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READER'S GUIDE TO THE *PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN* AND THE *PENNSYLVANIA CODE*

Pennsylvania Bulletin

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the official gazette of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. It is published weekly. A cumulative subject matter index is published quarterly.

The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* serves several purposes. It is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, which is the official codification of agency rules and regulations, Statewide court rules, and other statutorily authorized documents. Changes in the codified text, whether by adoption, amendment, rescission, repeal or emergency action, must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The following documents are published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*: Governor's Executive Orders; Summaries of Enacted Statutes; Statewide and Local Court Rules; Attorney General Opinions; Motor Carrier Applications before the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission; Applications and Actions before the Department of Environmental Protection; Orders of the Independent Regulatory Review Commission; and other documents authorized by law.

The text of certain documents published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the only valid and enforceable text. Courts are required to take judicial notice of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations

Generally an agency wishing to adopt, amend or rescind regulations must first publish in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* a Proposed Rulemaking. There are limited instances when the agency may omit the proposal step; it still must publish the adopted version.

The Proposed Rulemaking contains the full text of the change, the agency contact person, a fiscal note required by law and background for the action.

The agency then allows sufficient time for public comment before taking final action. A Final Rulemaking must be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* before the changes can take effect. If the agency wishes to adopt changes to the Proposed Rulemaking to enlarge the scope, it must repropose.

Citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*

Cite material in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* by volume number, a page number and date. Example: Volume 1, *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, page 801, January 9, 1971 (short form: 1 Pa.B. 801 (January 9, 1971)).

Pennsylvania Code

The *Pennsylvania Code* is the official codification of rules and regulations issued by Commonwealth agencies, Statewide court rules and other statutorily authorized documents. The *Pennsylvania Bulletin* is the temporary supplement to the *Pennsylvania Code*, printing changes when they are adopted. These changes are then permanently codified by the *Pennsylvania Code Reporter*, a monthly, loose-leaf supplement.

The *Pennsylvania Code* is cited by title number and section number. Example: Title 10 *Pennsylvania Code* § 1.1 (short form: 10 Pa. Code § 1.1).

Under the *Pennsylvania Code* codification system, each regulation is assigned a unique number by title and section. Titles roughly parallel the organization of Commonwealth government.

How to Find Rules and Regulations

Search for your area of interest in the *Pennsylvania Code*. The *Pennsylvania Code* is available at www.pacodeandbulletin.gov.

Source Notes give the history of regulations. To see if there have been recent changes not yet codified, check the List of *Pennsylvania Code* Chapters Affected in the most recent issue of the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

A chronological table of the history of *Pennsylvania Code* sections may be found at www.legis.state.pa.us/cfdocs/legis/CH/Public/pcde_index.cfm.

A quarterly List of *Pennsylvania Code* Sections Affected lists the regulations in numerical order, followed by the citation to the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* in which the change occurred.

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Printing Format

Rules, Regulations and Statements of Policy in Titles 1—107 of the Pennsylvania Code

Text proposed to be added is printed in **underscored bold face**. Text proposed to be deleted is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and sections are printed in regular type to enhance readability. Final rulemakings and statements of policy are printed in regular type.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

In Proposed Rulemakings and proposed Statements of Policy, existing text corresponds to the official codified text in the *Pennsylvania Code*.

Court Rules in Titles 201—246 of the Pennsylvania Code

Added text in proposed and adopted court rules is printed in **underscored bold face**. Deleted text in proposed and adopted court rules is enclosed in brackets [] and printed in **bold face**.

Proposed new chapters and rules are printed in regular type to enhance readability.

Ellipses, a series of five asterisks, indicate text that is not amended.

Fiscal Notes

Section 612 of The Administrative Code of 1929 (71 P. S. § 232) requires the Governor's Budget Office to prepare a fiscal note for regulatory actions and administrative procedures of the administrative departments, boards, commissions and authorities receiving money from the State Treasury. The fiscal note states whether the action or procedure causes a loss of revenue or an increase in the cost of programs for the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fiscal note is required to be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* at the same time as the change is advertised.

A fiscal note provides the following information: (1) the designation of the fund out of which the appropriation providing for expenditures under the action or procedure shall be made; (2) the probable cost for the fiscal year the program is implemented; (3) projected cost estimate of the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (4) fiscal history of the program for which expenditures are to be made; (5) probable loss of revenue for the fiscal year of its implementation; (6) projected loss of revenue from the program for each of the 5 succeeding fiscal years; (7) line item, if any, of the General Appropriation Act or other appropriation act out of which expenditures or losses of Commonwealth funds shall occur as a result of the action or procedures; and (8) recommendation, if any, of the Secretary of the Budget and the reasons therefor.

The omission of an item indicates that the agency text of the fiscal note states that there is no information available with respect thereto. In items (3) and (6) information is set forth for the first through fifth fiscal years, following the year the program is implemented, which is stated. In item (4) information is set forth for the current and two immediately preceding years. In item (8) the recommendation, if any, made by the Secretary of the Budget is published with the fiscal note. "No fiscal impact" means no additional cost or revenue loss to the Commonwealth or its local political subdivision is intended. See 4 Pa. Code Chapter 7, Subchapter R (relating to fiscal notes).

Per Curiam

And Now, this 18th day of December, 2024, upon the recommendation of the Orphans' Court Procedural Rules Committee; the proposal having been published for public comment at 54 Pa.B. 1654 (March 30, 2024):

It is Ordered pursuant to Article V, Section 10 of the Constitution of Pennsylvania that:

(1) Pennsylvania Rules of Orphans' Court Procedure 1.8, 2.4, 14.2, 14.3, 14.4, 14.6, 14.7, 14.8, 14.9, and 14.14 are amended;

(2) Form G-01 is rescinded and replaced;

(3) Forms G-02, G-03, and G-05 are rescinded; and

(4) the Index to the Appendix of Orphans' Court Forms is amended;

in the attached form. This Order shall be processed in accordance with Pa.R.J.A. 103(b) and shall be immediately effective.

Additions to the rules are shown in bold and are underlined.

Deletions from the rules are shown in bold and brackets.

TITLE 231. RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE

PART II. ORPHANS' COURT RULES

CHAPTER I. PRELIMINARY RULES

Rule 1.8. Forms.

(a) The forms approved by the Supreme Court for statewide practice and procedure before the Registers and courts shall be used exclusively and accepted for filing by all Registers and clerks; provided, however, versions of a Supreme Court-approved form shall be acceptable for filing if identical in content and sequential ordering.

(b) The forms approved by the Supreme Court for statewide practice are set forth in an Appendix to these [**Rules**] **rules**. The forms may be revised and supplemented from time to time. The forms shall also be maintained for public access at the official website of the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts.

(c) **The Court Administrator of Pennsylvania, in consultation with the Orphans' Court Procedural Rules Committee and the Advisory Council on Elder Justice in the Courts, shall prescribe forms necessary to implement Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.8(a).**

(d) A court may require a legal paper to be accompanied by a cover sheet or checklist. A court that imposes such requirements must promulgate a local rule, numbered [**Local Rule 1.8(c)**] **Local Rule 1.8(d)**, stating the requirements and setting forth the form of the cover sheet or checklist.

[**Note:** Rule 1.8 is substantively similar to former Rule 1.3, but with some modifications.]

[**Explanatory**] Comment:

Pa.R.O.C.P. 1.8 is substantively similar to former Pa.R.O.C.P. 1.3, but with some modifications. The statewide forms are set forth in the Appendix [**attached hereto**] **to these rules**. The current website for electronic access to the forms is found at [**www.pacourts.us/forms under the For-the-Public category**] **https://www.pacourts.us/forms/for-the-public/orphans-court-forms**. The forms posted on the website are capable of on-line completion.

In 2019, [**Rule 1.8**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 1.8** was revised to permit versions of Supreme Court forms to be accepted for filing, provided the replication was identical in content. This revision was intended to permit forms to differ stylistically as to format if content requirements do not differ. This revision was not intended to permit the re-ordering of content required by a form.

CHAPTER II. ACCOUNTS, OBJECTIONS AND DISTRIBUTIONS

Rule 2.4. Petition for Adjudication/Statement of Proposed Distribution; Virtual Representation.

* * * * *

[**Note**] **Comment:**

Although substantially modified, [**Rule 2.4**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 2.4** is derived from former [**Rule 6.9**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 6.9**. One modification is to require averments for virtual representation under 20 Pa.C.S. § 751(6) generally and representation in "trust matters" pursuant to 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 7721 *et seq.* Another substantial modification is the addition of [**subparagraph (e)**] **subdivision (e)** that requires counsel to sign the petition for adjudication/statement of distribution attesting that the submitted petition for adjudication/statement of distribution accurately replicates the Model Form and subjects counsel to rules and sanctions as provided in [**Pa.R.C.P. Nos. 1023.1 through 1023.4**] **Pa.R.Civ.P. 1023.1—1023.4**. (See [**Rule 3.12**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 3.12**.)

See [**Rule 5.50**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 5.50** for procedures governing petitions for the settlement of small estates filed pursuant to 20 Pa.C.S. § 3102.

The filings required by this rule are subject to the *Case Records Public Access Policy of the Unified Judicial System of Pennsylvania*. See [**Rule 1.99**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 1.99**.

[**Explanatory Comment:**] The Supreme Court has adopted form petitions for adjudication/statements of proposed distribution of a decedent's estate, trust, guardian of an incapacitated person's estate, guardian of a minor's estate, and the estate of a principal stated by an agent under a power of attorney. These form petitions for adjudication/statements of proposed distribution are the exclusive forms for adjudicating an Account, and conse-

quently, the local court and clerk must accept these statewide forms and may not accept or allow any other forms previously permitted under local rules. The exclusive statewide form petitions for adjudication/statements of proposed distribution appear in the Appendix **to these rules** and are available electronically at **[www.pacourts.us/forms under the For-the-Public category] <https://www.pacourts.us/forms/for-the-public/orphans-court-forms>.**

Cover sheets or checklists may be required by local rule as permitted by **[Rule 1.8(c)] Pa.R.O.C.P. 1.8(d)**.

CHAPTER XIV. GUARDIANSHIP OF INCAPACITATED PERSONS

Rule 14.2. Petition for Adjudication of Incapacity and Appointment of a Guardian of the Person or Estate of an Incapacitated Person.

(a) *Petition Contents.* A petition to adjudicate an individual as an incapacitated person and appoint a guardian shall state in plain language:

(1) Name, age, address, and mailing address, if different, of the petitioner and the petitioner's relationship to the alleged incapacitated person;

(2) Name, date of birth, residence, and mailing address, if different, of the alleged incapacitated person;

(3) Names and addresses of the spouse, parents, and presumptive intestate heirs of the alleged incapacitated person and whether they are *sui juris* or non *sui juris*;

(4) Name and address of the person or institution providing residential services to the alleged incapacitated person;

(5) Names and addresses of other service providers and nature of services being provided;

(6) Whether there is an executed health care power of attorney or advance health care directive pursuant to Title 20, Chapter 54, and if so, the name and address of the person designated in the writing to act as the agent;

[Note: See 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 5421 et seq. for health care power of attorney and advance health care directive (combination of a living will and health care power of attorney).]

(7) Whether there is an executed power of attorney pursuant to Title 20, Chapter 56, and if so, the name and address of the person designated in the writing to act as the agent;

[Note: See 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 5601 et seq. for power of attorney.]

(8) Whether there is any other writing by the alleged incapacitated person pursuant to Title 20, Chapters 54 or 58 authorizing another to act on behalf of the alleged incapacitated person, and if so, the name and address of the person designated;

[Note: See 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 5441—5447 for Living Will Act; 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 5451—5465 for Health Care Agents and Representatives Act; 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 5821—5826 for Advance Directive for Mental Health Act; 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 5831—5845 for Mental Health Care Agents Act.]

(9) **Whether the alleged incapacitated person is represented by counsel and, if so, the name and address of counsel;**

(10) Reason(s) why guardianship is sought, including a description of functional limitations and the physical and mental condition of the alleged incapacitated person;

[(10)] (11) If not plenary, then specific areas of incapacity over which it is requested that the guardian be assigned powers;

[(11)] (12) The probability of whether the physical condition and mental condition of the alleged incapacitated person will improve;

[(12)] (13) Whether there has been a prior incapacity hearing concerning the alleged incapacitated person, and if so, the name of the court, the date of the hearing, and the determination of capacity;

[(13)] (14) [Steps taken to find a less restrictive alternative than a guardianship] What less restrictive alternatives to a guardianship were considered or tried, and why the alternatives are unavailable or insufficient;

[(14)] (15) If a guardian of the estate is sought:

(i) the gross value of the estate and net income from all sources, to the extent known; and

(ii) whether there is a prepaid burial account, to the extent known;

[(15)] (16) Whether the alleged incapacitated person is a veteran of the United States Armed Services **or the spouse or dependent of a veteran of the United States Armed Services**, and whether the alleged incapacitated person is receiving benefits from the United States **[Veterans' Administration] Department of Veterans Affairs** on behalf of himself or herself or through **another person, including** a spouse; and

[(16)] (17) Name and address, if available, of any person that the petitioner proposes should receive notice of the filing of guardianship reports pursuant to **[Rule 14.8(b)] Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.8(b)**, which may include any person identified in **[paragraphs (a)(3)—(a)(8)] subdivisions (a)(3)—(a)(9)**.

(b) *Nomination of Guardian.* The petition shall also include:

(1) The name, address, and mailing address, if different, of the proposed guardian whom the petitioner nominates to be appointed guardian and the nominee's relationship, if any, to the alleged incapacitated person. If the proposed guardian is an entity, then the name of the person or persons to have direct responsibility for the alleged incapacitated person and the name of the principal of the entity;

(2) Whether the proposed guardian has any adverse interest to the alleged incapacitated person;

(3) Whether the proposed guardian is available and able to visit or confer with the alleged incapacitated person;

(4) Whether the proposed guardian has completed any guardianship training, including the name of the training program, length of the training, and date of completion;

(5) Whether the proposed guardian has any guardianship certification, the current status of the certification, and any disciplinary action related to the certification;

(6) Whether the proposed guardian is, **[or] was, or seeks to be** a guardian in any other matters and, if so, **the number of active matters and the judicial districts where the active matters were filed; [and]**

(7) If the proposed guardian is an individual seeking to serve in a third active guardianship and is not currently certified by a national certification organization as defined in 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f)(2)(ii)(B)(III), then how the proposed

guardian intends to satisfy the certification requirement prescribed in Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6(c); and

(8) If the petition nominates a different proposed guardian of the estate from the proposed guardian of the person, then the information required in [**subparagraphs (b)(1)—(b)(6)**] **subdivisions (b)(1)—(b)(7)** as to each nominee.

(c) *Exhibits*. The following exhibits shall be appended to the petition:

(1) All writings referenced in [**paragraphs (a)(6)—(a)(8)**] **subdivisions (a)(6)—(a)(8)**, if available;

(2) The certified response to a Pennsylvania State Police criminal record check, with Social Security Number redacted, for each proposed guardian issued within six months of the filing of the petition;

(i) If any proposed guardian has resided outside the Commonwealth within the previous five-year period and was 18 years of age or older at any time during that period, then the petition shall include a criminal record check obtained from the statewide database, or its equivalent, in each state in which such proposed guardian has resided within the previous five-year period.

(ii) [**When**] **If** any proposed guardian is an entity, the person or persons to have direct responsibility for the alleged incapacitated person and the principal of the entity shall comply with the requirements of [**subparagraph (c)(2)**] **subdivision (c)(2)**.

[**Note: For information on requesting a criminal record check from the Pennsylvania State Police, see <http://www.psp.pa.gov/Pages/Request-a-Criminal-History-Record.aspx>.**]

(3) Any proposed orders as required by [**Rule 3.4(b)**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 3.4(b)**; [**and**]

(4) Any consent or acknowledgement of a proposed guardian to serve [**.**]; **and**

(5) **Certification. If the proposed guardian is an individual required to be certified pursuant to 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f)(2) because he or she is seeking appointment to a third active guardianship, then either:**

(i) **proof of a currently valid national certification pursuant to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6(c)(2); or**

(ii) **a concurrent petition for waiver of the certification requirement pursuant to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6(c)(3) accompanied by written proof of equivalent licenses or certifications to ensure the capability of the proposed guardian.**

(d) *Emergency Guardian*. A petition seeking the appointment of an emergency guardian shall aver with specificity the facts giving rise to the emergent circumstances and why the failure to make such an appointment will result in irreparable harm to the person or estate of the alleged incapacitated person.

[**Note: Limitations on emergency guardianships are prescribed by statute. See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5513.**]

(e) *Separate Petitions*. Separate petitions shall be filed for each alleged incapacitated person.

(f) *Citation with Notice*. A citation with notice using the form provided in the Appendix to these [**Rules**] **rules** shall be attached to and served with the petition and any preliminary order as follows:

(1) By personal service upon the alleged incapacitated person no less than 20 days prior to the hearing.

Additionally, the content and terms of the petition shall be explained to the maximum extent possible in language and terms the alleged incapacitated person is most likely to understand.

(2) In a manner permitted by [**Rule 4.3**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 4.3** no less than 20 days prior to the hearing upon:

(i) All persons *sui juris* who would be entitled to an intestate share in the estate of the alleged incapacitated person;

(ii) The person or institution providing residential services to the alleged incapacitated person;

(iii) Any person named in [**paragraphs (a)(6)—(a)(8)**] **subdivisions (a)(6)—(a)(9)**; and

(iv) Such other entities and persons as the court may direct, including service providers.

[**Note: For notice to the United States Veterans' Bureau, see 20 Pa.C.S. § 8411.**]

(3) For a petition seeking the appointment of an emergency guardian, the court may direct the manner of service as emergent circumstances warrant. Thereafter, notice shall be served in accordance with [**Rule 14.2(f)(2)**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(f)(2)**.

[**Explanatory**] Comment:

See 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 5421 et seq. for health care power of attorney and advance health care directive, which includes a combination of a living will and a health care power of attorney. See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5601 et seq. for power of attorney. See 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 5441—5447 for Living Will Act; 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 5451—5465 for Health Care Agents and Representatives Act; 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 5821—5826 for Advance Directive for Mental Health Act; 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 5831—5845 for Mental Health Care Agents Act.

See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(a.1)(1) pertaining to the petitioner's obligation to inform the court if the petitioner learns the alleged incapacitated person is represented by counsel.

As used in subdivision (a)(14), less restrictive alternatives to a guardianship include, but are not limited to, an advance directive, such as a durable power of attorney or trust, a living will, a health care power of attorney, a health care representative, a financial power of attorney, trusts, including special needs trusts, representative payees for individuals receiving Social Security benefits, and mental health advance directives. See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5512.1(a)(3).

Petitioner's counsel should consider the Rules of Professional Conduct pertaining to confidentiality and conflicts if he or she has consulted with the alleged incapacitated person regarding the less restrictive alternatives to guardianship set forth in 20 Pa.C.S. § 5512.1(a)(3). See Pa.R.P.C. 1.6 and 1.7; see also Pa.R.P.C. 1.14.

Concerning the requirement of a criminal record check set forth in [**paragraph (c)(2)**] **subdivision (c)(2)**, the Pennsylvania State Police has created the Pennsylvania Access to Criminal History ("PATCH") System to enable the public to obtain criminal history record checks via Internet request. **For information on requesting a criminal record check from the Pennsylvania State Police, see <https://epatch.pa.gov/home>.** The certified response from the Pennsylvania State Police criminal history record check need not be notarized to comply with

the requirements of this rule. Any response other than “no record” may require supplementation at the discretion of the court.

An individual seeking appointment to a third active guardianship must be certified pursuant to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6(c) prior to the third guardianship appointment. See also 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f).

Limitations on emergency guardianships are prescribed by statute. See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5513.

For notice to the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, see 20 Pa.C.S. § 8411.

Rule 14.3. Alternative Proof of Incapacity: Expert Report in Lieu of In-Person or Deposition Testimony of Expert.

(a) A petitioner may seek to offer into evidence an expert report for the determination of incapacity in lieu of testimony, in-person or by deposition, of an expert using the form provided in the Appendix to these rules. In an emergency guardianship proceeding, an expert report may be offered into evidence if specifically authorized by the court.

(b) *Notice.*

(1) If a petitioner seeks to offer an expert report permitted under [**paragraph (a)**] **subdivision (a)**, the petitioner shall serve a copy of the completed report upon the alleged incapacitated person’s counsel and all other counsel of record pursuant to [**Rule 4.3 or, if unrepresented, upon the alleged incapacitated person, pursuant to Pa.R.C.P. No. 402(a) by a competent adult**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 4.3** no later than ten days prior to the hearing on the petition.

(2) If a petitioner seeks to offer an expert report, as permitted under [**paragraph (a)**] **subdivision (a)**, the petitioner shall serve pursuant to [**Rule 4.3**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 4.3** a notice of that fact upon those entitled to notice of the petition and hearing no later than ten days prior to the hearing on the petition.

(3) The petitioner shall file a certificate of service with the court as to [**paragraphs (b)(1) and (b)(2)**] **subdivisions (b)(1) and (b)(2)**.

(c) *Demand.*

(1) Within five days of service of the completed report provided in [**paragraph (b)(1)**] **subdivision (b)(1)**, the alleged incapacitated person’s counsel [**or, if unrepresented, the alleged incapacitated person,**] may file with the court and serve upon the petitioner pursuant to [**Rule 4.3**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 4.3** a demand for the testimony of the expert.

(2) If a demand for testimony is filed and served as provided herein, then the expert report may not be admitted and an expert must provide testimony at the hearing, whether in-person or by deposition.

(d) Unless otherwise demanded pursuant to [**paragraph (c)(2)**] **subdivision (c)(2)**, in the sole discretion of the court, incapacity may be established through the admission of an expert report prepared in compliance with the form provided in the Appendix to these rules. The expert must be qualified by training and experience in evaluating individuals with incapacities of the type alleged in the petition. The expert must sign, date, and verify the completed expert report.

(e) In the interest of justice, the court may excuse the notice and demand requirements set forth in [**paragraphs (b) and (c)**] **subdivisions (b) and (c)**.

[**Explanatory**] Comment:

This [**Rule**] **rule** is intended to permit the alleged incapacitated person to exercise the right to cross-examine testimony as to the capacity of the alleged incapacitated person. See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5518.1. Permitting the use of an expert report in compliance with this [**Rule**] **rule** replaces the requirement of testimony, in-person or by deposition, of an expert. See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5518. “Deposition,” as used in this [**Rule**] **rule**, is intended to be a deposition conducted in accordance with the Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure. The [**Rule**] **rule** is permissive; whether an expert report is admitted in lieu of testimony is in the sole discretion of the court. Nothing in this [**Rule**] **rule** is intended to preclude the court from requiring testimony from the expert or otherwise requiring supplementation.

Rule 14.4. Counsel.

(a) *Retention of Counsel.* [**If counsel for the alleged incapacitated person has not been retained, the petitioner shall notify the court in writing at least seven days prior to the adjudicatory hearing that the alleged incapacitated person is unrepresented and also indicate whether the alleged incapacitated person has requested counsel.**]

(1) **Except as provided in subdivision (a)(3) and if not set forth in the petition filed pursuant to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2 or 14.9(c), the petitioner shall file a written notice with the court containing the name and contact information of retained counsel as soon as the petitioner becomes aware that the alleged incapacitated person has retained counsel.**

(2) **The notice shall include the name and contact information of retained counsel.**

(3) **If retained counsel has filed an entry of appearance pursuant to Pa.R.O.C.P. 1.7(a), the petitioner is not required to file the notice in subdivision (a)(1).**

(b) *Private Counsel.* If the alleged incapacitated person has retained private counsel, counsel shall prepare a comprehensive engagement letter for the alleged incapacitated person to sign, setting forth when and how counsel was retained, the scope of counsel’s services, whether those services include pursuing any appeal, if necessary, how counsel will bill for legal services and costs and the hourly rate, if applicable, who will be the party considered responsible for payment, whether any retainer is required, and if so, the amount of the retainer. Counsel shall provide a copy of the signed engagement letter to the court upon request.

(c) *Appointed Counsel.* [**The court may appoint counsel if deemed appropriate in the particular case. Any such order appointing counsel shall delineate the scope of counsel’s services and whether those services include pursuing any appeal, if necessary.**]

(1) **Generally. If the alleged incapacitated person has not retained counsel, the court shall appoint counsel to represent the alleged incapacitated person in any matter initiated by a petition filed pursuant to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2 and in any proceeding to review, modify, or terminate a guardianship. The appointment required by this subdivision shall be made without regard to the ability of the alleged incapacitated person to pay.**

(2) **Qualifications of Appointed Counsel. Prior to appointing counsel to represent an alleged inca-**

pacitated person, the court shall inquire as to the experience and training of counsel to ensure adequate representation of the alleged incapacitated person.

(3) Initial Meeting; Certification by Counsel.

(i) Appointed counsel shall meet with the alleged incapacitated person as soon as reasonably possible after the appointment.

(ii) Within five days of the initial meeting between appointed counsel and the alleged incapacitated person, appointed counsel shall file a certification with the court setting forth the time and place of the meeting.

(d) Other Counsel. Counsel for any other party shall enter an appearance in accordance with [**Rule 1.7(a)**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 1.7(a).**

[Explanatory] Comment:

Reasonable counsel fees, when appropriate, should be paid from the estate of the alleged incapacitated person whenever possible. If the alleged incapacitated person is unable to pay for counsel, then the court may order counsel fees and costs to be paid by the county. See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(c). Any fee dispute should be resolved in a timely and efficient manner to preserve resources in order to maintain the best possible quality of life for the incapacitated person.

