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
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# READER'S GUIDE TO THE PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN AND THE PENNSYLVANIA CODE

#### Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

## Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rule-making must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

#### Citation to the Pennsylvania Bulletin

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

#### Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

#### **How to Find Rules and Regulations**

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylva*nia Code. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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#### **Printing Format**

Rules, Regulations and Statements of Policy in Titles 1—107 of the Pennsylvania Code

Text proposed to be added is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Text proposed to be deleted is enclosed in brackets [ ] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and sections are printed in regular type to enhance readability. Final rulemakings and statements of policy are printed in regular type.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in <u>underscored bold face</u>. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [ ] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

#### **Fiscal Notes**

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P.S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

## PROPOSED RULEMAKING

#### STATE BOARD OF PSYCHOLOGY

[ 49 PA. CODE CH. 41 ]

#### Accreditation

The State Board of Psychology (Board) proposes to amend §§ 41.1, 41.31 and 41.61 (relating to definitions; educational qualifications; and Code of Ethics) to read as set forth in Annex A.

Effective Date

This proposed rulemaking will be effective upon publication of the final-form rulemaking in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Statutory Authority

The Board has the authority to adopt and revise the regulations that govern its licensees under the authority granted to it by section 3.2 of the Professional Psychologists Practice Act (act) (63 P.S. § 1203.2). Under section 3.2(1) and (2) of the act, the Board has the authority to: pass upon the qualifications and fitness of applicants for licenses and reciprocal licenses; adopt and revise rules and regulations requiring applicants to pass examinations relating to their qualifications as a prerequisite to the issuance of license; and adopt and, from time to time, revise the rules, regulations and policies to be consistent with the law as may be necessary to carry into effect the provisions of this act. Under section 6(a)(2) of the act (63 P.S. § 1206(a)(2)), an applicant must be a graduate of an accredited college or university with a doctoral degree in psychology or a field related to psychology to be eligible for licensure as a psychologist.

Background and Need for the Amendments

The Board's regulations in § 41.31 recognize program accreditation from the American Psychological Association (APA) and the Canadian Psychological Association (CPA). In this proposed rulemaking, the Board seeks to also recognize the Psychological Clinical Science Accreditation System (PCSAS) to afford clinical psychological programs an additional pathway to licensure. Three PCSAS-accredited clinical psychology doctoral programs located in this Commonwealth (University of Pittsburgh, University of Pennsylvania and Temple University) attended a Board meeting and requested that the PCSAS receive parity with the APA and the CPA. Penn State University also has a PCSAS-accredited clinical psychological program.

The PCSAS is an independent, nonprofit organization providing rigorous, objective and empirically based accreditation of PhD programs that adhere to a clinical science training model—one that increases the quality and quantity of clinical scientists contributing to all aspects of public health and extends the science base for mental health care. The Academy of Psychological Clinical Science is the parent organization of the PCSAS. According to its web site, the PCSAS programs adhere to a clinical science training model—one that supports and expands the scientific foundation for mental and behavioral health care and increases the quality and quantity of clinical scientists contributing to all aspects of public health for all people. The PCSAS is recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA), which is the entity that carries out the recognition of accrediting agencies in the private, nongovernmental sector. The majority of top-ranked PhD programs in

clinical psychology in the United States are PCSAS programs. The PCSAS only accredits clinical science PhD programs.

The APA also accredits clinical psychology education and training programs. However, the PCSAS's scope is narrower with a goal to accredit doctoral programs that adhere to a clinical science training model. The APA accredits a broader range of programs. The PCSAS currently accredits 47 programs; the APA accredits over 500 programs. PCSAS accreditation focuses more on clinical science as compared to the APA. APA must cover three different training models whereas PCSAS focuses on evidence-based clinical training and science training. At this time, because the Board does not recognize the PCSAS, programs that want the more specific sciencecentered PCSAS accreditation would also be required to be accredited by the APA or the CPA. The Board has determined that this dual accreditation is unnecessary and overly burdensome, given the quality of PCSAS accreditation. The Board recognizes the importance of science-centered training in clinical psychology and believes that providing parity to the PCSAS will have a positive impact in the treatment of mental and behavioral health problems.

Delaware was the first state to pass legislation permitting the PCSAS parity in 2014. Since then, seven other states allow for PCSAS graduates to be licensed. Other states that recognize PCSAS graduates include Arizona, California, Illinois, Michigan, Missouri, New Mexico and New York.

