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READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rule-making must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylva-nia Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

Reproduction, Dissemination or Publication of Information

Third parties may not take information from the *Pennsylvania Code* and *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and reproduce, disseminate or publish information except as provided by 1 Pa. Code § 3.44:

§ 3.44. General permission to reproduce content of Code and Bulletin.

Information published under this part, which information includes, but is not limited to, cross references, tables of cases, notes of decisions, tables of contents, indexes, source notes, authority notes, numerical lists and codification guides, other than the actual text of rules or regulations may be reproduced only with the written consent of the [Legislative Reference] Bureau. The information which appears on the same leaf with the text of a rule or regulation, however, may be incidentally reproduced in connection with the reproduction of the rule or regulation, if the reproduction is for the private use of a subscriber and not for resale. There are no other restrictions on the reproduction of information published under this part, and the Commonwealth hereby consents to a reproduction.

Amendment to Proclamation of Disaster Emergency

August 20, 2024

Whereas, on August 9, 2024, I declared a general disaster emergency pursuant to Article IV, Section 20 of the Pennsylvania Constitution in Adams, Bedford, Berks, Bradford, Carbon, Chester, Cumberland, Dauphin, Fulton, Lackawanna, Luzerne, Lycoming, Monroe, Pike, Potter, Sullivan, Susquehanna, Tioga, Union, Wayne, and Wyoming Counties, due to the adverse impacts of Tropical Storm Debby; and

Whereas, heavy rain and flooding caused extensive damage to roads, streets, bridges, private homes, businesses, and utilities in those counties; and

Whereas, ongoing damage assessments and reports indicate that Cambria, Cameron, Centre, Clearfield, Elk, Indiana, and York Counties experienced the same adverse impacts from Tropical Storm Debby.

Now Therefore, pursuant to the provisions of section 7301(b) of the Emergency Management Services Code, 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(b), I do hereby amend my Proclamation dated August 9, 2024, to further declare the existence of a general disaster emergency in Cambria, Cameron, Centre, Clearfield, Elk, Indiana, and York Counties and add them to the list of counties that were impacted by Tropical Storm Debby. All directives, authorized actions, and provisions of my Proclamation of Disaster Emergency dated August 9, 2024, shall remain in full force and effect until terminated by law.

Given under my hand and the Seal of the Governor, at the City of Harrisburg, on this twentieth day of August two thousand twenty-four, the year of the Commonwealth the two hundred forty-ninth.

PART IV. ADMISSION TO PRACTICE LAW CHAPTER 71. PENNSYLVANIA BAR ADMISSION RULES

Subchapter B. ADMISSION TO THE BAR GENERALLY

PROCEEDINGS BEFORE BOARD

Rule 213. Hearings Before the Board.

(b) Hearing. Within 30 days after receipt of the request of an applicant for a hearing under this Rule the Board shall hold a hearing at which the applicant shall be present. The applicant may be represented by counsel at the hearing. The Board shall not be bound by the formal rules of evidence and such relevant evidence may be introduced at the hearing as may be necessary for the Board to make a final determination upon the application. The burden of proof shall be on the applicant to establish that he or she possesses the character, fitness and general qualifications that are compatible with the standards expected to be observed by a member of the Bar of this Commonwealth. The applicant may call and examine witnesses, cross-examine adverse witnesses and present such evidence as is relevant to the issue before the Board. The Board may in its discretion limit the number of witnesses who may be heard upon any issue to eliminate repetitious or cumulative evidence. At any such hearing the applicant and his or her counsel shall be permitted to inspect such portion of the record of the applicant bearing upon the issues before the Board as does not constitute confidential information. A stenographic or other verbatim record shall be made of any such hearing, but hearings before the Board shall not be open to the public. The Board shall have the power to issue subpoenas for the attendance of witnesses and for the production of documentary evidence at the hearing.

This notice provides information about persons who have applied to the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) for a new, renewed, or amended NPDES or WQM permit, or a permit waiver for certain stormwater discharges, or have

submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) for coverage under a General Permit. The applications and NOIs concern, but are not limited to, effluent discharges from sewage treatment facilities and industrial facilities to surface waters or groundwater; stormwater discharges associated with industrial activity (industrial stormwater), construction activity (construction stormwater), and municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s); the application of pesticides; the operation of Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs); and the construction of sewage, industrial waste, and manure storage, collection and treatment facilities. This notice is provided in accordance with 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91 and 92a and 40 CFR Part 122, implementing The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and the Federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C.A. §§ 1251-1376). More information on the types of NPDES and WQM permits that are available can be found on DEP's website (visit www.dep.pa.gov and select Businesses, Water, Bureau of Clean Water, Wastewater Management, and NPDES and WQM Permitting Programs).

DEP provides a 15-day public comment period for Individual WQM Permit Applications for amendments.

Section II identifies individual NPDES permit applications received and draft permits indicating DEP's tentative determination relating to sewage, industrial waste, industrial stormwater, MS4s, pesticides and CAFOs. A 30-day public comment period applies to these applications and draft permits, except when a site-specific water quality criterion is used to establish effluent limitations, in which case a 45-day public comment period applies. The period for comment may be extended at the discretion of DEP for one additional 15-day period. Additional information, including links to draft permits and fact sheets that explain the basis for DEP's tentative determinations may be reviewed by generating the "Applications Received with Comment Periods Report" on DEP's website at www.dep.pa.gov/CWPublicNotice. Notification of 15-day extensions for comment will be provided in the "Applications Received with Comment Periods Report" (Comments column).

Section III identifies individual NPDES permit applications received and draft permits indicating DEP's tentative determination relating to stormwater discharges associated with construction activities. A 30-day public comment period applies to these applications and draft permits. The period for comment may be extended at the discretion of the Department for one additional 15-day period. Additional information may be reviewed by generating the "Applications Received with Comment Periods Report" on DEP's website at www.dep.pa.gov/CWPublicNotice.

Applications, NOIs and draft permits, where applicable, may be reviewed at the DEP office that received the application or NOI. Members of the public are encouraged to use DEP's website to obtain additional information as discussed previously.

Comments received within the appropriate comment periods for WQM and NPDES permit applications will be retained by DEP and considered in the final determinations regarding the applications. A comment submittal should include the name, address and telephone number of the writer and a concise statement to inform DEP of the exact basis of a comment and the relevant facts upon which it is based.

DEP will also accept requests or petitions for public hearings on applications. The request or petition must indicate the interest of the party filing and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. A hearing will be held if DEP determines that there is a significant public interest. If a hearing is scheduled, a notice of the hearing will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* and a newspaper of general circulation within the relevant geographical area. DEP will postpone its final determination until after a public hearing is held.

Availability of National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) General Permit for Discharges of Stormwater Associated with Construction Activities (PAG-02)

Under The Clean Streams Law (35 P.S. §§ 691.1—691.1001) and sections 1905-A, 1917-A and 1920-A of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. §§ 510-5, 510-17 and 510-20), the Department of Environmental Protection (Department), by this notice, informs the public of the availability of the final National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) General Permit for Discharges of Stormwater Associated with Construction Activities (PAG-02) for a new 5-year term. The PAG-02 General Permit will become effective on December 8, 2024, and will expire on December 7, 2029.

The PAG-02 General Permit is intended to provide NPDES permit coverage to persons proposing an earth

disturbance activity (other than agricultural plowing or tilling activities, animal heavy use areas, timber harvesting activities, oil and gas activities and road maintenance activities) involving earth disturbance greater than or equal to one acre, or an earth disturbance on any portion, part or during any stage of, a larger common plan of development or sale that involves greater than or equal to 1 acre of disturbance, in satisfaction of State (25 Pa. Code §§ 92a.1(b) and 102.5(a) (relating to purpose and scope; and permit requirements)) and Federal (40 CFR 122.26(b)(14)(x) and (15) (relating to storm water discharges (applicable to State NPDES programs, see § 123.25)) regulations, if the eligibility requirements have been satisfied. The PAG-02 General Permit may also be used for NPDES permit coverage where the Department or the United States Environmental Protection Agency requires an NPDES permit based on the potential for contribution to a violation of a water quality standard or for significant contribution of pollutants to waters of the United States, in accordance with 40 CFR 122.26(b)(15)(ii). The PAG-02 General Permit may not be used for discharges to waters designated for special protection under 25 Pa. Code Chapter 93 (relating to water quality standards) or other discharges that do not meet eligibility requirements of the PAG-02 General Permit.

Notice of the availability of a draft PAG-02 General Permit was published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at 54 Pa.B. 1263 (March 9, 2024). A 30-day comment period was provided and interested parties were directed to submit comments to the Department's eComment system. The comment period ended on April 8, 2024. The Department received comments from 20 individuals and organizations during the comment period. A comment and response document has been developed by the Department.