An order adjudicating incapacity and appointing a guardian will identify the scope of representation of court-appointed counsel. See Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.7(a)(1)(v).

See Pa.R.P.C. 1.14 pertaining to the responsibilities of counsel to a client with diminished capacity.

Rule 14.6. Determination of Incapacity and the Need for Guardianship; Selection of Guardian; Certification of Certain Guardians.

(a) Determination of Incapacity. The procedure for determining incapacity and for appointment of a guardian shall meet all requirements set forth at 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 5511, 5512, and 5512.1. In addition, the petitioner shall present the citation and proof of service at the hearing.

[Note: See *In re Peery*, 727 A.2d 539 (Pa. 1999) (holding a person does not require a guardian if there is no need for guardianship services).]

(b) Selection of Guardian. If guardianship services are needed, then the court shall appoint the person nominated as such in a power of attorney, a health care power of attorney, an advance health care directive, a mental health care declaration, or mental health power of attorney, except for good cause shown or disqualification. Otherwise, the court shall consider the eligibility of one or more persons to serve as guardian in the following order:

(1) Guardian of the Person:

- (i) The guardian of the estate;
- (ii) The spouse, unless estranged or an action for divorce is pending;
- (iii) An adult child;
- (iv) A parent;
- (v) The nominee of a deceased or living parent of an unmarried alleged incapacitated person;
- (vi) An adult sibling;
- (vii) An adult grandchild;
- (viii) Other adult family member;

(ix) An adult who has knowledge of the alleged incapacitated person's preferences and values, including, but not limited to religious and moral beliefs, and would be able to assess how the alleged incapacitated person would make decisions; or

(x) Other qualified proposed guardian, including [**a professional guardian**] **an entity as provided in 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f)(1).**

(2) Guardian of the Estate. [**When**] **If** the estate of the incapacitated person consists of minimal assets or [**where**] the proposed guardian possesses the skills and experience necessary to manage the finances of the estate:

- (i) The guardian of the person;
- (ii) The spouse unless estranged or an action for divorce is pending;
- (iii) An adult child;
- (iv) A parent;
- (v) The nominee of a deceased or living parent of an unmarried alleged incapacitated person;
- (vi) An adult sibling;
- (vii) An adult grandchild;
- (viii) Other adult family member; [**or**]

(ix) An adult who has knowledge of the alleged incapacitated person's preferences and values, including, but not limited to religious and moral beliefs, and would be able to assess how the alleged incapacitated person would make decisions[.]; **or**

(x) [Where] If no individual listed in [**subparagraphs (i)—(ix) of paragraph (b)(2)**] **subdivisions (b)(2)(i)—(b)(2)(ix)** possesses the skills and experience necessary to manage the finances of the estate, **then** the guardian of the estate may be any qualified proposed guardian, including [**a professional guardian or corporate fiduciary**] **an entity as provided in 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f)(1).**

(c) Certification.

(1) Generally. **An individual shall be certified or receive waiver of certification pursuant to this subdivision prior to appointment to a third active guardianship.**

(2) Certification by a National Organization.

(i) An individual seeking to serve as a guardian in a third active guardianship shall satisfy the certification requirement in 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f)(2) by being certified by a national nonprofit organization that provides a comprehensive certification program for guardians that:

(A) requires submission of education and employment history;

(B) requires submission of Federal and State criminal history record information;

(C) requires passage of a certification exam; and

(D) administers and monitors a compliance and decertification process for certified guardians.

(ii) Continuing duty. **A guardian certified by a national organization defined in subdivision (c)(2)(i) shall:**

(A) maintain the certification in good standing; and

(B) file with the court:

(I) proof of recertification prior to the expiration date of the current certification; and

(II) written notice of any certification lapse, suspension, termination, or disciplinary action within seven days of such action.

(3) *Petition for Waiver of Certification.*

(i) *Generally.*

(A) The certification required by subdivision (c)(2) may be waived by the court in an individual court case following the grant of a petition demonstrating that a proposed guardian has such equivalent licenses or certifications as are necessary to ensure that the proposed guardian is capable of fully, faithfully, and competently performing the obligations of a guardian.

(B) The equivalent licenses or certifications shall be relevant to the form of guardianship sought in the petition.

(C) The petition shall include an averment identifying each judicial district where he or she has been granted a certification waiver and the number of active waivers.

(ii) *Prohibition.* A license to practice law alone is not an equivalent license or certification for purposes of subdivision (c)(3)(i).

[Explanatory] Comment:

The procedure for determining incapacity and for appointment of a guardian includes, among other things, the consideration of and factual findings as to the insufficiency of supports and less restrictive alternatives to guardianship. See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5512.1(a)(3); see also *In re Peery*, 727 A.2d 539 (Pa. 1999) (holding a person does not require a guardian if there is no need for guardianship services). Less restrictive alternatives include, but are not limited to, an advance directive, such as a durable power of attorney or trust, a living will, a health care power of attorney, a health care representative, a financial power of attorney, trusts, including special needs trusts, representative payees for individuals receiving Social Security benefits, and mental health advance directives. See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5512.1(a)(3). The findings of fact required by § 5512.1(a)(3) are not publicly available unless included in the order adjudicating a person as incapacitated. See *Case Records Public Access Policy of the United Judicial System of Pennsylvania*, § 9.0B, 204 Pa. Code § 213.81.

If the alleged incapacitated person has requested a jury trial pursuant to 20 Pa.C.S. § 777(b), then the findings of fact required by 20 Pa.C.S. § 5512.1(a) shall be made by the jury.

If a principal nominates a guardian pursuant to a power of attorney, a health care power of attorney, an advance health care directive, which [is] includes a combination of a living will and a health care power of attorney, a mental health care declaration, or mental health power of attorney, then the court must appoint that person as guardian except for good cause or disqualification. See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5604(c)(2) (power of attorney); 20 Pa.C.S. § 5460(b) (health care power of attorney); 20 Pa.C.S. § 5422 (defining “advance health care directive”); 20 Pa.C.S. § 5823 (mental health declaration); 20 Pa.C.S. § 5841(c) (mental health power of attorney); see also 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f) (who may be appointed guardian).

For guardianship certification and waiver pursuant to subdivision (c), see 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f). The Center for Guardianship Certification is an example of an organization that meets the criteria of § 5511(f).

See Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(c)(5) pertaining to exhibits to the petition for appointment of guardian to demonstrate compliance with subdivision (c) and 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f).

Examples of relevant licenses or certifications for a proposed guardian of the person may include, but are not limited to, health care, nursing, social work, psychology, or care management. Examples of relevant licenses or certifications for a proposed guardian of the estate may include, but are not limited to, accounting, financial management, or retirement income planning.

A license to practice law alone is not an equivalent license or certification for purposes of seeking waiver of certification. 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f)(3).

Rule 14.7. Order and Certificate.

(a) *Order Adjudicating Incapacity and Appointing Guardian.*

(1) An order adjudicating incapacity and appointing a guardian shall address:

(i) the type of guardianship being ordered and any limits, if applicable;

(ii) the continued effectiveness of any previously executed powers of attorney or health care powers of attorney and the authority of such agent to act under the document;

(iii) the necessity of filing reports pursuant to [Rule 14.8(a)] Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.8(a); [and]

(iv) the person or persons entitled to receive notice of the filing of such reports, pursuant to [Rule 14.8(b)] Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.8(b); and

(v) the continued scope of representation of court-appointed counsel.

(2) An order adjudicating incapacity and appointing a guardian shall contain a provision substantially in the following form:

[Incapacitated person] is hereby notified of the right to seek reconsideration of this Order pursuant to [Rule 8.2] Pa.R.O.C.P. 8.2 and the right to appeal this Order within 30 days from the date of this Order by filing a Notice of Appeal with the Clerk of the Orphans’ Court. [Incapacitated person] may also petition the court at any time to review, modify, or terminate the guardianship due to a change in circumstances. [Incapacitated person] has a right to be represented by [an attorney] counsel to file a motion for reconsideration, an appeal, or to seek modification or termination of this guardianship. [If the assistance of counsel is needed and [incapacitated person] cannot afford an attorney, an attorney will be appointed to represent [incapacitated person] free of charge.] If he or she is unrepresented, the court will appoint counsel to represent [incapacitated person]. The court may order that the representation is free of charge if it is determined that [incapacitated person] cannot afford to pay for counsel.

(3) *Scheduled Review Hearing.* If the court finds that evidence presented during the guardianship proceeding indicates that the circumstances of the incapacitated person’s incapacity may change, the order shall include the date for a review hearing no later than one year from the date of the order establishing the guardianship.

(b) *Order Adjudicating Incapacity and Appointing Guardian of Estate.*

(1) In addition to the requirements set forth in [**paragraph (a)(1)**] **subdivision (a)(1)**, an order adjudicating incapacity and appointing a guardian of the estate shall address:

- (i) whether a bond is required and when the bond is to be filed; and
- (ii) whether the guardian can spend principal without prior court approval.

(2) In addition to the requirement set forth in [**paragraph (a)(2)**] **subdivision (a)(2)**, an order adjudicating incapacity and appointing a guardian of the estate shall contain a provision [**substantially in the following form**] **reflecting the authority of the guardian:**

(i) Plenary Guardian. An order appointing a plenary guardian shall contain a provision in substantially the following form:

All financial institutions, including without limitation, banks, savings and loans, credit unions, and brokerages, shall grant to the guardian of [incapacitated person]’s estate access to any and all assets, records, and accounts maintained for the benefit of [incapacitated person], and the guardian of [incapacitated person]’s estate shall be entitled to transfer, retitle, withdraw, or otherwise exercise dominion and control over any and all said assets, records, and accounts. The failure of any financial institution to honor this order may lead to contempt proceedings and the imposition of sanctions.

(ii) Limited Guardian. An order appointing a limited guardian shall specify the portion of assets or income over which the guardian of the estate is assigned powers and duties.

(c) *Certificate of Guardianship of Estate.*

(1) Certificate of Plenary Guardianship of Estate. Upon the request of the **plenary** guardian of the estate, the clerk shall issue a certificate substantially in the following form:

(Caption)

I CERTIFY that on _____, [after giving full consideration to the factors set forth in Chapter 55 of the Probate, Estates, and Fiduciaries Code, 20 Pa.C.S. §§ 5501 et seq., in the above-captioned matter,] the Court adjudged _____ an incapacitated person and appointed _____ as plenary guardian of the estate. At the time of this certification, there is no record of modification of the appointment order on the docket.

FURTHER, I CERTIFY the Court, *inter alia*, ordered that:

All financial institutions, including without limitation, banks, savings and loans, credit unions, and brokerages shall grant to the guardian of [incapacitated person]’s estate access to any and all assets, records, and accounts maintained for the benefit of [incapacitated person], and the guardian of [incapacitated person]’s estate shall be entitled to transfer, retitle, withdraw, or otherwise exercise dominion and control over any and all said assets, records, and accounts. The failure of any financial institution to honor this order may lead to contempt proceedings and the imposition of sanctions.

(2) Certificate of Limited Guardianship of Estate. **Upon the request of the limited guardian of the estate, the clerk shall issue a certificate substantially in the following form:**

(Caption)

I CERTIFY that on _____, the Court adjudged _____ an incapacitated person and appointed _____ as limited guardian of the estate. At the time of this certification, there is no record of modification of the appointment order on the docket.

This is a limited certification of guardianship. The order appointing the limited guardian shall determine the extent of the guardian’s authority.

(d) Order Adjudicating Incapacity and Denying Appointment of a Guardian in Whole or in Part. **An order denying the appointment of a guardian in whole or in part shall identify the less restrictive alternatives that are available and sufficient to enable the alleged incapacitated person to manage personal financial resources or to meet essential requirements of personal physical health and safety.**

[Explanatory] Comment:

The requirements of [**paragraph (a)**] **subdivision (a)** are intended to apply to all guardianship orders.

See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5512.2(a) and Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.9 pertaining to grounds and procedures for scheduled review hearings, respectively.

The items addressed and contained in the order, as set forth in [**paragraphs (a) and (b)**] **subdivisions (a) and (b)**, are not exhaustive. The court may fashion a guardianship of a person order to inform health care providers of the guardian’s authority, including the authority to give informed consent to proposed treatment, to share information, and to make decisions for the incapacitated person. *See also In re DLH*, 2 A.3d 505 (Pa. 2010) (discussing whether guardian has authority concerning life-preserving care); 20 Pa.C.S. § 5460(a) (requiring the court to determine the extent of agent’s authority under a health care power of attorney); 20 Pa.C.S. § 5604(c)(3) (requiring the court to determine the extent of agent’s authority under a durable power of attorney).

The incapacitated person and any substitute decision maker may be assisted by the information in subdivision (d) to communicate instructions to third parties. See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5512.1(a)(6)(iv).

Rule 14.8. Guardianship Reporting, Monitoring, Review, and Compliance.

(a) *Reporting.* A guardian shall file the following reports with the clerk:

- (1) An inventory by the guardian of the estate within 90 days of such guardian’s appointment;
- (2) An annual report by the guardian of the estate of an incapacitated person one year after appointment and annually thereafter;

(3) An annual report by the guardian of the person one year after appointment and annually thereafter;

(4) A final report by the guardian of the person and the guardian of the estate within 60 days of the death of the incapacitated person, an adjudication of capacity, a change of guardian, or the expiration of an order of limited duration; and

(5) A final report from the guardian of the person and the guardian of the estate upon receipt of the provisional order from another state's court accepting transfer of a guardianship.

(b) *Notice of Filing.* If, pursuant to [**Rule 14.7(a)(1)(iv)**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.7(a)(1)(iv)**, the order appointing the guardian identifies the person or persons entitled to receive notice of the filing of any report set forth in subdivision (a), the guardian shall serve a notice of filing within ten days after filing a report using the form provided in the Appendix to these Rules. Service shall be in accordance with [**Rule 4.3**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 4.3**.

(c) [**Design of Forms. The Court Administrator of Pennsylvania, in consultation with the Orphans' Court Procedural Rules Committee and the Advisory Council on Elder Justice in the Courts, shall design and publish forms necessary for the reporting requirements set forth in subdivision (a).**] **{Rescinded}**.

(d) *Monitoring.* The clerk or the court's designee shall monitor the guardianship docket to confirm the guardian's compliance with the reporting requirements set forth in subdivision (a).

(e) *Review.* The court or its designee shall review the filed reports.

(f) *Compliance.* To ensure compliance with these reporting requirements:

(1) If any report is deemed incomplete or is more than 20 days delinquent, then the clerk or the court's designee shall serve notice on the guardian directing compliance within 20 days, with a copy of the notice sent to the court and the guardian's counsel, if represented.

(2) If the guardian fails to comply with the reporting requirements within 20 days of service of the notice, then the clerk or the court's designee shall file and transmit a notice of deficiency to the adjudicating judge and serve a notice of deficiency on those persons named in the court's order pursuant to [**Rule 14.7(a)(1)(iv)**] **Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.7(a)(1)(iv)** as being entitled to receive a notice of filing.

(3) The court may thereafter take such enforcement procedures as are necessary to ensure compliance.

(4) After reasonable enforcement procedures by the court have been unsuccessful, the court shall enter an order that:

(i) includes an explanation of the actions taken by the court to attempt enforcement of the filing requirements;

(ii) includes clearly enumerated reasons why the guardian or former guardian has not been compelled to comply with any filing requirements; and either

(A) directs that a successor guardian or designee of the court file the delinquent filing with the clerk and it shall be docketed as such by the clerk; or

(B) directs the order issued by the court to be docketed by the clerk in lieu of the delinquent filing.

Comment:

See Pa.R.J.A. 510 governing the filing of inventories and annual reports online using the Guardianship Tracking System.

Provisions of former subdivision (c), pertaining to reporting forms, were moved to Pa.R.O.C.P. 1.8(c).

The reporting forms are available at [<http://www.pacourts.us/forms/for-the-public/orphans-court-forms>] <https://www.pacourts.us/forms/for-the-public/orphans-court-forms>. This [**Rule**] **rule** is silent as to the manner of proceeding when reports are deficient or warrant further investigation, or when the guardian is recalcitrant after being given notice by the clerk or the court's designee. In its discretion, the court may order further documentation, conduct a review hearing, or take further action as may be deemed necessary, including, but not limited to, removal of the guardian or contempt proceedings. If those efforts are unsuccessful, the court shall proceed as set forth in subdivision (f)(4).

As used in subdivision (f)(4)(ii)(A), a "designee of the court" is an individual who is: (1) knowledgeable about the incapacitated person and the contents of the report; and (2) appointed by the court for the sole purpose of filing the delinquent report that the guardian or successor guardian is unable or unwilling to file. An attorney, accountant, or agent of the guardian or former guardian may have the requisite knowledge to serve in this capacity.

Rule 14.9. Review Hearing.

(a) *Initiation.* A review hearing may be requested by petition [**or**], ordered by the court **upon its own initiative, or set forth in the order adjudicating incapacity and appointing a guardian. The procedure for conducting a review hearing shall meet all requirements set forth at 20 Pa.C.S. § 5512.2.**

(b) *Counsel.* **If an incapacitated person is unrepresented by counsel prior to the review hearing, then the court shall appoint counsel to represent the incapacitated person prior to the review hearing. An order ruling on the merits of the review hearing shall address the continued scope of representation of court-appointed counsel.**

(c) *Petition.*

(1) A petition for a review hearing shall set forth:

[(1)] (i) the name, age, address, and mailing address, if different, of the petitioner and the petitioner's relationship to the incapacitated person;

[(2)] (ii) the date of the adjudication of incapacity;

[(3)] (iii) the names and addresses of all guardians;

[(4)] (iv) if the incapacitated person has been a patient in a mental health facility, the name of such facility, the date of admission, and the date of discharge;

[(5)] (v) the present address of the incapacitated person, and the name of the person with whom the incapacitated person is living;

[(6)] (vi) the names and addresses of the presumptive intestate heirs of the incapacitated person and whether they are *sui juris* or non *sui juris*; [**and**]

[(7)] (vii) **whether the incapacitated person is represented by counsel and, if so, the name and address of counsel; and**

(viii) [**an averment that:**

(i) **there has been significant change in the incapacitated person's capacity and the nature of that change;**

(ii) **there has been a change in the need for guardianship services and the nature of that change; or**

(iii) the guardian has failed to perform duties in accordance with the law or act in the best interest of the incapacitated person, and details as to the duties that the guardian has failed to perform or has performed but are allegedly not in the best interests of the incapacitated person.]

averments setting forth why the guardianship should be terminated or modified, including averments pertaining to the findings required by 20 Pa.C.S. § 5512.1(a)(1)—(a)(4).

[(c)] (2) *Service.* The petition shall be served in accordance with [Rule 4.3] Pa.R.O.C.P. 4.3 upon the incapacitated person, his or her counsel, and those entitled to notice pursuant to [Rule 14.2(f)(2)] Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(f)(2).

[(d)] (3) *Hearing.* The review hearing shall be conducted promptly after the filing of the petition with notice of the hearing served upon those served with the petition pursuant to [paragraph (b)(2)] subdivision (c)(2).

(d) Scheduled Review Hearing. If the court orders a review hearing on its own initiative or in the order establishing the guardianship pursuant to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.7(a)(3), then:

(1) the court shall give notice of the hearing to the incapacitated person, his or her counsel, and those entitled to notice pursuant to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(f)(2) at least 20 days prior to the date of the hearing; and

(2) the hearing notice shall be served in compliance with Pa.R.O.C.P. 4.3.

[Explanatory] Comment:

To be an Incapacitated Person means that you are not able to receive and effectively evaluate information and communicate decisions and that you are unable to manage your money and/or other property, or to make necessary decisions about where you will live, what medical care you will get, or how your money will be spent.

At the hearing, you have the right to appear, to be represented by an attorney, and to request a jury trial. You have the right to hire and pay for an attorney of your own choosing. Amendment of Pa.R.O.C.P. 1.8, 2.4, 14.2, 14.3, 14.4, 14.6, 14.7, 14.8, 14.9, and 14.14; Rescission and Replacement of Form G-01; Rescission of Forms G-02, G-03, and G-05; and Amendment of the Index to the Appendix of Orphans' Court Forms

On December 18, 2024, the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania: (1) amended Pa.R.O.C.P. 1.8, 2.4, 14.2, 14.3 14.4, 14.6, 14.7, 14.8, 14.9, and 14.14; (2) rescinded and replaced Form G-01; (3) rescinded Forms G-02, G-03, and G-05; and (4) amended the Index to the Appendix of Orphans' Court Forms. These changes update procedural rules and forms in guardianship matters pursuant to the Act of December 14, 2023, P.L. 446, No. 61 ("Act 61"). The Orphans' Court Procedural Rules Committee has prepared this Adoption Report describing the rulemaking process. An Adoption Report should not be confused with

Comments to the rules. See Pa.R.J.A. 103, cmt. The statements contained herein are those of the Committee, not the Court.

By way of background, Act 61 included guardianship reforms in the areas of certification of guardians, mandatory appointment of counsel, consideration of less restrictive alternatives before appointing a guardian, and scheduling review hearings within one year if there may be a change in capacity. While Act 61 largely contained substantive matters that were self-executing, amendment of the procedural rules governing guardianship proceedings was deemed necessary. The Committee published for public comment a proposal intended to address the requirements of Act 61. See 54 Pa.B. 1654 (March 30, 2024).

Certification of Guardians

Act 61 added a new certification requirement for "individuals" proposed as guardians prior to appointment to a third active guardianship. See 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f)(2). Use solely of the term "individual" in § 5511(f)(2) is in

contrast with the more fulsome list of potential appointees referenced in § 5511(f)(1), which includes “individuals,” as well as a corporate fiduciary, a nonprofit corporation, a guardianship support agency under Subchapter F (relating to guardianship support), or a county agency. *Id.* § 5511(f)(1). A threshold question for the Committee was determining who is required to obtain a certification prior to appointment as a guardian given the statutory language found in § 5511(f)(1) and (f)(2). The Committee relied on the plain language of § 5511(f)(2) to recommend that the certification requirement for an “individual” was clear and unambiguous.

Per Act 61, the certification must require, at a minimum, submission of education and employment history, submission of federal and state criminal history information, and passage of a certification exam administered by a national nonprofit guardianship certification organization. *See* 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f)(2)(ii)(B). The “national nonprofit guardianship certification organization” must provide a “comprehensive certification program for guardians, including supervising a national certification process, developing certification exam content and maintaining a decertification process.” *Id.* At this time, the Center for Guardianship Certification (“CGC”) appears to meet the statutory requirement for a national nonprofit guardianship certification organization. It is unknown to the Committee whether there are other organizations that satisfy the requirements of § 5511(f)(2)(ii)(B) or whether such other organization may be formed in the future.

Act 61 also permits the court to waive the certification requirement upon a petition “demonstrating that a proposed guardian has such equivalent licenses or certifications as are necessary” to ensure the guardian is capable of performing the obligations of a guardian. *See* 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f)(3). Notably, a law license alone is not an equivalent license or certification for purposes of waiver. *Id.*

Rule Changes Pertaining to Certification

The Act 61 certification requirements necessitated changes to the guardianship petition. Averments were added to the petition to advise the court whether the proposed guardian is required to be certified. Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(b)(6) requires an averment whether the proposed guardian is, was, or is seeking to be a guardian in any other matters, as well as the number of active guardianships. Similarly, the required averment in subdivision (b)(7) is intended to inform the court how the proposed guardian will satisfy the certification requirement, if required. Current subdivision (b) relates to any completed guardianship training and certifications that the proposed guardian holds. *See* Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(b)(4)-(b)(5). With respect to petition exhibits, Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(c)(5) requires attachment of proof of a guardianship certification or a copy of a concurrently filed petition for waiver of the certification. *See* Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(c)(5).

Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6 generally addresses appointment preferences and eligibility to serve as a guardian. It was amended to reflect the certification requirement for an individual seeking appointment as a guardian prior to a third active guardianship. *See* Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6(c)(1).

Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6(c)(2) addresses certification by a national organization and tracks the express language of § 5511(f)(2). A guardian required to be certified has a continuing duty to maintain the certification in good standing, to file with the court proof of recertification prior to the expiration of the current certification, and to file with the court of any negative actions against the certification within seven days of such action. *See* Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6(c)(2)(ii).

Act 61 permits waiver of the certification requirement upon a petition demonstrating that a proposed guardian has “such equivalent licenses or certifications as are necessary” to ensure the suitability of the proposed guardian. 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(f)(3). The procedure for waiver of the certification is incorporated in Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6(c)(3)(i). The equivalent licenses or certifications must be relevant to the type of guardianship that is established. *See id.* Examples of relevant equivalencies are included in the commentary to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6. As provided in § 5511(f)(3), Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6(c)(3)(iii) reflects that a law license is not an equivalent license or certification for waiver purposes. *See id.*

Post-publication, Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(b)(6), pertaining to petition averments for the nomination of the guardian, was further revised to require identification of all judicial districts where the proposed guardian is actively serving in other guardianships. The change is intended to assist the jurist in assessing the scope of the proposed guardian’s experience and existing obligations.

The Committee also deleted a proposed requirement in Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6(c)(2) that a national certification entity provide guardianship training. Subdivision (c)(2) now tracks the statute more closely and does not impose certification requirements beyond those set forth in Act 61.