In this proposed rulemaking, the Board also proposes to update its regulations to reflect a name change from the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation (CORPA) to the CHEA.

In accordance with the requirements of Executive Order 1996-1 (4 Pa. Code §§ 1.371—1.382 (relating to regulatory review and promulgation)), on February 5, 2024, the Board sent an exposure draft of the proposed regulation to interested parties and stakeholders. After a 30-day comment period, no comments were received.

Description of the Proposed Amendments

Psychological Clinical Science Accreditation System

In the Board's existing regulations, § 41.1 defines "doctoral degree in psychology" and "doctoral degree in a field related to psychology." In both definitions, a doctoral degree must meet one of the following: be accredited by the APA or the CPA, be designated by the Association of State and Provincial Psychology Boards/National Register Designation Committee (ASPPB/National Register) or be offered by a foreign college or university whose standards are equivalent to the ASPPB/National Register Designation Project criteria. To reflect the Board's intent to provide for PCSAS parity, the Board proposes to add a definition of "PCSAS" in § 41.1 and proposes to amend the definitions of "doctoral degree in a field related to psychology" and "doctoral degree in psychology" by making PCSAS accreditation an alternative to APA and CPA accreditation. The Board also proposes to amend § 41.31(1) and (3) to reflect PCSAS parity.

Council for Higher Education Accreditation

The Board also proposes to update its regulations to reflect a name change from the "CORPA" to the "CHEA." The Board's regulations at § 41.1 define an accredited

college or university as an "institution which is recognized as an institution of higher education under 22 Pa. Code (relating to education) or which is accredited by a regional accrediting association recognized by the Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation (CORPA)." CORPA was established in January 1994 to continue the recognition of accrediting agencies previously carried out by the Council on Postsecondary Accreditation (COPA) until the time a new National organization for accreditation could be established. CORPA was dissolved in April 1997 after the CHEA was created. The CHEA is currently the entity that carries out the recognition function in the private, nongovernmental sector. The PCSAS is recognized by the CHEA.

Accordingly, the Board proposes to update the definition of "accredited college or university" in § 41.1 to delete the outdated reference to "CORPA" and to add "CHEA." Similarly, the Board proposes to amend § 41.61(d) to update the Board's regulations to replace the term "CORPA" with "CHEA."

#### Fiscal Impact and Paperwork Requirements

This proposed rulemaking will have no adverse fiscal impact on the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions and will impose no additional paperwork requirements upon the Commonwealth, political subdivisions or the private sector.

#### Sunset Date

A sunset date is not being established for this proposed rulemaking. The need and efficacy of the regulation will be periodically monitored by the Board.

#### Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)), on November 4, 2024, the Board submitted a copy of this proposed rulemaking and a copy of a Regulatory Analysis Form to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and to the chairperson of the Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee of the Senate and the chairperson of the Professional Licensure Committee of the House of Representatives. A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC may convey comments, recommendations or objections to the proposed rulemaking within 30 days of the close of the public comment period. The comments, recommendations or objections shall specify the regulatory review criteria in section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5b) which have not been met. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review prior to final publication of the rulemaking by the Board, the General Assembly and the Governor.

#### Public Comment

Interested persons are invited to submit written comments, recommendations or objections regarding this proposed rulemaking to the Regulatory Counsel, State Board, P.O. #### PART I. DEPARTMENT OF STATE

## Subpart A. PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS

## CHAPTER 41. STATE BOARD OF PSYCHOLOGY GENERAL

#### § 41.1. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in this chapter, have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

\* \* \* \* \*

Accredited college or university—An institution which is recognized as an institution of higher education under 22 Pa. Code (relating to education) or which is accredited by a regional accrediting association recognized by the [Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation (CORPA)] Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA).

\* \* \* \* \*

Doctoral degree in a field related to psychology—A degree awarded upon successful completion of a program which, within 1 year from the award of the doctoral degree, meets one of the following:

- (i) Is accredited by the APA [ or the ], CPA or PCSAS.
- (ii) Is designated by the ASPPB/National Register Designation Project.
- (iii) Is offered by a foreign college or university whose standards are equivalent to the ASPPB/National Register Designation Project criteria.

Doctoral degree in psychology—A degree awarded upon successful completion of a program in psychology which, within 1 year from the award of the doctoral degree, meets one of the following criteria:

- (i) Is accredited by the APA [ or the ], CPA or PCSAS.
- (ii) Is designated by the ASPPB/National Register Designation Project.
- (iii) Is offered by a foreign college or university whose standards are equivalent to the ASPPB/National Register Designation Project Criteria.