The notice of availability of the draft PAG-02 at 54 Pa.B. 1263 included a description of the significant changes in the draft PAG-02 compared with the PAG-02 that became effective on December 8, 2019. The following additional significant changes were made to the final PAG-02 General Permit documents in comparison to the draft General Permit published on March 9, 2024:

- Submission to Municipalities—The draft PAG-02 proposed a requirement to submit annual reports and Notices of Termination (NOT) to municipalities. In response to public comments, the Department has removed this requirement from the final PAG-02.
- Landowner Acknowledgement—The draft PAG-02 proposed a new "Landowner Acknowledgement" section of the PAG-02 Notice of Intent (NOI) that the landowners of a project site would sign to demonstrate the applicant has authority to conduct earth disturbance activities, if the applicant was not the sole owner of land comprising the project site. In response to public comments, the Department has removed this section from the final PAG-02 NOI.
- Legal Instrument Recording—Under 25 Pa. Code § 102.8(m)(2) (relating to PCSM requirements), permittees must record a legal instrument identifying post-construction stormwater management (PCSM) stormwater control measures (SCM) on properties. In the 2019 version of PAG-02, this instrument was required to be recorded within 45 days of permit issuance. The draft PAG-02 published March 9, 2024, proposed that the legal instrument recording occur and the recorded documentation be submitted to the Department or a delegated county conservation district (CCD) prior to the scheduling of the required pre-construction meeting to aid in ensur-

ing that this requirement will be satisfied and does not prevent the approval of an NOT. In response to comments received, the Department is, in the final PAG-02, making an exception to this requirement for utility projects and other projects that receive written approval from the Department or a CCD. If the exception applies, the permittee will be required to record the instrument and submit the recorded documentation to the Department or a CCD within 45 days of PAG-02 coverage approval.

- Residential Impervious—The Department has removed questions on the final PAG-02 NOI concerning whether the maximum impervious allowed on a lot or a factor of safety was used for planned impervious areas. PCSM Module 2 will be updated to include a table of lots and impervious areas for multilot development projects. If the stormwater analysis and design of SCMs considers either the maximum allowable impervious area under a local ordinance or the maximum impervious on a lot, as designed, is at least 10% greater than the planned impervious, the permittee would not be responsible for amending the approved PCSM Plan and PAG-02 coverage or documenting future changes on record drawings, assuming the changes are within the factor of safety.
- Monthly Color Photographs—The draft PAG-02 proposed that color photographs be taken at least monthly of best management practices and SCMs. In the final PAG-02, the Department has modified this requirement to allow for alternative approaches when approved by the Department or a CCD, generally for large projects.
- Effective Date—The Department has clarified in the final PAG-02 that the requirements for site inspectors to be qualified and for confirmation testing of infiltration SCMs go into effect on December 8, 2025, 1 year following the effective date of the final PAG-02, to provide adequate time to prepare for these new requirements.
- Confirmation Testing for Infiltration Capacity—The Department has decided to eliminate the 20% threshold on ponding or drawdown times when evaluating infiltration SCMs through confirmation testing for infiltration capacity and instead allow the licensed professional the discretion to determine if the SCM is infiltrating in a manner consistent with the design.

Changes to the new PAG-02 General Permit compared with the PAG-02 that became effective on December 8, 2019, are also detailed in the "PAG-02 Modifications" section of the fact sheet accompanying the new PAG-02.

Permittees with existing coverage under the PAG-02 General Permit will be required to submit a renewal NOI to maintain continued coverage under the reissued PAG-02 General Permit by December 7, 2024. Permittees must use the PAG-02 Renewal NOI form (3800-PM-BCW0405h). The Department or CCDs will transmit notification to all existing PAG-02 permittees explaining the changes to the terms and conditions of General Permit coverage.

The fees for the PAG-02 General Permit include: 1) a \$500 administrative filing fee that is payable to the appropriate CCD Clean Water Fund or, if earth disturbance will occur in Forest or Philadelphia counties, payable to the Commonwealth Clean Water Fund; 2) a disturbed acreage fee calculated by multiplying the number of disturbed acres (rounded to the nearest whole acre) by \$100, payable to the Commonwealth Clean Water Fund; and 3) any additional fees that the CCD has established for review of the NOI for PAG-02 coverage. The administrative filing fee and disturbed acreage fee do

not apply to entities satisfying the criteria for an exemption under 25 Pa. Code § 102.6(b)(4) (relating to permit applications and fees).

In accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 92a.84(c)(3) (relating to public notice of general permits), the Department will publish notice of every approval of coverage under the PAG-02 General Permit in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Draft Safe Drinking Water General Permit for Community Water System Finished Water Storage Tank Painting

The Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is announcing the availability of a draft General Permit—Safe Drinking Water General Permit 01 (SDWGP-01) for painting of the interior of finished water storage tanks by community water systems. To access the draft SDWGP-01 and related documents, visit the Department's eLibrary at www.depgreenport.state.pa.us/elibrary/ (select "Permit and Authorization Packages," then "Safe Drinking Water," then "SDWGP-01: Safe Drinking Water General Permit 01—Community Water System Finished Water Storage Tank Painting (3940-PM-BSDW0004) (Draft)"). The Department previously published notice of the availability of the draft SDWGP-01 at 54 Pa.B. 2327 (April 27, 2024), but experienced some technical difficulties with the Department's eComment system for that prior notice, so the Department is republishing this notice now to resolicit public comments on the draft SDWGP-01.

The Department is authorized under section 4 of the Pennsylvania Safe Drinking Water Act (35 P.S. § 721.4) and 25 Pa. Code Chapter 109, Subchapter E (relating to permit requirements) to issue general permits for a specific category of modifications if the Department determines that the modifications meet the requirements in 25 Pa. Code § 109.511(a)(1)—(3) (relating to general permits).

The proposed SDWGP-01 is intended to provide permit coverage to public water systems to repaint the interior of finished water storage tanks in compliance with 25 Pa. Code § 109.511.

If a storage tank painting project (project) is ineligible for SDWGP-01, the public water system will be required to obtain a Public Water System Minor Amendment Construction Permit that meets the requirements of 25 Pa. Code § 109.503 (relating to public water system construction permits).

To be eligible for SDWGP-01, the project must meet, at a minimum, the following conditions:

1. SDWGP-01 Application: The Permittee shall submit a complete Safe Drinking Water General Permit—01

- (SDWGP-01): Community Water System Finished Water Storage Tank Painting Application (3940-PM-BSDW0004) to the Department.
- 2. *SDWGP-01 Authorization*: If the application is approved by the Department, the Permittee shall receive a signed copy of SDWGP-01 from the Department authorizing coverage under SDWGP-01.
 - 3. *Eligibility*:
- a. Finished water storage tanks used to provide the required 1.0-log Giardia or 4.0-log virus inactivation chlorine contact time for the entry point do not qualify for SDWGP-01. Instead, the public water system will be required to obtain a Public Water System Minor Amendment Construction Permit that meets the requirements of 25 Pa. Code § 109.503, with a detailed explanation of how the required chlorine contact time will be achieved while the storage tank is out of service.
- b. The Department may require the Permittee to apply for and obtain a Public Water Supply Minor Amendment Construction Permit by notifying the Permittee based on review of the SDWGP-01 application.
- 4. ANSI/NSF Standard 61: The Permittee shall only utilize coatings that are certified to American National Standards Institute (ANSI)/NSF Standard 61 (see https://www.nsf.org/knowledge-library/nsf-ansi-standard-61-drinking-water-system-components-health-effects).
- 5. Coating Application: The Permittee shall mix and apply to the coatings in accordance with the ANSI/American Water Works Association (AWWA) Standard D102 Coating Steel Water Storage Tanks (see https://engage.awwa.org/PersonifyEbusiness/Bookstore/Product-Details/productId/102200016).
- 6. Surface Preparation: The Permittee shall prepare interior steel surfaces in accordance with the ANSI/AWWA Standard D102 Coating Steel Water Storage Tanks.
- 7. Interior Preparation: The Permittee shall follow the AWWA Standard D100 Welded Steel Tanks for Water Storage (see https://engage.awwa.org/PersonifyEbusiness/Bookstore/Product-Details/productId/101843325) while welding the interior of the tank.
- 8. Pressure and Peak Demands: The Permittee shall provide a detailed explanation on how pressure will be maintained and peak demands will be met while the storage tank is out of service.
- 9. Pressure and Peak Demands Testing: The method for maintaining pressure and meeting peak demands while the storage tank is out of service must be tested with the storage tank full and isolated from the system. This allows the storage tank to be returned to service if necessary (to maintain pressure or meet peak demands) and other options can be explored. While the storage tank is isolated from the system, a 0.2 mg/L disinfectant residual must be maintained within the storage tank.
- 10. Fire Protection: If the system provides fire protection, the Permittee shall verify the local fire department was notified of any potential fire flow deficiencies with the storage tank being out of service.
- 11. Disinfection: After the work is completed, the Permittee shall disinfect the interior of the tank utilizing one of the procedures set forth in the latest edition of AWWA Standard C652 Disinfection of Water Storage Facilities (see https://engage.awwa.org/PersonifyEbusiness/Bookstore/Product-Details/productId/81912774). Special conditions will be included in the permit for this requirement.

- 12. Disinfectant Residual: After disinfecting the storage tank, the Permittee shall maintain a disinfectant residual of at least 0.2 mg/L in the storage tank at all times until the tank is placed back into service. If the residual falls below 0.2 mg/L, the water supplier shall disinfect the tank again and obtain satisfactory bacteriological test results before placing the tank into service. Special conditions will be included in the permit for this requirement.
- 13. Volatile Organic Chemical (VOC) Testing: After the storage tank painting project is completed, the Permittee shall have the water from the storage tank sampled at least 24 hours after the tank is filled and have the samples analyzed by a Department-accredited laboratory for VOCs (EPA Methods 502.2, 524.2 or 524.3). A special condition will be included in the permit for this requirement.
- 14. Expiration: The base general permit, SDWGP-01, will expire 5 years from the date of its issuance. If the Department reissues SDWGP-01 upon expiration or modifies SDWGP-01 during its current term, a Permittee with approval under SDWGP-01 may perform the approved work with the terms and conditions of the modified or reissued SDWGP-01, unless the Department notifies the Permittee in writing that a new application is required.
- 15. Other Requirements: No condition of SDWGP-01 releases the Permittee from any responsibility or requirements under other Federal, State or local regulations, statutes or ordinances.