Mandatory Appointment of Counsel

Prior to the enactment of Act 61, appointment of counsel in a guardianship case was at the discretion of the court. *See* 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(a) (effective through June 10, 2024). Act 61 eliminated the court’s discretionary appointment power and made appointment of counsel mandatory in all circumstances when the alleged incapacitated person has not retained counsel. “[T]he court shall appoint counsel to represent the alleged incapacitated person in any matter for which counsel has not been retained by the alleged incapacitated person, including in [a guardianship proceeding] and in any subsequent proceedings to consider, modify or terminate a guardianship.” 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(a.1)(2) (effective June 11, 2024). The appointment is to be made without regard to the alleged incapacitated person’s ability to pay. *See id.* New § 5511(a.1)(2) also provides that “[a]ppointed counsel shall be qualified by experience or training and shall act without delay under the circumstances.” *Id.*

In order to facilitate appointment of counsel, the petitioner is required to notify the court if he or she knows that the alleged incapacitated person is represented by counsel. *See* 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(a.1)(1). The petitioner must include an averment in the petition or file notice with the court as soon as possible if the petitioner becomes aware of the representation. *See id.*

Section 5511(a.1) also contains statutory directives pertaining to the relationship between appointed counsel and the alleged incapacitated person. Appointed counsel for the alleged incapacitated person is required to “maintain a normal client-attorney relationship with the client,” “advocate for the client’s expressed wishes and consistent with the client’s instructions” to the extent possible, and “comply with the Rules of Professional Conduct governing the attorney-client relationship.” 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(a.1)(3). New § 5511(a.1)(3) also requires appointed counsel to “meet with the incapacitated person as soon as reasonably possible after the appointment” and to file a certification of the meeting with the court within five days. *Id.*

Rule Changes Pertaining to Appointment of Counsel

Incorporating the mandatory appointment requirements necessitated amendments to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2, 14.3,

14.4, and 14.7. A new petition averment will enable the petitioner to notify the court if the alleged incapacitated person is represented by counsel and counsel's name and address if known. *See* Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(a)(9). If counsel for the alleged incapacitated person is identified in the petition, Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(f)(2)(iii) requires the petitioner to serve the petition on retained counsel identified in Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(a)(9).

Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.3 relates to proof of incapacity and the use of expert reports. Subdivision (b)(1) was amended to delete a reference to an alleged incapacitated person "unrepresented by counsel," insofar as all incapacitated persons will now be represented by retained or appointed counsel pursuant to § 5511(a.1)(2). Post-publication, a similar change was made to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.3(c)(1).

Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.4 governs retention and appointment of counsel. Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.4(a)(1) requires the petitioner to file notice with the court as soon as the petitioner becomes aware that counsel has been retained if not indicated in the petition at the time of filing. The Committee considered timing issues relating to appointment of counsel. The Committee anticipates that many courts will appoint counsel at the time the petition is filed if retained counsel has not been identified. On the other hand, there may be overlap between appointed and retained counsel if the alleged incapacitated person retains counsel upon or following receipt of the petition for adjudication but before the appointment of counsel. The Committee foresees that courts will navigate these timing issues as they arise.

Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.4(c) sets forth the new requirements for appointed counsel. Subdivision (c)(1) addresses the general requirement that the court shall appoint counsel to represent the alleged incapacitated person in any matter for which counsel has not been retained. To the extent the statute limits court-appointed counsel to the alleged incapacitated person, subdivision (c)(1) will eliminate any ambiguity as to whether counsel can be appointed for the petitioner.

Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.4(c)(2) addresses qualifications of appointed counsel. As previously discussed, appointed counsel is required to be "qualified by experience or training." 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(a.1)(2). The Committee believes the judge making the appointment is best suited to ensure qualified representation of an alleged incapacitated person.

Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.4(c)(3) addresses the new statutory requirement that appointed counsel meet with the alleged incapacitated person "as soon as reasonably possible" after the appointment and file a certification with the court relating the time and place the meeting occurred within five days of the meeting. *See* 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(a.1)(3).

The commentary to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.4 was revised to cross-reference Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.7(a)(1)(v), concerning a requirement that the guardianship order identify the scope of representation of court-appointed counsel in order to eliminate uncertainty and the need for counsel to file a withdrawal petition if scope is not defined at the commencement of representation.

Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.7(a)(1)(v) requires the order adjudicating incapacity and appointing a guardian to address the scope of representation of court-appointed counsel. This should provide the court with flexibility to determine whether the incapacitated person requires ongoing representation or if representation may be terminated until the commencement of a future proceeding. Similarly, post-publication changes were made to the notice to the incapacitated person set forth in Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.7(a)(2).

Post-publication, changes were made to the proposal concerning the attorney-client relationship. The authority of the Court to regulate the conduct comprising the practice of law is well established. "There can be no question the authority to supervise the practice of law in this Commonwealth lies in this Court's constitutional province, and we affirm the command in Article V, Section 10(c) that 'all laws shall be suspended to the extent' they are inconsistent with our Rules." *Yocum v. Commonwealth Pennsylvania Gaming Control Bd.*, 161 A.3d 228, 247 (Pa. 2017). With regard to the new statutory provisions relating to the relationship between appointed counsel and an alleged incapacitated person, the Committee observes that all counsel are bound by the Pennsylvania Rules of Professional Conduct, including Pa.R.P.C. 1.14 (responsibilities of counsel to a client with diminished capacity). Therefore, the proposed cross-reference to § 5511(a.1)(3), pertaining to the attorney-client relationship, in the commentary to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.4 was deleted. A cross-reference to Pa.R.P.C. 1.14, concerning the conduct of counsel representing a client with diminished capacity, was retained in the commentary to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.4.

Similarly, Act 61 provides that "[r]etained or appointed counsel may not act as guardian *ad litem* for the alleged incapacitated person." 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(a.1)(3). Post-publication, a proposed cross-reference pertaining to the prohibition on appointed counsel serving as guardian *ad litem*, was deleted from the commentary to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.4 and is undergoing further review by the Committee.

Less Restrictive Alternatives

Act 61 added a requirement to § 5512.1(a) that the court consider and make findings of fact regarding less restrictive alternatives to a guardianship prior to appointing a guardian. These less restrictive alternatives include, but are not limited to, advance directives, living wills, powers of attorney, trusts, health care representatives, and representative payees for social security benefits. 20 Pa.C.S. § 5512.1(a)(3). Likewise, § 5511(e), pertaining to the petition, was amended to require specific factual averments in the petition "demonstrating that less restrictive alternatives were considered or tried and why the alternatives are unavailable or insufficient." 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(e).

A new requirement concerning identification of less restrictive alternatives in an order denying a petition for guardianship in whole or in part was also added to § 5512.1(a). If the court enters such an order, the court must identify "the less restrictive alternatives that are available and sufficient to enable the alleged incapacitated person to manage personal financial resources or to meet essential requirements of personal physical health and safety." 20 Pa.C.S. § 5512.1(a)(6)(iv). It appears that including the less restrictive alternatives in a partial order was intended to "assist the respondent and any supportive and substitute decision makers involved to effectuate the respondent's decisions with third parties." *Id.*

Rule Changes Pertaining to Less Restrictive Alternatives

Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(a)(14) was amended to include the statutory requirement that the petition identify what less restrictive alternatives to a guardianship were considered or tried, and why the alternatives are unavailable or insufficient. *See* 20 Pa.C.S. § 5511(e). Because Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6(a), pertaining to the procedure for determining incapacity and appointing a guardian, already cross-references § 5512.1, it was not necessary to incorporate detailed language regarding consideration of less

restrictive alternatives to guardianship in the rule text. Instead, the commentary to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6 provides more detailed information regarding less restrictive alternatives and a cross-reference to § 5512.1(a)(3).

Post-publication, the Committee considered efforts by petitioner's counsel to pursue less restrictive alternatives to guardianship with the alleged incapacitated person, *e.g.*, drafting pre-need documents. To the extent that such efforts could implicate ethical considerations relating to confidentiality and conflicts, cross-references to Pa.R.P.C. 1.6, 1.7, and 1.14 were added to the commentary to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2.

Scheduled Review Hearing

Section 5512.2(a) adds new requirements relating to review hearings. It introduced a new concept, "automatic review hearings." Specifically, "if the evidence presented during the guardianship proceeding indicates that the circumstances of the person's incapacity may change, the court shall hold a review hearing to determine whether the guardianship continues to be necessary." 20 Pa.C.S. § 5512.2(a). The court is required to set a hearing date in the order to be held no later than one year from the date of the order. *Id.*

Rule Changes Pertaining to Scheduled Review Hearing

Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.9 was amended to incorporate these new review hearings. However, the hearings are "scheduled" rather than "automatic," insofar as they are scheduled as the result of judicial action. Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.7(a)(3) requires the court to include in the adjudication order a date for a scheduled review hearing, if warranted. Additional provisions relating to scheduled review hearings were added to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.9(c). Persons to be served notice of the review hearing are the same persons entitled to notice of the petition filing, *i.e.*, Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(f)(2).

Post-publication, further revisions were made to Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.9(b) to require the appointment of counsel for a review hearing if the person is unrepresented. Additionally, Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.9(b) was revised to require that an order ruling on the merits of a review hearing shall address the continued scope of representation of court-appointed counsel. This is similar to the requirement in Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.7(a)(1)(v), which requires an order adjudicating incapacity and appointing a guardian to set forth the continued scope of representation of court-appointed counsel. Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.9(c)(1)(viii) was also revised post-publication to delete the prior petition averments and instead require averments setting forth the need for termination or modification of the guardianship as well as averments relating to the findings required by § 5512.1(a)(1)—(a)(4).

Form G-01 (Citation and Notice)

The Committee received a comment in response to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking suggesting the deletion of a provision in Form G-01 concerning an alleged incapacitated person's right to request that the court appoint counsel to represent them. Because all alleged incapacitated persons are now entitled to representation, the provision is obsolete. The form has been rescinded and replaced with corrective language.

Guardianship Tracking System Reporting Forms

Post-publication, the Committee recommended that the Court rescind the three Guardianship Tracking System ("GTS") reporting forms, G-02 (Report of Guardian of the Estate), G-03 (Report of Guardian of the Person), and G-05 (Guardian's Inventory for an Incapacitated Person), from the Appendix to the rules. In lieu of maintaining the reporting forms in the rules, the Committee recommended

relocating the forms to the GTS and the Unified Judicial System website in the manner of numerous other forms used by participants. The Committee believes this change will enable the Advisory Council on Elder Justice in the Courts, the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts ("AOPC"), and the Committee to revise the reporting forms more timely outside of the rulemaking process. The Committee further believes that this change will give AOPC greater flexibility in coordinating changes to the GTS and its reporting forms.

Rescinding the GTS reporting forms from the Appendix to the rules required further amendments to Pa.R.O.C.P. 1.8, 2.4, 14.8, and 14.14 and the Index to the Appendix of Orphans' Court Forms. Pa.R.O.C.P. 1.8 was revised to add a new provision relating to the reporting forms required by Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.8 and an updated website address. Second, the Committee revised Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.8 to provide that the Court Administrator of Pennsylvania, in consultation with the Committee and Advisory Council, shall prescribe the forms necessary for filing reports. The phrasing is intended to reflect that the forms are not adopted by the Court but required by the rules. *See, e.g.*, Pa.R.Civ.P.M.D.J. 350(c)(1) and 1002. Third, the Committee revised Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.14 to rescind Forms G-02, G-03, and G-05 from the Appendix. The commentary to Rule 14.14 was amended to explain this change and provide an updated website address. Fourth, the Committee revised the Index to the Appendix of Orphans' Court Forms to the rules to reflect the rescission of the referenced forms. Finally, corollary revisions were made to the Comment to Pa.R.O.C.P. 2.4 to reflect the renumbering of Pa.R.O.C.P. 1.8.

Other Rule Changes

In addition to the previously discussed rule changes, the proposal was modified in a number of areas both within and beyond the scope of Act 61. Some of the changes were the result of public comments received in response to the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, while others were made in the interest of avoiding serial recommendations to the guardianship rules.

Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.2(a)(16) and its commentary reference the United States Veterans' Administration and the United States Veterans' Bureau, respectively. These references are made in the context of fulfilling 20 Pa.C.S. § 8411, which requires notice to the United States Veterans' Bureau or its successor when a petition for a guardian is filed with respect to veterans or their dependents who receive veterans' benefits. The rule and its commentary were revised to reflect the successor entity of the United States Veterans' Administration and the United States Veterans' Bureau, the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Former Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.6(b)(1)(x) and (b)(2) referenced a "professional guardian" as being eligible to serve as the guardian of an incapacitated person. Post-publication, those references to a "professional guardian" were deleted to reflect that neither Title 20, Chapter 55, nor the rules address or define "professional guardians." A cross-reference to § 5511(f)(1), which, among other things, identifies those entities eligible to serve as a guardian, was substituted for the deleted term.

The Committee also published proposed revisions relating to the pre-existing "Certificate of Guardianship of the Estate" ("Certificate") in the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking. Prior to the adoption of Act 61, the Committee received a request to review Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.7(c). It was suggested that the rule requires the clerk to certify that the guardian is still serving before issuing a Certificate to that effect, noting that the clerk's office should not issue

the Certificate if the guardian has been removed or resigned. The Committee generally agreed with this suggestion and proposed amending the Certificate to: (1) have the clerk certify that no record of modification of the appointment order was on the docket at the time of the certification; and (2) deleting the statement that the appointment was made by the court "in full consideration of Chapter 55 of the PEF Code" insofar as the clerk would have no factual basis to make that statement.

While preparing the proposal for publication, it became apparent there was a need to distinguish between a plenary and limited guardian of the estate because a limited guardian would not have unlimited access to all of the incapacitated person's accounts. Therefore, the Committee proposed new subdivision (c)(2) relating to a certification for a limited guardian. However, it was suggested that the Committee should further revise Pa.R.O.C.P. 14.7(b), pertaining to the order adjudicating incapacity and appointing guardian of the estate to distinguish between orders appointing a plenary or limited guardian. Post-publication, new subdivisions (b)(2)(i) and (b)(2)(ii) were added to address the authority of a plenary or limited guardian, respectively.

Stylistic changes were made throughout the rule-making.

These rule changes are immediately effective.

PROPOSED RULEMAKING

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

[67 PA. CODE CH. 441]

Access to and Occupancy of Highways by Driveways and Local Roads

The Department of Transportation (department), under section 420 of the State Highway Law (act) (36 P.S. § 670-420), proposes to amend 67 Pa. Code Chapter 441 (relating to access to and occupancy of highways by driveways and local roads) to read as set forth in Annex A.

Effective Date

This proposed rulemaking will be effective upon final-form publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

Statutory Authority

This rulemaking is proposed under the authority of section 420 of the act. Specifically, section 420(a) of the act provides that “[t]he secretary is empowered to make reasonable rules and regulations governing the use of all State highways. . . .” Furthermore, section 420(b) of the act states that “[t]he secretary may issue permits for the opening of streets and driveways onto State highways and for the opening of the surface and occupancy of State highways on terms and conditions established in department regulations.”

Background and Need for the Amendments

Chapter 441 is an exercise of the department’s statutory authority to promulgate a regulation controlling the safe location, design, construction and maintenance of: driveways; local roads; drainage facilities; structures; means of ingress, egress and access; and other property within the State highway right-of-way. The purpose of this proposed rulemaking is: 1) to amend and clarify the provisions relating to who may apply for and who may be issued a permit to construct or alter driveways; local roads; drainage facilities; structures; means of ingress, egress and access; and other property within the State highway right-of-way; 2) to amend definitions and terminology to make the definitions and terminology consistent with current industry-accepted and department usages; 3) to update sight distance requirements by replacing the values, tables and formulas with a reference to the department’s Design Manual Part 2, Highway Design which uses the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials’ Sight Distance standards; 4) to replace driveway design criteria and layout figures with a reference to the department’s Highway Occupancy Permit Operations Manual, which references established engineering standards necessary to ensure that the highway system is operated in an efficient and safe manner; 5) to formally include the Electronic Permitting System; 6) to regulate nonvehicular access to the State highways; 7) to eliminate five indemnification forms and instead provide for automatic indemnification in accordance with current law; 8) to allow the department to remove an unpermitted access that the department determines is unsafe and the property owner or facility owner fails to remove the same after receiving notice; and 9) to ensure that all official documents use gender neutral language consistent with the department’s policy and commitment.

It is important to note that current Chapter 441 incorporates multiple department publications, some of which are no longer in use or applicable. The department is updating references to eliminate publication numbers and instead providing the name of the referenced manuals throughout this proposed rulemaking. The department’s manuals are required to be maintained by the United States Department of Transportation’s Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) as a condition of receipt of Federal funding and provide references to industry-accepted engineering standards that are approved by the FHWA in accordance with the Federal-Aid Highways Stewardship and Oversight Agreement between Pennsylvania and the FHWA. The agreement is intended to ensure efficient and effective management of public funds consistent with Federal law relating to highway funding and it is entered into in accordance with 23 U.S.C. § 106 (relating to project approval and oversight). The agreement can be accessed at <https://www.fhwa.dot.gov/federalaid/stewardship/agreements/pa.pdf>.

The proposed regulatory revisions will ensure that modifications to the highway system brought about by the issuance of highway occupancy permits are implemented in the safest and least disruptive way for the overall efficiency and operation of the highway system and that the modifications comply with Federally accepted standards.

Description of the Proposed Amendments

Significant amendments to the chapter include the following:

Section 441.1

The department proposes to amend § 441.1 (relating to definitions) to delete, modify and add terms as follows based on current industry standards, department practice and the desire to simplify, where possible, the requirements to apply for and obtain a permit.

The department proposes to amend the definition of “access” to include nonvehicular facilities used to enter or exit the highway that require opening of the surface or occupancy of the highway. The term “street” is proposed to be replaced by the term “local road” as the definition of “local road” includes a street. The department proposes to replace “drainage structures” with the proposed defined term “drainage facilities” to remove ambiguity. The department proposes to remove the phrase “of vehicles” because the department has historically issued permits for drainage facilities, as well as other pedestrian facilities such as sidewalks and ramps, under Chapter 441. The statutory authority to issue permits for these facilities can be found under section 420(b)(2) of the act which states that “no person. . . shall open a driveway onto a State highway or open the surface of or occupy a State highway without a permit.” The additional clarity afforded by this amendment also addresses a problematic result in a recent Commonwealth Court case, *N-Jie v. Dep’t of Transportation*, 300 A.3d 1131 (Pa. Cmwlth. 2023), which considered the department’s removal of a pedestrian bridge occupying the State highway right-of-way without the department’s permission. In *N-Jie*, the court opined that § 441.6(4)(ii) (relating to general conditions) did not authorize the department to remove a pedestrian bridge on which a permit had never been issued. The court held that this subparagraph of the regulation only applies where a highway occupancy permit has been issued. *Id.* at 1140. In a footnote, the

Commonwealth Court noted that § 441.10 (relating to penalties and enforcement) did not authorize the department to remove a pedestrian bridge where the regulation only allowed the department to block “driveways.” *Id.* at FN 9. The Commonwealth Court pointed out that the regulation’s definition of “driveway” did not include a pedestrian bridge. *Id.* The department seeks to amend the definition of “access,” in addition to proposing other amendments, to continue its existing practices of exercising its duty under the act in furtherance of the safety of the traveling public.

The department proposes to add a definition of “authorized agent” to reflect the department’s practice of allowing engineers or other representatives to submit applications on behalf of an applicant.

The department proposes to delete “Central Permit Office” from the definitions as the only section in which the term is used, § 441.5(i) (relating to issuance of permits), is proposed to be deleted.

The department proposes to delete “combination” from the definitions as the only sections in which the term is used, §§ 441.8 and 441.9 (relating to driveway design requirements; and driveway layout illustrations), are proposed to be deleted.

The department proposes to add “department specifications” to the definitions to replace “Form 408”, which is Department Publication 408, with a more general term to eliminate the risk that the current publication number will become obsolete in the future. This publication is amended and updated periodically by a process whereby changes are vetted by appropriate third-party stakeholders and approved by the FHWA.

The department proposes to add “Deputy Secretary” to the definitions to replace the definition of “director,” which is now obsolete as the department believes that the authority that was vested in the director should reside with the Deputy Secretary.

The department proposes to delete “director” from the definitions because it is no longer a title the department uses for officials with authority under Chapter 441. For the same reason, the department proposes to replace the term “director” in the remainder of Chapter 441 with “Deputy Secretary or designee.” In addition, the department’s Bureau of Highway Services, which is currently referenced in the definition of “director,” no longer exists. The director had the authority to waive design requirements, approve requests to remove median divisors and revoke a permit for nonpayment of a fee; this authority now rests with the Deputy Secretary or designee.

The department proposes to add “Design Manual Part 2” a department publication to the definitions to refer applicants to design requirements, criteria and figures found in this publication throughout various sections of Chapter 441. This publication is amended and updated periodically by a process whereby changes are vetted by appropriate third-party stakeholders and approved by the FHWA.

The department proposes to add “drainage facility” to the definitions because § 441.3(a) (relating to permit application procedure) requires a permit for drainage facilities within the State highway right-of-way but there is no definition setting forth what constitutes a “drainage facility.”

The department proposes to add “Electronic Permitting System” or “EPS” to the definitions because since this chapter was last amended, the department has imple-

mented an electronic system to allow for more efficient processing of permit applications. Applicants are required to submit their applications by means of the EPS. The EPS has been operational since 2011.

The department proposes to delete “Form 408” from the definitions in favor of the more general term “department specifications” to eliminate the risk that the current publication number will become obsolete in the future.

The department proposes to add “Highway Occupancy Permit Operations Manual” to the definitions and refer to it in various sections of Chapter 441. The manual is intended for anyone who wishes to obtain guidance or information on the department’s highway occupancy permit program. It includes but is not limited to the following: 1) an overview of the department’s highway occupancy permit program, how it is staffed and how staff collectively administers the program; 2) a detailed walk-through from application submission to application review to permit issuance to construction, inspection and close-out of permitted work; 4) guidance on resolving highway occupancy permit-related disputes and complaints; and 5) guidance on the use of all highway occupancy permit-related department forms. The Highway Occupancy Permit Operation Manual is approved by the FHWA and is required under the Federal-Aid Highways Stewardship and Oversight Agreement between the FHWA and the Commonwealth. The agreement is intended to ensure efficient and effective management of public funds consistent with Federal law relating to highway funding and it is entered into in accordance with 23 U.S.C. § 106. The agreement can be accessed at <https://www.fhwa.dot.gov/federalaid/stewardship/agreements/pa.pdf>.

The department proposes to delete “intermediate island” from the definitions as the term is not used in Chapter 441.

The department proposes to amend “low volume driveway,” which currently includes driveways that are used by up to 749 vehicles per day, to include driveways expected to generate 750 vehicles per day. Due to an oversight, Chapter 441 currently does not include or classify a driveway that generates exactly 750 vehicles per day. This proposed amendment remedies that oversight.

The department proposes to amend “medium volume driveway” to include and classify a driveway that is expected to generate 1,500 vehicles per day as a medium volume driveway. Chapter 441 currently does not include or classify a driveway that generates 1,500 vehicles per day. This proposed amendment remedies that oversight.

The department proposes to add “municipality” to the definitions to clarify what governmental units are considered municipalities. This definition is consistent with the definition of municipality provided in 1 Pa.C.S. § 1991 (relating to definitions) and 53 Pa.C.S. (relating to municipalities generally).

The department proposes to amend “owner” to clarify who may apply for a permit under the permit application procedure provided in § 441.3. The amendment would delete persons with a sales agreement or option to purchase property. Sales agreements for developments are often conditioned on receipt of permits. Those persons with a sales agreement or option to purchase property would still be able to apply for a permit and obtain preliminary permit approval; but would not be issued a permit until title to the property is transferred. Section 441.3(b) currently requires an application to be in the name of an “owner,” which is confusing in light of the definition the department is proposing to change. Pro-

posed § 441.3(b) would allow an application to be submitted by an “owner” and applicants with equitable interests in the property under a sales agreement would be able to apply without (1) the seller (the fee title owner) having to consent to the application, (2) the applicant having to further indemnify the department in accordance with § 441.3(7), and (3) the need to execute and record a covenant running with the land indicating the ongoing indemnification requirement. This would allow developers who condition their sales agreements on permitting to be able to submit applications and work through the review process. This will streamline the permit process for developers by eliminating many of the steps and expense currently necessary for developers operating under a sales agreement to apply for a permit. With 1.1 million small businesses in this Commonwealth, this change will most likely have a large impact on small businesses and other businesses that are not fee owners that are applying for a driveway permit.

The department proposes to delete “Publication 43,” “Publication 68” and “Publication 90” from the definitions because these publications are obsolete.

The department proposes to amend “roadway” to rectify an inconsistency with the definition of “shoulder.” Under the definition of “shoulder,” the shoulder is considered a part of the roadway; under the definition of “roadway,” shoulders are excluded. Shoulders should be considered a part of the roadway. This proposed amendment deletes the exclusion of the shoulder from the definition of “roadway” to make the two terms consistent.

The department proposes to amend “roadway construction standards” by deleting the publication number in case it is changed in the future and to indicate that the publication can be found on the department’s website. This publication is amended and updated periodically by a process whereby changes are vetted by appropriate third-party stakeholders and approved by the FHWA.

The department proposes to delete “setback” from the definitions as the term is not used in Chapter 441.

The department proposes to delete “turning radius” from the definitions as the term is not used in Chapter 441.

Section 441.2

The department proposes to amend subsection (a) to use the proposed amended definitions, remove redundancy and clarify that Chapter 441 applies to both vehicular and non-vehicular access to the highway right-of-way.

Section 441.3

The department proposes to replace the term “driveway, local road or drainage facility or structure” with the term “access” in subsection (a) to clean up the language and avoid redundancy. Because of the Commonwealth Court’s recent discussion of Chapter 441 in *N-Jie*, described previously, the department desires to make clear that non-vehicular accesses, such as pedestrian facilities that require “the opening of the surface and occupancy of the State highway,” are included in its regulations and a permit is required. The proposed amendment will alleviate the problematic result under the *N-Jie* decision’s reasoning and allow the department to remove unauthorized nonvehicular accesses in furtherance of the safety of the traveling public. Without this amendment, unpermitted pedestrian facilities that cause a safety hazard could not be removed without the department bringing an action in trespass and obtaining a court order for its

removal. The department seeks to have the same ability to block, sever or remove these facilities as it currently has to block, sever or remove driveways and drainage facilities constructed without a permit or in violation of the regulations.

