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READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylvania Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state. pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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Rules, Regulations and Statements of Policy in Titles 1-107 of the Pennsylvania Code

Text proposed to be added is printed in **underscored bold face**. Text proposed to be deleted is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and sections are printed in regular type to enhance readability. Final rulemakings and statements of policy are printed in regular type.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201–246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

Whereas, by continuing to strengthen the Commonwealth's recruitment, hiring, development, and retention of high-performing individuals, the Commonwealth can continue to meet the rapidly evolving needs of Pennsylvanians.

Now, Therefore, I, Josh Shapiro, Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other laws, do hereby establish the Hire, Improve, Recruit, Empower (HIRE) Committee, and do order and direct as follows:

TITLE 4. ADMINISTRATION

PART I. GOVERNOR'S OFFICE

CHAPTER 1. AGENCY OPERATION AND ORGANIZATION

Subchapter RR. [Reserved]

§§ 1.521—1.525. [Reserved].

Subchapter NNN. HIRE, IMPROVE, RECRUIT, EMPOWER COMMITTEE

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§ 1.931. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in this subchapter, shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

CODE PA—The Commonwealth Office of Digital Experience.

HIRE Committee—The Hire, Improve, Recruit, Empower Committee.

OA—The Office of Administration of the Commonwealth.

§ 1.932. HIRE Committee.

(a) *Membership*. The HIRE Committee shall consist of the following 11 members, who shall serve by virtue of their public position and at the pleasure of the Governor:

(1) Secretary of Administration or the Secretary's designee. The Secretary of Administration shall serve as the Committee's Chair.

(2) Governor's Chief of Staff or the Chief of Staff's designee.

(3) Governor's Secretary of Policy and Planning or the Secretary's designee.

(4) Governor's Director of External Affairs or the Director's designee.

(5) Secretary of General Services or the Secretary's designee.

(6) Secretary of Corrections or the Secretary's designee.

(7) Adjutant General or the Adjutant General's designee.

(8) Deputy Secretary for Human Resources and Management or the Deputy Secretary's designee.

(9) Executive Director of the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation, Department of Labor and Industry or the Executive Director's designee.

(10) Chief Diversity Officer.

(11) Chief Accessibility Officer.

(b) Responsibilities. The HIRE Committee may do all of the following:

(1) Make recommendations to the OA related to hiring and recruitment for the Commonwealth workforce.

(2) Develop and make recommendations to improve the competitiveness of the Commonwealth's workforce after gathering information from agencies about agency needs.

(3) After discussion and consultation with the Governor's Office, make recommendations to the OA on additional ways to attract, train and retain

top talent in this Commonwealth that can meet the diverse and expanding needs of Commonwealth residents and visitors.

(c) *Meetings*. Beginning no later than August 1, 2024, the HIRE Committee shall meet quarterly to monitor progress on the implementation of this subchapter.

§ 1.933. Responsibilities of the OA.

(a) The OA shall:

(1) Pursue implementation of a pilot program to create financial incentives for Commonwealth employees who work in identified positions and can demonstrate a foreign language proficiency that the agency has determined is necessary to deliver more effective Commonwealth services.

(2) Develop and maintain an active list of hard-to-fill jobs and manage interagency progress to creatively recruit for those positions.

(3) Require the OA's Bureau of Enterprise Recruitment to expand career internship, apprenticeship and fellowship opportunities to recruit and foster meaningful career development opportunities for Commonwealth employees to help build a pipeline of future Commonwealth leaders.

(4) Affirm that the Commonwealth can hire non-United States citizens if they are legally authorized to work in the United States.

(5) Study the evolving needs of Commonwealth employees and their families with the goal of ensuring Commonwealth policies and benefits provide meaningful support in a fiscally responsible manner.

(6) Provide employees notice that they may utilize their allotted sick leave for purposes of addressing and prioritizing their mental health and well-being in a manner consistent with collective bargaining agreements and existing laws and policies.

(7) Continue to develop strategies to enhance language access for individuals with limited English proficiency and increase digital accessibility by continuing the development of language access plans in agencies under the Governor's jurisdiction.

(8) Continue to direct CODE PA and the Chief Accessibility Officer to spearhead digital accessibility efforts to ensure individuals with disabilities may seamlessly and securely access the Commonwealth's online programs and services.