Applicants must submit to the Department a complete SDWGP-01 application, a \$500 permit fee, an engineer's report and the coating specifications. The complete application must be submitted, signed and sealed by a professional engineer licensed in this Commonwealth.

Special conditions for the authorization of SDWGP-01, at a minimum, will include:

- 1. The Permittee shall comply with the terms and conditions of the SDWGP-01.
- 2. The Permittee's failure to comply with the terms, conditions or limitations of the SDWGP-01 is grounds for the Department to take an enforcement action or to terminate or revoke coverage under SDWGP-01.
- 3. Authorization of SDWGP-01 does not authorize any activities other than the construction or modification as per the terms and conditions of SDWGP-01.
- 4. The Permittee's coverage under SDWGP-01 will expire 2 years from the date of its approved authorization.
- 5. The Permittee shall notify the Department at least 48 hours prior to isolating and draining the finished water storage tank.
- 6. Prior to returning the storage tank to operation, the storage tank and related appurtenances shall be properly disinfected in accordance with 25 Pa. Code § 109.711 (relating to disinfection of facilities prior to placing them into service) and the most recent procedures established by AWWA. Water from the storage tank shall be tested for total coliforms in accordance with AWWA standards. The samples shall be analyzed by a Department-accredited laboratory. Copies of all microbiological test results shall be submitted to the Department within 24 hours of receiving the results.
- 7. After disinfecting the storage tank, the Permittee shall maintain a disinfectant residual of at least 0.2 mg/L in the storage tank at all times until the tank is placed back into service. If the residual falls below 0.2 mg/L, the

system shall disinfect the tank again and again obtain satisfactory bacteriological test results before placing the storage tank into operation. The Permittee shall sample chlorine residual at least daily and take one sample that is within 4 hours of returning to operation.

- 8. Prior to returning the storage tank to operation, water from the storage tank shall be sampled and tested for VOCs utilizing EPA Method 524.2 or EPA Method 502.2. The storage tank shall be filled with water for at least 24 hours prior to the collection of the VOC sample. The sample shall be analyzed by a Department-accredited laboratory.
- 9. If any of the bacteriological results are positive, any regulated VOC concentration exceeds a maximum contaminant level or any nonregulated VOC is found to be present at a concentration that is greater than the method detection limit, the storage tank may not be returned to service until the Department first approves its use, in writing.
- 10. Upon completion of construction and testing, the Permittee shall submit to the Department a Certificate of Construction (3900-FM-BSDW0062) available on the Department's eLibrary web site at www.depgreenport. state.pa.us/elibrary/ (select "Forms," then "Safe Drinking Water," then "Certificate of Construction 3900-FM-BSDW0062") copies of the bacteriological test results, chlorine residual results and VOC test results. The Certificate of Construction form shall be provided to the Department within 24 hours of returning the storage tank to operation or the next business day.

The Permittee's authorization approval under SDWGP-01 will expire 2 years from the approval date. Failure to comply with the terms, conditions or effluent limitations of the SDWGP-01 will be grounds for the Department to take an enforcement action or terminate or revoke coverage under SDWGP-01.

Fee Schedule Rates and Department-Established Fees for Services Funded Through the Office of Developmental Programs' Consolidated, Community Living, Person/Family Directed Support and Adult Autism Waivers, Targeted Support Management and the Community Intellectual Disability Base-Funded Program

The Department of Human Services (Department) is providing final notice of the Fee Schedule Rates for Targeted Support Management and services funded through the Consolidated, Community Living, Person/Family Directed Support (P/FDS), and Adult Autism Waivers and Department-established fees for residential ineligible services. The rates for community-based services and residential services are effective July 1, 2024. The rates for Agency With Choice Financial Management Services and Life Sharing with and without day will be effective October 1, 2024.

The Fee Schedule Rates also serve as the Department-established fees under 55 Pa. Code § 4300.115(a) (relating to Department established fees) for base-funded services managed through county programs for individuals with an intellectual disability under the Mental Health and Intellectual Disability Act of 1966 (50 P.S. §§ 4101—4704), 55 Pa. Code Chapter 4300 (relating to county mental health and intellectual disability fiscal manual) and 55 Pa. Code Chapter 6100 (relating to services for individuals with an intellectual disability or autism).

Background

The amount of funding available for Targeted Support Management and services funded through the Consolidated, Community Living, P/FDS and Adult Autism Waivers and Department-established fees for residential ineligible services is dependent upon the funds appropriated by the General Assembly. The General Appropriation Act of 2024, Act 1A of 2024, made available funding for rate increases for Targeted Support Management and home and community-based services funded through the Consolidated, Community Living, P/FDS and Adult Autism Waivers and Department-established fees for residential ineligible services. The Department is required to fund services within the amount of funds appropriated by the General Assembly.

Rate-Setting Methodology for Fee Schedule Rates and Department-Established Fees:

The Fee Schedule Rates and Department-established fees were established by applying an inflationary adjustment factor of 8% to the rates for nonresidential services and 6% to the rates for residential services.

Payments for Residential Services

Licensed Residential Habilitation, Unlicensed Residential Habilitation, Life Sharing and Supported Living providers whose services are funded through the Consolidated and Community Living Waivers and have been assigned to the primary, select or clinically enhanced tier as part of the Department's implementation of performance-based contracting are eligible to receive pay-

for-performance supplemental payments. To receive a supplemental payment, the provider must meet or exceed performance targets for staff credentialing, employment of individuals served, transition of individuals to Life Sharing or Supported Living services, rural provider capacity and reporting on use of technology.

Residential providers that meet or exceed performance standards for staff credentialing, employment of individuals served, rural provider capacity and reporting on the use of technology will receive one-time or combined payments up to 3% of Office of Developmental Programeligible service revenue from the applicable review period or established payment amount per qualifying event.

Residential providers that support individuals to successfully transition from licensed Residential Habilitation services to Life Sharing or Supported Living services are eligible for 2 one-time per individual transition to Independent Living payments. To be eligible for the payment, an individual must transition from a licensed home in which Residential Habilitation is provided to four or fewer people to a Life Sharing or Supported Living service rendered by the same provider. The first payment of \$15,000 will be made after the new Life Sharing or Supported Living service is rendered. The second payment of \$15,000 will be made after the individual has

received 6 consecutive months of Life Sharing or Supported Living service if the individual continues to reside in the setting to which the individual transitioned and is expected to continue residing in that location and receive Life Sharing or Supported Living services.

Licensed Residential Habilitation, Unlicensed Residential Habilitation, Life Sharing and Supported Living providers that meet the requirements to qualify as a Select provider or a Clinically Enhanced residential provider will also receive a payment that is in addition to the Fee Schedule Rate for the services they provide. Select providers will receive a rate add-on of 3% per individual served and Clinically Enhanced providers will receive a rate add-on of 5% per individual served.

For all services but residential services, the final Fee Schedule Rates represent the maximum rates the Department will pay for each service. For residential services the maximum rate the Department will pay for each service is the Fee Schedule Rate and the Department-established fees and any add on per individual served. Inpatient Hospitals Qualifying for Medical Assistance Disproportionate Share Payments

On July 1, 1988, the Department of Human Services (Department) implemented a disproportionate share payment system. The Department is required to annually publish the names of each inpatient acute care general hospital, rehabilitation hospital and private psychiatric hospital qualifying for a disproportionate share payment and their respective disproportionate share payment percentage as set forth in 55 Pa. Code §§ 1151.54(i), 1163.67(k) and 1163.459(j) (relating to disproportionate share payments).

A. Disproportionate Share for Acute Care General Hospitals, Rehabilitation Hospitals and Private Psychiatric Hospitals.

The following lists identify the inpatient acute care general hospitals, psychiatric units, drug and alcohol units and rehabilitation units of acute care general hospitals, rehabilitation hospitals, private psychiatric hospitals and private drug and alcohol hospitals eligible for disproportionate share payments for the period of July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024, and their respective payment percentages. B. Additional Disproportionate Share Payments

C. Additional Class of Disproportionate Share Payments

Effective March 1, 1998, the Department established a new class of disproportionate share payments to hospitals which render uncompensated care and which the Department has determined are experiencing significant revenue loss as a result of MA Program revisions under the act of May 16, 1996 (P.L. 175, No. 35).

Effective January 15, 1999, the Department established a new class of disproportionate share payments to include a Charity Care component of the Community Access Fund. A disproportionate share payment will be made to qualifying hospitals based on each hospital's percentage of charity care cost to the total charity care costs of all qualifying hospitals. The Department also established a disproportionate share payment for those hospitals which the Department has determined advanced its goal of enhanced access to multiple types of medical care in economically distressed areas of this Commonwealth.

Pennsylvania 8-Legged Loot Fast Play Game 5255

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. Name: The name of the Fast Play lottery game is Pennsylvania 8-Legged Loot ("8-Legged Loot"). The game number is PA-5255.