The department proposes in subsection (b) to make clear who may apply for a highway occupancy permit. The proposed amendment simplifies the definition of “owner” while still allowing persons with an equitable interest in property under a sales agreement to apply, accommodating the reality that developers will often condition sales agreements on the ability to obtain permits. Applicants for commercial driveways will benefit from the proposed amendment to this section because many developers of commercial driveways have sales agreements with the fee title holder that are contingent upon permit approvals. The proposed definition of “owner” will allow those with a sales agreement, or an option to purchase, to apply for a permit and obtain preliminary approval for the occupancy to close on the purchase of the property, though permits will not be issued until the developer is the fee title owner of the property. With 1.1 million small businesses in this Commonwealth, this change will most likely have a large impact on small businesses and other businesses that are not fee owners that apply for a driveway permit. The current requirement for the applicant to provide notice to the fee title holder has been moved to § 441.3(e)(7).

The department proposes to amend § 441.3(c) to provide for submission of permit applications through the EPS, while still allowing paper applications at the department’s discretion.

The department proposes, in § 441.3(c.1), to require applicants who are not the owner of fee title to property or who will not be the owner of fee title to property prior to permit issuance to indemnify the Commonwealth against actions brought by the fee title holder of the property because of the granting of the permit to the nonfee owner applicant. This is consistent with the current automatic indemnification requirement in § 441.6(13) and will simplify the permitting process by eliminating the necessity to execute a specific form. This addition is proposed to replace the current text in § 441.3(e)(7)(ii) but simplifies that requirement by not having a separate indemnification form to execute and by not requiring a covenant running with land.

Section 441.3(d), regarding when to submit an application, is proposed to be amended by adding the term “access” and deleting the term “driveway” to clarify that permit applications shall be submitted for construction involving any access to the State highway, whether vehicular or nonvehicular.

Section 441.3(e) regarding application procedures and submission of the permit application, is proposed to be amended to accommodate the use of the EPS. In addition, § 441.3(e)(6) and (7) would distinguish between application requirements for fee owners, owners with an estate or other legal interest in property other than fee title and owners and persons with an equitable interest in property under a sales agreement or an option to purchase. Section 441.3(e)(7)(ii) and (iii) are proposed to be deleted as an applicant other than the fee owner will automatically indemnify the Commonwealth against actions brought by the fee title owner of property per proposed addition of § 441.3(c.1). This would simplify the current process and reduce the time required to submit an application by eliminating the need to draft and execute a form. It

would also reduce the time required to review an application by eliminating the need for the department to seek a legal review.

The department proposes to amend § 441.3(f) to delete references to “Publication 43” and “Publication 90” because those publications are obsolete. The amendment references the appropriate regulation governing temporary traffic control, which references the current manual and publication related to temporary traffic control (the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices and Department Publication 213).

The department proposes to amend § 441.3(g) to indicate that a drainage control plan must be signed and sealed by a professional engineer or other persons authorized by law. Subsection (g)(1)(vii) and (3) are proposed to be added because a facility that uses best management practices (BMP), as defined by 25 Pa. Code Chapter 102 (relating to erosion and sediment control), is prohibited under section 421 of the act (36 P.S. § 670-421) from discharging stormwater onto a highway right-of-way. Chapter 102 of 25 Pa. Code contains the Department of Environmental Protection’s regulations addressing stormwater runoff. Because stormwater runoff is prohibited on the State highway, permit applicants should not be exploiting a highway right-of-way to handle the stormwater runoff generated as a result of constructing a facility that uses BMPs as defined by 25 Pa. Code Chapter 102. Stormwater runoff is limited to runoff from the transportation facilities into the drainage and its facilities, and not from runoff from adjacent properties.

The department proposes to amend § 441.3(h) to require applicants who cannot obtain a drainage release from an affected property owner to automatically indemnify the Commonwealth against actions brought by the fee title holder of the property because of the granting of the permit. This is consistent with the current automatic indemnification requirement in § 441.6(13) and will simplify the permitting process by reducing the time required to submit an application by eliminating the need to draft and execute a form. This would also reduce the time required to review an application by eliminating the need for the department to seek a legal review. The obsolete drainage release form numbers mentioned in this section are being deleted and the language instead directs the applicant to the department’s website for the current form.

The department proposes to amend § 441.3(j) by deleting the word “driveway” to clarify that municipalities, planning commissions and zoning boards shall have the ability to review any access points to State highways within their jurisdictions, whether for vehicles or not, and that applications for access must be accompanied by evidence indicating that the location and type of access requested has been reviewed by that municipality or agency.

Section 441.4

The department proposes to amend subsections (a)—(d) to modernize spelling and grammar. The Department proposes in subsection (e) to eliminate the requirement for a permittee to provide their copy of the permit if requesting a refund. Historically, the permit was a carbon copy form but now is an easily accessible PDF stored in the department’s electronic storage system.

The department proposes to amend subsection (f), relating to miscellaneous fees, to break up the provision regarding permit recording into its own subsection (g). This will enhance the readability of the section. The

department retains the language in the prior subsection (f) and proposes to add subsection (g) with the following additions. In subsection (g), the department proposes to lay out when permits are to be recorded. Proposed changes from the prior subsection (f) include a new reference to the department’s website for a copy of the form. This amendment is being proposed to make the form reference more general so that there is not a risk of the reference becoming obsolete in the future. The department also proposes adding paragraphs (4) and (5) from what was in the prior subsection (f) to add to the list of reasons a permit needs to be recorded at a County Office of the Recorder of Deeds. This includes when the permittee must indemnify the Commonwealth as specified in § 441.3(c.1) and (h) and § 441.5(e)(1)(v) or § 441.8(j)(5), and when a release is executed as specified in §§ 441.3(h) and 441.8(d). This amendment is being proposed because recording allows potential purchasers of properties that have permitted highway occupancies to be on notice of the obligations attached to the permit that are binding on successors and assigns per § 441.6(1). The department proposes, under subsection (h), to provide for a waiver of the recording requirement for temporary access permits.

Section 441.5

The department proposes to amend § 441.5 to reflect modernization of the permitting process, including provisions reflecting the use of the EPS.

Section 441.5(a), regarding the issuance of permits generally, is proposed to be amended to delete the fact that the permit will also serve as a receipt for the fees accompanying the application. The department proposes to delete this because payment of the permit fees is documented in the EPS.

Section 441.5(b), regarding permits only being issued to the property owner, is proposed to be amended to indicate that an applicant with a sales agreement or option to purchase may receive preliminary permit approval but will not be issued a permit until the applicant submits proof of ownership of the property. Developers often indicate that they must obtain the required permits before closing on the property. This addition is intended to assist developers in moving forward with financing prior to the issuance of a permit and closing.

The department proposes to amend § 441.5(e)(1)(v), regarding indemnification for the waiver of design requirements, to replace the phrase found in the existing regulation, “an indemnity agreement satisfactory to the Commonwealth,” with language that automatically indemnifies the Department. This is consistent with the current automatic indemnification requirement in § 441.6(13) and will simplify the permitting process by reducing the time required to submit an application by eliminating the need to draft and execute a form and reducing the time required to review an application by eliminating the need for the department to seek a legal review.

The department proposes in § 441.5(e)(2) to delete “for extracting natural resources for a period of no more than one year” to encompass more situations where temporary access may be permitted, and to replace district “engineer” with district “executive” to be consistent with current terminology.

In § 441.5(f), regarding permits requiring agreements, the department proposes to require the permittee to provide security when the permittee is performing a substantial amount of work, as authorized under section 420 of the act.

In § 441.5(h), regarding work completion notifications, the department proposes to replace the need for the permittee to mail a self-addressed post card (Form M-945G) with written notification to the district office when the permitted work is complete.

The department proposes to delete § 441.5(i) because the Department no longer uses microfilm as permanent record of the permit. Instead, the permit is stored electronically in the department's electronic document storage system.

Section 441.6

The department proposes to delete § 441.6(1)(vi) and (vii), regarding scope of permit, because the information is inaccurate. Disputes arising from the permit are not within the jurisdiction of the Board of Claims. Disputes between the permittee and the department are governed by 2 Pa.C.S. §§ 501—508 (relating to practice and procedure of Commonwealth agencies) and 67 Pa. Code Chapter 491 (relating to administrative practice and procedure), rather than Form 408.

The department proposes to amend § 441.6(1)(viii) to allow the department to provide notice of intent to revoke a permit and to provide the permittee 30 calendar days to either apply for the appropriate permit classification or request a hearing if the actual traffic volume of a driveway exceeds its permit classification.

Paragraph (2) is proposed to be amended to delete outdated statutory references.

The department proposes to add paragraph (2.1) to incorporate applicable Federal standards because the department must comply with those standards to receive Federal highway funds. Therefore, the department must ensure that any work done in the right-of-way under a permit also complies with those standards.

The department proposes to amend § 441.6(3), regarding work to conform to department standards, to update the applicable reference of what work must conform to because the reference currently in the section is obsolete.

The department proposes to amend § 441.6(4) to permit the department to delete structures, equipment or property belonging to a permittee from the highway right-of-way and to restore the right-of-way to its former condition. This provision is statutorily authorized by sections 401 and 407 of the act (36 P.S. §§ 670-401 and 670-407).

In § 441.6(9), regarding traffic protection and maintenance, the department proposes to update the applicable reference regarding maintenance and protection of traffic to department regulations in Chapter 212, Subchapter E (relating to temporary traffic control). The department proposes to rescind subparagraphs (i)—(iii) as these provisions are covered in Subchapter E.

The department proposes to amend § 441.6(10) to provide proper terminology for guide rail and drainage pipes.

The department proposes to amend § 441.6(16)(i), regarding future additional driveways and access covenants, to further clarify when the department may consider restricting access and deletes and replaces the referenced form (Form CC-14) that is no longer in use with a form available on the department's website.

The department proposes to amend § 441.6(17), regarding use of highway prohibited, to delete the referenced figures from subsection (ii), as proposed amendments remove all figures from § 441.9. The figures are outdated

and are no longer used when designing land uses with fuel pumps. Land use has changed considerably by the expansion of the convenience stores, the amount of fuel pumps and the amount of traffic generated.

Section 441.7

The department proposes to amend § 441.7(b), (c), (d) and (f) (relating to general driveway requirements) to make the terminology consistent with the intent of the department in promulgating this rulemaking. The department proposes to add subsection (g) to allow for the issuance of temporary access permits for temporary driveways or local roads related to activities such as fairs, construction projects, extraction of natural resources or other activities for which the property owner does not need to have permanent access. In these cases, this proposed amendment would allow the department to permit coarse aggregate material to be placed on a temporary access surface instead of paving, thereby reducing the property owner's costs without inconveniencing the public or adversely affecting the highway infrastructure.

Section 441.8

In general, proposed amendments to § 441.8 clarify design requirements to reflect current engineering standards, delete outdated figures and instead reference figures in the department's Highway Occupancy Permit Operations Manual.

Subsection (a) is proposed to be amended to clarify that the examples are most applicable when one driveway serves the property. Subsection (d), regarding property line clearance, is proposed to be amended to allow a portion of the proposed access to be outside of the applicant's property frontage boundary line if a release is obtained from the affected property owner and submitted with the application.

The department proposes to amend subsection (e) to add the term "tangential" to eliminate any confusion of where to measure from. Adding the term clearly describes that the distance is measured between the ends of the radii of both driveways. A tangent is a straight line or plane that touches a curve. Additionally, the section is proposed to be amended to provide the department discretion in requiring permanent curbing between driveways if less than 50 feet apart. There are instances where it does not make sense to place permanent curbing, such as in rural areas where curbing is not expected.

The department proposes to amend subsection (h) to delete the existing "desirable" sight distance values in Tables 1 through 6 and the "minimum acceptable sight distance" formula, and to establish a general rule that "optimal driveway sight distance" must be considered. In addition, the amendment allows the use of the stopping sight distance formula in cases where it is impractical or infeasible to achieve intersection sight distance. Both formulas are identified in the department's Design Manual Part 2, Highway Design.

The department proposes to amend subsection (i) to provide department discretion regarding the need for a pipe under the driveway in paragraph (2). Additionally, in paragraph (2), the form reference is proposed to be deleted. In paragraph (3), reference to Figure 6 is being deleted as the figure is being deleted. Also, additional wording is proposed to be added to describe when a maximum 10:1 driveway embankment slope is not needed.

The department proposes to amend subsection (j), relating to auxiliary lanes, to update obsolete references and

to require automatic indemnification if the permittee is unsuccessful in securing the other property owner's approval for a lane in front of the other property. This is consistent with the current automatic indemnification requirement in § 441.6(13) and will simplify the permitting process by reducing the time required to submit an application by eliminating the need to draft and execute a form. It will also reduce the time required to review an application by eliminating the need for the department to seek a legal review.

The department proposes to amend subsection (k) to clarify the difference between a driveway and an access. The reference to Form 408 is also replaced with a more general term to eliminate the risk that the current publication number will become obsolete in the future.

The department similarly proposes to amend subsection (l) to clarify the difference between an access and a driveway. An editorial change is also made to correct a spelling error.

The department proposes to amend subsection (m), as the Deputy Secretary is replacing the director with the authority to approve requests to remove median divisors.

The department proposes to amend subsection (o)(2) to eliminate the traffic signal permit form number and rather refer to department approval of a traffic signal. The department proposes replacing "municipality" with "local authority" to be consistent with 75 Pa.C.S. § 6122 (relating to authority to erect traffic-control devices). Lastly, this section is proposed to be amended to acknowledge that this section will not apply to department-managed signals under 74 Pa.C.S. § 9202(i) (relating to maintenance agreement) regarding department-managed signals.

Section 441.9

The department proposes to delete this section, removing the driveway layout illustrations. Although the illustrations provide a range of dimensions based on types of vehicles and roadway speed, strict adherence to the dimensions is not always achievable due to site constraints, the size of certain vehicles and consideration of other roadway users such as bicyclists and pedestrians. Today, driveways are often designed using commercially available, vehicle turning-template software which provides dimensions for the driveway to function safely and efficiently as an integral component of the highway system. The illustrations are located in the department's Highway Occupancy Permit Operations Manual with additional guidance provided regarding the geometric designs of the various classifications of driveways.

Section 441.10

Proposed amendments to § 441.10 would expand a violation to include failure to obtain a required permit and failure to comply with permit conditions. In subsection (a)(4), the department proposes to replace the term "driveway" with the term "access," as a driveway is included in the definition of "access." This proposed amendment is in consideration of the *N-Jie* case, which noted that a pedestrian bridge could not be blocked under Chapter 441 as the definition of "driveway" did not include nonvehicular traffic. Proposed subsection (a)(5) would allow the department to remove any or all unpermitted accesses, structures or equipment, or property from the legal limits of the right-of-way and to restore the right-of-way to its former condition after the department determines that there is a threat to public safety and after notice to the property or facility owner. Current language in subsection (a)(5) is proposed to be

deleted because the department is already granted authority to do what is provided by the language.

Persons and Entities Affected

This proposed rulemaking will affect all applicants for highway occupancy permits who intend to create an access point, drainage facility or structure within the State highway or to change the design, operation or location of existing access points, drainage facilities or structures within the State highway right-of-way. These applicants include municipalities and owners of properties who require access to exercise their property rights, such as easement holders and mineral estate holders, as well as fee title holders. In some cases, the regulations can affect neighboring property owners.

Fiscal Impact

This proposed rulemaking is revenue neutral because the department's current resources are already being used to administer this program. This proposed rulemaking only modernizes, clarifies and implements what the department is already doing.

Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)), on December 11, 2024, the Department submitted a copy of this proposed rulemaking and a copy of a Regulatory Analysis Form to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and to the chairperson of the Transportation Committee of the Senate and the chairperson of the Transportation Committee of the House of Representatives. A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, IRRC may convey any comments, recommendations or objections to the proposed rulemaking within 30 days of the close of the public comment period. The comments, recommendations or objections shall specify the regulatory review criteria in section 5.2 of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5b) which have not been met. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review, prior to final publication of the rulemaking by the department, the General Assembly and the Governor.

Sunset Date

The department is not establishing a sunset date for these regulations because these regulations are needed to administer provisions required under section 420 of the act. The department, however, will continue to closely monitor these regulations for their effectiveness.

Public Comments

Interested persons are invited to submit written comments, suggested edits or objections regarding this proposed rulemaking to Victoria P. ARTICLE III. HIGHWAYS

CHAPTER 441. ACCESS TO AND OCCUPANCY OF HIGHWAYS BY DRIVEWAYS AND LOCAL ROADS

§ 441.1. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in this chapter, have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

* * * * *

Access—A driveway, [street] **local road** or other means of passage [of vehicles] between the highway and abutting property, including acceleration and deceleration lanes and such drainage [structures] **facilities** as may be necessary for the proper construction and maintenance thereof.

Authorized agent—A person who is authorized to act on behalf of an owner.

[**Central Permit Office**—The office for the control of issuance of permits located at:

Combination—Two or more vehicles physically interconnected in tandem.]

Commonwealth—The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

* * * * *

Department—The Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth.

Department specifications—A Department publication containing current highway construction requirements, which is available on the Department's website.

[**Director**—The director of the Department's Bureau of Highway Services.]

Deputy Secretary—The Deputy Secretary for the Department's Highway Administration.

Design Manual Part 2—A Department publication containing current highway geometric design criteria and other design and engineering principles for highways, which is available on the Department's website.

District office—Any of the 11 engineering district offices of the Department.

Divided highway—A highway divided into two or more roadways and so constructed as to impede vehicular traffic between the roadways by providing an intervening space, physical barrier[,] or clearly indicated divided highway.

Drainage facility—A facility that conveys water away from the roadway to prevent erosion or damage to the roadway, saturation of the subgrade and standing water or ice on the roadway.

Driveway—Every entrance or exit used by vehicular traffic to or from properties abutting a highway. The term includes proposed streets, lanes, alleys, courts and ways.

* * * * *

Egress—The exit of vehicular traffic from abutting properties to a highway.

EPS—Electronic Permitting System—The Department's electronic system that accepts, reviews, tracks, issues and stores highway occupancy permits, applications, plans, documents and engineering studies.

Equipment—[All machinery] **Machinery** and equipment, together with the necessary supplies for upkeep and maintenance, and also tools and apparatus necessary for the proper construction and completion of the work.

[**Form 408**—The latest revision of highway construction specifications issued by the Department.]

Frontage width—The distance along the right-of-way line in front of an abutting property.

High volume driveway—A driveway used or expected to be used by more than [1500] **1,500** vehicles per day.

Highway—A highway or bridge on the system of State highways and bridges, including the entire width between right-of-way lines, over which the Department has assumed or has been legislatively given jurisdiction.

Highway Occupancy Permit Operations Manual—A Department publication providing regulatory and technical knowledge, policy, process and procedure for permitting access to or occupancy of the State system of highways, which is available on the Department's website.

Improved area—The area within the right-of-way which has been constructed for highway purposes, including roadbed, pavement, shoulders, slope, sidewalks, drainage facilities[,] and any other appurtenances.

Ingress—The entrance of vehicular traffic to abutting properties from a highway.

Inspector—The Department's authorized representative assigned to inspect permit operations.

[**Intermediate island**—The section of right-of-way between driveways from the pavement edge or curb to the property line.]

Joint-use driveway—A driveway shared by and constructed to provide access to two or three properties.

Limited access highway—A highway to which owners or occupants of abutting lands and other persons have no legal right of access except at points and in the manner determined by the Department.

Local road—Every public highway other than a State highway. The term includes existing or proposed streets, lanes, alleys, courts[,] and ways.

Low volume driveway—A driveway used or expected to be used by more than 25 but [less] **not more** than 750 vehicles per day.

* * * * *

Medium volume driveway—A driveway used or expected to be used by more than 750 but [less than 1500] **not more than 1,500** vehicles per day.

Minimum use driveway—A residential or other driveway which is used or expected to be used by not more than 25 vehicles per day.

Municipality—A county, city, borough, incorporated town or township.

Owner—A person holding one of the following rights to access that is clearly established in the legal document granting the property interest:

- (i) fee title to property, or
- (ii) an estate or other legal interest in property, such as an easement, a lease, a license or subsurface rights[, or
- (iii) an equitable interest in property under a sales agreement or an option to purchase;

provided that the estate or other legal or equitable interest in property includes the use requested in the permit].

Pavement edge—The edge of the main traveled portion of any highway, exclusive of shoulder.

Permanent curbing—Plain or reinforced cement concrete curb which meets Department standards.

Permit—A highway occupancy permit (Form M-945P) issued by a district office pursuant to this chapter.

Person—An individual, business entity, association, political subdivision, authority, Federal or Commonwealth agency, or other entity recognized by law.

Plans—Drawings which show the location, character[,] and dimensions of the proposed occupancy and related highway features, including layouts, profiles, cross sections, drainage[,] and other details.

Property line clearance—The distance measured along the pavement edge or curb between the property frontage boundary line and the near edge of the driveway.

[Publication 43—A Department publication, sometimes called “Bulletin 43,” containing requirements for the maintenance and protection of traffic on construction projects.

Publication 68—A Department publication containing regulations governing the design, location, and operation of all official traffic signs, signals, and markings on and along highways.

Publication 90—A Department publication containing requirements for work area traffic control during highway maintenance operations and utility work.]

Right-of-way—The area which has been acquired by the Department for highway purposes.

Roadway—That portion of a highway improved, designed[,] or ordinarily used for vehicular travel, exclusive of the sidewalk [or shoulder] .

Roadway construction standards—Department [**Publication No. 72**] **publication** containing the Department’s [**design**] standards for roadway construction, **which is available on the Department’s website.**

Secretary—The Secretary of the Department.

[Setback—The lateral distance between the right-of-way line and the roadside building, liquid fuel pump island, display stand, or other object, which will result in space for vehicles to stop or park between such objects and the right-of-way line.]

Shoulder—The portion of the roadway, contiguous to the traffic lanes, for accommodation of stopped vehicles, for emergency use, and for lateral support of base and surface courses and pavements.

* * * * *

Supplement—An amendment to a highway occupancy permit issued on Department Form M-945S.

[Traveled way—The portion of the roadway for the movement of vehicles, exclusive of shoulders and auxiliary lanes.]

Traffic control device—Any sign, signal, marking or device placed or erected for the purpose of regulating, warning[,] or guiding vehicular traffic or pedestrians, or both.

Traveled way—The portion of the roadway for the movement of vehicles, exclusive of shoulders and auxiliary lanes.

[Turning radius—The radius of an arc which approximates the turning path of the exterior corner of a vehicle.]

Vehicle—Every device in or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway. The term includes special mobile equipment as defined in the Vehicle Code.

§ 441.2. Purpose and application.

(a) *General rule.* It is in the public interest to regulate the location, design, construction, maintenance and drainage of [**access driveways, local roads,**] **accesses** and other property within State highway right-of-way for the purpose of security, economy of maintenance, preservation of proper drainage and safe and reasonable [**access**] travel and **use.**

* * * * *

§ 441.3. Permit application procedure.

(a) *General rule.* No [**driveway, local road or drainage facility or structure**] **access** shall be constructed or altered within State highway right-of-way and no drainage facility of the Department may be altered or connected onto without first obtaining a permit from the Department. A permit may not be required for maintenance.

(b) *Who may apply for a permit.* Permit applications [**shall be submitted in the name of the owner of the property. If the applicant does not hold fee title to the property, the applicant shall notify the fee title holder that an application has been submitted.] may be submitted by the applicant or by an authorized agent on behalf of the applicant if the application is accompanied by written authorization from the applicant. An applicant shall be one of the following:**

- (1) The owner of the property.**
- (2) A person with an equitable interest in property under a sales agreement or an option to purchase.**

(c) *Where to submit application.* Permit applications [**shall be submitted to either the district or county office having jurisdiction over the county in which the proposed work will be performed**] **must be submitted to the Department’s EPS, which can be accessed through the Department’s website. The**

Department may accept, at its discretion, paper applications and supporting documents instead of an electronic submission.

(c.1) (Editor's Note: Addition of subsection heading recommended.) For an applicant who is a person holding an estate or other legal interest in property, such as an easement, a lease, a license or subsurface rights, the applicant agrees to indemnify, save harmless and defend, if requested, the Commonwealth against all suits, damages, claims and demands of any type whatsoever by the fee title holder of the property because of granting the permit to the applicant.

(d) *When to submit applications.* Permit applications shall be submitted prior to the construction of any building which the proposed [driveway] access will serve to assure that the [driveway] access can be constructed in accordance with this chapter.

(e) *Application procedure and required information.* Permit applications:

(1) Shall be submitted to the Department's EPS. At the Department's discretion, applications may be submitted in person or by mail on a properly completed Department [Form M-945A] application form.

(2) Shall be [signed] submitted by the applicant or the applicant's authorized agent.

(3) Shall include [five sets of] plans in an electronic or other format acceptable to the Department, of a quality, type and content sufficient for [microfilming] reproduction, electronic scanning, storage and recording, detailing the location and pertinent dimensions of both the proposed installation and related highway features.

(4) Shall [be accompanied by a check or money order, payable to the Department,] include payment in the appropriate amount, as set forth in § 441.4 (relating to permit fees).

(5) Shall be submitted to the Department at least 30 days prior to the anticipated start of work.