(b) The OA and Department of Military and Veterans Affairs shall develop a mentorship and networking program that assists recently discharged veterans entering or returning to Commonwealth employment with a smooth transition from military service to the civilian workforce.

(c) The OA and Department of Corrections shall continue to work to promote pathways to employment in State government for individuals who have interacted with the criminal justice system as returning citizens by collaborating with the PA Reentry Council to support the needs of reentrants. This includes identifying pathways to Commonwealth employment and supporting workforce training initiatives.

(d) The Department of General Services (DGS) shall continue to build a welcoming, inviting workplace that supports the Commonwealth's hiring and recruitment of individuals from all backgrounds, including doing all of the following:

(1) Identify opportunities in its capital plan to expand the availability of more multipurpose single-use restrooms.

(2) Direct an accessibility study of the Capitol Complex in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, to make recommendations to improve mobility in and around the Capitol Complex for individuals with disabilities, including whether accessibility within Commonwealth-owned facilities can be improved.

(3) Expand available space that could be used for child care options in the Capitol Complex and other Commonwealth-owned buildings as DGS continuously right-sizes the Commonwealth's real estate footprint.

(4) Provide guidance and procurement options for agencies on expanding availability of free menstrual products in restrooms in Commonwealthowned facilities.

§ 1.934. Implementation.

Agencies shall take the necessary steps to implement this subchapter. This subchapter shall be implemented consistent with applicable law. This subchapter is not intended to, and does not create, any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by any party against the Commonwealth, its departments, agencies or entities, its officers, employees or agents or any other persons. Independent agencies are also strongly encouraged to participate.

§ 1.935. Effective date.

This subchapter shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect until amended or rescinded by the Governor.

§ 1.936. Rescission.

Effective immediately, Executive Order 2008-06 as amended, Office of Diversity Management, is rescinded.

Adoption of Philadelphia Rule of Judicial Administration *5101 and Rescission of Philadelphia Rule of Judicial Administration *1900; President Judge General Court Regulation; No. 6 of 2024

Order

And Now, this 10th day of June, 2024, the Board of Judges of Philadelphia County having voted at the Board of Judges' meeting held on May 16, 2024, to adopt Philadelphia Rule of Judicial Administration *5101, and rescind *1900 as follows to this Order, and, as required by Pa.R.J.A. 103, the Supreme Court Civil Procedural Rules Committee has reviewed the following local rules, has determined that Rule *5101 is consistent with applicable statewide rules, and has authorized their promulgation.

Now, therefore, it is hereby *Ordered* and *Decreed* that Philadelphia Local Rule of Judicial Administration *5101 is adopted, as follows, effective thirty days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

As required by Pa.R.J.A. 103(d), the local rule which follows this Order was submitted to the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania Procedural Rules Committee for review, and written notification has been received from the Rules Committee certifying that the local rule is consistent with any general rule of the Supreme Court. This Order and the following local rule shall be filed with the Office of Judicial Records in a docket maintained for Administrative Orders issued by the First Judicial District of Pennsylvania. As required by Pa.R.J.A. 103(d)(5)(ii), two certified paper copies of this Administrative Order and the following local rule, as well as one copy of the Administrative Order and local rule shall be distributed to the Legislative Reference Bureau on a computer diskette for publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. As required by Pa.R.J.A. 103(d)(6) one certified copy of this Administrative Order and local rule shall be filed with the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, shall be published on the website of the First Judicial District at https://www.courts.phila.gov, and shall be incorporated in the compiled set of local rules no later than 30 days following publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. Copies of the Administrative Order and local rules shall also be published in The Legal Intelligencer and will be submitted to American Lawyer Media, Jenkins Memorial Law Library, and the Law Library for the First Judicial District.

Philadelphia Rule of Judicial Administration No. *5101

Rule *5101. Protocols to Mark, Inventory, Store and Retain Exhibits, Physical Evidence and Electronic Evidence Offered During Trials and Evidentiary Hearings in the Philadelphia Court of Common Pleas.

(a) *General Rule*. In accordance with Pa.R.J.A. 5101, counsel and unrepresented parties shall present all exhib-

its, physical evidence and electronic evidence used and offered during trials or evidentiary hearings, which shall be inventoried, filed, and retained as provided in this rule.