2. Definitions:

(a) \$8-LEGGED: A feature of the 8-Legged Loot game containing a "WINNING WEB" area, which further consists of one play symbol next to a "START" spot and one play symbol next to a "FINISH" spot. If the play symbol at the "START" matches the play symbol at the "FINISH," the player wins \$8. "\$8-LEGGED" is played separately.

- (b) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (c) Bar code: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (d) FINISH: A spot within the "\$8-LEGGED" feature containing one play symbol. If the play symbol at the "START" matches the play symbol at the "FINISH" of the "WINNING WEB" area, the player wins a prize of \$8. "\$8-LEGGED" is played separately.
- (e) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (f) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (g) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing

plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

- (h) *Play*: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (i) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.
- (j) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (k) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (1) START: A spot within the "\$8-LEGGED" feature containing one play symbol. If the play symbol at the START matches the play symbol at the "FINISH" of the "WINNING WEB" area, the player wins a prize of \$8. "\$8-LEGGED" is played separately.
- (m) WINNING NUMBERS: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area.
- (n) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (o) WINNING WEB: The area in the center of an 8-Legged Loot ticket where the \$8-LEGGED feature is played. "\$8-LEGGED" is played separately.
- (p) YOUR NUMBERS: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area.
 - 3. Price: The price of an 8-Legged Loot ticket is \$2.
- 4. Description of the 8-Legged Loot Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) The 8-Legged Loot lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. 8-Legged Loot tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) 8-Legged Loot is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. When matching play symbols are 8 (EIGHT) symbols, the player wins all 8 prizes shown in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) 8-Legged Loot tickets contain an "\$8-LEGGED" feature that includes a "WINNING WEB" area. When the play symbol at the "START" matches the play symbol at the "FINISH" the player wins a prize of \$8. "\$8-LEGGED" is played separately.
- (d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).

- (e) 8-Legged Loot tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request an 8-Legged Loot ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of an 8-Legged Loot ticket and select the 8-Legged Loot option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
 - 5. 8-Legged Loot ticket characteristics:
- (a) 8-Legged Loot tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) *Play Symbols*: 8-Legged Loot tickets will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and a "\$8-LEGGED" feature containing a "WINNING WEB" area. The "\$8-LEGGED" feature is played separately.
- (1) The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area and the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT) and an 8 (EIGHT) symbol.
- (2) The play symbols and their captions, located in the "START" and "FINISH" spots within the "WINNING WEB" area, are:

- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$8,000 (EGT THO) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$8,000.

- (o) Holders of tickets upon which an 8 (EIGHT) play symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and that 8 (EIGHT) play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$8.00 (EGT DOL) appears in four of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in four of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.
- (p) Holders of tickets upon which an 8 (EIGHT) play symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and that 8 (EIGHT) play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$8^{.00} (EGT DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$4^{.00} (FOR DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$2^{.00} (TWO DOL) appears in four of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$32.
- (q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (r) Holders of tickets upon which an 8 (EIGHT) play symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and that

- 8 (EIGHT) play symbol matches any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $\$4^{.00}$ (FOR DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of $\$2^{.00}$ (TWO DOL) appears in six of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (s) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (t) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$8.00 (EGT DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$8.
- (u) Holders of tickets upon which two matching play symbols appear in the "START" and "FINISH" areas within the "WINNING WEB" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$8.
- (v) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- (w) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4^{.00} (FOR DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.
- (x) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

- (2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/, as well as any related policies.
- (3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:
- (i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;
 - (ii) The player's date of birth;
- (iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;
 - (iv) The player's address;
 - (v) The player's telephone number;
 - (vi) The player's email address;
- (vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.
- (4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.
- (5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted

- only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted, and entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Pennsylvania Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

 - (c) Drawing description:

- (2) The entry period for Fast Play Qualifying Tickets will begin after 4:59:59 a.m. September 3, 2024 and will end at 11:59:59 p.m. October 31, 2024. All entries received during the entry periods will be entered into the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between November 1, 2024 and November 15, 2024.
- (3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Pennsylvania Lottery's publicly accessible web site.
- (4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-5254 Count de Cash (\$5) = five entries, PA-5255 8-Legged Loot (\$2) = two entries and PA-5256 Trick or Win (\$1) = one entry.
- (5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.
- (d) Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:
- (1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 9(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

- (2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 9(c)(2).
- (i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$50,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (ii) The second entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$31,000, less required income tax withholding.
- (iii) The third through the fifteenth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (iv) The sixteenth through the sixty-fifth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.
- (3) All prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment or uploaded to a winning player's lottery account.

- (2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.
- (3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.
- (4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), Scientific Games, LLC and MDI Entertainment, LLC, (collectively "SG") and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.
- (5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to

errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.
- (7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Cash prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within one (1) year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.
- (10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.
- (11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).
- (12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.
- (13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.
- (14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery terms and conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 9(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash.  - (15) Prizes are not transferrable.
 - (16) Other restrictions may apply.
 - 10. Ticket responsibility:
- (a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.
- (b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.
- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

- 11. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
 - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.
 - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
 - 12. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
 - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
 - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.
- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

- 13. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 14. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.
- 15. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.
 - 16. Governing law:
- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play 8-Legged Loot lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
 - 17. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 18. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play 8-Legged Loot lottery game tickets.
- 19. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a

winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

- 20. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote 8-Legged Loot or through normal communications methods.
- 21. Applicability: This notice applies only to the 8-Legged Loot lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Count de Cash Fast Play Game 5254

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

- 1. Name: The name of the Fast Play lottery game is Pennsylvania Count de Cash ("Count de Cash"). The game number is PA-5254.
 - 2. Definitions:
- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) *Bar code*: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (c) CASH: A feature of the Count de Cash Fast Play game that determines whether the player wins a prize of \$31 when any five of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols appear printed on a Cash symbol.
- (d) *DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS*: The area at the bottom of a Count de Cash ticket containing four "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" play symbols that determines whether the player wins the prize shown in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area when three Bat (BAT) symbols appear in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area. "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" is played separately.
- (e) *Game Ticket*: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (f) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (g) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including

making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

- (h) *Play*: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (i) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.
- (j) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (k) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (l) WINNING NUMBERS: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area.
- (m) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (n) YOUR NUMBERS: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area.
 - 3. Price: The price of a Count de Cash ticket is \$5.
- 4. Description of the Count de Cash Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) The Count de Cash lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Count de Cash tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) Count de Cash is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. When five of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols appear printed on a "CASH" symbol, the player wins a prize of \$31. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Count de Cash is also played by finding three Bat (BAT) play symbols in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area. "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" is played separately.
- (d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (e) Count de Cash tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Count de Cash ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total

purchase price of a Count de Cash ticket and select the Count de Cash option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

- 5. Count de Cash ticket characteristics:
- (a) Count de Cash tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: Count de Cash tickets will contain one play area, consisting of a "WINNING NUMBERS" area and a "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and one "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area. The play symbols and their captions located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, and which are not printed on a "CASH" symbol, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUM-BERS" area, and which are printed on a "CASH" symbol, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols located in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area are: Skull (SKULL) symbol, Potion (POTION) symbol, Spider (SPIDER) symbol, Haunted House (HNTD HOUSE) symbol, Pumpkin (PUMPKIN) symbol and a Bat (BAT) symbol.
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: \$5.00 (FIV DOL), \$10.00 (TEN DOL), \$13.00 (THIRTEEN), \$20.00 (TWENTY), \$31.00 (TRYONE), \$50.00 (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$500 (FIV HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO) and \$31,000 (TRYONETHO). The prize symbols and their captions located in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area are: \$5.00 (FIV DOL), \$10.00 (TEN DOL), \$13.00 (THIRTEEN), \$20.00 (TWENTY), \$31.00 (TRYONE), \$50.00 (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN) and \$500 (FIV HUN).
- (d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$5, \$10, \$13, \$20, \$31, \$50, \$100, \$500, \$1,000 and \$31,000. The prizes that can be won in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area are: \$5, \$10, \$13, \$20, \$31, \$50, \$100 and \$500. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to 14 times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 480,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Count de Cash lottery game.
- 6. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct an Eek-a-Boo Second-Chance Drawing for

- which non-winning Trick or Win lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9 (relating to second-chance drawing).
- 7. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All Count de Cash prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$31,000 (TRYONETHO) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$31,000.
- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000
- (d) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.
- (e) Holders of tickets upon which three Bat (BAT) play symbols appear in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.
- (f) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (g) Holders of tickets upon which three Bat (BAT) play symbols appear in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (h) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (i) Holders of tickets upon which three Bat (BAT) play symbols appear in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (j) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$31.00 (TRYONE) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$31.
- (k) Holders of tickets upon which any five of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols appear printed on a "CASH" symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$31.
- (l) Holders of tickets upon which three Bat (BAT) play symbols appear in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area

and a prize symbol of \$31.00 (TRYONE) appears in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$31.

- (m) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (n) Holders of tickets upon which three Bat (BAT) play symbols appear in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$20^{.00} (TWENTY) appears in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (o) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$13.00 (THIRTEEN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$13.
- (p) Holders of tickets upon which three Bat (BAT) play symbols appear in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$13^{.00} (THIRTEEN) appears in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$13.

