds for DSH payments to MA enrolled acute general hospitals that qualify as a trauma center for the purpose of improving access to readily available and coordinated trauma care, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$59.296 million in total funds for DSH payments to qualifying acute care hospitals to promote access to comprehensive inpatient services for MA eligible persons by assuring an adequate supply of health care professionals who have been trained in high volume MA enrolled hospital settings, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$9.671 million in total funds for DSH payments to qualifying acute care general hospital burn centers, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$14.562 million in total funds for DSH payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals providing obstetrical and neonatal services, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$0.500 million in total funds for DSH payments to qualifying teaching hospitals that provide psychiatric services to MA beneficiaries to help offset medical education costs of psychiatrists that are incurred by hospitals providing assistance to MA beneficiaries and uninsured persons, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$38.518 million in total funds for DSH payments to critical access and qualifying rural hospitals, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$0.719 million in total funds for DSH payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals that, in partnership with an independent facility listed as a Cleft and Craniofacial Team by the American Cleft Palate-Craniofacial Association, provide surgical services to patients with cleft palate and craniofacial abnormalities, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$30.466 million in total funds for DSH payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals that serve the indigent population of cities with a per capita income significantly below the Statewide average for this Commonwealth.

The Department intends to allocate \$0.760 million in total funds funding for DSH payments made to qualifying MA enrolled acute care general hospitals that provide a high volume of inpatient services to MA eligible and low-income populations, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$4.468 million in total funds for DSH payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals that qualify as academic medical centers, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$24.697 million in total funds for DSH payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals to provide additional support for the

operation of academic medical programs through the medical education of health care professionals needed to treat the MA population, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$7.629 million in total funds for DSH payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals that participate in an academic medical program, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$9.808 million in total funds for DSH payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals that provide a high volume of services to the MA population to promote continued access to inpatient and ancillary outpatient services in this Commonwealth and to support academic medical programs for integrated patient-centered medical services, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$6.103 million in total funds for DSH payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals to promote the availability of professional medical services to MA populations in less urbanized areas of this Commonwealth by supporting medical education and academic medical programs, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$8.537 million in total funds for supplemental payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals that provide medical and surgical ocular services to MA beneficiaries to ensure continued access to these critical eye related services, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$94.682 million in total funds for supplemental payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals that treat a high volume of opioid use disorder patients in their emergency rooms, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$61.193 million in total funds for supplemental payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals that treat a high percentage of MA patients under 18 years of age, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$4.927 million in total funds for supplemental payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals located in a county with an estimated general population count of less than 1 million that serve a high percent of MA patients, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$5.449 million in total funds for supplemental payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals that provide a high volume of services to MA eligible and low-income populations in nonrural medically underserved areas, upon approval by CMS.

The Department intends to allocate \$0.900 million in total funds for supplemental payments to qualifying acute care general hospitals that provide a substantial portion of their inpatient services to MA beneficiaries, upon approval by CMS.

Fiscal Impact

The FY 2023-2024 impact, as a result of the funding allocation for these payments, is \$464.337 million in total funds (State and Federal), upon approval by CMS.

Consumer Price Index Adjustment of Base Amounts on Bids Effective January 1, 2024

Each year the Department of Labor and Industry (Department) is required by the following statutes to publish changes to the base amounts triggering the requirement for public bids, telephonic bids or separate bids, or both, for certain contracts. The Department is required to announce the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U): All Items (CPI-U) for the United States City Average for the 12-month period ending September 30 of each year. The Department utilizes the most current nonseasonally adjusted series, as published by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), which at present uses 1982—1984 as the index base period (set equal to 100). The percentage change for the 12-month period ending September 30, 2023, is 3.7%.

The change to the base rate is determined as follows:

1) Calculate the percentage change in CPI-U (I) from September 2022 to September 2023. This is derived as $I = (CPI_{23} - CPI_{22})/CPI_{22}$, where the subscripts refer to September 2023 and 2022 values of CPI-U. As reported by the BLS these values are $(307.789 - 296.808)/296.808 = +10.981/296.808 = +3.6997\%$, which when rounded to 1 decimal place = 3.7%. (This was also reported as 3.7% in Table A of the BLS News release on the Consumer Price Index Summary for September 2023.)