(6) Shall contain proof that the applicant is an owner or a person with an equitable interest in property under a sales agreement or an option to purchase. The proof shall be in the form of a copy of the valid legal document or court order verifying the applicant's legal estate or interest in the property, or a valid legal agreement for the sale of the property.

(7) Shall, when submitted by [an applicant other than a fee title holder] or on behalf of, an owner with an estate or other legal interest in property other than fee title or a person with an equitable interest in property under a sales agreement or an option to purchase, contain proof of one of the following:

(i) [Proof of one of the following:

(A) The fee title holder consents to the application.

(B) The applicant provided written notice of the submission of the application to the fee title holder apprising the fee title holder of the administrative rights relative to the permit application under 1 Pa. Code §§ 35.23, 35.24 and 35.27—35.32. The Department will not grant or deny the permit applica-

tion until 30 days after receipt of the written notice by the fee title holder] {Reserved}.

(ii) [A signed written statement, whereby the applicant agrees to indemnify and defend the Commonwealth (if requested) from all suits, damages, claims and demands of any type whatsoever by the fee title holder of the property because of granting the permit to the applicant, such as a failure of the permittee or other person to comply with the permit or any other statutes, ordinances or regulations in connection with the permit] {Reserved}.

(iii) [Proof that the applicant executed and recorded in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds in the appropriate county or counties, a covenant running with the land providing that all subsequent purchasers, heirs, assigns or transferees of the property take the property subject to the indemnification in subparagraph (ii), unless released by the Department] {Reserved}.

(iv) The fee title holder consents to the application.

(v) The applicant provides written notice of the submission of the application to the fee title holder apprising the fee title holder of the administrative rights relative to the permit application under 1 Pa. Code §§ 35.23, 35.24 and 35.27—35.32. The Department will not grant or deny the permit application until 30 days after receipt of the written notice by the fee title holder. The applicant shall submit proof of receipt of the notice.

(f) *Traffic control plan.* Submission of the traffic control plan shall be as follows:

* * * * *

(3) The traffic control plan shall be either:

(i) [A] a detailed drawing, showing all traffic control devices [.] ; or

(ii) a reference to a [standard drawing found in Publication 43 or Publication 90] specific figure as described in § 212.403 (relating to temporary traffic-control plans), provided the referenced [standard drawing] specific figure properly depicts the work area and completely addresses the needed traffic control.

(g) *Drainage control plan for other than minimum use driveways.* Drainage control plan for other than minimum use driveways shall be as follows:

(1) If it can reasonably be anticipated that there will be an increase in the flow of water onto the highway or into highway drainage facilities as a result of action by the applicant, or that there will be an increase in the flow of water onto the property of some other person as a result of any action authorized by the permit, a drainage control plan signed and sealed by a professional engineer or other persons authorized by law shall be submitted with the application. The drainage control plan shall contain the following:

- (i) Source of water.
- (ii) Existing flow in cubic feet per second.
- (iii) Predicted flow in cubic feet per second.
- (iv) Where drainage currently flows.
- (v) Where drainage ultimately outlets.

(vi) Hydraulic computations showing effect of additional flow on existing highway drainage system.

(vii) Post construction stormwater management plans, riparian buffer management plans or any other erosion and sediment control measures required under 25 Pa. Code Chapter 102 (relating to erosion and sediment control) for the source property, or a written and signed statement confirming no plans exist.

(2) Issuance of a permit shall be conditioned upon the Department's approval of the drainage control plan.

(3) A permit will not be issued if any of the documents provided in accordance with subsection (g)(1)(vii) provide for the location of any post construction stormwater management controls or riparian buffer improvements required by 25 Pa. Code Chapter 102 within the State route's right-of-way.

(h) *Drainage release for other than minimum use driveways.* If it can reasonably be anticipated that there will be an increase in the flow of water onto the property of some other person as a result of action, authorized by the permit, a drainage release shall be submitted with the application. Where possible, drainage releases **[—Form L-15 or CC-15—] on a form prescribed by the Department, available on the Department's website** will be obtained by and at the expense of the applicant, from all property owners over whose land additional drainage will flow. All drainage releases shall be notarized and recorded, by and at the expense of the applicant, in the County Office of the Recorder of Deeds. If a drainage release cannot be obtained from any affected property owner, the Department may nonetheless issue a permit if it determines that there is no reasonable and prudent alternative available to the applicant **[and the applicant executes an indemnification agreement acceptable to the Department]. If the applicant has not obtained a drainage release, the applicant shall fully indemnify, save harmless and defend (if requested) the Commonwealth, its agents and employees, against an action which the affected property owner may bring against the Commonwealth relating to an increase in the flow of water onto another property as a result of work performed under the permit, including an action brought pursuant to the provisions 26 Pa.C.S. (relating to Eminent Domain Code).**

(i) *Plans for other than minimum use driveways.* The permit application for **[all] driveways** other than those classified as minimum use shall include a plan which illustrates, as a minimum, the following, including dimensions where applicable:

* * * * *

(j) *Review by municipalities, planning commissions[,] and zoning boards.* Review by municipalities, planning commissions[,] and zoning boards shall comply with the following:

(1) Certain local **[governing bodies] governments** wish to review **[driveway] State highway access permit** applications within their jurisdictions.

(2) A listing of these municipalities and local agencies is available from the appropriate district office.

(3) Each application for an access **[driveway]** within one of these jurisdictions must be accompanied by evi-

dence which indicates that the location and type of access **[driveway]** being requested has been reviewed by that municipality or agency.

(4) The Department will consider any comments or recommendations resulting from this review prior to approving the access permit.

* * * * *

§ 441.4. Permit fees.

(a) *Permit issuance fees.* Issuance fees shall be used to defray costs incurred by the Department in reviewing and processing the application and plan, including the preliminary review of the site location identified in the application, and issuing and processing the permit.

* * * * *

(2) Supplement fee **for** each **[six-month] 6-month** time extension or each submitted change **[shall be]—** \$10.

(b) *General permit inspection fees.* General inspection fees shall be used to defray costs incurred by the Department in spot inspection of permitted work or subsequent inspection after the permitted work has been completed, to **[insure] ensure** compliance with the permit and this chapter; they shall be as follows:

* * * * *

(d) *Additional inspection fees.* If the Department determines that the permitted work is of sufficient magnitude or importance to warrant assignment of one or more **[employes] employees** to inspect the permitted work on a more than spot inspection basis, the permit will so indicate and the permittee shall be charged for all salary, overhead[,] and expenses incurred by the Department for inspection.

(e) *Refunds.* The Department will refund the general permit inspection fees on unused permits. **[In order to] To** be eligible to receive such a refund, the permittee shall deliver the request **[with the permittee's copy of the permit]** to the issuing district permit office on or before the permit expiration date.

(1) A refund processing fee of \$10 shall be deducted from the general permit inspection fees.

(2) The permit issuance fee shall not be refundable on unused permits.

(f) *Miscellaneous fees.* The applicant shall pay notary and recording costs including the cost of recording the permit in the County Office of the Recorder of Deeds when required, and the cost of all drainage releases. **[Permits shall be recorded whenever deemed necessary by the Department, including when:**

(1) a permit requires drainage facilities to be installed and maintained;

(2) a permit authorizes one or more high volume driveways to be constructed; or

(3) an access covenant (Form CC-14) is executed with the permit as specified in paragraph (16) of § 441.6 of this title (relating to general conditions).]

(g) Recording permits. Permits shall be recorded whenever deemed necessary by the Department, including when:

(1) A permit requires drainage facilities to be installed and maintained.

(2) A permit authorizes one or more high volume driveways to be constructed.

(3) An access covenant on a form prescribed by the Department, available on the Department's website, is executed with the permit as specified in § 441.6(16) (relating to general conditions).

(4) A permit requires indemnification per § 441.3(c.1) and (h) (relating to permit application procedure), § 441.5(e)(1)(v) (relating to issuance of permits) or § 441.8(j)(5) (relating to driveway design requirements).

(5) a permit requires a release per § 441.3(h) or § 441.8(d) regarding an increase in the flow of water onto the property of some other person.

(h) Waiver of recording. The Department may waive the recording requirement for permits issued pursuant to § 441.7(g) (relating to general driveway requirements).

§ 441.5. Issuance of permits.

(a) *General rule.* Upon application duly made, in accordance with this chapter, a permit will be issued by the appropriate district office, subject to this chapter and the conditions contained on the permit and its attachments and supplements. The permit will be the authority of the applicant to proceed with the work [**and will also serve as a receipt for the fees accompanying the application**].

(b) *Permit issued only to property owner.* Permits will be issued only to the owners of the property. **Permits for applicants under § 441.3(b)(2) (relating to permit application procedure) may be preliminarily approved but will not be issued until the applicant submits proof of ownership of the property.** Permits will not be issued to contractors of the property owner nor to any person other than the owner of the property.

* * * * *

(e) *Waiver of design requirements.* Waiver of design requirements shall be as follows:

(1) If any design requirement set forth in this chapter cannot be met, the [**director**] **Deputy Secretary or designee** may waive the requirement if **all of** the following conditions are satisfied:

(i) [**no**] **No** other reasonable access is available[;].

(ii) [**the**] **The** applicant has done all that can reasonably be done to satisfy the design requirements[;].

(iii) [**if**] **If** additional land is required, the applicant provides satisfactory evidence that it cannot be purchased at a reasonable price[;].

(iv) [**no**] **No** traffic problem will be created[; and].

(v) [**the applicant executes an indemnity agreement satisfactory to the Commonwealth**] **The applicant indemnifies, saves harmless and defends, if requested, the Commonwealth, its agents and employees against any action which may be brought against the Commonwealth relating to the waiver of design requirements.**

(2) In the case of a temporary access [**for extracting natural resources for a period of no more than one year**], any design requirement set forth in this chapter which cannot be met may be waived by the district

[**engineer**] **executive**, provided conditions (i), (ii), (iii)[,] and (v) of paragraph (1) of this subsection are satisfied.

(f) *Permit requiring agreement or security.* Where the applicant will be required to perform a substantial amount of work, the Department may require the applicant to execute an agreement or provide security, or both, as a prerequisite to issuance of the permit. **If security is required, it shall be delivered to the Department in a form and amount acceptable to the Department and shall guarantee construction, inspection, indemnification, restoration and maintenance of the highway made necessary by the permitted work and the obligations and conditions of the permit for a period not in excess of 2 years from the Department's acknowledgment of completion of the work.**

* * * * *

(h) *Work completion notification.* When all permitted work has been completed, the [**self-addressed post card (Form M-945G) which accompanies the permit shall be mailed**] **permittee shall provide written notification** to the district office.

(i) [**Permanent permit microfilm record. The permit, together with plans, relevant correspondence, and any supplements issued, will be microfilmed, and the microfilm record will be retained in the central permit office**] [**Reserved**].

§ 441.6. General conditions.

The following conditions shall apply to permits issued under the provisions of this chapter:

(1) *Scope of permit.* The permit shall be binding upon the permittee, its agents, contractors, successors[,] and assigns.

* * * * *

(vi) [**The permittee shall be the only party in interest in any action against the Department before the Board of Claims involving disputes arising from the permit**] [**Reserved**].

(vii) [**Disputes between the permittee and the Department shall be governed by the appropriate provisions in Form 408**] [**Reserved**].

(viii) A permit shall be valid only as long as the traffic volume of the driveway does not exceed the approved driveway classification as set forth in § 441.8(a) [**of this title**] (relating to driveway design requirements). **If the actual traffic volume of a driveway exceeds its permit classification, the Department may issue a notice of intent to revoke the permit and provide the permittee 30 calendar days to either apply for the appropriate permit classification or request a hearing in accordance with 2 Pa.C.S. §§ 501—508 (relating to practice and procedure of Commonwealth agencies) and Chapter 491 (relating to administrative practice and procedure).**

* * * * *

(2) *Additional restrictions.* All work authorized by the permit shall be subject to the following:

(i) All applicable laws, rules[,] and regulations[, **including but not limited to the following**]:

(A) **Act of October 26, 1972 (P.L. 1017, No. 247) (53 P.S. § 1611), concerning environmental control**

measures related to pollution and the preservation of public natural resources.

(B) Act of December 10, 1974 (P.L. 852, No. 287) (73 P.S. §§ 176—182), concerning protection of the public health and safety by preventing excavation or demolition work from damaging underground utility facilities.

(C) Act of October 5, 1978 (P.L. 1104, No. 260) (72 P.S. §§ 4651-1—4651-10) which provides that the Board of Claims shall have jurisdiction of claims against the Commonwealth arising from contracts.

(D) O.S.H.A. construction safety and health regulations, 39 Fed. Reg. 22801 (June 24, 1974) and 29 CFR § 1926.1 et seq.

(E) 42 U.S.C. § 2000d, as implemented by 49 CFR § 21 and 23 CFR § 230.101 et seq.

(F) Ordinances enacted by local municipalities which contain more stringent minimum safety requirements than this chapter] .

(ii) Any rights of any person.

(iii) The conditions, restrictions[,] and provisions of the permit.

(2.1) Federal Standards. The Federal Highway Administration, Department of Transportation regulatory provisions in 23 CFR Part 625 (relating to Design Standards for Highways) are incorporated by reference to the extent that these provisions are applicable and not contrary to the law of the Commonwealth. In the event of a conflict between a Federal regulatory provision and a regulation of the Commonwealth, the provision expressly set out in this chapter shall be applied unless the Federal provision is more stringent.

(3) *Work to conform to Department standards.* The work shall be done at such time and in such a manner as shall be consistent with the safety of the public and shall conform to [**all requirements and standards of] plans and specifications approved by the Department [including, but not limited to, Form 408] consistent with Article IV of the State Highway Law (36 P.S. §§ 670-401—670-425). If at any time it shall be found by the Department that the work is not being done or has not been properly performed, the permittee upon being notified in writing by the Department shall immediately take the necessary steps, at its own expense, to place the work in condition to conform to such requirements or standards. In case any dispute arises between the permittee and the Department's inspector, the Department's inspector shall have the authority to suspend work until the question at issue can be referred to and be decided by the district office.**

(4) *Permittee responsibilities.* Permittee responsibilities shall be as follows:

(i) The permittee shall pay all fees, costs[,] and expenses incident to or arising from the project, including the cost of related highway improvements which increased traffic or surface drainage may necessitate. The permittee shall reimburse the Department for any and all inspection costs within 30 days after receipt of the Department's invoice.

(ii) In the event of failure or neglect by the permittee to perform and comply with the permit or the provisions of this chapter, the Department may immediately revoke and annul the permit and order and direct the permittee

to remove any or all structures, equipment[,] or property belonging to the permittee or its contractors from the legal limits of the right-of-way and to restore the right-of-way to its former condition. In the event the Department determines that such structures, equipment[,] or property pose a threat to the public safety and the permittee fails to remove the same after notice from the Department to do so, the Secretary or [**his attorneys, or any attorney of any court of record shall be authorized to appear for the permittee, and to enter an amicable action of ejectment and confess judgment against the permittee; and the attorney shall be authorized to issue forthwith a writ of possession without leave of court,] the Department may authorize its own staff or engage a contractor to remove any or all structures, equipment or property belonging to the permittee or its contractors from the legal limits of the right-of-way and to restore the right-of-way to its former condition all at the cost of the permittee.**

(iii) If work is stopped on a project for any reason, other than at the end of any normal work day, and any ditch or trench, in the opinion of the Department, remains open for an unreasonable period, the permittee, if so directed, shall refill the ditch or trench and work shall not be resumed until the permittee is prepared to proceed immediately with the work to its completion. In the event the permittee fails to refill the ditch or trench or proceed to completion of the work upon notice from the Department to do so, the Department may perform the necessary and required work and shall be reimbursed for the costs by the permittee within 30 days after receipt of the Department's invoice.

* * * * *

(9) *Traffic protection and maintenance.* Maintenance and protection of traffic shall be carried out in accordance with the requirements of the Department, as set forth in [**Publication 43 and Publication 90] Department regulations in Chapter 212, Subchapter E (relating to temporary traffic control).**

[(i) The permittee shall provide and maintain all necessary precautions to prevent injury or damage to persons and property in accordance with instructions furnished by the district office. A traffic control plan shall be submitted to and approved by the district office before closing any portion of a lane to vehicular traffic.

(ii) Traffic control devices shall be provided in accordance with Publication 43 and Publication 90. Any open trench or hole shall be adequately barricaded to prevent possible injury to pedestrians and the motoring public. All traffic control devices shall be of an approved type. Signs shall conform to the requirements of Publication 68.

(iii) Designated employes shall be assigned by the permittee to direct one lane traffic. Flagmen shall be provided as specified in the permit and in accordance with Publication 43 and Publication 90.]

(10) *Restoration.* All disturbed portions of the highway, including slopes and all appurtenances and structures such as [**guard rail or drain] guide rail or drainage pipes, shall be restored by the permittee to a condition at least equal to that which existed before the start of any work authorized by the permit. This includes providing**

appropriate end treatments on [**guard**] **guide** rail systems where existing [**guard**] **guide** rail is being broken by the driveway.

* * * * *

(16) *Future additional driveways.* Future additional driveways shall consist of the following:

(i) If the Department anticipates that a property may be **developed**, subdivided [**and that such subdivision will result**] **or utilized, resulting** in an unacceptable number or arrangement of driveways, or both, the Department may require the property owner to enter into an access covenant [**(Form CC-14)**] **on a form prescribed by the Department, available on the Department's website**, prior to issuance of a permit.

* * * * *

(17) *Use of highway prohibited.* Prohibited use of the highway shall be as follows:

* * * * *

(ii) Improvements on private property adjacent to the right-of-way shall be so located that parking, stopping[,] and maneuvering of vehicles on the right-of-way will not be necessary [**in order**] for vehicles or patrons to be served. New liquid fuel pump islands installed in service stations adjacent to the highway shall be located at least 12 feet outside the right-of-way[, **in order**] for a driveway permit to be issued. [**See Figure 11 and Figure 12.**]

§ 441.7. General driveway requirements.

* * * * *

(b) *General location restrictions.* [**Access driveways**] **Driveways** shall be permitted at locations in which:

(1) Sight distance is adequate to safely allow each permitted movement to be made into or out of the [**access**] driveway.

(2) The free movement of normal highway traffic is not impaired.

(3) The driveway will not create a hazard.

(4) The driveway will not create an area of undue traffic congestion on the highway.

(c) *Specific location restrictions.* Specific location restrictions shall include the following:

(1) [**Access driveways**] **Driveways** may not be located at interchanges, ramp areas[,] or locations that would interfere with the placement and proper functioning of highway signs, signals, detectors, lighting or other devices that affect traffic control.

(2) The location of a driveway near a signalized intersection may include a requirement that the permittee provide, in cooperation with the municipality, new or relocated detectors, signal heads, controller and the like, for the control of traffic movements from the driveway.

(3) [**Access to a property**] **A driveway** which abuts two or more intersecting streets or highways may be restricted to only that roadway which can more safely accommodate its traffic.

(4) The Department may require the permittee to locate [**an access**] **a** driveway directly across from [**a highway, local road, or access driveway**] **another access** on the opposite side of the roadway if it is judged that offset driveways will not permit left turns to be

made safely or that [**access across**] **crossing** the roadway from one access to the other will create a safety hazard.

(d) [**Local roads. An access**] **Driveways serving more than three properties. A driveway** intended to serve more than three properties or to act as a connecting link between two or more roadways shall be, for the purpose of this chapter, considered a local road and not a driveway regardless of its ownership. As such, its design must be in accordance with the Department's current standards governing the design of local roads. All other requirements of this chapter shall be complied with before the local road will be allowed access onto a State highway.

* * * * *

(f) *Approaches to driveways.* Driveway approaches shall conform to the following standards:

(1) The location and angle of [**an access**] **a** driveway approach in relation to the highway intersection shall be such that a vehicle entering or leaving the driveway may do so in an orderly and safe manner and with a minimum of interference to highway traffic.

(2) Where the [**access**] driveway approach and highway pavement meet, flaring of the approach may be necessary to allow safe, easy turning of vehicular traffic.

(3) Where the highway is curbed, driveway approaches shall be installed 1 1/2 inches above the adjacent highway or gutter grade to maintain proper drainage. [**See Figure 5.**]

(g) *Temporary access.* **The Department may authorize, by permit, the temporary occupancy of highway right-of-way by an access.**

(1) Applicants may request a temporary permit to accommodate access for any of the following time periods:

(i) Up to 1 month (for example, for a single event such as a fair).

(ii) Up to 6 months (for example, for a construction project).

(iii) Up to 1 year (for example, for extracting natural resources such as timber from private property).

(2) The Department may allow coarse aggregate material to be placed on a temporary access surface instead of paving, as long as no material is deposited onto the highway pavement or shoulder and as long as the temporary access is continuously maintained.

(3) Prior to the expiration of a temporary permit, the temporary access shall be removed and the highway shall be restored as directed by the Department.

§ 441.8. Driveway design requirements.

(a) *General.* General requirements shall be as follows:

(1) The ability of a driveway to safely and efficiently function as an integral component of a highway system requires that its design and construction be based on the amount and type of traffic that it is expected to serve and the type and character of roadway which it accesses. This chapter separates driveways into four classifications, based on the amount of traffic they are expected to serve. [**A description of each classification and typical**

examples of land uses normally associated with each follows] The following list contains a description of each driveway classification and examples of typical uses associated with the classification when a property is served by one driveway:

(i) Minimum use driveway, [see Figure 7. A driveway] normally used by not more than 25 vehicles per day, such as:

- (A) single family dwellings, duplex houses; or
- (B) apartments with five units or less.

(ii) Low volume driveway, [see Figure 8. A driveway] normally used by more than 25 vehicles per day but [less] **not more** than 750 vehicles per day, such as:

- (A) office buildings;
- (B) elementary and junior high schools; or
- (C) car washes.

(iii) Medium volume driveway, [see Figures 9, 11, and 12. A driveway] normally used by more than 750 vehicles but [less than 1500] **not more than 1,500** vehicles per day, which does not normally require traffic signalization, such as:

- (A) motels;
- (B) fast food restaurants; or
- (C) service stations and small shopping centers or plazas.

(iv) High volume driveway, [see Figure 10. A driveway] normally used by more than [1500] **1,500** vehicles per day, which often requires traffic signalization, such as:

- (A) large shopping centers; or
- (B) multi-building apartment or office complexes.

(2) The design features described in this section and illustrated in the [attendant figures] Department's Design Manual Part 2 and the Department's Highway Occupancy Permit Operations Manual are to be used by the applicant [in designing the driveway plans which accompany the application. Dimensions shall be selected from the range of values shown on the appropriate figure], unless site conditions warrant a deviation. The Department may require design details which are more stringent than those specified in this chapter to [insure] **ensure** the safe and efficient operation of any proposed driveway.

[(3) Figures 7, 8, and 9 show two sets of design values. The applicant shall design his driveway using the values appropriate for the posted speed of the roadway being accessed] **{Reserved}**.

(b) *Angle of [access] driveway approach.* [Angle of access] The angle of access of the driveway approach shall [include the following] **be as follows:**

(1) [Access driveway] Driveway approaches used for two-way operation shall be positioned at right angles, that is, 90 degrees, to the highway or as near thereto as site conditions permit[, except as authorized in Figure 11].

(2) When two [access] driveways are constructed on the same property frontage and used for one-way opera-

tion, each of these driveways may be placed at an angle less than a right angle, but not less than 45 degrees to the highway[, except that along divided highways where no openings are allowed in the median the minimum angle of an exit driveway may be 30 degrees, as shown in Figure 12].

* * * * *

(d) *Property line clearance.* Except for joint-use driveways, no portion of any driveway shall be located outside of the property frontage boundary line **unless a release is submitted with the application. The release shall be from the affected property owner and shall release the Commonwealth from any liability resulting from the issuance of the permit. Releases must be obtained, by and at the expense of the applicant, from the affected property owners on a form prescribed by the Department, available on the Department's website. The releases must be notarized and recorded, by and at the expense of the applicant, in the County Office of the Recorder of Deeds.**

(e) *Multiple driveways.* Multiple driveways serving the same property must be separated by a minimum **tangential** distance of 15 feet measured along the right-of-way line and 20 feet measured along the shoulder, ditch line[,] or curb. When the **tangential** distance between multiple driveways is 50 feet or less measured along the shoulder or ditch line, the **Department may require the** area between [shall] **to** be clearly defined by permanent curbing. This curb shall be placed in line with existing curb or [two] **2** feet back of the shoulder or ditch line on uncurbed highways. It shall be extended around the driveway radii to the right-of-way line.

(f) *Site requirements.* Site requirements shall be as follows:

(1) [All nonresidential] **Nonresidential** buildings shall be located a sufficient distance from the right-of-way line to provide ample driving area and parking off the right-of-way to prevent storage of vehicles on the [access] driveways and to prevent the back-up and turning of vehicles on the highway pavement.

* * * * *

(h) *Sight distance.* [Conditions for sight distance shall be as follows:

(1) Access driveways shall be located at a point within the property frontage limits which provides at least the minimum sight distance listed in the appropriate following table:

(2) In using Tables 1 through 6 the following additional requirements shall apply:

(i) Tables 2, 4, and 6 shall be used in lieu of Tables 1, 3, and 5 only when combination traffic exceeds 5.0% of the total traffic using the proposed driveway.

(ii) Posted speeds shall be used unless operating speeds vary from the posted speed by more than ten miles per hour, in which case the Department may require that operating speeds be used.

(iii) The sight distances in Tables 1 through 4 apply only when highway grades are zero to 3.0%, either up or down.

(A) When the highway grade in the section to be used for acceleration, after leaving the driveway, ascends at 3.0—5.0%, the sight distance in the direction of approaching ascending traffic may be increased by a factor of 1.4.