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National Register—The Council for the National Register of Health Service Providers.

## $\begin{array}{c} PCSAS - Psychological \ Clinical \ Science \ Accreditation \ System. \end{array}$

Parent—A biological parent, adoptive parent or legal guardian.

#### QUALIFICATIONS

#### § 41.31. Educational qualifications.

To meet the education requirements for licensure under section 6 of the act (63 P.S. § 1206), an applicant shall

complete the requirements for a doctoral degree in psychology or a field related to psychology as defined in § 41.1 (relating to definitions). The following documentation evidences compliance:

(1) For degree holders from a program in the United States, Canada or United States territories, a Verification of Doctoral Program Approval Status completed by the program's director reflecting accreditation by the APA [or], CPA or PCSAS or designation by the ASPPB/National Designation Project within 1 year from the award of the doctoral degree, and an official transcript from the registrar.

\* \* \* \* \*

(3) An applicant who does not meet the criteria in paragraph (2) shall complete supplemental education or training, or both, from a program accredited by the APA [or the], CPA or PCSAS or designated by ASPPB/National Register Designation Project based upon an evaluation of the deficiency by the program. The program director shall certify that the supplemental coursework or experience, or both, makes the applicant equivalent to a graduate of that program.

(d) Psychologists accurately represent their competence, education, training and experience. They claim as evidence of psychological educational qualifications only those degrees obtained from institutions accredited by a regional accrediting association approved by the [Commission on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation (CORPA) ] Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA). Degrees earned from foreign colleges and universities may be represented only if they are determined to be equivalent to the degrees conferred by these accredited institutions. Determinations of equivalency shall be made by an agency acceptable to the Board, subject to the Board's final approval. Representations of nonpsychological earned academic degrees are not prohibited, if the degrees are from accredited schools. If these degrees are generic, such as Ph.D., Ed.D., M.S., M.A. and M.Ed., the holder may represent them, but shall specify the discipline in which each particular degree was earned.

# Agricultural Product Promotion, Education and Export Promotion Matching Grant Program; 2024-2025 Application Period

The Department of Agriculture (Department) announces the program requirements and application period for grants under the Pennsylvania Agricultural Product Promotion, Education and Export Promotion Matching Grant Program (Program). The Program is authorized under a Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-2025 budgetary appropriation to the Department for agricultural product promotion, education and exports. The Department intends to make up to \$303,000 available for grants under the Program. The term "agricultural products" includes hardwoods and wood or fiber-based products such as bio-char or other soil amendments.

#### 1. Program objectives.

- (a) *Purpose*. The Department will award grants to provide matching funds to nonprofit organizations engaged in market research, development or promotion to reimburse up to 50% of the cost of projects intended to:
- (1) Research market opportunities for agricultural products grown, raised or produced within this Commonwealth;
- (2) Educate producers and consumers with respect to market opportunities for agricultural products grown, raised or produced within this Commonwealth; or
- (3) Otherwise promote the growth and development of export markets for agricultural products grown, raised or produced within this Commonwealth.
- (b) Applicants. Grants will be awarded to nonprofit organizations that can demonstrate engagement in market research, product development or promotion of agricultural products grown, raised or produced within this Commonwealth. Priority will be given to applicants who can demonstrate experience in marketing agricultural products outside of the United States.
- (c) FY 2024-2025 project funding priorities. The Department will prioritize eligible projects that:
- (1) Facilitate the growth and development of export markets for agricultural products grown, raised or produced within this Commonwealth, with special priority for markets in western African or Caribbean Basin nations:
- (2) Increase consumer awareness of hardwood lumber and value-added products, with special consideration given to projects emphasizing hardwood species for which the Commonwealth is particularly recognized including, but not limited to, black cherry, oaks and maples; or
- (3) Promote the marketing of agricultural commodities produced within this Commonwealth through the PA Preferred® or PA Preferred Organic $^{\rm TM}$  programs.
- (d) Competitive program. The Program is competitive. Grant requests and related documentation will be reviewed by the Secretary, who will approve all grants awarded.
- (e) Funds available basis. Grants will be awarded based on the appropriation; however, the Department

reserves the right to negotiate final grant amounts with awardees and need not expend all the funds that are available for the Program.