2) The legislation puts a floor of 0 and a cap of 3% on the percentage change to be utilized in the calculations (technically these restrictions are on the Preliminary Adjusted Base (PAB), defined in step 4, however this is mathematically equivalent). The truncated value of the percentage change to be used in the adjustment formula is denoted as PC, resulting in:

- a) $PC = I$, for $0 \leq I \leq 3\%$,
- b) $PC = 0$, for $I < 0$ and
- c) $PC = 3\%$, for $I > 3\%$.

3) The base value (either original for new legislation or the prior year's PAB) is designated as B and the product of B and PC (determined previously) is P. (There are different values of the base depending on the entity and the type of bid, so technically B could be designated with 2 subscripts. For illustration purposes, the subscripts are omitted.) Then $P = B \cdot PC$. A common value for the base amount in 2023 for a public bid is \$22,547.55. (The other two prior PABs, which are this year's bases for a variety of bid types, were \$12,187.86 and \$30,469.66.) For example, using $B = \$22,547.55$, results in $P = \$22,547.55 * 3.0\% = \676.43 . (Since $I = 3.7\%$, $PC = 3\%$ as stated previously in 2c).

4) Then the Preliminary Adjusted Base, $PAB = P + B$, which reduces to $\$676.43 + \$22,547.55 = \$23,223.98$.

5) The Final Adjusted Base Amount, FAA, (which is used as the limit for the next year that is 2024) is the PAB rounded to the nearest 100. Therefore, the $FAA = \$23,200.00$.

Interest Rate Notice

Under sections 806 and 806.1 of The Fiscal Code (72 P.S. §§ 806 and 806.1), the Secretary of Revenue announces that, for the calendar year beginning January 1, 2024, all underpayments of tax which became due and payable to the Commonwealth shall bear interest at the rate of 8% per annum. All overpayments of the tax paid during this calendar year under Article III of the Tax Reform Code of 1971 (72 P.S. §§ 7301—7361) shall bear interest at the rate of 8% per annum. All other overpayments of tax paid during this calendar year shall bear interest at the rate of 6% per annum. These rates will remain constant until

December 31, 2024. These rates will be codified under 61 Pa. Code § 4.2(a) (relating to rate of interest).

These rates have been established based upon the rate established by the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States under section 6621(a)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code (26 U.S.C.A. § 6621(a)(2)) to be effective January 1, 2024.

Although the Tax Reform Act of 1986 amended section 6621 of the Internal Revenue Code by requiring that the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States establish quarterly rates of interest to become effective for Federal purposes on the first month of each calendar quarter, these amendments do not affect Commonwealth law. The Fiscal Code, as previously cited, requires that the interest

rate be established effective January 1 of each calendar year without regard to any change in the Federal interest rate during the calendar year.

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the game is Pennsylvania \$1 Million Moneybag Crossword (“\$1 Million Moneybag Crossword”). The game number is PA-1669.

2. *Price:* The price of a \$1 Million Moneybag Crossword instant lottery game ticket is \$20.

3. *Play symbols:* Each \$1 Million Moneybag Crossword instant lottery game ticket will feature a “YOUR LETTERS” area, three crossword puzzle play grids, known as “GRID 1,” “GRID 2” and “GRID 3,” respectively, a “20X MULTIPLIER” area and a “FAST CASH BONUS” area. Each crossword “GRID” is played separately. The “FAST CASH BONUS” area is played separately and cannot be multiplied. The play symbols located in the “YOUR LETTERS” area are: the letters A through and including Z. The play symbols located in “GRID 1,” “GRID 2” and “GRID 3” are: the letters A through and including Z. The play symbols and their captions located in the “20X MULTIPLIER” area are: Stack of Cash (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Vault (NOMULT) symbol, Key (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Lock (NOMULT) symbol, Diamond (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Necklace (NOMULT) symbol, Gem (TRYAGAIN) symbol and a Moneybag (20TIMES) symbol. The play symbols, prize amounts and their captions located in the “FAST CASH BONUS” area are: Chest (NOBONUS) symbol, Money Clip (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Bank (NOBONUS) symbol, Stack of Coins (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Gold Bar (NOBONUS) symbol, Dollar Bill (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Purse (NOBONUS) symbol, Wallet (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Jewelry Box (NOBONUS) symbol, Piggy Bank (TRYAGAIN) symbol, \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY), \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY), \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$400 (FOR HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN) and \$1,000 (ONE THO).