- (q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (r) Holders of tickets upon which three Bat (BAT) play symbols appear in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area and a prize symbol of $$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (s) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- (t) Holders of tickets upon which three Bat (BAT) play symbols appear in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the "DRAC-CASH-TIC BONUS" area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- 8. Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning: The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate chances of winning:

iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

- (5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.
- (d) Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:
- (1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 9(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.
- (2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 9(c)(2).

- (3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.
- (4) Employees of the Pennsylvania Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), Scientific Games, LLC and MDI Entertainment, LLC, (collectively "SG") and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.
- (5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.
- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Pennsylvania Lottery.
- (7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the

operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

- (8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) Cash prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within one (1) year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.
- (10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.
- (11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).
- (12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.
- (13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.
- (14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery terms and conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 90 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 9(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's account.
 - (15) Prizes are not transferrable.
 - (16) Other restrictions may apply.
 - 10. Ticket responsibility:
- (a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.
- (b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.
- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.
 - 11. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
 - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.

- (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
 - 12. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;
 - (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
 - (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.
- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.
- 13. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 14. *Unclaimed prizes*: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

15. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

16. Governing law:

- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Count de Cash lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
 - 17. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 18. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Count de Cash lottery game tickets.
- 19. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win
- 20. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Count de Cash or through normal communications methods.

21. Applicability: This notice applies only to the Count de Cash lottery game announced in this notice.

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. Name: The name of the Fast Play lottery game is Pennsylvania GAME OF THRONES $^{\rm TM}$ ("GAME OF THRONES $^{\rm TM}$ "). The game number is PA-5253.

2. Definitions:

- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) Bar code: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (c) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (d) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (e) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.
- (f) *Play*: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (g) $Play\ Area$: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.
- (h) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (i) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (j) WINNING NUMBERS: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area.
- (k) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (l) WINTER WINALL: The area at the bottom of a GAME OF THRONES $^{\rm TM}$ ticket where the player wins all

16 prizes shown in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area when an Iron Throne (WINALL) symbol appears.

- (m) YOUR NUMBERS: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area.
- 3. Price: The price of a GAME OF THRONESTM ticket is \$10.
- 4. Description of the GAME OF THRONESTM Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) The GAME OF THRONESTM lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. GAME OF THRONESTM tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) GAME OF THRONESTM is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. Whenever a Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, the player wins the prize shown under that Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol automatically. When a 7X (7TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, the player multiplies the prize shown under that 7X (7TIMES) symbol by 7 and wins that amount. Whenever an Iron Throne (WINALL) symbol appears in the "WINTER WINALL" area, the player wins all 16 prizes shown in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (d) GAME OF THRONES $^{\rm TM}$ tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (e) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a GAME OF THRONESTM ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
- (f) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a GAME OF THRONESTM ticket and select the GAME OF THRONESTM option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
 - 5. GAME OF THRONESTM ticket characteristics:
- (a) GAME OF THRONESTM tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: GAME OF THRONESTM tickets will contain one play area featuring a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a "WINTER WINALL" area. The play symbols and their captions located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV),

- 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRT), a 7X (7TIMES) symbol and a Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINTER WINALL" area are: Targaryen (TARGARYEN) symbol, Baratheon (BARATHEON) symbol, Tyrell (TYRELL) symbol and an Iron Throne (WINALL) symbol.
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions, located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area, are: $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL), $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY), $\$30^{.00}$ (THIRTY), $\$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY), $\$70^{.00}$ (SEVENTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$300 (THR HUN), \$700 (SVN HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO) and \$150,000 (ONEFTYTHO).
- (d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game, are: \$10, \$20, \$30, \$50, \$70, \$100, \$300, \$700, \$1,000 and \$150,000. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to 16 times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 1,440,000 tickets will be available for sale for the GAME OF THRONES $^{\rm TM}$ lottery game.
- 6. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct a GAME OF THRONESTM Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning GAME OF THRONESTM lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9 (relating to second-chance drawing).
- 7. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All GAME OF THRONES $^{\rm TM}$ prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$150,000 (ONEFTYTHO) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$150,000.
- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (d) Holders of tickets upon which a Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the Prize area under that Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.
- (e) Holders of tickets upon which an Iron Throne (WINALL) symbol appears in the "WINTER WINALL" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in six of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of $\$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY)

appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$30.00 (THIRTY) appears in five of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

- (l) Holders of tickets upon which a 7X (7TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $$70^{.00}$ (SEVENTY) appears in the Prize area under that 7X (7TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$490.
- (m) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$300 (THR HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.
- (n) Holders of tickets upon which a Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$300 (THR HUN) appears in the Prize area under that Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.
- (o) Holders of tickets upon which an Iron Throne (WINALL) symbol appears in the "WINTER WINALL" area and a prize symbol of \$50 $^{.00}$ (FIFTY) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$30 $^{.00}$ (THIRTY) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$20 $^{.00}$

(TWENTY) appears in two of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in ten of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.

- (p) Holders of tickets upon which an Iron Throne (WINALL) symbol appears in the "WINTER WINALL" area and a prize symbol of \$30^{.00} (THIRTY) appears in five of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$20^{.00} (TWENTY) appears in four of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$10^{.00} (TEN DOL) appears in seven of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.
- (q) Holders of tickets upon which an Iron Throne (WINALL) symbol appears in the "WINTER WINALL" area and a prize symbol of $$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in five of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of $$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in ten of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$300.
- (r) Holders of tickets upon which a 7X (7TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $\$30^{.00}$ (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under that 7X (7TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$210.
- (s) Holders of tickets upon which a 7X (7TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under that 7X (7TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$140.
- (t) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (u) Holders of tickets upon which a Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under that Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (v) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$70.00 (SEVENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$70.
- (w) Holders of tickets upon which a Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $\$70^{.00}$ (SEVENTY) appears in the Prize area under that Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$70.
- (x) Holders of tickets upon which a 7X (7TIMES) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under that 7X (7TIMES) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$70.
- (y) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.

- (z) Holders of tickets upon which a Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of 50^{00} (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under that Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of 50^{10}
- (aa) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30.00 (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (bb) Holders of tickets upon which a Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$30.00 (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under that Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (cc) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

- (dd) Holders of tickets upon which a Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol appears in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under that Dragon Egg (DRAGON EGG) symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (ee) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

- (1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit https://www.PAiLottery.com. Creating a lottery account is free.
- (2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/, as well as any related policies.
- (3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:
- (i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;
 - (ii) The player's date of birth;
- (iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;
 - (iv) The player's address;
 - (v) The player's telephone number;
 - (vi) The player's email address;
- (vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.
- (4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.
- (5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at https://www.palottery.com, or the Lottery's official mobile application during the entry period. The entry period for qualifying instant tickets will begin after 11:59:59 p.m. September 15, 2024, and will end at 11:59:59 p.m. January 23, 2025. All entries received during the entry periods will be entered in the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between January 24, 2025 and February 7, 2025.
- (3) The entry periods for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site at https://www.palottery.com.
- (4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Ticket is as follows: PA-1706 GAME OF THRONESTM (\$10) = ten entries and PA-5253 GAME OF THRONESTM (\$10) = ten entries.
- (5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.
- (d) Prizes available to be won, determination of winners, and odds of winning:
- (1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations mentioned anywhere in these rules.
- (2) The Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 9(c)(2).
- (3) The first through the forty-fourth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of one THE SEVEN KINGDOMS EXPERIENCE Trip Prize Package, as described in section 9(e) (relating to THE SEVEN KINGDOMS EXPERIENCE trip prize package description) of these rules.
- (4) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site.
- (5) The odds of winning in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.
- (6) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.
- (e) THE SEVEN KINGDOMS EXPERIENCE Trip Prize Package Description:
- (1) Each THE SEVEN KINGDOMS EXPERIENCE Trip Prize Package ("Trip Prize Package") shall consist of a five-day, four-night trip for the Trip Prize Package Winner ("Trip Prize Winner") and up to one guest to Napa Valley, California and subsequently to San Francisco, California during the Fall of 2025.
- (2) The specific date and location of the Trip Prize Package events are subject to change and will be confirmed during the fulfillment process. Each Trip Prize Package shall include:
- (i) Round trip airfare, if required, for up to two coach class tickets on a major airline, as defined by the Federal Aviation Administration, from a United States interna-