(B) When the highway grade ascends at greater than 5.0%, sight distance may be increased by a factor of 1.7.

(C) When the highway grade in the section to be used for acceleration after leaving the driveway descends at 3.0—5.0%, sight distance in the direction of approaching descending highway traffic may be reduced by a factor of 0.6.

(D) When the road descends at greater than 5.0%, sight distance may be reduced by a factor of 0.5.

(iv) The sight distance values in Tables 1 through 6 are desirable for safe operation of the driveway. Sight distance values less than desirable will be accepted only if it is impossible to achieve the desirable value by locating the driveway at any point within the property frontage boundaries. The minimum acceptable sight distance values shall be computed from the following formula:

$$SSSD = 1.47 Vt + \frac{V^2}{30 (f+g)}$$

SSSD = Minimum safe stopping sight distance (feet).

V = Velocity of vehicle (miles per hour).

t = Perception time of motorist (average = 2.5 seconds).

f = Wet friction of pavement (average = 0.30).

g = Percent grade of roadway divided by 100.

(3) If sight distance requirements as specified in this chapter cannot be met, the Department may:

(i) prohibit left turns by exiting vehicles;

- (ii) restrict turning movements to right turns in and out of a driveway;
- (iii) require installation of a right turn acceleration lane or deceleration lane;
- (iv) require installation of a separate left turn standby lane;
- (v) alter the horizontal or vertical geometry of the roadway; or
- (vi) deny access to the highway.]

Achieving optimal sight distance along the property frontage must be considered when determining the location of the driveway. The following shall apply:

(1) For intersection sight distance, a driveway must be located at a point within the property frontage limits which provides at least the minimum intersection sight distance as required by 23 CFR 625.4 (relating to standards, policies, and standard specifications), and as set forth in the Department's Design Manual Part 2.

(2) For stopping sight distance, the stopping sight distance formula, as required by 23 CFR 625.4 and as set forth in the Department's Design Manual Part 2, may be used to determine the minimum acceptable sight distance values for a driveway only if it is impractical or infeasible to achieve intersection sight distance values by locating the driveway at any point within the property frontage boundaries. For the purpose of measuring the available sight distance, the driver's eye, when exiting from the driveway, should be assumed to be a minimum 10 feet back from the near edge of the traveled way.

(i) *Grade of [access] driveway. [Grade of access]* The grade of the driveway shall be constructed in the following manner:

* * * * *

(2) Where a drainage ditch or swale exists, the permittee shall maintain an adequate swale across the driveway or install an adequate pipe under the driveway in accordance with [Form 408] the Department's Design Manual Part 2 and the Department's specifications. Drainage pipe installed under driveways shall be at least 15 inches in diameter.

(3) The side slopes for driveway embankments within the right-of-way shall not be steeper than [ten to one. See Figure 6] 10:1, unless the roadway slope is steeper than 3:1 and guide rail exists at the top of the roadway slope.

(4) Grade requirements in uncurbed shoulders within the right-of-way shall conform to [Figure 1] criteria identified in the Department's Design Manual Part 2.

(5) Grade requirements where curbs and sidewalks are present shall conform to criteria identified in the Department's Design Manual Part 2.

[(i) The driveway approaches shall be installed 1 1/2 inches above the adjacent roadway or the gutter grade to maintain proper drainage. See Figure 5.

(ii) The difference between the cross slope of the roadway and the upward grade of the driveway approach shall not exceed 8.0%.

(iii) When a planted area exists in front of the sidewalk, one of the following three cases shall apply:

(A) When the grass strip between the curb and the sidewalk is wide enough to maintain an 8.0% maximum driveway approach grade, construct the driveway as shown in Figure 2.

(B) If the driveway grade would exceed 8.0%, depress the outer edge of the sidewalk and maintain a maximum sidewalk cross slope of 6.0%. This will enable the driveway slope to stay within the 8.0% slope limit. See Figure 3.

(C) If the sidewalk cross slope would exceed 6.0%, as indicated in clause (B) of this subparagraph, depress the entire sidewalk. The amount of depression shall not exceed 1 1/2 inches at the inner edge of the sidewalk. The longitudinal slope of the sidewalk shall not exceed two inches per foot. See Figure 3.

(iv) When the sidewalk is directly against the back of the curb and the sidewalk is at least five feet wide, the curb shall be sloped as shown in Figure 5 of this subsection. This will eliminate the need for depressing the back edge of the sidewalk. For sidewalks narrower than five feet, the curb will be sloped and the back edge of the sidewalk will be depressed (maximum 1 1/2 inches) to maintain an 8.0% maximum grade on the driveway. The longitudinal grade of the sidewalk shall not exceed two inches per foot.]

(j) *Auxiliary lanes.* Auxiliary lanes shall [consist of] be subject to the following:

* * * * *

(4) *Cost.* When required, auxiliary lanes shall be constructed, at no cost to the Department, in accordance with the Department's Roadway Construction Standards and [Form 408] the Department's specifications.

(5) *Lane in front of another property.* If an auxiliary lane must be located in front of property of another person, the applicant shall be required to make reasonable efforts to secure the approval of the other person [or]. If approval of the other person is not obtained, the applicant agrees to indemnify, save harmless and defend, if requested, the Commonwealth against any action which the other person may bring against the Commonwealth under the Eminent Domain Code.

(k) [Access driveway pavement. Access driveways] Driveway pavement. Driveways shall be appropriately surfaced with a stabilized material between the traveled way and the right-of-way line unless a higher type material is specified by the permit. Low, medium[,] and high volume driveways which provide access to paved highways shall be paved within the right-of-way. Materials used in the construction of driveways shall meet the

requirements of [**Form 408**] the Department's specifications. The driveway pavement shall be at least [**four**] 4 inches thick within the right-of-way.

(l) *Driveways relative to ramps*. Ramps are intended to provide access from one roadway or roadway system to another with a minimum amount of conflict or interference from other traffic. To [**insure**] ensure the integrity of this intended function, no [**access**] driveway will be permitted on a ramp or within 50 feet of the intersection of the edge of pavement of the ramp or its speed change lane with the edge of pavement of the intersecting roadway. Exceptions will be considered only if the enforcement of this subsection would result in the prohibition of reasonable access from the adjacent property to the highway system.

(m) *Median openings*. Median openings shall [**consist of**] be subject to the following:

* * * * *

(3) Requests for removal of a median divisor will not be granted without the approval of the [**director**] Deputy Secretary or designee.

* * * * *

(o) *Traffic control devices*. Requirements for traffic control devices shall be as follows:

(1) *Nonelectrically powered devices*. The permittee shall, at [**his**] the permittee's own expense, install and maintain all nonelectrically powered traffic control devices, as specified in the permit, which are required to provide for the safe and orderly movement of vehicular or pedestrian traffic, or both. These devices shall include, but not be limited to, any required regulatory, warning or guide signs, delineators[,] and pavement markings.

(2) *Electrically powered devices*. Electrically powered devices shall consist of the following:

(i) When power operated devices, including traffic signals, are required for proper traffic control, [**a traffic signal permit (Form TE 964) shall be obtained in addition to the occupancy permit. The permit to own and operate a traffic control device**] Departmental approval shall be obtained for the traffic signal in addition to a highway occupancy permit. Except for Department-managed signals under 74 Pa.C.S. § 9202(i) (relating to maintenance agreement) regarding Department-managed signals, the traffic signal shall be requested by and Departmental approval issued to only the appropriate [municipal-ity] local authority, in accordance with 75 Pa.C.S. § 6122 (relating to authority to erect traffic-control devices) and Chapter 212 (relating to official traffic-control devices).

* * * * *

§ 441.9. [**Driveway layout illustrations**] {Reserved}.

[**Figures 7 through 12 illustrate and supplement the minimum design requirements described in this chapter. Although site conditions may not allow strict adherence to the dimensions shown in these**

illustrations, every effort shall be made to design and construct the safest and most efficient access onto the State highway.]

§ 441.10. Penalties and enforcement.

(a) *General rule*. [**A violation**] Failure to obtain the required permit, violating any provision of this chapter or violating the permit requirements or conditions shall constitute grounds for imposition of any or all of the following penalties:

(1) Upon receipt of oral or written notice of a violation from the authorized representative of the Department or a police officer [**whose jurisdiction includes the permitted work area, the permittee**] with jurisdiction, the violator shall cease using an unpermitted access or cease to perform further work in the [**permitted area**] State highway right-of-way except to restore the area to a safe condition. Further work may not commence [**in the permitted area**] within the State highway right-of-way until the violation has been remedied. If the violator or permittee has received oral notice of the violation, written notice shall be sent to the permittee within 10 days of receipt of the oral notice.

(2) Confiscation of the applicant's permit by a police officer or authorized representative of the Department.

(3) Revocation of the applicant's permit by the Department.

(4) The Department may block [**driveways**] an access or sever, remove or block drainage facilities constructed without a permit or in violation of this chapter.

(5) [**The fines, imprisonment or other penalties as are provided by law.**] Where a property owner has constructed an access without a permit and the Department determines that the access, facilities, structures, equipment or property pose a threat to the public safety and the property owner or facility owner fails to remove the same after notice from the Department to do so, the Secretary or Department may authorize its own staff or engage a contractor to remove any or all unpermitted accesses, structures, equipment or property from the legal limits of the right-of-way and to restore the right-of-way to its former condition all at the cost of the permittee.

(6) [**The other action as may be deemed necessary or proper after consultation with the Office of Chief Counsel**] The Department may bring any other action and seek any other penalties as permitted by law.

(b) *Additional grounds for revocation*. Additional grounds for revocation shall be as follows:

(1) The Secretary may revoke a permit whenever [**he**] the Secretary determines that the driveway or approaches or their use constitute a hazard to traffic or interferes with the proper use of the highway by the Department or the public.

(2) The [**director**] **Deputy Secretary or designee** may revoke a permit for nonpayment of a fee specified in § 441.4 (relating to permit fees) including default of a check submitted for the payment.

(c) *Revocation procedure.* Prior to revocation of a permit except for nonpayment as specified in paragraph (2), the applicant shall be given an opportunity for a hearing

in accordance with 2 Pa.C.S. §§ 501—508 (relating to practice and procedure of Commonwealth agencies) **and Chapter 491 (relating to administrative practice and procedure).**

Reorganization of the Department of Education

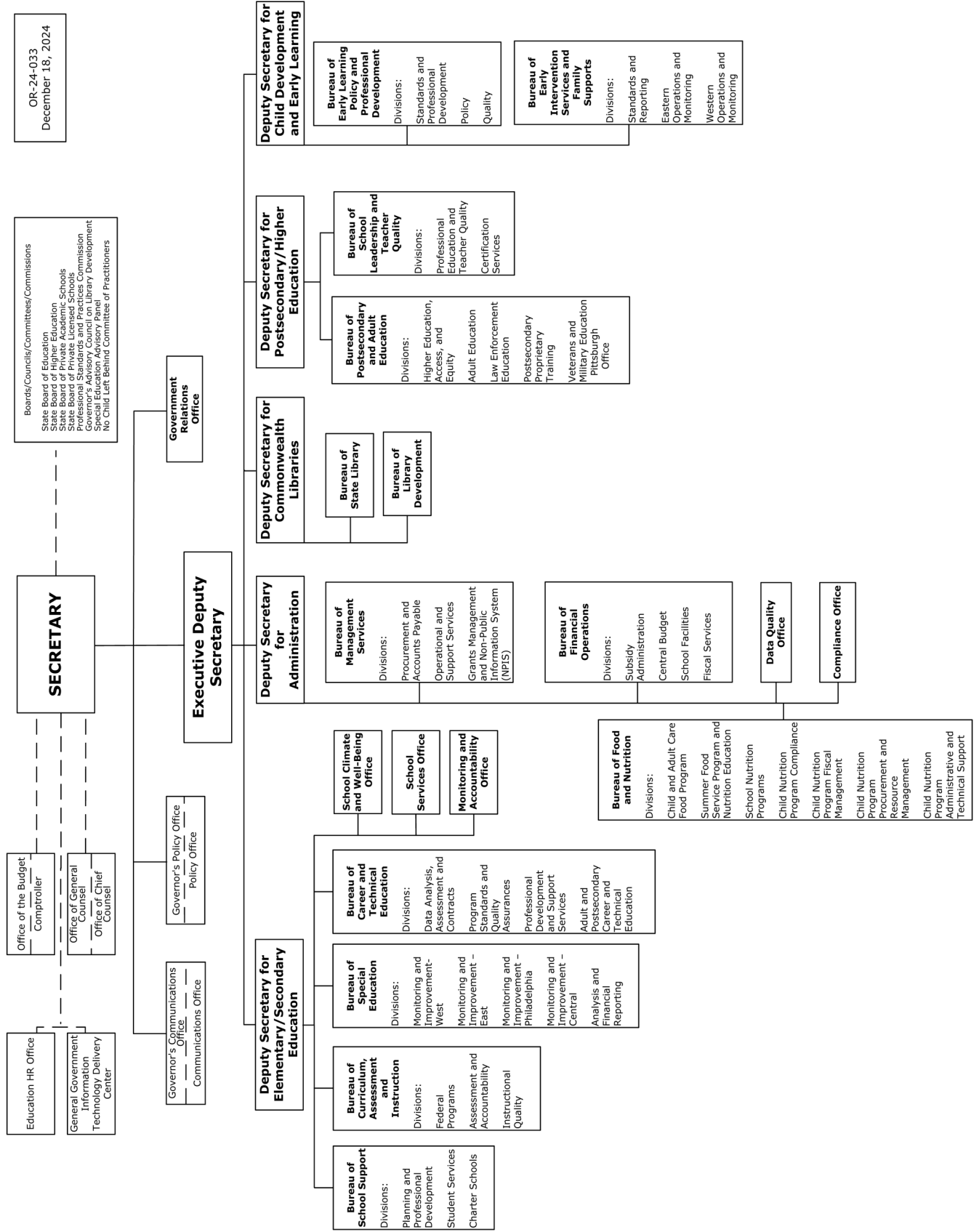
The Executive Board approved a reorganization of the Department of Education effective December 18, 2024.

Holding and Humane Disposition of Stray Unlicensed Dogs Reimbursement Amount

The Department of Agriculture (Department) gives notice that effective January 1, 2025, it will increase the amount it reimburses humane societies and societies for the prevention of cruelty to animals that maintain compounds for the humane disposition of stray unlicensed dogs apprehended running at large. The current reimbursement amount is \$5 per dog. As of January 1, 2025, the reimbursement amount for the care and disposal of the dogs at the facilities shall increase to \$50 per dog. No other fee will be paid by the Department for the care and disposal of stray unlicensed dogs.

This reimbursement is authorized under 7 Pa. Code § 25.1 (relating to general), which allows the Secretary of the Department to determine an appropriate reimbursement amount (over \$5) on a funds-available basis. The reimbursement payments will be funded from the Dog Law Restricted Account, from funds which are hereby declared to be “surplus” funds for the limited purposes set forth in section 1002(b) of the Dog Law (3 P.S. § 459-1002(b)).

The referenced \$50 per dog payments shall be applicable to dogs apprehended on or after January 1, 2025, and will continue on a funds-available basis until further notice.

While PennDOT is interested in using regulated fill for highway improvement projects, they have historically not been able to use regulated fill because of the time associated with obtaining permit coverage for each project as it directly impacts the ability of PennDOT to bid and execute roadway construction project contracts within necessary timeframes. Further, there are conditions under WMGR096 that are more directly applicable to the types of projects currently permitted underneath it, which are generally longer-term regulated fill placement activities at a single site/location in comparison to PennDOT roadway construction projects which often require less fill material for shorter project durations and several project sets. The district-wide coverage under WMGR096 in conjunction with the MOU would allow PennDOT to obtain one WMGR096 permit for all highway improvement projects within PennDOT Engineering District 6 and specify how regulated fill can be beneficially used in a manner that is better suited for roadway construction projects while also satisfying the conditions of WMGR096 to ensure regulated fill material continues to be beneficially used in a manner that is protective of human health and safety and the environment. Under the MOU, regulated fill is limited to being transferred between PennDOT project areas/rights-of-way solely within PennDOT Engineering District 6; it does not include authorization to import fill from other sources to PennDOT projects or to transfer regulated fill from a PennDOT project to a property that is not part of a PennDOT project. Prior to transferring regulated fill

between a donor project site and a receiving project site, PennDOT shall submit a notice of the transfer to DEP's Southeast Regional Office for review. These notices include similar information as new source submittals under WMGR096, including source and placement location of regulated fill, documentation including laboratory analytical results and a certification by PennDOT that the regulated fill meets the regulated fill concentration limits for beneficial use, a description of activities to be performed involving regulated fill and a schedule for regulated fill placement, and, if applicable, proof that a Pennsylvania Natural Diversity Inventory at the site has been completed. During active operations, PennDOT must maintain records related to environmental due diligence, regulated fill transfers, site inspections, regulated fill placement areas, until project completion. PennDOT must maintain these records and any other related documentation with the final construction plans at its District Office for a minimum of 5 years and must be made available to DEP upon request. PennDOT shall notify DEP within thirty days of the completion of regulated fill placement activities and provide DEP with a copy of final construction plans associated with the placement of regulated fill, including descriptions of where regulated fill was placed, a description of the types of regulated fill placed, records of environmental due diligence, and sampling and analytical data. For any divestitures of real property used for construction as part of a PennDOT roadway construction project in accordance with WMGR096 and the MOU to a non-Commonwealth entity or private party, PennDOT shall establish and record a deed notice for the transfer of the property that identifies information related to the placement of regulated fill on that property for all future conveyances or property transfers. District-wide coverage under WMGR096 and the MOU will significantly increase the use of regulated fill in highway improvement projects, which will in turn significantly reduce the amount of regulated fill material that PennDOT and its contractors would normally send to landfills for disposal. Similarly, modified BAT limits apply to iron, manganese and suspended solids in surface runoff, discharges and drainage resulting from these precipitation events and those of greater magnitude in accordance with 25 Pa. Act 537 Sewage Facilities Plan Update Public-to-Public Wastewater Disposal System Transfer, The proposal was prepared to officially recognize the acquisition of South Whitehall Township Authority's (Authority) collection and conveyance system by South Whitehall Township (Township), and to address any previous planning not yet implemented for the Township service area, all of which will be undertaken in the next Act 537 Plan Update for the Township. The Township conveys a portion of Lower Macungie Township and Salisbury Township's wastewater through the centralized collection system via multiple interconnections. Similarly, a portion of South Whitehall Township's wastewater is conveyed through Upper Macungie Township and Coplay-Whitehall Sewer Authority's collection systems. All wastewater is then conveyed to the Lehigh County Authority (LCA) Kline's Island Wastewater Treatment Facility. On May 3, 2017, the Township Board of Commissioners adopted Ordinance 1021 to dissolve the South Whitehall Township Authority. As part of the dissolution, the Township was granted ownership and maintenance obligations of the Authority, and authorization to act on behalf of the Authority, whose debt was absorbed by the Township through a General Obligation Bond. This transfer also includes rights-of-way, easements, permits, and inter-municipal agreements with neighboring entities, meaning that said agreements will now be with the Township instead of the Authority. There was no purchase price for the transfer, and the only other associated cost was the transfer of payroll disbursements from Authority water and sewer accounts to the Township payroll fund to compensate Township employees for performing Authority work. The transfer of property from the Authority to the Township is completed automatically through the recording of the Certificate of Termination of the Authority, which was executed and placed in escrow with the Township Solicitor. The Certificate will be released from escrow and officially recorded upon approval of this Act 537 Plan Update.

The DEP may approve or disapprove plans and reports submitted. This notice provides DEP's decision and, if relevant, the basis for disapproval.

Determination of Need; Disabled Veterans' Real Estate Tax Exemption

Under 51 Pa.C.S. § 8904 (relating to duty of commission), the State Veterans' Commission (Commission) fixes uniform and equitable standards for determining the need for exemption from the payment of real estate taxes. Initially, section 8904 of 51 Pa.C.S. required the Commis-

sion to apply a rebuttable presumption of need for applicants with an annual income of \$75,000 or less.

Beginning January 1, 2009, and every 2 years thereafter, section 8904 of 51 Pa.C.S. requires the Commission to adjust the presumptive need level by an amount equal to the change in the Consumer Price Index in the preceding 2 years. Adjustments were made to the presumptive need level in 2009, 2011, 2013, 2015, 2017, 2019, 2021 and 2023.

During the 2-year period from November 1, 2022, until October 31, 2024, the Consumer Price Index (Northeast all items CPI-U index) increased by a total of 6.1%. Therefore, beginning January 1, 2025, the Commission will apply a rebuttable presumption that applicants for the Disabled Veterans' Real Estate Tax Exemption Program with an annual income of \$114,637 or less have need for the exemption. Applicants with an annual income exceeding \$114,637 can request a full determination of need in accordance with the rule at 43 Pa. Code § 5.24(d) (relating to processing applications).

The Commission will use the following approach to determine the effective date of the exemption:

Applications pending on December 31, 2024, which demonstrate need based on the presumptive need level applicable on or before that date (\$108,046), shall be effective based on the date of application in accordance with 43 Pa. Code § 5.25 (relating to effective date of exemption).

Applications pending on December 31, 2024, which do not demonstrate need based on the presumptive need level applicable on or before that date but demonstrate need under the adjusted presumptive need level applicable on January 1, 2025, shall be effective as of January 1, 2025.

Applications submitted to county boards for the assessment and revision of taxes, or similar boards for the assessment of taxes, on or after January 1, 2025, shall be effective based on the date of application as provided by 43 Pa. Code § 5.25.

Applicants who were denied certificates of need prior to January 1, 2025, but who believe they may qualify under the newly adjusted presumptive need level, can reapply with the effective date based on the date of the new application as provided by 43 Pa. Code § 5.25.

Pennsylvania \$500 Cash Comet Fast Play Game 5266

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. *Name*: The name of the Fast Play lottery game is Pennsylvania \$500 Cash Comet (“\$500 Cash Comet”). The game number is PA-5266.

2. *Definitions*:

(a) *\$500 COMET CASH*: The area at the bottom of a \$500 Cash Comet ticket containing one play symbol. The player wins a prize of \$500 when a Comet (WIN500) play symbol appears in the “\$500 COMET CASH” area. “\$500 COMET CASH” is played separately.

(b) *Authorized retailer* or *retailer*: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.

(c) *Bar code*: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.

(d) *Game Ticket*: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player’s record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.

(e) *Lottery Central Computer System*: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.

(f) *Lottery Terminal*: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

(g) *MOON MULTIPLIER*: The area to the left of the “WINNING NUMBERS” on a \$500 Cash Comet ticket containing one multiplier play symbol. The player multiplies the total won in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area by the multiplier shown in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area.

(h) *Play*: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.

(i) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.

(j) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.

(k) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.

(l) *WINNING NUMBERS*: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area.

(m) *Winning ticket*: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.

(n) *YOUR NUMBERS*: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area.

3. *Price*: The price of a \$500 Cash Comet ticket is \$10.

4. *Description of the \$500 Cash Comet Fast Play lottery game*:

(a) The \$500 Cash Comet lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. \$500 Cash Comet tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an autho-

rized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.

(b) \$500 Cash Comet is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area to any of the play symbols located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol. The player will multiply the total prize amount won in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area by the multiplier shown in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area and win that amount. A bet slip is not used to play this game.

(c) \$500 Cash Comet is also played by finding a Comet (WIN500) play symbol in the “\$500 COMET CASH” area. Players finding a Comet (WIN500) play symbol in the “\$500 COMET CASH” area will win a prize of \$500.

(d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 6 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).

(e) \$500 Cash Comet tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.

(f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a \$500 Cash Comet ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

(g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a \$500 Cash Comet ticket and select the \$500 Cash Comet option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

5. \$500 Cash Comet ticket characteristics:

(a) \$500 Cash Comet tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.

(b) *Play Symbols:* \$500 Cash Comet tickets will contain one play area, consisting of a “WINNING NUMBERS” area, a “YOUR NUMBERS” area, a “MOON MULTIPLIER” area and a “\$500 COMET CASH” area. The play symbols and their captions located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area are: 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWY TWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRT), 31 (THYONE), 32 (THYTWO), 33 (THYTHR), 34 (THYFOR) and 35 (THYFIV). The play symbols and their captions located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area are: 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWY TWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN), 30 (THIRT), 31 (THYONE), 32 (THYTWO), 33 (THYTHR), 34 (THYFOR), 35 (THYFIV) and an Alien (ALIEN) symbol. The play symbols located in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area are: 1X (NOMULT) symbol, 2X (2TIMES) symbol, 5X (5TIMES) symbol, 10X (10TIMES) symbol and a 25X (25TIMES) symbol. The play symbols and their captions located in the “\$500 COMET CASH” area are: Star (TRYAGAIN) symbol, Planet (NOBONUS) symbol, Sun (TRYAGAIN) symbol,

Star (NOBONUS) symbol, Planet (TRYAGAIN) symbol and a Comet (WIN500) symbol.

(c) *Prize Symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area are: \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN), \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY), \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY), \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$250 (TWOHUNFTY) and \$500 (FIV HUN).

(d) *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$10, \$15, \$20, \$30, \$40, \$50, \$100, \$250 and \$500. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 7 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to ten times on a ticket.

(e) *Approximate number of tickets available for the game:* Approximately 3,000,000 tickets will be available for sale for the \$500 Cash Comet lottery game.

6. Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:

(a) All \$500 Cash Comet prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which an Alien (ALIEN) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$500 (FIV HUN) appears in the Prize area under that Alien (ALIEN) play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which a Comet (WIN500) play symbol appears in the “\$500 COMET CASH” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which a 5X (5TIMES) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$50⁰⁰ (FIFTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which a 10X (10TIMES) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which a 25X (25TIMES) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$500.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$250

(z) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(aa) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(bb) Holders of tickets upon which an Alien (ALIEN) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under that Alien (ALIEN) play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(cc) Holders of tickets upon which an Alien (ALIEN) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN) appears in the Prize area under that Alien (ALIEN) play symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(dd) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(ee) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(ff) Holders of tickets upon which an Alien (ALIEN) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under that Alien (ALIEN) play symbol, and upon

which a 1X (NOMULT) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(gg) Holders of tickets upon which an Alien (ALIEN) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under that Alien (ALIEN) play symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(hh) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which a 2X (2TIMES) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(ii) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(jj) Holders of tickets upon which an Alien (ALIEN) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN) appears in the Prize area under that Alien (ALIEN) play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$15.

(kk) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) play symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(ll) Holders of tickets upon which an Alien (ALIEN) play symbol appears in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under that Alien (ALIEN) play symbol, and upon which a 1X (NOMULT) symbol appears in the “MOON MULTIPLIER” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

7. *Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning:* The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate chances of winning:

8. *Ticket responsibility:*

(a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.

(b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.

(c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

9. *Ticket validation and requirements:*

(a) *Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets.* To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:

(1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.

(2) The game ticket must be intact.

(3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.

(4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.

(5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.

(6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.

(7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.

(8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.

(b) *Invalid or defective game tickets.* A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.

10. *Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:*

(a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.

(b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.

(c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.

(d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:

(1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;

(2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;

(3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and

(4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 12 (relating to unclaimed prizes).

(e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

(f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

11. *Funding for prizes:* Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.

12. *Unclaimed prizes:* Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

13. *Purchase and prize restrictions:* A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery,

Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

14. *Governing law:*

(a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play \$500 Cash Comet lottery game.

(b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

15. *Retailer compensation:*

(a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.

(b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.

16. *Retailer Incentive Programs:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play \$500 Cash Comet lottery game tickets.

17. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

18. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote \$500 Cash Comet or through normal communications methods.

19. *Applicability:* This notice applies only to the \$500 Cash Comet lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania BETTY BOOP™ Fast Play Game 5268

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the Fast Play lottery game is Pennsylvania BETTY BOOP™ (“BETTY BOOP™”). The game number is PA-5268.

2. *Definitions:*

(a) *A WINK AND A GIGGLE WINALL:* A feature at the bottom of a BETTY BOOP™ game ticket with a “LOVE” area that contains one play symbol. The player wins all eight prizes shown in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area if the play symbol in the “LOVE” area is a BETTY BOOP™ (WINALL) symbol.

(b) *Authorized retailer or retailer:* A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.

(c) *Bar code:* The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.

(d) *BOOP LOVE BONUS:* A feature at the top of a BETTY BOOP™ game ticket with a “THOUGHT BUBBLE” area that contains one play symbol. The player wins a prize of \$14 if the play symbol in the “THOUGHT BUBBLE” area is a Heart (WIN14) symbol. “BOOP LOVE BONUS” is played separately.

(e) *Game Ticket:* A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.

(f) *Lottery Central Computer System:* The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.

(g) *Lottery Terminal:* A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

(h) *LOVE:* The area within the “A WINK AND A GIGGLE WINALL” feature that contains one play symbol. The player wins all eight prizes shown in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area if the play symbol in the “LOVE” area is a BETTY BOOP™ (WINALL) symbol.

(i) *Play:* A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.

(j) *Play Area:* The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.

(k) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.

(l) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.

(m) *THOUGHT BUBBLE*: The area within the “BOOP LOVE BONUS” feature that contains one play symbol. The player wins a prize of \$14 if the play symbol in the “THOUGHT BUBBLE” area is a Heart (WIN14) symbol. “BOOP LOVE BONUS” is played separately.

(n) *WINNING NUMBERS*: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area.

(o) *Winning ticket*: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.

(p) *YOUR NUMBERS*: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area.

3. *Price*: The price of a BETTY BOOP™ ticket is \$2.

4. *Description of the BETTY BOOP™ Fast Play lottery game*:

(a) The BETTY BOOP™ lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. BETTY BOOP™ tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.

(b) BETTY BOOP™ is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area to any of the play symbols located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol. A player wins all eight prizes shown in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area when a BETTY BOOP™ (WINALL) play symbol appears in the “LOVE” area. A bet slip is not used to play this game.

(c) BETTY BOOP™ tickets have a “BOOP LOVE BONUS” feature that contains a “THOUGHT BUBBLE” area. A player wins a prize of \$14 when the “THOUGHT BUBBLE” play symbol is a Heart (WIN14) symbol. “BOOP LOVE BONUS” is played separately.

(d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).

(e) BETTY BOOP™ tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.

(f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a BETTY BOOP™ ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

(g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a BETTY BOOP™ ticket and select the BETTY BOOP™ option on the Lottery self-service termi-

nal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

5. *BETTY BOOP™ ticket characteristics*:

(a) BETTY BOOP™ tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.

(b) *Play Symbols*: BETTY BOOP™ tickets will contain a “WINNING NUMBERS” area, a “YOUR NUMBERS” area, a “A WINK AND A GIGGLE WINALL” feature containing a “LOVE” area, and a “BOOP LOVE BONUS” feature containing a “THOUGHT BUBBLE” area. The “BOOP LOVE BONUS” feature is played separately.

(1) The play symbols and their captions, located in the “WINNING NUMBERS” area and the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN) and 20 (TWENT). The play symbols and their captions located in the “THOUGHT BUBBLE” area within the “BOOP LOVE BONUS” feature are: Kiss (NOBONUS) symbol, Star (NOBONUS) symbol, B (NOBONUS) symbol, Musical Note (NOBONUS) symbol and a Heart (WIN14) symbol.

(2) The play symbols and their captions located in the “LOVE” area within the “A WINK AND A GIGGLE WINALL” feature are:

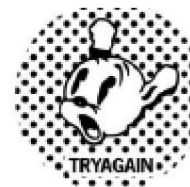

(c) *Prize Symbols:* The prize symbols and their captions, located in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, are: \$2.⁰⁰ (TWO DOL), \$4.⁰⁰ (FOR DOL), \$5.⁰⁰ (FIV DOL), \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$14.⁰⁰ (FOURTEEN), \$20.⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$40.⁰⁰ (FORTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$200 (TWO HUN), \$400 (FOR HUN) and \$14,000 (FORTNTHO).

(d) *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$2, \$4, \$5, \$10, \$14, \$20, \$40, \$100, \$200, \$400 and \$14,000. The prize that can be won in the “BOOP LOVE BONUS” area is \$14. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to nine times on a ticket.

(e) *Approximate number of tickets available for the game:* Approximately 480,000 tickets will be available for sale for the BETTY BOOP™ lottery game.

6. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery (“Lottery”) will conduct an All You Need is Love Second-Chance Drawing (“Drawing”) for which non-winning

BETTY BOOP™ Fast Play lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9 (relating to second-chance drawing).

7. *Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:*

(a) All BETTY BOOP™ prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$14,000 (FORTNTHO) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$14,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$400 (FOR HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which a BETTY BOOP™ (WINALL) play symbol appears in the “LOVE” area and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in three of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$40.⁰⁰ (FORTY) appears in two of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$2.⁰⁰ (TWO DOL) appears in three of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$386.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$200 (TWO HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which a BETTY BOOP™ (WINALL) play symbol appears in the “LOVE” area and a prize symbol of \$40.⁰⁰ (FORTY) appears in four of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in four of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$200.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which a BETTY BOOP™ (WINALL) play symbol appears in the “LOVE” area and a prize symbol of \$40.⁰⁰ (FORTY) appears in three of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$20.⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in three of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$4.⁰⁰ (FOR DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$2.⁰⁰ (TWO DOL) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$186.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which a BETTY BOOP™ (WINALL) play symbol appears in the “LOVE” area and a prize symbol of \$20.⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in four of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$5.⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in four of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which a BETTY BOOP™ (WINALL) play symbol appears in the “LOVE” area and a prize symbol of \$14.⁰⁰ (FOURTEEN) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$10.⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in three of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which a BETTY BOOP™ (WINALL) play symbol appears in the “LOVE” area and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in three of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in three of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$86.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$40.00 (FORTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which a BETTY BOOP™ (WINALL) play symbol appears in the “LOVE” area and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in three of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in five of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which a BETTY BOOP™ (WINALL) play symbol appears in the “LOVE” area and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in three of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$26.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which a BETTY BOOP™ (WINALL) play symbol appears in the “LOVE” area and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in six of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$14.00 (FOURTEEN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$14.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which a Heart (WIN14) symbol appears in the “THOUGHT BUBBLE” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$14.

(s) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(t) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$5.00 (FIV DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$5.

(u) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

8. *Number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning:* The following table sets forth the approximate number of winners, amounts of prizes and approximate chances of winning:

9. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Lottery's All You Need is Love Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying Fast Play lottery game tickets:

(a) *Qualifying Tickets:* Non-winning PA-5267 Howdy, Valentine (\$5), PA-5268 BETTY BOOP™ (\$2) and PA-5269 Sugar Crush (\$1) Fast Play lottery game tickets ("Qualifying Tickets") are eligible for entry into the Drawing.

(b) *Participation and entry:*

(1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit <https://www.PAiLottery.com>. Creating a lottery account is free.

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at <https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/>, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player's date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player's address;

(v) The player's telephone number;

(vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <https://www.palottery.com>, or the Lottery's official mobile application, during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be accepted. Entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(6) Each entry must be complete, and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be accepted.

(7) Only one claimant per entry is allowed.

(8) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(9) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.

(10) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

(c) *Drawing description:*

(1) The Lottery will conduct one All You Need is Love Second-Chance Drawing from among all Fast Play lottery game Qualifying Tickets entered into the Drawing. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time.

(2) The entry period for Fast Play lottery game Qualifying Tickets will begin after 4:59:59 a.m. January 7, 2025 and will end at 11:59:59 p.m. February 14, 2025. All entries received during the entry period will be entered into the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between February 15, 2025, and March 5, 2025.

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site at <https://www.palottery.com>.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Tickets are as follows: PA-5267 Howdy, Valentine (\$5) = five entries, PA-5268 BETTY BOOP™ (\$2) = two entries and PA-5269 Sugar Crush (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:*

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 9(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 9(c)(2).

(i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$20,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The second through the sixth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$4,000.

(iii) The seventh through the fifty-sixth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(3) All cash prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment.

(4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. All winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(5) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(6) The odds of winning a prize in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.

(7) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.

(e) *Drawing restrictions:*

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC, Scientific Games, LLC and MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery terms and conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 30 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 9(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's account.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

10. *Ticket responsibility:*

(a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.

(b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.

(c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

11. *Ticket validation and requirements:*

(a) *Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets.* To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:

(1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.

(2) The game ticket must be intact.

(3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.

(4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.

(5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.

(6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.

(7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.

(8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.

(b) *Invalid or defective game tickets.* A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.

12. Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:

(a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.

(b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.

(c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.

(d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:

(1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;

(2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;

(3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and

(4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).

(e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

(f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

13. *Funding for prizes:* Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.

14. *Unclaimed prizes:* Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

15. *Purchase and prize restrictions:* A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

16. *Governing law:*

(a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play BETTY BOOP™ lottery game.

(b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

17. *Retailer compensation:*

(a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.

(b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.

18. *Retailer Incentive Programs:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play BETTY BOOP™ lottery game tickets.

19. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a

winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

20. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote BETTY BOOP™ or through normal communications methods.

21. *Applicability:* This notice applies only to the BETTY BOOP™ lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Howdy, Valentine Fast Play Game 5267

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. *Name:* The name of the Fast Play lottery game is Pennsylvania Howdy, Valentine (“Howdy, Valentine”). The game number is PA-5267.

2. *Definitions:*

(a) *Authorized retailer or retailer:* A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.

(b) *Bar code:* The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.

(c) *CACTUS COUNT-UP:* When five Cactus Heart play symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area the player increases each prize won in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area by \$5.

(d) *Game Ticket:* A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player's record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.

(e) *LASSO:* The area at the top of a Howdy, Valentine game ticket containing one play symbol. When the “LASSO” play symbol matches the “WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD” play symbol located in the “WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD” area the player wins all 12 prizes shown in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area.

(f) *Lottery Central Computer System:* The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.

(g) *Lottery Terminal:* A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including

making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

(h) *Play*: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.

(i) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.

(j) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.

(k) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money, or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.

(l) *WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD*: The area within the "YOUR NUMBERS" area of a Howdy, Valentine game ticket containing one play symbol. When the "LASSO" play symbol matches the "WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD" play symbol the player wins all 12 prizes shown in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area.

(m) *WINNING NUMBERS*: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area.

(n) *Winning ticket*: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.

(o) *YOUR NUMBERS*: The play symbols found in the play area that determine whether a player wins a prize when matched against the play symbols in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area.

3. *Price*: The price of a Howdy, Valentine ticket is \$5.

4. *Description of the Howdy, Valentine Fast Play lottery game*:

(a) The Howdy, Valentine lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Howdy, Valentine tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.

(b) Howdy, Valentine is played by matching any of the play symbols located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area to any of the play symbols located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area. A player matching play symbols in this manner will win the prize shown under the matching "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbol. When five Cactus Heart play symbols appear in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area the player increases each prize won in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area by \$5. A bet slip is not used to play this game.

(c) Howdy, Valentine is also played by matching play symbols in the "LASSO" area and the "WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD" area. The player will win all 12 prizes shown in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area when the "LASSO" play symbol matches the "WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD" play symbol.

(d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).

(e) Howdy, Valentine tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.

(f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Howdy, Valentine ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

(g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Howdy, Valentine ticket and select the Howdy, Valentine option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

5. *Howdy, Valentine ticket characteristics*:

(a) Howdy, Valentine tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.

(b) *Play Symbols*: Howdy, Valentine tickets will contain one play area, consisting of a "WINNING NUMBERS" area, a "YOUR NUMBERS" area, a "LASSO" area containing one play symbol, and a "WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD" area containing one play symbol. The play symbols and their captions located in the "WINNING NUMBERS" area and the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: 1 (ONE), 2 (TWO), 3 (THREE), 4 (FOUR), 5 (FIVE), 6 (SIX), 7 (SEVEN), 8 (EIGHT), 9 (NINE), 10 (TEN), 11 (ELEVN), 12 (TWLV), 13 (THRTN), 14 (FORTN), 15 (FIFTN), 16 (SIXTN), 17 (SVNTN), 18 (EGHTN), 19 (NINTN), 20 (TWENT), 21 (TWYONE), 22 (TWYTWO), 23 (TWYTHR), 24 (TWYFOR), 25 (TWYFIV), 26 (TWYSIX), 27 (TWYSVN), 28 (TWYEGT), 29 (TWYNIN) and 30 (THIRT). The play symbols located in the "LASSO" area and the "WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD" area are: Horseshoe (HSHOE) symbol, Hat (HAT) symbol, Saddle (SADDLE) symbol, Snake (SNAKE) symbol, Bandana (BNDANA) symbol, Lizard (LIZARD) symbol, Dreamcatcher (CATCHER) symbol, Saloon (SALOON) symbol, Wolf (WOLF) symbol and a Wheel (WHEEL) symbol. The "CACTUS COUNT-UP" play symbol located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area is a Cactus Heart symbol.

(c) *Prize Symbols*: The prize symbols and their captions located in the "YOUR NUMBERS" area are: \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL), \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN), \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY), \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$400 (FOR HUN), \$1,000 (ONE THO), \$4,000 (FOR THO) and \$24,000 (TWYFORTHO).

(d) *Prizes*: The prizes that can be won in this game are: \$5, \$10, \$15, \$20, \$30, \$40, \$100, \$400, \$1,000, \$4,000 and \$24,000. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to 12 times on a ticket.

(e) *Approximate number of tickets available for the game*: Approximately 480,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Howdy, Valentine lottery game.

6. *Second-Chance Drawing*: The Pennsylvania Lottery ("Lottery") will conduct an All You Need is Love Second-Chance Drawing ("Drawing") for which non-winning Howdy, Valentine lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9 (relating to second-chance drawing).

7. *Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners*:

(a) All Howdy, Valentine prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which any of the "YOUR NUMBERS" play symbols match any of the "WINNING

NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$24,000 (TWYFORTH) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$24,000.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$4,000 (FOR THO) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4,000.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which the “LASSO” play symbol matches the “WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD” play symbol and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in three of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$400 (FOR HUN) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY) appears in three of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in four of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4,000.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which the “LASSO” play symbol matches the “WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD” play symbol and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$400 (FOR HUN) appears in four of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in three of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY) appears in two of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4,000.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$1,000 (ONE THO) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which the “LASSO” play symbol matches the “WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD” play symbol and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in five of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in four of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$400 (FOR HUN) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,000.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which the “LASSO” play symbol matches the “WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD” play symbol and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in five of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which the “LASSO” play symbol matches the “WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD” play symbol and a prize symbol of \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY) appears in five of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY) appears in six of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which the “LASSO” play symbol matches the “WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD” play symbol and a prize symbol of \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY) appears in three of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY) appears in five of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in one of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which five Cactus Heart symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$105.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$100 (ONE HUN) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which the “LASSO” play symbol matches the “WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD” play symbol and a prize symbol of \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN) appears in two of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in four of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in six of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which the “LASSO” play symbol matches the “WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD” play symbol and a prize symbol of \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL) appears in six of the Prize areas, a prize symbol of \$5⁰⁰ (FIV DOL) appears in five of the Prize areas and a prize symbol of \$15⁰⁰ (FIFTEEN) appears in one of the Prize areas, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which five Cactus Heart symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$45.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(s) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30⁰⁰ (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which five

Cactus Heart symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$35.

(t) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$30.⁰⁰ (THIRTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$30.

(u) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, and upon which five Cactus Heart symbols appear in the “YOUR NUMBERS” area, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$25.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which any of the “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbols match any of the “WINNING NUMBERS” play symbols and a prize symbol of \$20.⁰⁰ (TWENTY) appears in the Prize area under the matching “YOUR NUMBERS” play symbol, on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD: Match the LASSO symbol to the WANTED \$WINALL\$ REWARD symbol to win ALL 12 prizes shown in the YOUR NUMBERS area!

CACTUS COUNT-UP: Find five "CACTUS HEART" symbols in the YOUR NUMBERS area to ADD \$5 to ANY prize won!

Prizes, including top prizes, are subject to availability at the time of purchase.

9. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Lottery's All You Need is Love Second-Chance Drawing for qualifying Fast Play lottery game tickets:

(a) *Qualifying Tickets:* Non-winning PA-5267 Howdy, Valentine (\$5), PA-5268 BETTY BOOP™ (\$2) and PA-5269 Sugar Crush (\$1) Fast Play lottery game tickets ("Qualifying Tickets") are eligible for entry into the Drawing.

(b) *Participation and entry:*

(1) Entrants must have a registered lottery account in order to participate in the Drawing. To create a lottery account, visit <https://www.PAiLottery.com>. Creating a lottery account is free.

(2) A registered lottery account holder is subject to the iLottery regulations and specifically agrees to be bound by the iLottery terms and conditions located at <https://www.pailottery.com/signup/terms-and-conditions/>, as well as any related policies.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player's date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player's address;

(v) The player's telephone number;

(vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <https://www.palottery.com>, or the Lottery's official mobile application, during the entry period. The identifying information from a Qualifying Ticket may be submitted only once in the Drawing. Entries will automatically be awarded at the time of successful submission of a Qualifying Ticket. No other method of submission will be

accepted. Entries submitted using any other method, including entries mailed or hand-delivered to the Lottery, are not valid and will be disqualified.

(6) Each entry must be complete, and the information supplied by the entrant must be accurate. Incomplete entries cannot be accepted.

(7) Only one claimant per entry is allowed.

(8) Entrants must be 18 years of age or older.

(9) Players may submit the identifying information from an unlimited number of Qualifying Tickets in the Drawing.

(10) Once an entry has been submitted it cannot be withdrawn or changed.

(c) *Drawing description:*

(1) The Lottery will conduct one All You Need is Love Second-Chance Drawing from among all Fast Play lottery game Qualifying Tickets entered into the Drawing. All time references are Eastern Prevailing Time.

(2) The entry period for Fast Play lottery game Qualifying Tickets will begin after 4:59:59 a.m. January 7, 2025 and will end at 11:59:59 p.m. February 14, 2025. All entries received during the entry period will be entered into the Drawing tentatively scheduled to be held between February 15, 2025, and March 5, 2025.

(3) The entry period for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site at <https://www.palottery.com>.

(4) The number of entries an entrant will receive for the Drawing is determined by the purchase price of the Qualifying Ticket entered. The purchase price and corresponding number of entries for the Qualifying Tickets are as follows: PA-5267 Howdy, Valentine (\$5) = five entries, PA-5268 BETTY BOOP™ (\$2) = two entries and PA-5269 Sugar Crush (\$1) = one entry.

(5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:*

(1) The prize entitlements described below are subject to all restrictions and limitations described in section 9(e), or those mentioned anywhere else in these rules.

(2) Lottery will conduct one Drawing from among all the entries received during the entry period as described in section 9(c)(2).

(i) The first entry selected in the Drawing will be a winning entry and the entrant who submitted that winning entry shall be entitled to a prize of \$20,000, less required income tax withholding.

(ii) The second through the sixth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$4,000.

(iii) The seventh through the fifty-sixth entries selected in the Drawing will be winning entries and the entrants who submitted those winning entries shall each be entitled to a prize of \$100 iLottery Bonus Money.

(3) All cash prizes will be paid as a lump-sum cash payment.

(4) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money are not required to claim a prize. All winners of iLottery Bonus Money will have the iLottery Bonus Money credited to their lottery account and will receive an email notifying them that they won a prize.

(5) The number of winning entries to be selected for the Drawing will be posted to the Lottery's publicly accessible web site.

(6) The odds of winning a prize in the Drawing depend upon the number of entries received for the Drawing.

(7) A computer-generated randomizer will be used to select the Drawing winners.

(e) *Drawing restrictions:*

(1) To be eligible to participate in the Drawing, entrants must have complied with the requirements of these rules.

(2) The Lottery is not responsible for late, lost or misdirected entries not entered into the Drawing. The Lottery is not responsible for entries that are not entered into the Drawing because of incompatible internet browsers, mobile Lottery application failure or other technical issues. The Lottery is not responsible for entries not entered due to delays in creating a lottery account or the inability to create a lottery account. If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC, Scientific Games, LLC and MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

(10) Final determination of winners will be made by the Secretary, whose judgment will be final and binding.

(11) A prize awarded in the Drawing to a person who dies before receiving the prize shall be paid according to 61 Pa. Code § 811.16 (relating to prizes payable after death of a prize winner).

(12) A winner is responsible for all taxes arising from or in connection with any prize won.

(13) A player may only win the prize for which the player is first selected in the Drawing. Subsequent entries, from the same individual, selected in the same Drawing will be disqualified and one replacement entry will be selected.

(14) Winners of iLottery Bonus Money must abide by the iLottery terms and conditions, the iLottery Bonus Policy and these rules. iLottery Bonus Money will expire 30 days from the date on which the winner was notified, via email, of the prize win, as further detailed in section 9(d)(4). iLottery Bonus Money has a five times play through requirement in order to convert the iLottery Bonus Money into cash. For example, for a player winning \$100 of iLottery Bonus Money, the player is required to place \$500 in wagers before the iLottery Bonus Money awarded is converted into cash which may be withdrawn from the player's account.

(15) Prizes are not transferrable.

(16) Other restrictions may apply.

10. *Ticket responsibility:*

(a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.

(b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.

(c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

11. *Ticket validation and requirements:*

(a) *Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets.* To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:

(1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.

(2) The game ticket must be intact.

(3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.

(4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.

(5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.

(6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.

(7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.

(8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.

(b) *Invalid or defective game tickets.* A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.

12. *Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:*

(a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.

(b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.

(c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.

(d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:

(1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;

(2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;

(3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and

(4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).

(e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

(f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

13. *Funding for prizes:* Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.

14. *Unclaimed prizes:* Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

15. *Purchase and prize restrictions:* A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

16. *Governing law:*

(a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Howdy, Valentine lottery game.

(b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

17. *Retailer compensation:*

(a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.

(b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.

18. *Retailer Incentive Programs:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Howdy, Valentine lottery game tickets.

19. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

20. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Howdy, Valentine or through normal communications methods.

21. *Applicability*: This notice applies only to the Howdy, Valentine lottery game announced in this notice.

Pennsylvania Sugar Crush Fast Play Game 5269

Under the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314) and 61 Pa. Code § 803.11 (relating to powers and duties of the Secretary of Revenue), the Secretary of Revenue hereby provides public notice of the rules for the following lottery game:

1. *Name*: The name of the Fast Play lottery game is Pennsylvania Sugar Crush (“Sugar Crush”). The game number is PA-5269.

2. *Definitions*:

(a) *Authorized retailer or retailer*: A person who is properly licensed by the Lottery pursuant to 61 Pa. Code §§ 805.1—805.17.

(b) *Bar code*: The symbology on the ticket containing certain encrypted validation and accounting data used for identifying winning and losing tickets.

(c) *GAME*: A specific, pre-defined portion of the play area containing four prize symbols and a “SWEET TREAT” play symbol in a horizontal line that determines whether a player wins a prize when three matching prize amounts appear in the same “GAME.” Each “GAME” is played separately.

(d) *Game Ticket*: A bearer instrument produced through a Lottery Terminal that is the player’s record of a play for a Fast Play lottery game and sold by an authorized retailer containing the play and validation data as published in this game notice.