4. *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$20, \$30, \$40, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$400, \$500, \$1,000, \$5,000, \$10,000, \$100,000 and \$1,000,000. The prizes that can be won in the “FAST CASH BONUS” area are: \$20, \$30, \$40, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$400, \$500 and \$1,000. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 7 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate odds). A player can win up to four times on a ticket.

5. *Approximate number of tickets printed for the game:* Approximately 9,600,000 tickets will be printed for the \$1 Million Moneybag Crossword instant lottery game.

6. *Determination of prize winners:*

(a) Holders of tickets upon which the player completely matches ten entire words in “GRID 3,” using only the letters found in the “YOUR LETTERS” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000,000. The prize shall be paid as a one-time, lump-sum cash payment.

(b) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches nine entire words in “GRID 3,” using only the letters found in the “YOUR LETTERS” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000.

(c) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches ten entire words in “GRID 1,” using only the letters found in the “YOUR LETTERS” area, and upon which a Moneybag (20TIMES) symbol appears in the “20X MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100,000.

(d) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches ten entire words in “GRID 2,” using only the letters found in the “YOUR LETTERS” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10,000.

(h) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches ten entire words in “GRID 1,” using only the letters found in the “YOUR LETTERS” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(i) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches nine entire words in “GRID 2,” using only the letters found in the “YOUR LETTERS” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(j) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches six entire words in “GRID 1,” five entire words in “GRID 2” and four entire words in “GRID 3,” using only the letters found in the “YOUR LETTERS” area, and upon which a Moneybag (20TIMES) symbol appears in the “20X MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5,000.

(k) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches nine entire words in “GRID 1,” using only the letters found in the “YOUR LETTERS” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(l) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches eight entire words in “GRID 2,” using only the letters found in the “YOUR LETTERS” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(m) Holders of tickets where the player completely matches seven entire words in “GRID 3,” using only the letters found in the “YOUR LETTERS” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which a prize amount of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "FAST CASH BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

4. *Prize Symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions, located in the “PRIZE” box, are: FREE (TICKET), \$1^{.00} (ONE DOL), \$2^{.00} (TWO DOL), \$4^{.00} (FOR DOL), \$5^{.00} (FIV DOL), \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL), \$14^{.00} (FORTN), \$20^{.00} (TWENTY), \$40^{.00} (FORTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$400 (FOR HUN) and \$1,400 (FORTNHUN).

5. *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: Free \$1 Ticket, \$1, \$2, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$14, \$20, \$40, \$100, \$400 and \$1,400. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 9 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate odds). A player can win up to two times on a ticket.

appears in the “PRIZE” box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which three matching Lightning Bolt (BOLT) symbols appear in a row, column or diagonal and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the “PRIZE” box, and upon which an Arrow (4TIMES) symbol appears in the “BONUS” box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which three matching Lightning Bolt (BOLT) symbols appear in a row, column or diagonal and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the “PRIZE” box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which three matching Lightning Bolt (BOLT) symbols appear in a row, column or diagonal and a prize symbol of \$40^{.00} (FORTY) appears in the “PRIZE” box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which three matching Lightning Bolt (BOLT) symbols appear in a row, column or diagonal and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears in the “PRIZE” box, and upon which an Arrow (4TIMES) symbol appears in the “BONUS” box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which three matching Lightning Bolt (BOLT) symbols appear in a row, column or diagonal and a prize symbol of \$20^{.00} (TWENTY) appears in the “PRIZE” box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which three matching Lightning Bolt (BOLT) symbols appear in a row, column or diagonal, and a prize symbol of \$5^{.00} (FIV DOL) appears in the “PRIZE” box, and upon which an Arrow (4TIMES) symbol appears in the “BONUS” box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which three matching Lightning Bolt (BOLT) symbols appear in a row, column or diagonal and a prize symbol of \$14^{.00} (FORTN) appears in the “PRIZE” box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$14.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which three matching Lightning Bolt (BOLT) symbols appear in a row, column or diagonal and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears in the “PRIZE” box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which three matching Lightning Bolt (BOLT) symbols appear in a row, column or diagonal, and a prize symbol of \$5^{.00} (FIV DOL) appears in the “PRIZE” box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which three matching Lightning Bolt (BOLT) symbols appear in a row, column or diagonal and a prize symbol of \$4^{.00} (FOR DOL) appears in the “PRIZE” box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which three matching Lightning Bolt (BOLT) symbols appear in a row, column or diagonal and a prize symbol of \$1^{.00} (ONE DOL) appears in the “PRIZE” box, and upon which an Arrow (4TIMES) symbol appears in the “BONUS” box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which three matching Lightning Bolt (BOLT) symbols appear in a row, column