- tional airport to a San Francisco-area international airport in San Francisco, California (inclusive of all security fees, taxes and surcharges). It is the responsibility of the Trip Prize Winner to comply with the REAL ID Act to the extent that the Act is applicable to the Trip Prize Winner's air travel.
- (ii) Ground transfers between the San Francisco-area International Airport and the assigned destination hotel and, if necessary, between the hotel and Scientific Games, LLC ("SG") hosted events.
- (iii) One double occupancy room accommodation (room and room tax only), at a three star or better hotel room in Napa Valley, California, for three nights and one double occupancy room accommodation (room and room tax only), at a three star or better hotel room in San Francisco, California, for one night.
- (iv) Admission to the Welcome Reception, the Napa Wine Train and a selected variety of curated tours and activities in and around California's Napa Valley for the Trip Prize Winner and guest.
- (v) \$1,000 spending money for the Trip Prize Winner, provided in the form of a check mailed to the winner after successful completion and validation of the prize claim process as described in section 9(h) (relating to prize claim procedure), below.
- (vi) State income tax withholding in the amount of \$145.51 and federal income tax withholding of \$3,594.24 (excluding any additional prizes won during THE SEVEN KINGDOMS EXPERIENCE Event).
- (f) THE SEVEN KINGDOMS EXPERIENCE Event Description: Each THE SEVEN KINGDOMS EXPERIENCE Event ("Event") shall consist of:
- (1) Each Trip Prize Winner shall receive the chance to participate in the Event.
- (2) The Event shall afford each Trip Prize Winner or Proxy one chance to participate as a Contestant together with Contestants from other participating lotteries for the chance to win a shared cash prize ranging from \$25,000 to \$7,000,000, as described below.
 - (3) The Event shall consist of:
- (i) Admission to the Event venue for the Trip Prize Winner ("Contestant") and one guest. Each Contestant shall be randomly assigned to one of seven Houses (each a "House" or plural, the "Houses") along with other Contestants. The number of Contestants in a House (a "House Member" or plural, "House Members") will be determined based on lottery participation.
- (ii) Participation in a House Ruler Selection and one to three (3) rounds (each a "Round" or plural, "Rounds") of the Event, as described below.
- (A) PRE-EVENT HOUSE RULER SELECTION: Prior to the start of Round #1, one (1) House Member from each of the seven Houses will be randomly selected, using a ball machine, as the House Ruler (the "House Ruler" or plural, "House Rulers") to represent their House in the Event going forward.
- (B) Round #1 JOUSTING TOURNAMENT: During Round #1 each House will be randomly assigned a jouster (each a "Jouster" or plural, "Jousters") for the chance to win a cash prize that will be split evenly among all House Members of each House. The JOUSTING TOURNAMENT will include three (3) matches (each a "Match" or plural, "Matches"), with the match pairings and outcomes randomly determined prior to the event, as follows:

(1) Match #1 Quarterfinal: At the beginning of Match #1, one of the seven Houses will randomly be assigned a tournament bye ("House Bye") and will not be paired with another House for Match #1, automatically advancing to Match #2. The remaining six Houses will each participate in Match #1, where three Houses will be eliminated. Each eliminated House will win a prize of \$25,000 that will be split evenly among all House Members in that House, and the eliminated Houses' Event participation will end. The three remaining Houses along with the House Bye will advance to Match #2 of Round #1.

- (2) Match #2 Semifinal: The remaining four Houses will each participate in Match #2, where two Houses will be eliminated. Each eliminated House will win a prize of \$100,000 that will be split evenly among all House Members in that House, and the eliminated Houses' Event participation will end. The two remaining Houses will advance to Match #3 of Round #1.
- (3) Match #3 Final: The two remaining Houses will each participate in Match #3, where one House will be eliminated. The eliminated House will win a prize of \$250,000 that will be evenly split among all House Members in that House and the eliminated House's Event participation will end. The winning House will win a prize of \$1,000,000 that will be evenly split among all House Members in that House, and the winning House's Ruler will become the House Finalist in Round #3.
- (C) Round #2 DRAGON EGGS BONUS. Each of the seven House Rulers will have the opportunity to win an individual prize ranging from \$7,000 to \$77,000 that will not be shared among the respective Houses. At the start of Round #2, the Event Host will call each House Ruler, in a randomly selected order, to select one of 15 numbered Dragon Eggs (each a "Dragon Egg" or plural, "Dragon Eggs"). Each Dragon Egg will contain an envelope that, when opened, will reveal a prize amount. After a House Ruler selects a Dragon Egg, that House Ruler's Event participation will end, with the exception of the House Ruler Finalist determined in Match #1.
- (D) Round #3 THE SPOILS OF WAR. The House Ruler Finalist will have a chance to spin a wheel up to three times for the chance to win an additional prize of up to \$6,000,000 that will be evenly split among all House Members in that House.
 - (g) Prize Package restrictions:
 - (1) There is no cash option for the Trip Prize Package.
- (2) The Lottery is not responsible for injury, loss or damage to person or property in connection with the Trip Prize Package. A Trip Prize Winner and guest participate solely at their own risk and responsibility.
- (3) Lottery is not responsible for Trip Prize Package fulfillment. Lottery disclaims any responsibility for any and every occurrence with respect to fulfillment or enjoyment of the Trip Prize Package.
- (4) All Trip Prize Winners must be 18 years of age or older at the time of the scheduled Trip Prize Package in order to participate in the Event. If the Trip Prize Winner is not 18 years of age or older at the time of the scheduled Trip Prize Package, they may designate a Proxy to participate in the Event. The designated Proxy must be 18 years of age or older at the time of the scheduled Trip Prize Package. If a Trip Prize Winner is under the age of 21, any guest must be at least the age of majority in the guest's state of residence in order to check in to the hotel as described in section 9(e) (relating to prize package description) above. If the Trip Prize win-

ner's guest is a minor, the Trip Prize winner must either be the parent or legal guardian of such guest, or must present a notarized, written consent from the minor's parent or legal guardian for the minor guest to accompany the Trip Prize winner on the Trip Prize. Trip Prize Winners are solely responsible for the actions of accompanying guests.

- (5) By accepting the Trip Prize Package, Trip Prize Winner and guest agree a background investigation, derived from public information, prior to the Trip Prize departure date.
- (6) By accepting the Trip Prize Package, Trip Prize Winner and guest agree to follow all health and safety protocols, including always wearing a facemask and following social distancing guidelines, as instructed by the event's staff and volunteers and all federal, state, and local guidelines relating to COVID-19 or any pandemic.
- (7) All expenses involved with or related to the Trip Prize Package not specifically included in the Trip Prize Package Description, as described in section 9(e), above, including, without limitation, ground transportation, transfers, additional hotel amenities (i.e., spa services, internet access, phone calls, laundry services, room service, fees and gratuities), airline change fees, airline premium seat fees, airline baggage fees both checked and carry on, travel insurance and personal expenses such as laundry, valet service, photos, souvenirs, and other incidentals), are the responsibility of Trip Prize Winner and guest.
- (8) Trip Prize Winners will be required to submit a valid major credit card to the hotel to cover all expenses not specifically awarded as part of the Trip Prize Package.
- (9) Travel and hotel accommodations are subject to availability.
- (10) The date and location of any events included within the Trip Prize Package may be subject to change. The Lottery is not responsible if any event is delayed, postponed, or cancelled for any reason, in whole or in part, and in such event, the Lottery's only obligation is to award the other elements of the Trip Prize Package. No compensation will be paid in lieu of any cancelled event or any other element of the Trip Prize Package.
- (11) Trip Prize Winners and guests must comply with all of the rules and regulations of the venues where the events are held and all applicable federal, state, and local government and/or agency laws, rules, orders, and regulations as well as any rules, regulations, and safety guidelines. Trip Prize Winners acknowledge that if winners or guests behave in a disorderly or disruptive manner or with intent to annoy, abuse, threaten, or harass any other person at any event, winners and/or guests may be removed from the venue or denied entry as determined by SG or its designee(s) in their sole and absolute discretion.
- (12) Trip Prize Winners who do not elect to take a guest, or whose guest, for any reason, does not actually take the trip, are still subject to the full amount of any taxes due on the total value of the Trip Prize Package.
- (13) By accepting any ticketed portion of the Trip Prize Package, Trip Prize Winners agree to abide by any terms, conditions, and restrictions provided. Lost, mutilated, or stolen tickets, vouchers, certificates, or pre-paid gift cards will not be replaced.
- (14) In the event that a Trip Prize Winner misses their flight, reasonable efforts will be used to reschedule the flight at the Trip Prize Winner's expense. If the flight is

- not able to be rescheduled in a reasonable time for the Trip Prize Winner's participation in the elements of the Trip Prize Package, the Lottery or SG will appoint a Proxy to participate in the Event for the Trip Prize Winner, and the Trip Prize Winner shall receive any prizes won by the Proxy.
- (15) If a Trip Prize Package winner chooses not to travel or becomes ineligible for any reason, provided travel has not yet been booked, that winner may appoint a Proxy during the fulfillment process and the Trip Prize Winner shall receive any prize won by the Proxy.
- (16) If, after claiming the Trip Prize Package, the Trip Prize Winner fails to check in to the participating hotel when arriving in Napa Valley, California or San Francisco, California, SG will use reasonable efforts to hold the participating hotel reservation. It is the Trip Prize Winner's responsibility to communicate with SG in the event of a delay in hotel registration and/or required Event registration. If Trip Prize Winner has communicated any delay to SG, SG and the participating hotel will hold the hotel room on behalf of the Trip Prize Winner. - (17) If, after claiming the Trip Prize Package, the Trip Prize Winner fails to arrive for scheduled Event participation, the Trip Prize Winner will forfeit the right to personally participate in the Event and a Proxy will be appointed. The Trip Prize Winner will receive any prize won by the Proxy.
- (18) In the event that the Trip Prize Winner does not designate a Proxy and a Proxy becomes necessary to participate in the Event, for any reason, SG or the Lottery will appoint a Proxy. The Trip Prize Winner acknowledges that the appointed Proxy will have to make decisions on behalf of the Trip Prize Winner and therefore that the Trip Prize Winner delegates the power, authority, or discretion to the appointed Proxy to make such decisions on the Trip Prize Winner's behalf. In such event, SG assumes all liability which, in any way, may be associated with the appointment. There shall be no charge for the appointment of a Proxy. The Trip Prize Winner will receive any prize won by the Proxy.
- (19) If a Trip Prize Winner or designated Proxy fails to book the trip forty-five (45) calendar days prior to the departure date, that Trip Prize Package shall be forfeited, as described in section 9(g)(20).
- (20) The forfeiture of any Trip Prize Package includes forfeiture of attendance at any of the events or activities included in the Trip Prize as described in section 9(e), above. In the event that a Trip Prize Winner must forfeit a Trip Prize Package, an alternate winner will be selected according to Lottery procedure.
- (21) Except as set forth above, no prize element substitution, cash substitution, assignment, or transfer of the Trip Prize Package or any elements thereof is permitted. Any unused elements of the Trip Prize Package will be forfeited, will not be redeemable for cash, and may not reduce the prize value awarded for tax purposes.