2. *Definitions*. The following words and terms have the following meanings:

*Applicant*—A nonprofit organization located in this Commonwealth whose mission includes research, development or promotion of market opportunities related to agricultural products.

Bureau—The Bureau of Market Development of the Department.

Pennsylvania agricultural products—The following agricultural commodities grown, processed or manufactured within this Commonwealth: agricultural, horticultural, aquacultural, viticulture and dairy products, including artisan cheese, livestock and the products thereof, ranch raised fur-bearing animals and the products thereof, the products of poultry and beef raising, forestry and wood products, and all products raised or produced on farms intended for human consumption, and the processed or manufactured products thereof intended for human consumption, transported or intended to be transported in commerce.

Secretary—The Secretary of Agriculture.

- 3. Limitations on grants. The minimum amount of a matching grant is \$1,000. A matching grant is a reimbursement grant, meaning no payment of grant funds will be made by the Department until the subject project is completed and the applicant documents the completion of the project to the Department in accordance with this notice.
  - 4. Uses of matching grant moneys.
- (a) Conformity to application. Matching grant moneys awarded to an applicant shall be expended solely to reimburse up to 50% of the cost of the specific project described in the grant application.
- (b) Allowable expenditures of grant moneys. Grant moneys shall be used for one or more of the following purposes described in the grant application:
- (1) To pay the cost of the specific project described in the grant application.
- (2) To pay the cost of a portion of the applicant organization's contribution to a National or regional agricultural product promotion and marketing project.
  - (3) To pay travel costs associated with market research.
- (4) To pay the cost of trade shows conducted or attended by an applicant, or other projects to facilitate the growth and development of export markets for agricultural products grown, raised or produced in this Commonwealth.
- (c) Prohibited expenditure of grant moneys. Grant moneys may not be used to defray the costs of employing permanent personnel; however, funds may be used to defray the costs of consultants temporarily retained specifically for their expertise related to the project.
  - 5. Applications.
- (a) Application required. Eligible applicants shall submit grant applications to the Department by means of electronic application to https://grants.pa.gov. An applica-

tion shall include a detailed work plan and project budget. Applications must be submitted by 5 p.m. on Friday, December 20, 2024.

- (b) Project start and completion dates. An application shall designate July 1, 2024, or a later date, as the project start date and June 30, 2026, or earlier, as the project completion date. Program grant funds will not be awarded or paid for project activities that occur before the stated project start date or beyond the stated project completion date.
- (c) Additional documentation. The Secretary may require that an applicant submit additional documentation to complete or verify an application. The additional documentation may include a letter, affidavit, board resolution or other documentation:
- (1) Verifying that an applicant is a Commonwealth nonprofit agricultural product promotion and marketing organization.
- (2) Verifying the activities and location of offices of an applicant.
- (3) Confirming that the applicant for a matching grant has secured funds in an amount at least equal to the matching grant amount sought for the project.
  - 6. Review of application.
- (a) Transmittal of application to Bureau. When the Bureau receives a complete and accurate grant application, it will forward this application, together with supporting documentation submitted therewith, to the Secretary for review. The Bureau may also forward a recommendation as to whether the application should be approved or rejected, whether the grant should be in an amount less than requested and whether special restrictions or limitations should be placed on the grant.
- (b) Factors. The Secretary will review and evaluate the application and supporting documentation and may consider the following factors, among others, in deciding whether to approve or reject the grant request:
- (1) The relevance of the project to the promotion or marketing of agricultural products in this Commonwealth.
- (2) The innovativeness of the project described in the application.
- (3) The scope of the project and the number of people who will be exposed to or affected by the project described in the application.
- (4) The impact which the project will have upon the promotion and sales of the Commonwealth agricultural products to which the project is targeted.
- (5) The availability of full funding for the project from the applicant or from any source other than the Grant Program. Projects that are joint efforts between two or more Commonwealth nonprofit agricultural product promotion and marketing organizations may be given preference over projects involving only one organization.
- (6) The apparent ability of the applicant to complete the project as described in the application or, in the case of a grant to fund a National or regional agricultural product promotion or marketing project, the apparent ability of the entity with primary responsibility for the project to complete it.
- (7) The overall performance of the project if the project had received funding through any other grant program administered by the Department in a previous fiscal year.