or diagonal and a prize symbol of \$2.⁰⁰ (TWO DOL) appears in the "PRIZE" box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which three matching Lightning Bolt (BOLT) symbols appear in a row, column or diagonal and a prize symbol of FREE (TICKET) appears in the "PRIZE" box, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to

a prize of one Love Struck instant game ticket or one Pennsylvania Lottery instant game ticket of equivalent sale price which is currently on sale.

9. *Number and description of prizes and approximate odds:* The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate odds of winning:

10. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery's Perfect Match Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying instant lottery game tickets ("Drawing"):

(a) *Qualifying Tickets:* Non-winning PA-1670 You Make My Heart Skip a Beat (\$5), PA-1672 My Cherry on Top (\$2) and PA-1673 Love Struck (\$1) lottery game tickets are eligible for entry into the Drawing.

(b) *Participation and entry:*

(1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit <https://www.PAiLottery.com>. Creating a lottery account is free.

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at <https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/>, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player's date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player's address;

(v) The player's telephone number;

(vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <https://www.palottery.com>, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted, and entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(6) Each entry must be complete and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be accepted.

- (7) Only one claimant per entry is allowed.
- (8) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.
- (9) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.

(10) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

(c) *Drawing description:*

(1) The Lottery will conduct one Perfect Match Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying instant lottery game tickets. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time.

(2) All entries received after 11:59:59 p.m. December 25, 2023, through 11:59:59 p.m. February 15, 2024, will be entered into the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between February 20, 2024 and March 4, 2024.

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1670 You Make My Heart Skip a Beat (\$5) = five entries, PA-1672 My Cherry on Top (\$2) = two entries and PA-1673 Love Struck (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:*

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 10(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).

(i) The first through the fourteenth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$10,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The fifteenth through the sixty-fourth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(3) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.

(4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(5) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(6) The odds of winning in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.

(7) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.

(e) *Drawing restrictions:*

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure. Entries not received for any other reason will not be considered entries.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), MUSL, Scientific Games International, Inc., MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent en-

tries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

11. *Retailer incentive awards:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Love Struck instant lottery game tickets.

12. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. *Unclaimed prize money:* For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Love Struck, prize money from winning Love Struck instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Love Struck instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. *Governing law:* In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be

disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Love Struck or through normal communications methods.

(1) The Lottery will conduct one ADVANCE TO GO™ Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying Instant and Fast Play lottery game tickets. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time.

(2) The entry period for Qualifying PA-1668 MONOPOLY™ Own It All Instant lottery game tickets will begin after 11:59:59 p.m. December 25, 2023 and will end at 11:59:59 p.m. February 29, 2024. The entry period for Qualifying PA-5222 MONOPOLY™ Free Parking Progressive Fast Play lottery game tickets will begin after 4:59:59 a.m. January 2, 2024 and will end at 11:59:59 p.m. February 29, 2024. All entries received during the entry periods will be entered into the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between March 4, 2024 and March 15, 2024.

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1668 MONOPOLY™ Own It All (\$50) = 50 entries and PA-5222 MONOPOLY™ Free Parking Progressive (\$10) = ten entries.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:*

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 10(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 10(c)(2).

(i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$200,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The second through the fifty-first entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(3) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.

(4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. Winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(5) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(6) The odds of winning in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.

(7) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.