(b) Custody of Exhibits During Court Proceedings. The tipstaff or other court staff designated by the presiding judge shall be the custodian of exhibits pursuant to Pa.R.J.A. 5102. The custodian shall secure and maintain all exhibits presented to the court during the proceedings, including during breaks and recesses.

(c) Documentary Evidence. Counsel and unrepresented parties may pre-mark exhibits. When possible, all documentary exhibits such as letters and reports should be $8-1/2 \times 11$ size. For oversized documentary evidence, see subsection (d).

(d) *Physical Evidence*. Physical evidence and oversized exhibits must be photographed by the proponent, converted to letter sized pdf and appropriately marked and produced during the trial or evidentiary hearing. Unless otherwise provided by the presiding judge, at the conclusion of the trial or evidentiary hearing, physical evidence shall be returned to the police in criminal cases and to counsel in civil cases for safekeeping as required by any applicable retention schedule, statute, rule, regulation, or policy, or until further order of court.

(e) *Electronic Evidence*. Electronic evidence, including audio or video exhibits, must be produced by the proponent on a USB drive, CD/DVD, or other medium specified by the presiding judge or Office of Judicial Records.

(f) Confidential Documents. Confidential documents offered as exhibits shall be produced with a Confidential Document form as provided by the Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania: Case Records of the Appellate and Trial Courts (UJS Case Records Policy) as provided in Phila.R.J.A. No. *401. Confidential Documents are not accessible by the public.

(g) *Confidential Information*. Documents offered as exhibits which contain confidential information listed in the UJS Case Records Policy shall be produced in a Redacted Format. All confidential information will be contained on the confidential information sheet which is not accessible by the public.

(h) Sealed Documents. Any documents the presiding judge deems necessary to seal will not be accessible by the public. Exhibits that are ordered sealed cannot be electronically filed. They can be given to the tipstaff or other court staff designated by the presiding judge and will be manually uploaded or kept and sealed from the public view.

(i) *Exhibit List.* At the conclusion of the trial or evidentiary hearing, designated court staff shall inventory all exhibits and evidence, whether documentary, physical, electronic, audio, video or otherwise, and whether admitted or marked for identification. Any oversized exhibit, physical evidence or visual evidence not previously converted to letter size pdf format as provided in subsection (d) shall be photographed and/or converted to pdf letter size and marked. Each Exhibit and piece of evidence shall be clearly marked and placed on the Exhibit List which shall be reviewed and approved by the presiding judge, filed of record and copies provided to all parties no later than five days following the conclusion of the trial or evidentiary hearing. When submitting or uploading Exhibit Lists and Exhibits, Counsel and unrepresented parties shall certify compliance with this rule by including the following language:

I certify that this filing is in compliance with Philadelphia Rule of Judicial Administration No. *5101 and all files submitted with this transaction were introduced as evidence during trial or other evidentiary hearing.

(j) *After Court Proceedings*. Exhibits and evidence shall be made part of the record as follows:

(1) Trial Division:

a. *Civil Section*: within five (5) days of the conclusion of the trial or evidentiary hearing, counsel for each proponent of the exhibits and evidence shall upload their documentary exhibits through the Electronic Filing System and, if not already done, provide to the Office of Judicial Records a USB drive, or CD/DVD with audio or video evidence, as provided in this rule. The Office of Judicial Records shall either upload the contents of any USB drive or CD/DVD to a documentary-evidentiary program, or retain any USB drive, or CD/DVD as required by Pa.R.J.A. 5101—5103 until further order of court.

b. *Criminal Section*: within five (5) days of the conclusion of the trial or evidentiary hearing, counsel for each proponent of the exhibits and evidence shall upload their documentary exhibits through the Electronic Filing System and, if not already done, provide to the Office of Judicial Records a USB drive, or CD/DVD with audio or video evidence, as provided in this rule. The Office of Judicial Records shall either upload the contents of any USB drive or CD/DVD to a documentary-evidentiary program, or retain any USB drive, or CD/DVD as required by Pa.R.J.A. 5101—5103 until further order of court.

c. Self-represented Parties: at the conclusion of the trial or evidentiary hearing, the tipstaff or other designated court staff pursuant to subsection (b) shall take possession of all exhibits and any USB drive or CD/DVD proffered by self-represented Parties and shall deliver them to the Office of Judicial Records which shall convert all documentary evidence to PDF format and stored in a documentary-evidentiary program as required by Pa.R.J.A. 5101—5103, or upload the contents of any USB drive or CD/DVD to a documentary-evidentiary program and/or retain any USB drive or CD/DVD as required by required by Pa.R.J.A. 5101—5103 until further order of court.