- (8) Projects where reference to the Department as a source of funding can practicably be made in promotional materials or broadcasts, and that would make such a reference, may be given preference over projects that would not make such a reference.
- (9) Whether the project has been assigned priority for funding in FY 2024-2025, as previously described in Paragraph No. 1(c).
- (c) *Decisions*. The Secretary may approve a grant in an amount less than that requested in the grant application. In addition, the Secretary may impose restrictions or special conditions upon the issuance of a grant. The Secretary will review all recommendations of the Bureau but will have final authority to accept or reject these recommendations.

#### 7. Notice of disposition of application.

The Department will e-mail notice of the acceptance or rejection of a grant application. This notice will be by e-mail to the address provided by the applicant in the grant application.

#### 8. Grant agreement.

After the Secretary approves a grant application, and as a precondition to the Department's release of grant moneys to a successful applicant, the Department and the applicant will execute a written or electronic grant agreement which establishes the terms and conditions subject to which the grant is made. The grant agreement will not be effective, and work should not begin, until all required signatures have been applied to the grant agreement. The grant agreement will contain and conform to the requirements of this notice and will also contain special terms and conditions as required by the Secretary. Among the terms of the grant agreement will be a requirement that the grant recipient provide the Department full and complete access to all records relating to the performance of the project and submit the information as the Department may require. Applicants who wish to view the full terms and conditions of the grant agreement in advance of submitting an application may contact the Department at the address set forth in Section 11. Applicants who are unable to agree to the terms and conditions should not submit an application.

- 9. Verification of project completion.
- (a) *General*. Within 30 days of completion of the subject project, the applicant shall provide the Department with proof of the completion of the project and eligibility to receive reimbursement grant funds from the Department.
- (b)  $Required\ documentation.$  The proof described in subsection (a) shall consist of:
- (1) Copies of invoices for goods or services directly related to the project, confirming that the total billed amount is at least twice the amount of the grant, along with the written certification of the president or treasurer of the applicant that the goods or services that are the subject of the invoices have been delivered or provided to the applicant; and
- (2) A certificate of completion, signed by its president or treasurer, verifying completion of the subject project and stating that the grant funds will reimburse the applicant for a portion of the costs incurred by the applicant in completing the subject project.
- 10. Delivery of grant funds by the Department. The Department will pay the grant amount to the applicant in a single payment within 45 days of receiving the proof of completion previously described in Paragraph No. 9.

The Department of Agriculture (Department) hereby provides notice of the standards and requirements for the Pennsylvania Veteran Grant Program (Program). This notice establishes the grant solicitation procedures by the Department to solicit and review applications to conduct one or more "mini-grant" programs for the benefit of military veterans entering or expanding farm operations or related businesses as part of its ongoing commitment to agricultural business and workforce development in Fiscal Year 2024-2025.

1. Grant Solicitation. The Department is soliciting applications to conduct one or more "mini-grant" programs for the benefit of military veterans entering or expanding farm operations or related businesses as part of its ongoing commitment to agricultural business and workforce development.

The Department may make awards of up to \$200,000 each to veteran organizations. Veteran organizations who receive grants may award mini-grants to individual veteran farmers, which may not exceed \$10,000 each. - b. Up to 20 points for projected Program outcomes, including enhancement of diversity, equity and inclusion in farming.

c. Up to 30 points for the methodology of awarding mini-grants to individual veteran farmers and for ensuring those funds are used as intended.

- d. Up to 20 points for the applicant's project evaluation process.  $\,$
- e. Up to 20 points for support, including financial support, and participation in operating the mini-grant from veterans and the farming industry.

Upon completion of application scoring, the Department will prepare a record identifying each complete and timely filed project proposal and grant application received and the numerical score assigned to each. The Department will award up to three grants based upon its evaluation and scoring of applications.

- 6. Notice of Award. Applicants shall be notified by mail of the decision on their grant applications by the Department. Best efforts will be made to do so within 15 days of the application deadline.
- 7. Nonmatching Cost-Reimbursable Grant. Grants made hereunder do not require the applicant to provide matching funds; however, outside funding may be considered as an evaluation criterion under paragraph 2 of this solicitation. Payment of grant funds will occur on a reimbursement basis, with the possibility of a 50% advance payment option upon the written submission of justification and subsequent approval of the Department and Comptroller Operations. The Department of Banking and Securities (Department), under the authority contained in section 301 of the act of January 30, 1974 (P.L. 13, No. 6) (41 P.S. § 301), determines that the maximum lawful rate of interest for residential mortgages for the month of December 2024, is

The interest rate limitations under the Commonwealth's usury statute were pre-empted to a great extent by Federal law, the Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (Pub.L. No. 96-221). Further pre-emption was instituted with the signing of Pub.L. No. 96-399, which overrode State interest rate

limitations on any individual who finances the sale or exchange of residential real property which the individual owns and which the individual occupies or has occupied as his principal residence.