(e) *Drawing restrictions:*

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure. Entries not received for any other reason will not be considered entries.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), Hasbro, LLC., Scientific Games LLC and MDI Entertainment, LLC, (collectively "SG") and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within one (1) year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within one (1) year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery terms and conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 10(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's account.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

11. *Retailer incentive awards:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell MONOPOLY™ Own It All instant lottery game tickets.

12. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania instant lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

13. *Unclaimed prize money:* For a period of 1 year from the announced close of MONOPOLY™ Own It All, prize money from winning MONOPOLY™ Own It All instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the MONOPOLY™ Own It All instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

14. *Governing law:* In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

15. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote

MONOPOLY™ Own It All or through normal communications methods.

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the game is Pennsylvania My Cherry on Top ("My Cherry on Top"). The game number is PA-1672.

2. *Price:* The price of a My Cherry on Top instant lottery game ticket is \$2.

3. *Play symbols:* Each My Cherry on Top instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area featuring a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a "CUPID'S SCOOP" area. The "CUPID'S SCOOP" area is played separately. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTW), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR) and 25 (TWYFIV). The play symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTW), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV) and a Cherry (WINALL) symbol. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "CUPID'S SCOOP" area, are: NO BONUS (TRYAGAIN) symbol, TRY AGAIN (NOBONUS) symbol, NO BONUS (TRYAGAIN) symbol, TRY AGAIN (NOBONUS) symbol and a Cupid (WIN14) symbol.

4. *Prize Symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: \$2⁰⁰ (TWO DOL), \$4⁰⁰ (FOR DOL), \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL), \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$14⁰⁰ (FORTN), \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY), \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO) and \$14,000 (FORTNTHO).

5. *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$2, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$14, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$100, \$200, \$500, \$1,000 and \$14,000. The prize that can be won in the "CUPID'S SCOOP" area is \$14. A player can win up to nine times on a ticket.

6. *Approximate number of tickets printed for the game:* Approximately 5,400,000 tickets will be printed for the My Cherry on Top instant lottery game.

7. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct one Perfect Match Second-Chance Drawing

for which non-winning My Cherry on Top instant lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 10.

8. *Determination of prize winners:*

(a) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$14,000 (FORTNTHO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$14,000.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which a Cherry (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in four of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in four of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which a Cherry (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in four of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in two of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which a Cherry (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in four of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in one of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in one of the "Prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$14⁰⁰ (FORTN) appears in one of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$2⁰⁰ (TWO DOL) appears in one of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$486.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match either of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the "Prize" area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which a Cherry (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in three of the "Prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in five of the "Prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which a Cupid (WIN14) symbol appears in the “CUPID’S SCOOP” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$14.

(w) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the “Prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(x) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING

NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in the “Prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(y) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4.⁰⁰ (FOR DOL) appears in the “Prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.

(z) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match either of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$2.⁰⁰ (TWO DOL) appears in the “Prize” area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

Project Description: The Radio Road Interceptor Improvements Project involves replacing and rehabilitating approximately 11,400 linear feet (LF) of deteriorated and hydraulically limited sewer main. It includes replacing the existing 15-inch diameter pipe between manholes K15 and G5, upgrading the interceptor between manholes G5 and L39 from 15-inch diameter pipe to 18-inch diameter pipe, upgrading the interceptor between manholes L36 and J30 from 18-inch diameter pipe to 21-inch diameter, replacing the existing 21-inch diameter pipe between manholes J30 and C44 and realignment of various sanitary sewer mains segments to improve sewer flow. The goal of the project is to reduce infiltration and inflow and provide for adequate hydraulic capacity for existing and future flows.

Problem Description: The Radio Road interceptor experiences peak flows in excess of its hydraulic capacity leading to sewer back-ups and overflows during periods of wet weather and high groundwater table. The facility is under a corrective action plan (CAP) to remediate overloading. Findings from studies conducted in 2016 and later in 2020 under the CAP showed that the interceptor was deteriorated due to age and hydraulically limited causing the surcharging and overload in the sewer system.