(2) *Family Court*: Pursuant to 5104(b), proceedings before hearing officers in divorce, custody, support, delinquency, and dependency matters are excluded from this Rule.

a. Dependency Matters: at the conclusion of the trial or evidentiary hearing, the tipstaff or other designated court staff pursuant to subsection (b) shall take possession of the exhibits and evidence and upload the documentary exhibits through the electronic filing system and provide to the Clerk of Family Court any USB drive, or CD/DVD with audio or video evidence, as provided in this rule. The Clerk of Family Court shall either upload the contents of any USB drive or CD/DVD to a documentary-evidentiary program, or retain any USB drive, or CD/DVD as required by Pa.R.J.A. 5101—5103 until further order of court.

b. Adoption Matters: at the conclusion of the trial or evidentiary hearing, the tipstaff or other designated court staff pursuant to subsection (b) shall take possession of the exhibits and evidence and upload the documentary exhibits through the electronic filing system and provide to the Clerk of Family Court any USB drive, or CD/DVD with audio or video evidence, as provided in this rule. The Clerk of Family Court shall either upload the contents of any USB drive or CD/DVD to a documentary-evidentiary program, or retain any USB drive, or CD/DVD as required by Pa.R.J.A. 5101—5103 until further order of court.

c. *Delinquency Matters*: at the conclusion of the trial or evidentiary hearing, the Office of Judicial Records shall take possession of all exhibits and any USB drive or CD/DVD, shall upload the documentary exhibits through the electronic filing system and shall either upload the contents of any USB drive or CD/DVD to a documentaryevidentiary program, or retain any USB drive, or CD/ DVD as required by Pa.R.J.A. 5101—5103 until further order of court.

d. Adult Criminal Matters in Family Court: See section (j)(1)b.

e. Domestic Relations Matters: at the conclusion of the trial or evidentiary hearing, the tipstaff or other designated court staff pursuant to subsection (b) shall take possession of all exhibits and any USB drive or CD/DVD proffered, and shall deliver them to the Clerk of Family Court, which shall convert all documentary evidence to PDF format and stored in a documentary-evidentiary program as required by Pa.R.J.A. 5101—5103, or upload the contents of any USB drive or CD/DVD to a documentary-evidentiary program and/or retain any USB drive or CD/DVD as required by Pa.R.J.A. 5101—5103 until further order of court.

E. Summary of Proposal

Glade Run Lake is a 52-acre impoundment owned by this Commonwealth, managed by the Commission and located in Middlesex Township, Butler County which is approximately 10 miles south of the City of Butler. The dam impounds Glade Run at river mile (RM) 9.3 upstream from its confluence with Connoquenessing Creek at RM 34.3. This reservoir was completely dewatered during the spring of 2011 to upgrade the dam and spillway structures per Department of Environmental Protection dam safety standards. Following the completion of these repairs and modifications, refill occurred in the winter of 2017, and the Commission stocked the lake from 2017 through 2023 with select fish species, to establish a high-quality, warm-water and cool-water fishery. Since 2017, Glade Run Lake has been managed under § 65.24 which allows for the harvest of trout under § 61.1 (relating to Commonwealth inland waters), seasons, sizes and daily limits but no harvest of other fish species. The intent was to facilitate rapid development of the warm-water and cool-water fish populations in the absence of harvest while allowing for the harvest of trout as the lake is included in the Commission's Stocked Trout Waters program. Once the warm-water and cool-water fish populations were sufficiently reestablished, the lake would then be recommended for removal from the miscellaneous special regulations and moved to one or more of the Commission's existing regulation programs.