- (22) The total amount of any cash prize won, less required income tax withholding, will be mailed to each Trip Prize Winner within 30 business days after the Trip Prize Winner's departure from California. SG shall withhold from such cash prizes the minimum required federal tax withholdings and any applicable state tax withholdings and shall deposit said withholdings on behalf of the Trip Prize Winner to the appropriate agencies. The Trip Prize Winner will receive an IRS Tax Form W-2G, and may be responsible for additional state or federal taxes.
- (23) In the event that a Trip Prize Package is not claimed or is refused by the Trip Prize Winner, the Lottery will select an alternate winner according to Lottery procedure, provided that such prize is still available and time requirements have not elapsed.
- (24) During Round #1, Match #1 and Match #3 of the Event, all House Members in a House shall be awarded an equal prize amount (a "Prize Split") if a shared prize is won. In the event that a House contains more than 16 House Members, each House Member shall receive one sixteenth of the prize won, regardless of the number of House Members in that House, if the number of House Members is greater than 16.
 - (h) Prize claim procedures:
- (1) Winners of any prize awarded in the Drawing will be contacted by email by the Pennsylvania Lottery to initiate the prize claim procedure.
- (2) Winners will have fourteen (14) calendar days from the date they are notified by the Pennsylvania Lottery, pursuant to this section, to claim their prizes. In order to claim their prizes, winners must respond to the Pennsylvania Lottery's email regarding prize claim procedure and must submit a properly completed prize claim form within fourteen (14) calendar days from the date they are notified by the Pennsylvania Lottery. Failure to comply with the prize claim requirements as set forth herein, for any reason, shall result in the winner forfeiting their right to receive the prize. Another alternate winner will be awarded the respective prize, according to Lottery procedure.
- (3) By entering into the Drawing, players agree to be bound by these rules and the prize claim requirements set forth herein, and expressly waive any claim against the Lottery for a prize not awarded in conformance with these rules.
 - (i) Delinquent Support Offset:
- (1) If the Department of Human Services, pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S.A. § 4308, the Department of Revenue or the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, pursuant to 72 P.S. § 215, determines that a prize winner is a delinquent support obligor as provided in 23 Pa.C.S.A. § 4308 or 72 P.S. § 215, and if the amount of any arrearages shall be \$1,000, or less, the amount of any arrearages shall be deducted from the spending money portion of the Trip Prize Package. After the delinquent support obligation is met, the Prize Package winner will receive the remaining portion of the Prize Package spending money, if any, which shall be fulfilled according to Lottery procedure.
- (2) If the Department of Human Services, pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S.A. § 4308, the Department of Revenue or the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, pursuant to 72 P.S. § 215, determines that a prize winner is a delinquent support obligor, as provided in 23 Pa.C.S.A. § 4308 or 72 P.S. § 215, and if the amount of any arrearages shall be greater than \$1,000, the prize winner

shall forfeit the prize and shall be considered to have waived their right to receive the prize, as described in section 9(g)(20)) (relating to prize package restrictions). In this event, the Lottery will select another entry to replace the forfeited entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

- (j) Drawing restrictions:
- (1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.
- (2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. If an entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select another entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.
- (3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.
- (4) Employees of the Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC (formerly known as MARC USA, LLC), Scientific Games, LLC and MDI Entertainment, LLC (collectively "SG"), and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.
- (5) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs, or any other cause beyond the control of the Lottery that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity, or proper conduct of the Drawing.
- (6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.
- (7) The Pennsylvania Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.
- (8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.
- (9) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).
- (10) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.
- (11) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the Drawing will be disqualified and a replacement entry will be selected.
 - (12) Prizes are not transferrable.
 - (13) Other restrictions may apply.

- 10. Ticket responsibility:
- (a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.
- (b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.
- (c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.
 - 11. Ticket validation and requirements:
- (a) Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets. To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:
- (1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.
 - (2) The game ticket must be intact.
- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.
 - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
 - 12. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.
- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.
- (c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.
- (d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:
- (1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;

- (2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;
- (3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and
- (4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).
- (e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.
- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.
- 13. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 14. Unclaimed prizes: Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.
- 15. Purchase and prize restrictions: A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.
 - 16. Governing law:
- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play GAME OF THRONES IN lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.
 - 17. Retailer compensation:
- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 18. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play GAME OF THRONESTM lottery game tickets.
- 19. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket

that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

- 20. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote GAME OF THRONESTM or through normal communications methods.
- 21. Applicability: This notice applies only to the GAME OF THRONES $^{\rm TM}$ lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Trick or Win Fast Play Game 5256

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

- 1. Name: The name of the Fast Play lottery game is Pennsylvania Trick or Win ("Trick or Win"). The game number is PA-5256.
 - 2. Definitions:
- (a) Authorized retailer or retailer: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.
- (b) Bar code: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.
- (c) Game Ticket: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.
- (d) Lottery Central Computer System: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.
- (e) Lottery Terminal: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing

plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

- (f) *Play*: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.
- (g) Play Area: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.
- (h) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.
- (i) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.
- (j) *TRICK OR TRY AGAIN*: The area located in the middle of a Trick or Win ticket where the player wins all six prizes shown in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area when a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears.
- (k) WINNING NUMBERS: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area.
- (l) Winning ticket: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.
- (m) YOUR NUMBERS: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area.
 - 3. *Price*: The price of a Trick or Win ticket is \$1.
- 4. Description of the Trick or Win Fast Play lottery game:
- (a) The Trick or Win lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Trick or Win tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.
- (b) Trick or Win is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player correctly matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown to the right of the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. Whenever a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area, the player wins all six prizes shown in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area. A bet slip is not used to play this game.
- (c) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).
- (d) Trick or Win tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.
- (e) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Trick or Win ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

- (f) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Trick or Win ticket and select the Trick or Win option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.
 - 5. Trick or Win ticket characteristics:
- (a) Trick or Win tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.
- (b) Play Symbols: Trick or Win tickets will contain a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area and a "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area. The play symbols and their captions, located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area and the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN) and 20 (TWENT). The play symbols and their captions located in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area are: Spiderweb (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Cat (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Tombstone (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Ghost (TRYAGAIN) symbol and a TRICK (WINALL) symbol.
- (c) Prize Symbols: The prize symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: FREE (TICKET), $\$1^{.00}$ (ONE DOL), $\$2^{.00}$ (TWO DOL), $\$3^{.00}$ (THR DOL), $\$4^{.00}$ (FOR DOL), $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL), $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL), $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY), $\$30^{.00}$ (THIRTY), $\$40^{.00}$ (FORTY), $\$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN) and \$1,300 (THRTNHUN).
- (d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: Free \$1 Ticket, \$1, \$2, \$3, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$30, \$40, \$50, \$100, and \$1,300. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to six times on a ticket.
- (e) Approximate number of tickets available for the game: Approximately 960,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Trick or Win lottery game.
- 6. Second-Chance Drawing: The Pennsylvania Lottery will conduct an Eek-a-Boo Second-Chance Drawing for which non-winning Trick or Win lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9 (relating to second-chance drawing).
- 7. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:
- (a) All Trick or Win prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.
- (b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,300 (THRTNHUN) appears in the Prize area to the right of the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,300.
- (c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area to the right of the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (d) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of $\$20^{.00}$ (TWENTY) appears in three of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL)

- appears in two of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of $\$30^{.00}$ (THIRTY) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (e) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of $$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of $$50^{.00}$ (FIFTY) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.
- (f) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50.00 (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area to the right of the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (g) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$1.00 (ONE DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (h) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in four of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (i) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of \$5 $^{.00}$ (FIV DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$4 $^{.00}$ (FOR DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$30 $^{.00}$ (THIRTY) appears in one of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$2 $^{.00}$ (TWO DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$50.
- (j) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$40.00 (FORTY) appears in the Prize area to the right of the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.
- (k) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$1.00 (ONE DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in one of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.
- (l) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of $\$2^{.00}$ (TWO DOL) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of $\$30^{.00}$ (THIRTY) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.
- (m) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of $\$30^{.00}$ (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area to the right of the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (n) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in two of the

Prize areas, a prize symbol of $\$2^{.00}$ (TWO DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of $\$5^{.00}$ (FIV DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of $\$1^{.00}$ (ONE DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30

- (o) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.
- (p) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area to the right of the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (q) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of $\$4^{.00}$ (FOR DOL) appears in four of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of $\$2^{.00}$ (TWO DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (r) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of \$4^{.00} (FOR DOL) appears in three of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$5^{.00} (FIV DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$2^{.00} (TWO DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$1^{.00} (ONE DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (s) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of $\$2^{.00}$ (TWO DOL) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of $\$10^{.00}$ (TEN DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.
- (t) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area to the right of the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (u) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in four of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$1.00 (ONE DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

- (v) Holders of tickets upon which a TRICK (WINALL) symbol appears in the "TRICK OR TRY AGAIN" area and a prize symbol of \$1.00 (ONE DOL) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.
- (w) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area to the right of the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.
- (x) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING NUMBERS" play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in the Prize area to the right of the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.