Project Description: This project involves rehabilitating the sanitary sewer collection system and the wastewater treatment facility (WWTF) operated by Curwensville Municipal Authority (Authority). The sanitary sewer collection system rehabilitation includes slip lining 2,300 LF of 8-inch diameter clay sewer mains, replacing 10 brick manholes with concrete manholes, replacing 400 LF of existing sewer laterals and 650 LF of 4-inch force main. The WWTF rehabilitation includes replacing existing valves, piping and appurtenances in the raw wastewater pumping system, replacing the existing utility water system, updating the WWTF's remote pumping station alarm systems and constructing an auger system for spreading out biosolids. It also includes upgrading the control building, effluent pump station tank, sewer inspection camera, sewer cleaning jet, lab equipment and the security system.

Problem Description: The Authority was notified in 2010 that the WWTF would be assigned annual nutrient discharge limitations as part of Pennsylvania's Chesapeake Bay Tributary Strategy. In response, the Authority prepared an Act 537 Sewage Facilities Plan Special Study to evaluate how to address the nutrient limitations and other needs within its system. Other needs identified include failing rotating biological contactors, anaerobic digesters and other existing equipment at the WWTF, hydraulic overload within the collection system causing sanitary sewer overflows and erosion of an Anderson Creek stream crossing that may lead to a sewer main break and discharge of sewage.

Project Description: This project involves demolishing the primary clarifier, final clarifier and trickling filter at the Shinglehouse Borough wastewater treatment plant (WWTP). Construction activity includes a new headworks building to house the existing screening equipment, installing a grit removal system within the new headworks building, installing a two-channel oxidation ditch process with a preanaerobic reactor tank for biological treatment and two new final clarifiers.

Problem Description: Shinglehouse Borough owns and operates a wastewater collection, conveyance and treatment system that serves Shinglehouse Borough. The WWTP was constructed in 1966 and is mostly original equipment. Small repairs and modifications have been made over the past 50 years to keep the facility in operation and in compliance with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit. In 2016, the WWTP was evaluated and it was determined that the existing equipment had reached the end of its useful life and the current treatment process would not be capable of reliably meeting certain effluent limitations.

Additional activities include constructing 114 one-and-a-quarter inch HDPE lateral connections, 13 air release/vacuum valves in manholes at high points on the mains, 22 cleanout connections and 1 discharge connection.

Problem Description: The septic systems of many parcels between the existing gravity sewer system on Seitzinger Road and the Pennsylvania-New York state line are failing, causing direct discharges to Lake Erie and forcing property owners who address the issue to resort to expensive small flow treatment systems.

Lastly, a pressure reducing valve vault will be installed where the new Hillcrest main makes connection to the existing system.

Problem Description: The Hillcrest Development's water system is prone to leaks and pressurized by a booster pump station that is not capable of providing fire protection.

Project Description: Sandy Lake Borough (Borough) is proposing improvements to the water system. Sandy Lake proposes replacing approximately 22,000 LF of waterline and the addition of 1,400 LF of new waterline. The proposed construction will consist of the replacement of nonPVC waterlines within the Borough and portions of Sandy Lake Township, tie-ins with new meters and meter pits to residential and commercial areas along the new waterlines, erosion and sedimentation controls, and all other appurtenances necessary, such as the installation of new curb stop boxes and valves, replacing fire hydrant assemblies and valves and replacing non-operable valves.

Problem Description: This project proposes problem resolution to the current water distribution system's deteriorating conditions. Certain portions of the distribution system have been replaced over time; however, a significant part of the system requires replacement, exhibiting on average about 60 waterline breaks a year. Characterization of the water line breaks generally in-

clude pipeline fractures in the cast iron, pin holes in the copper pipe, splitting in the asbestos cement materials and service saddles/fitting bolts rusting off, all indicative of acidic soil/metallic piping reactions. Another issue is that residential customers do not have metered water. This makes it more difficult to locate breaks in the system.

BWSA has a history of exceeding the maximum contaminant level (MCL) for total trihalomethane (TTHM). This is due to receiving water that often exceeds the MCL for TTHM due to the age of the water. It is very difficult to eliminate this contaminant from the water without considerable expense. Water proposed to be furnished by SPWA to BWSA will have a lower water age and is treated to minimize the formation of disinfection by-products including total TTHM.