Each month the Department is required by State law to compute and announce the ceiling rate on residential mortgages in this Commonwealth. This maximum rate is determined by adding 2.50 percentage points to the yield rate on long-term government bonds as published by the Federal Reserve Board or the United States Treasury, or both. The latest yield rate on long-term government securities is 4.31 to which was added 2.50 percentage points for a total of 6.81 that by law is rounded off to the nearest quarter at 6.75%.

### LAND RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION

Persons aggrieved by an action may appeal that action to the Environmental Hearing Board (Board) under section 4 of the Environmental Hearing Board Act (35 P.S. § 7514) and 2 Pa.C.S. §§ 501—508 and 701—704 (relating to Administrative Agency Law).

The appeal should be sent to the Environmental Hearing Board, Second Floor, Rachel Carson State Office Building, 400 Market Street, P.O. Box 8457, Harrisburg, PA 17105-8457, 717-787-3483. Appeals must be filed with the Board within 30-days of publication of this notice in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* unless the appropriate statute provides a different time period. Copies of the appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure may be obtained from the Board. This paragraph does not, in and of itself, create a right of appeal beyond that permitted by applicable statutes and decisional law. For individuals who wish to challenge an action, the appeal must reach the Board within 30-days. A lawyer is not needed to file an appeal with the Board. Individuals who cannot afford a lawyer may qualify for free pro bono representation. Call the Secretary to the Board at 717-787-3483 for more information. The appeal form and the Board's rules of practice and procedure are also available in Braille or on audiotape from the Secretary to the Board at 717-787-3483. Code § 57.11 (relating to listing of wild trout streams), it is the policy of the Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) to accurately identify and classify stream sections supporting naturally reproducing populations of trout as wild trout streams. The Commission's Fisheries Management Division maintains the list of wild trout streams. The Executive Director, with the approval of the Commission, will from time-to-time publish the list of wild trout streams in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The listing of a stream section as a wild trout stream is a biological designation that does not determine how it is managed. The Commission relies upon many factors in determining the appropriate management of streams.

Proposed Changes to List of Class A Wild Trout Waters; January 2025

The Fish and Boat Commission (Commission) is considering changes to its list of Class A wild trout streams. Under 58 Pa. Code § 57.8a (relating to Class A wild trout

streams), it is the Commission's policy to manage self-sustaining Class A wild trout populations as a renewable natural resource to conserve that resource and the angling it provides. Class A wild trout populations represent the best of this Commonwealth's naturally reproducing trout fisheries. With rare exceptions, the Commission manages these stream sections solely for the perpetuation of the wild trout fishery with no stocking.

- (1) Criteria developed for Class A Wild Trout fisheries are species specific.
- (2) Wild Trout Biomass Class Criteria include provisions for:
  - (i) Wild brook trout fisheries.
- (A) Total brook trout biomass of at least 30 kg/ha (26.7 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- $\left( C\right)$  Brook trout biomass must comprise at least 75% of the total trout biomass.
  - (ii) Wild brown trout fisheries.
- (A) Total brown trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- $\left( C\right)$  Brown trout biomass must comprise at least 75% of the total trout biomass.
  - (iii) Mixed wild brook and brown trout fisheries.
- (A) Combined brook and brown trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (D) Brook trout biomass must comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
- (E) Brown trout biomass must comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.

- (iv) Wild rainbow trout fisheries. Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 2.0 kg/ha (1.78 lbs/acre).
  - (v) Mixed wild brook and rainbow trout fisheries.
- (A) Combined brook and rainbow trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brook trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- $\left( D\right)$  Brook trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
- (E) Rainbow trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
  - (vi) Mixed wild brown and rainbow trout fisheries.
- (A) Combined brown and rainbow trout biomass of at least 40 kg/ha (35.6 lbs/acre).
- (B) Total biomass of brown trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- (C) Total biomass of rainbow trout less than 15 cm (5.9 inches) in total length of at least 0.1 kg/ha (0.089 lbs/acre).
- $\left( D\right)$  Brown trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
- (E) Rainbow trout biomass shall comprise less than 75% of the total trout biomass.