The black bass and panfish populations were evaluated from 2019 through 2023 to monitor progress toward development of a high-quality, warm-water and cool-water fishery. Sportfish abundance and population size structure have improved to levels where populations can now sustain limited harvest. As such, it is recommended that Glade Run Lake be deleted from miscellaneous special regulations, allowing Commission staff to consider this reservoir for management under §§ 65.9 and 65.11 (relating to big bass; and panfish enhancement).

The Commission proposes that § 65.24 be amended to read as set forth in Annex A.

Sportfish populations were evaluated from 2022 through 2023 to monitor progress towards development of a high-quality, warm-water and cool-water fishery. Sportfish abundance and population size structure have improved to levels where populations can now sustain harvest. As such, it is recommended that Chapman Dam Reservoir be deleted from miscellaneous special regulations, allowing staff to consider this reservoir for management of all species with Commonwealth inland waters regulations. Background

The Department of Human Services (Department) announced its intent to allocate funding for Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-2024 for supplemental payments for certain acute care general hospitals that provide a high volume of services to Medical Assistance (MA) eligible and low-income populations in nonrural medically underserved areas at 53 Pa.B. 8003 (December 23, 2023). The Department subsequently announced it would not allocate funding for this payment at 54 Pa.B. 2428 (May 4, 2024).

Purpose of Notice

Although the Department previously announced that it would not allocate funding for FY 2023-2024 for supplemental payments for certain acute care general hospitals that provide a high volume of services to MA eligible and low-income populations in nonrural medically underserved areas, this notice provides information on how the public may submit comments.

Fiscal Impact

The Department will not allocate the \$5.449 million in total funds (State and Federal) for the supplemental payments identified previously.

If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter

a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

11. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Big Bucks, prize money from winning Big Bucks instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Big Bucks instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

12. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

13. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Big Bucks or through normal communications methods.

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101— 3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 819.203 (relating to notice of instant game rules), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following instant lottery game:

1. *Name*: The name of the game is Pennsylvania Giant Bucks ("Giant Bucks"). The game number is PA-1698.

2. *Price*: The price of a Giant Bucks instant lottery game ticket is \$5.

3. Play symbols: Each Giant Bucks instant lottery game ticket will contain one play area featuring a "WINNING NUMBERS" area and a "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a "BONUS" area consisting of a "GIANT \$100 BONUS" spot, a "\$50 BONUS" spot, a "\$10 BONUS" spot and a "\$5 BONUS" spot. The play symbols and their captions located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). 4. *Prize symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: $5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL), $10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL), $20^{.00}$ (TWENTY), $30^{.00}$ (THIRTY), $50^{.00}$ (FIFTY), 100 (ONE HUN), 300 (THR HUN), 500 (FIV HUN), 1,000 (ONE THO), 5,000 (FIV THO) and 500,000 (FIVHUNTHO).

5. *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$5, \$10, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$100, \$300, \$500, \$1,000, \$5,000 and \$500,000. The prizes that can be won in the four "BONUS" spots are: \$5, \$10, \$50 and \$100. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate odds). A player can win up to 16 times on a ticket.

6. Approximate number of tickets printed for the game: Approximately 14,400,000 tickets will be printed for the Giant Bucks instant lottery game.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which a Moneybag (WINALL) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in four of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$300 (THR HUN) appears in two of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$50⁻⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in four of the "prize" areas, a prize symbol of \$30⁻⁰⁰ (THIRTY) appears in one of the "prize" areas and a prize symbol of \$5⁻⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in one of the "prize" areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4,835.

Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a nonwinning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

11. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Giant Bucks, prize money from winning Giant Bucks instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Giant Bucks instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

12. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

13. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Giant Bucks or through normal communications methods.

2. *Price*: The price of a Jumbo Bucks instant lottery game ticket is \$10.

Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the instant ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery instant ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

11. Unclaimed prize money: For a period of 1 year from the announced close of Jumbo Bucks, prize money from winning Jumbo Bucks instant lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto. If no claim is made within 1 year of the announced close of the Jumbo Bucks instant lottery game, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by the ticket, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided for by statute.

12. Governing law: In purchasing a ticket, the customer agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), 61 Pa. Code Part V (relating to State Lotteries) and the provisions contained in this notice.

13. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Jumbo Bucks or through normal communications methods.