- (8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

- (3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.
- (4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.
 - (5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.
- (6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.
- (7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.
- (8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.
- (b) Invalid or defective game tickets. A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.
 - 12. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:
- (a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.

- (b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.

- (f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.
- 13. Funding for prizes: Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.
- 14.  - 16. Governing law:
- (a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Trick or Win lottery game.
- (b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

17. Retailer compensation:

- (a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.
- (b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.
- 18. Retailer Incentive Programs: The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Trick or Win lottery game tickets.
- 19. Retailer bonus: The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.
- 20. Termination of the game: The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Trick or Win or through normal communications methods.
- 21. Applicability: This notice applies only to the Trick or Win lottery game announced in this notice.

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

Finding

Under section 2002 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 512) establishing the Department of Transportation, the Director of the Bureau of Design and Delivery, as delegated by the Secretary of Transportation, makes the following written finding:

The selected alternative (Alternative 1) includes improvements to Exit 164 State Route (SR) 0029—Nanticoke) and Exits 165A and B (Mountain Top/Wilkes-Barre) as well as a partial realignment of I-81 northbound

and southbound. The selected alternative includes the addition of a third travel lane along both I-81 northbound and southbound to accommodate current and future traffic growth. This alternative also includes significant improvements to the I-81 northbound exit and entrance ramps with SR 0029. The SR 0029 southbound movement to I-81 northbound ramp will utilize an update to the existing ramp that passes SR 0029 under I-81. The existing I-81 northbound loop exit ramp to SR 0029 northbound will be eliminated and replaced with a proposed ramp that continues an exclusive exit loop ramp that traverses under I-81 northbound and southbound mainline using the same structures that cross over SR 0309.

A new diamond interchange between I-81 and SR 0309 is proposed in the middle-bifurcated area. I-81 north-bound and southbound will be relocated to the middle of the bifurcated area to create alignments for both directions of traffic that will meet or exceed the current design requirements for a 70-mph design speed. SR 0309 will also be relocated farther to the west within the bifurcated area to better align with the proposed diamond interchange with I-81. The existing connection of Hazleton Street (SR 2003) with the existing SR 0309 will be eliminated with this alternative. Hazleton Street will be realigned to connect with the realigned SR 0309 to the west of the proposed diamond interchange.

The Environmental Assessment (EA) and EA comment responses have been evaluated by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and were determined to discuss adequately and accurately the need, environmental issues and impacts of the proposed project and mitigation measures that will be taken to minimize harm as stipulated in the EA. Based on the EA, the FHWA has issued a Finding of No Significant Impact for the project. The Bureau of Design and Delivery has concluded that all State Environmental Evaluation Requirements, as published in section 2002 of The Administrative Code of 1929, have been satisfied.

Mitigation measures will be taken to minimize harm as stipulated in the EA. No significant environmental impact is likely to result from the proposed action.

The Department is planning the following projects. Environmental and Section 4(f) Documentation have been developed for the following identified projects to evaluate the potential environmental impacts caused by these projects. The Section 4(f) documents also serve as the Section 2002 Evaluation. The approved documents are available in the CE/EA Expert System at dominoappsbp. penndot.pa.gov/ceea/ceeamain.nsf. The environmental,

economic, social and other effects of the proposed projects have been considered. Based upon studies, there is no feasible and prudent alternative to the use of the Section 2002 resources for the proposed projects identified, and all reasonable steps have been taken to minimize the effects

SR 0062, Section 13M—Sandycreek Township and the City of Franklin, Venango County.

Project Description: The project is for resurfacing as well as intersection, signal and ADA sidewalk improvements on State Route (SR) 62, SR 322 and SR 8.

Environmental Documents: CE 1b Evaluation approved on June 5, 2024, and a Determination of Section 4(f) De Minimis Use Section 2002 No Adverse Use Historic Properties approved on January 30, 2024.

Proposed Use of Section 4(f)/2002 Resource: Approximately 0.0237-acre of right-of-way (ROW) will be required from the approximately 26 city blocks of the City of Franklin Historic District, which is listed in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP).

Cancelation of Certificates of Public Convenience for Telecommunication Utilities; Failure to Operate or Report Any Intrastate Operating Revenue; M-2024-3049348

Tentative Order

By the Commission:

The Public Utility Code (Code) requires that by March 31st of each year, every public utility must file a report detailing its total gross intrastate operating revenue for the preceding calendar year. 66 Pa.C.S. § 510(b). This report is essential for the Commission to fund its operations and to properly allocate assessment costs among the regulated utility community. Id. Commission regulations authorize the cancelation of a telecommunication utility's Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC) for failure to comply with applicable reporting requirements such as the filing of annual financial reports. See 52 Pa. Code § 63.36.

The Commission has undertaken a review of its records which has revealed that a significant number of telecommunication utilities have repeatedly failed to file the required annual assessment report or have continually reported zero intrastate operating revenue in their filed annual assessment report. Specifically, each telecommunication utility listed in Appendix A, attached hereto, has failed to report any intrastate operating revenue to the Commission since calendar year 2020. The telecommunication utilities listed in Appendix B have either reported zero intrastate revenue since 2020 or reported zero intrastate revenue in any year since 2020 in combination with not reporting intrastate operating revenue.

The Commission's Bureau of Administration sent a final warning letter to each individual telecommunication utility listed in Appendix A and Appendix B, requesting that they either file an assessment report detailing their annual intrastate operating revenue for the applicable period or notify the Commission of their desire to abandon their CPCs. The telecommunication utilities were provided twenty (20) days to comply. The letter further warned the telecommunication utilities that their failure to comply with the filing directive would result in the Commission taking appropriate action to cancel their CPCs. None of the telecommunication utilities listed in Appendix A or Appendix B responded to the warning letter.

The Public Utility Code requires each telecommunications public utility to operate continuously and without unreasonable interruptions of service. 66 Pa.C.S. § 1501. Section 510(b) of the Code requires these public utilities to file a report detailing their total gross intrastate operating revenue for the preceding calendar year based on the intrastate revenues it generates from the jurisdictional telecommunications services it offers within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. 66 Pa.C.S. § 510(b).

Under the present circumstances, the failure of the telecommunication utilities listed in Appendix A to file an annual assessment report for various years has created a rebuttable presumption that they are not operating in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Additionally, the continual filing of zero intrastate operating revenue in their annual assessment form by the telecommunication utilities listed in Appendix B has created a rebuttable presumption that they are not providing jurisdictional telecommunications services in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

As such, we determine that the actions of failing to file an annual assessment report with the Commission or reporting zero intrastate operating revenue in each successive calendar year since 2020 indicates that there is no need for these non-reporting or zero reporting telecommunications utilities to possess a CPC in Pennsylvania. These carriers are not in compliance with the reporting requirements of 66 Pa.C.S. § 510(b) nor are they in compliance with the operational requirements of 66 Pa.C.S. § 1501. Based on their failure to cure these deficiencies in a timely manner, we tentatively conclude that it is in the public interest to initiate the process for canceling the telecommunication utilities' CPCs listed in Appendix A and Appendix B; *Therefore*,

It Is Ordered:

- 1. That cancelation of the Certificates of Public Convenience of each telecommunication utility listed in Appendix A and Appendix B is hereby tentatively approved as being in the public interest.
- 2. That all parties listed in Appendices A and B, to the extent they challenge the rebuttable presumption created by their actions and inactions which led to the conclusion that cancelation of their CPC remains appropriate and in the public interest, must file comments in support of their challenge no later than 20 days after publication of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The comments shall be sent to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, Attn: Secretary Rosemary Chiavetta, Commonwealth Keystone Building, 400 North Street, 2nd Floor, Harrisburg, PA 17120.
- 3. Alternatively, the telecommunication utilities listed in Appendices A and B may file an Assessment Report with the Commission's Fiscal Office reflecting their total gross intrastate operating revenues for calendar years 2020, 2021 and 2022, no later than 20 days after publication of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*
- 4. That absent the timely filing of any comment challenging cancelation of the CPC, or the timely reporting of a telecommunication utility's gross intrastate operating revenues from calendar years 2020, 2021 and 2022, the Law Bureau shall prepare a Final Order for entry by the Secretary canceling the telecommunication utility's CPC.
- 5. That upon entry of the Final Order described in Ordering Paragraph No. 4 above, the CPC of each non-compliant carrier shall be canceled, and each non-compliant carrier listed in Appendix A and Appendix B will be stricken from all active utility lists maintained by the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services and the Fiscal & Assessments Section of the Bureau of Administration.
- 6. That the Secretary serve a copy of this Tentative Order upon the Bureau of Investigation & Enforcement, the Bureau of Technical Utility Services, the Bureau of Administration, Department of Revenue—Bureau of Cor-

poration Taxes, and all telecommunication utilities listed in Appendix A and Appendix B. The Tentative Order shall be filed at each carrier's docket number.

7. That the Law Bureau shall publish a copy of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.