(e) *Lottery Central Computer System*: The computer gaming system on which all Fast Play plays are recorded.

(f) *Lottery Terminal*: A device authorized by the Lottery to function in an interactive mode with the Lottery Central Computer System for the purpose of issuing plays, executing Quick Pick selections, and entering, receiving, and processing lottery transactions, including making purchases, validating plays, transmitting reports and performing inventory functions.

(g) *Play*: A chance to participate in a particular Fast Play lottery game.

(h) *Play Area*: The area on a ticket which contains one or more play symbols.

(i) *Play Symbol*: A number, letter, symbol, image or other character found in the play area which is used to determine whether a player wins a prize.

(j) *Prize*: A non-monetary item, money or experience that can be won as specified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners) of this game notice.

(k) *SUGAR CRUSH*: A feature of the Sugar Crush game. The player wins all four of the prize amounts shown in any “GAME” when the “SWEET TREAT” play

symbol for that “GAME” matches the “SUGAR CRUSH” play symbol in the top right corner of a Sugar Crush game ticket.

(l) *SWEET TREAT*: The play symbol located in the middle of each “GAME.” The player wins all four of the prize amounts shown in any “GAME” when the “SWEET TREAT” play symbol for that “GAME” matches the “SUGAR CRUSH” play symbol.

(m) *Winning ticket*: A game ticket which has been validated and qualifies for a prize.

3. *Price*: The price of a Sugar Crush ticket is \$1.

4. *Description of the Sugar Crush Fast Play lottery game*:

(a) The Sugar Crush lottery game is an instant win game printed from a Lottery Terminal. All prizes are predetermined, and the player does not have the ability to select their own play symbols. Sugar Crush tickets may be purchased from an authorized retailer or at a Lottery self-service terminal that sells terminal-based Lottery game tickets. Tickets purchased from an authorized retailer shall be printed on-demand at the time of purchase and may not be preprinted by the retailer.

(b) Sugar Crush is played by matching three of the prize amounts in any “GAME.” A player correctly matching prize amounts in this manner will win the matching prize amount. A bet slip is not used to play this game.

(c) Sugar Crush tickets contain a “SUGAR CRUSH” feature. A player wins all four of the prize amounts shown in any “GAME” when the “SWEET TREAT” play symbol for that “GAME” matches the “SUGAR CRUSH” spot play symbol.

(d) Players can win the prizes identified in section 7 (relating to prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners).

(e) Sugar Crush tickets cannot be canceled or voided once printed by the Lottery Terminal, even if printed in error.

(f) To purchase a ticket at an authorized retailer, a player must remit the purchase price to the retailer and verbally request a Sugar Crush ticket. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

(g) To purchase a ticket at a Pennsylvania Lottery self-service terminal, the player must insert into the self-service terminal a dollar amount equal to the total purchase price of a Sugar Crush ticket and select the Sugar Crush option on the Lottery self-service terminal. The ticket shall be the only valid proof of the bet placed and the only valid receipt for claiming a prize.

5. *Sugar Crush ticket characteristics*:

(a) Sugar Crush tickets shall contain a play area, the cost of the play, the date of sale and a bar code.

(b) *Play Symbols*: Sugar Crush tickets will contain four “GAME” areas designated as “GAME 1,” “GAME 2,” “GAME 3” and “GAME 4,” respectively. The prize amounts and their captions located in each of the four “GAME” areas are: FREE (TICKET), \$1⁰⁰ (ONE DOL), \$2⁰⁰ (TWO DOL), \$4⁰⁰ (FOR DOL), \$10⁰⁰ (TEN DOL), \$14⁰⁰ (FOURTEEN), \$20⁰⁰ (TWENTY), \$40⁰⁰ (FORTY), \$100 (ONE HUN), \$400 (FOR HUN) and \$1,400 (FRTHUN). The play symbols and their captions located in “SUGAR CRUSH” spot, and the “SWEET TREAT” play symbols located in each of the four “GAME” areas are: Frosting (FROSTING) symbol, Candy (CANDY) symbol,

Lollipop (LOLLIPOP) symbol, Gumdrop (GUMDROP) symbol, Sprinkles (SPRNKLES) symbol, Cherry (CHERRY) symbol, Heart (HEART) symbol, Lime Cake (LIMECKE) symbol, Chocolate Cake (CHCLTCKE) symbol, Blueberry Cake (BLBRYCKE) symbol, Red Velvet Cake (VLVTCKE) symbol and a Lemon Cake (LEMNCKE) symbol.

(c) *Prizes:* The prizes that can be won in this game are: Free \$1 Ticket, \$1, \$2, \$4, \$10, \$14, \$20, \$40, \$100, \$400 and \$1,400. For a complete description of how these prizes can be won, see section 8 (relating to number and description of prizes and approximate chances of winning). A player can win up to five times on a ticket.

(d) *Approximate number of tickets available for the game:* Approximately 720,000 tickets will be available for sale for the Sugar Crush lottery game.

6. *Second-Chance Drawing:* The Pennsylvania Lottery ("Lottery") will conduct an All You Need is Love Second-Chance Drawing ("Drawing") for which non-winning Sugar Crush lottery game tickets may be eligible as provided for in section 9 (relating to second-chance drawing).

7. *Prizes available to be won and determination of prize winners:*

(a) All Sugar Crush prize payments will be made as one-time, lump-sum cash payments.

(b) Holders of tickets upon which three matching prize amounts of \$1,400 (FRTNHUN) appear in the same "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1,400.

(c) Holders of tickets upon which three matching prize amounts of \$400 (FOR HUN) appear in the same "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$400.

(d) Holders of tickets upon which three matching prize amounts of \$100 (ONE HUN) appear in the same "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(e) Holders of tickets upon which the "SWEET TREAT" play symbol in any "GAME" matches the "SUGAR CRUSH" play symbol and two prize amounts of \$40.00 (FORTY) and two prize amounts of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appear in that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$100.

(f) Holders of tickets upon which the "SWEET TREAT" play symbol in any "GAME" matches the "SUGAR CRUSH" play symbol and two prize amounts of \$10.00 (TEN DOL), one prize amount of \$40.00 (FORTY) and one prize amount of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appear in that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$80.

(g) Holders of tickets upon which the "SWEET TREAT" play symbol in any "GAME" matches the "SUGAR CRUSH" play symbol and one prize amount of \$40.00 (FORTY), one prize amount of \$14.00 (FOURTEEN), one prize amount of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) and one prize amount of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appear in that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$60.

(h) Holders of tickets upon which three matching prize amounts of \$40.00 (FORTY) appear in the same "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(i) Holders of tickets upon which the "SWEET TREAT" play symbol in any "GAME" matches the "SUGAR CRUSH" play symbol and one prize amount of \$20.00 (TWENTY), one prize amount of \$14.00 (FOURTEEN),

one prize amount of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) and one prize amount of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appear in that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(j) Holders of tickets upon which the "SWEET TREAT" play symbol in any "GAME" matches the "SUGAR CRUSH" play symbol and two prize amounts of \$14.00 (FOURTEEN), one prize amount of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) and one prize amount of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appear in that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$40.

(k) Holders of tickets upon which the "SWEET TREAT" play symbol in any "GAME" matches the "SUGAR CRUSH" play symbol and two prize amounts of \$14.00 (FOURTEEN) and two prize amounts of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appear in that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$36.

(l) Holders of tickets upon which three matching prize amounts of \$20.00 (TWENTY) appear in the same "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(m) Holders of tickets upon which the "SWEET TREAT" play symbol in any "GAME" matches the "SUGAR CRUSH" play symbol and two prize amounts of \$4.00 (FOR DOL), one prize amount of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) and one prize amount of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appear in that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(n) Holders of tickets upon which the "SWEET TREAT" play symbol in any "GAME" matches the "SUGAR CRUSH" play symbol and two prize amounts of \$1.00 (ONE DOL), one prize amount of \$14.00 (FOURTEEN) and one prize amount of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appear in that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$20.

(o) Holders of tickets upon which the "SWEET TREAT" play symbol in any "GAME" matches the "SUGAR CRUSH" play symbol and two prize amounts of \$2.00 (TWO DOL), one prize amount of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) and one prize amount of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) appear in that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$18.

(p) Holders of tickets upon which three matching prize amounts of \$14.00 (FOURTEEN) appear in the same "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$14.

(q) Holders of tickets upon which the "SWEET TREAT" play symbol in any "GAME" matches the "SUGAR CRUSH" play symbol and two prize amounts of \$1.00 (ONE DOL), one prize amount of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) and one prize amount of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appear in that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$14.

(r) Holders of tickets upon which the "SWEET TREAT" play symbol in any "GAME" matches the "SUGAR CRUSH" play symbol and two prize amounts of \$4.00 (FOR DOL) and two prize amounts of \$2.00 (TWO DOL) appear in that "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$12.

(s) Holders of tickets upon which three matching prize amounts of \$10.00 (TEN DOL) appear in the same "GAME," on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(t) Holders of tickets upon which the "SWEET TREAT" play symbol in any "GAME" matches the "SUGAR CRUSH" play symbol and two prize amounts of \$4.00

(FOR DOL) and two prize amounts of \$1^{.00} (ONE DOL) appear in that “GAME,” on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$10.

(u) Holders of tickets upon which the “SWEET TREAT” play symbol in any “GAME” matches the “SUGAR CRUSH” play symbol and two prize amounts of \$1^{.00} (ONE DOL), one prize amount of \$4^{.00} (FOR DOL) and one prize amount of \$2^{.00} (TWO DOL) appear in that “GAME,” on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$8.

(v) Holders of tickets upon which the “SWEET TREAT” play symbol in any “GAME” matches the “SUGAR CRUSH” play symbol and two prize amounts of \$2^{.00} (TWO DOL) and two prize amounts of \$1^{.00} (ONE DOL) appear in that “GAME,” on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$6.

(w) Holders of tickets upon which three matching prize amounts of \$4^{.00} (FOR DOL) appear in the same

“GAME,” on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$4.

(x) Holders of tickets upon which three matching prize amounts of \$2^{.00} (TWO DOL) appear in the same “GAME,” on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$2.

(y) Holders of tickets upon which three matching prize amounts of \$1^{.00} (ONE DOL) appear in the same “GAME,” on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of \$1.

(z) Holders of tickets upon which three matching FREE (TICKET) play symbols appear in the same “GAME,” on a single ticket, shall be entitled to a prize of one Sugar Crush Fast Play Game Ticket.

(3) To establish a lottery account, players must provide the following information:

(i) The player's name as it appears on a valid government-issued identification or tax documents;

(ii) The player's date of birth;

(iii) The entire or last four digits of the player's Social Security Number, or comparable equivalent;

(iv) The player's address;

(v) The player's telephone number;

(vi) The player's email address;

(vii) Any other information established by the Lottery to be necessary to verify the age and identity of the player.

(4) An individual may be required to provide additional information or documentation, as set forth in the iLottery terms and conditions, to establish a lottery account or register for iLottery. The information may be used for iLottery registration or to confirm information provided by that individual during the registration process.

(5) To enter the Drawing, entrants must submit the identifying information from at least one Qualifying Ticket via the Drawing's promotional web site, available at <https://www.palottery.com>, or the Lottery's official mobile application, during the entry period. (5) Players may review prizes won and their entries for the Drawing via the Drawing's promotional web site.

(d) *Prizes available to be won, determination of winners and odds of winning:*

If a Drawing entry is selected as a winner and rejected or otherwise disqualified during or following the Drawing, the Lottery will select one entry to replace the rejected or otherwise disqualified entry in accordance with these rules and Lottery procedure.

(3) If any discrepancy exists between these rules and any material describing the Drawing, these rules shall govern.

(4) Employees of the Lottery, 9Rooftops Marketing, LLC, Scientific Games, LLC and MDI Entertainment, LLC, and their subcontractors, or a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of residence of any such person are not eligible to participate in the Drawing. Offer void where prohibited or restricted.

(5) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel or suspend the Drawing and change these rules

if the Drawing cannot be conducted as planned due to errors in these rules or advertising, unauthorized intervention, tampering, fraud, technical errors, viruses, worms, bugs or any other cause that, in the Lottery's sole judgment, could corrupt or impair the administration, security, fairness, integrity or proper conduct of the Drawing.

(6) All entries shall be subject to verification by the Lottery.

(7) The Lottery reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify an entrant found to be tampering with the operation of the Drawing or to be acting in violation of these rules or applicable law.

(8) The Drawing is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Applicable laws and regulations apply.

(9) Prizes must be claimed within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made within 1 year of the drawing date of the Drawing in which the prize was won, the right of an entrant to claim the prize won, if any, will expire and the prize money will be paid into the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes provided by statute.

10. *Ticket responsibility:*

(a) A Fast Play lottery game ticket is a bearer document deemed to be owned by the person holding the game ticket, except that if a name is contained on the back of the game ticket, the person named will, for all purposes, be considered the owner of the game ticket.

(b) The holder of a Fast Play lottery game ticket has the sole responsibility for checking the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the game ticket.

(c) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a lost or stolen Fast Play lottery game ticket, or for a Fast Play ticket redeemed by a player in error.

11. *Ticket validation and requirements:*

(a) *Valid Fast Play lottery game tickets.* To be a valid Fast Play lottery game ticket, the presented game ticket must meet the following requirements:

(1) The game ticket's bar code shall be present in its entirety.

(2) The game ticket must be intact.

(3) The game ticket may not be mutilated, altered, reconstituted or tampered with.

(4) The game ticket may not be counterfeit or a duplicate of a winning ticket.

(5) The game ticket must have been validly issued.

(6) The game ticket data shall have been recorded on the Lottery Central Computer System and the game ticket data shall match the computer record in every respect.

(7) The game ticket must not be defectively printed or printed or produced in error such that it cannot be processed or validated by the Lottery.

(8) The game ticket must pass other confidential security checks of the Lottery.

(b) *Invalid or defective game tickets.* A game ticket not passing the validation requirements in subsection (a) will be considered invalid and no payment will be made on account of any play recorded thereon. The determination of the Secretary in this regard is final.

12. *Procedures for claiming and payment of prizes:*

(a) A prize may be claimed through an authorized retailer or the Lottery, as provided in this section. A prize must be claimed within 1 year of the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket.

(b) An authorized retailer is authorized to pay prizes of \$2,500 or less. The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize of \$2,500 or less may be paid by a participating authorized retailer if a proper validation pay ticket was issued by the retailer's Lottery Terminal.

(c) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play representing a prize in excess of \$2,500 may present the game ticket to an authorized retailer, Lottery District Office, or Lottery Headquarters.

(d) The holder of a game ticket evidencing a winning play shall present the ticket, in person, to an authorized retailer, Lottery Headquarters or a Lottery District Office. The retailer or the Lottery will issue payment if:

(1) The game ticket is scanned, and the play is validated through the Lottery Terminal or the Lottery Central Computer System;

(2) A claim form is properly and fully completed;

(3) The identification of the claimant is confirmed; and

(4) The winning ticket has not expired, pursuant to this section or section 14 (relating to unclaimed prizes).

(e) The Commonwealth shall not be responsible for a winning play paid in error by an authorized retailer.

(f) In the event a prize described in these rules is not available, the Lottery may either provide a substitute prize, determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won, or make a cash payment to the winner, in an amount determined by the Secretary to have an equivalent value to the prize won.

13. *Funding for prizes:* Moneys will be drawn from the State Lottery Fund, to the extent necessary, to fund the payment of prizes under this section. If this lottery game is terminated for any cause, prize moneys remaining undistributed will remain in the State Lottery Fund and used for purposes otherwise provided for by law.

14. *Unclaimed prizes:* Unclaimed prize money on winning Fast Play lottery game tickets will be retained by the Secretary for payment to the persons entitled thereto for 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket. If no claim is made within 1 year from the sale date of the Fast Play lottery game ticket, the right of a ticket holder to claim the prize represented by that ticket, if any, shall expire.

15. *Purchase and prize restrictions:* A Fast Play lottery game ticket may not be purchased by, and a prize may not be paid, to an officer or employee of the Lottery, Lottery professional services contractors or subcontractors, or to a spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing in the same household of an officer, employee, contractor or subcontractor who is involved in the production, distribution or operation of systems for the validation or accounting of Fast Play games.

16. *Governing law:*

(a) By purchasing a ticket, the purchaser agrees to comply with and abide by the State Lottery Law (72 P.S. §§ 3761-101—3761-314), this notice, instructions, conditions and final decisions of the Secretary, and procedures established by the Secretary for the conduct of the Fast Play Sugar Crush lottery game.

(b) Decisions made by the Secretary, including the declaration of prizes and the payment thereof, in interpretation of this notice are final and binding on players and persons making a claim in respect thereof.

17. *Retailer compensation:*

(a) Authorized retailers may be entitled to compensation as determined by the Lottery.

(b) No authorized retailer or employee of an authorized retailer shall request, demand, or accept gratuities or any compensation other than as provided in subsection (a) in exchange for the performance of duties authorized pursuant to the Lottery retailer's license without the Lottery's prior written authorization.

18. *Retailer Incentive Programs:* The Lottery may conduct a separate Retailer Incentive Program for retailers who sell Pennsylvania Fast Play Sugar Crush lottery game tickets.

19. *Retailer bonus:* The Lottery may offer a retailer bonus in connection with the sale of Pennsylvania Fast Play lottery game tickets. If a retailer bonus is offered, a Lottery retailer shall be eligible for a bonus as described in this section. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$100,000 and not exceeding \$500,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$500. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$500,001 and not exceeding \$1,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$5,000. Lottery retailers who sell a winning ticket that entitles the ticket holder to a prize, either payable in a single installment or having a guaranteed minimum payout, of at least \$1,000,001 and not exceeding \$10,000,000 shall be paid a bonus of \$10,000. A Lottery retailer is entitled only to the largest bonus for which they qualify on a

winning ticket. A bonus will be initiated for payment after the Fast Play game ticket is claimed and validated. A bonus will not be awarded to a Lottery retailer that sells a non-winning Pennsylvania Lottery Fast Play game ticket used to enter a Pennsylvania Lottery second-chance drawing or promotion that is subsequently selected to win a prize.

20. *Termination of the game:* The Secretary may announce a termination date, after which no further tickets from this game may be sold. The announcement will be disseminated through media used to advertise or promote Sugar Crush or through normal communications methods.

21. *Applicability:* This notice applies only to the Sugar Crush lottery game announced in this notice.

Temporary Change to Fishing Regulations; Tobyhanna Lake, Monroe County

The Executive Director of the Fish and Boat Commission (Commission), acting under the authority of 58 Pa. Code § 65.25 (relating to temporary changes to fishing regulations), has taken immediate action to temporarily modify fishing regulations at Tobyhanna Lake, Monroe County, in anticipation of a complete drawdown of the lake. The Executive Director is lifting all seasons, sizes and daily limits for all species, except trout. The season, sizes and daily limits for trout at Tobyhanna Lake will remain under 58 Pa. Code § 61.1(d) (relating to Commonwealth inland waters). The Executive Director has found that this action is necessary and appropriate for the management of the fish at this lake.

The Executive Director will cause these temporary modifications to fishing regulations to be posted in the

vicinity of the lake, and the modified regulations will be fully effective and enforceable when so posted. These temporary modifications will remain in effect until January 1, 2026, unless the Commission shall by then, by appropriate action, have approved the designation or redesignation of waters or shall have approved the revision of the regulation in question.

INSURANCE DEPARTMENT

Increase in the Accident Surcharge Dollar Threshold (Cap) to \$2,250; Notice 2025-01

Insurers writing private passenger automobile insurance in this Commonwealth may not, by law, penalize their policyholders (for example, apply rate surcharges or otherwise increase premiums) whose aggregate claim cost over a 3-year period does not exceed a certain threshold (cap). This threshold (cap) applies to any person injured or property damaged and is measured in excess of any deductible or self-insured retention. Effective July 1, 2025, the Insurance Department (Department) has increased the threshold (cap) to \$2,250.

Section 1799.3(a) of 75 Pa.C.S. (relating to limit on cancellations, refusals to renew, refusals to write, surcharges, rate penalties and point assignments) does not allow an insurer to “cancel or refuse to renew a policy or apply any surcharge, rate penalty or driver record point assignment” when the threshold (cap) is not exceeded.

By law, the Department is required to adjust the amount of the threshold (cap) at least once every 3 years. Section 1799.3(e) of 75 Pa.C.S. requires the adjustment be made relative to changes in the Consumer Price Index for medical care and automobile maintenance and repair costs and may be rounded to the nearest \$50. The previous adjustment to the threshold (cap) was effective July 1, 2023, when the threshold (cap) increased to \$2,100.

Each individual insurer and rating organization should file the previously discussed change for prior approval by April 1, 2025, and specify an effective date of no later than July 1, 2025.

To expedite the review process, companies are advised to limit their rate/rule filings to the required threshold revision only. Unrelated changes, revisions and manual pages should not be included in the filing. Additionally, “surcharge disclosure plan(s)” required under 75 Pa.C.S. § 1793(b) (relating to special provisions relating to premiums) do not require the Department’s review and prior approval and should not be submitted in response to this notice.

Tentative Order

By the Commission:

The Commission’s regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) state that an Electric Generation Supplier (EGS) license will not be issued or remain in force until the licensee furnishes a bond or other security approved by the Commission. In addition, 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(d) states that the maintenance of an EGS license is contingent on the licensee providing proof to the Commission that a bond or other approved security in the amount directed by the Commission has been obtained.

Each EGS must file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other approved financial instrument with Rosemary Chiavetta, Secretary, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA, 17120, prior to the EGS’s current security expiration date. Each financial instrument must be an original document that displays a “wet” signature or digital signature, preferably in blue ink, and displays a “raised seal” or original notary stamp. The name of the principal on the original financial instrument must match exactly with the name that appears on the EGS’s license issued by the Commission.

Failure to file before the financial security’s expiration date may cause Commission staff to initiate a formal proceeding that may lead to the following: cancellation of each company’s electric supplier license, removal of each company’s information from the Commission’s website, and notification to all electric distribution companies, in which each company is licensed to do business, of the cancellation of the license.

As of December 10, 2024, each EGS listed in the Supplier Table below has not provided proof to the Commission that it has a bond or other approved security in the amount or language directed by the Commission, to replace a bond which is expired, or which is non-compliant with Commission regulations.

As part of its EGS license validation procedures, the Commission’s Bureau of Technical Utility Services sent a 90-day Security Renewal Notice email to each entity in the Supplier Table above stating that original documentation of a bond, or other approved security in the amount or language directed by the Commission, must be filed within 30-days prior to each entity’s security expiration date. None of the companies listed in the Supplier Table provided the required documentation.

Based on the above facts, we tentatively conclude that the EGSs listed in the Supplier Table are not in compliance with 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) and (d) and therefore it is appropriate to initiate the cancellation process for the EGS license of each company listed in the Supplier Table,

without the necessity of a formal complaint, as being in the public interest;

Therefore,

It Is Ordered That:

1. Cancellation of the Electric Generation Supplier License of each company listed in the Supplier Table is hereby tentatively approved as being in the public interest.

2. The Secretary (i) serve a copy of this Tentative Order upon the Office of Consumer Advocate, the Office of Small Business Advocate, the Bureau of Investigation & Enforcement, all electric generation distribution companies, and all of the Electric Generation Suppliers listed in

the Supplier Table; (ii) publish a copy of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 30-day comment period; and (iii) file a copy of this Tentative Order at each Electric Generation Supplier's assigned docket number.

3. To the extent any of the Electric Generation Suppliers listed in the Supplier Table challenge the cancellation of their license, they must file comments within thirty (30) days after publication of this Tentative Order in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Written comments referencing Docket No. M-2024-3045251 must be eFiled to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission through the Commission's eFiling System. You may set up a free eFiling account with the Commission at <https://efiling.puc.pa.gov/> if you do not have one. Filing instructions may be found on the Commission's website at http://www.puc.pa.gov/filing_resources.aspx. Comments containing confidential information should be emailed to Commission Secretary Rosemary Chiavetta at rchiavetta@pa.gov rather than eFiled.

4. Alternatively, Electric Generation Suppliers listed in the Supplier Table may provide the Commission an approved security up to and within thirty (30) days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. The Electric Generation Supplier must file an original bond, letter of credit, continuation certificate, amendment, or other approved financial instrument displaying a "wet" signature or digital signature, preferably in blue ink, and displaying a "raised seal" or original notary stamp with Rosemary Chiavetta, Secretary, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, PA, 17120.

5. Absent the timely (i) filing of comments challenging the cancellation of the Electric Generation Supplier's license, or (ii) the filing of an approved security within 30-days after publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, the Bureau of Technical Utility Services, shall prepare a Final Order for entry by the Secretary revoking the license of each Electric Generation Supplier that fails to respond.

6. Upon entry of the Final Order, Electric Generation Suppliers that remain listed as not in compliance with 52 Pa. Code § 54.40(a) and (d) will be stricken from all active utility lists maintained by the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services and the Assessment Section of the Bureau of Administration, removed from the Commission's website, and notifications be sent to all electric distribution companies in which the Electric Generation Suppliers are licensed to do business.

7. Upon entry of the Final Order, Electric Generation Suppliers that fail to respond will be prohibited from providing electric generation supply services to retail electric customers. That upon entry of the Final Order described in Ordering Paragraph No. 5, each electric distribution company in which the Electric Generation Suppliers are licensed to do business, shall return the customers of the Electric Generation Suppliers to default service.

PHILADELPHIA PARKING AUTHORITY

Petition to Establish Pilot Program; Doc. No. 24-007

Order

By the Authority:

The Philadelphia Parking Authority regulates taxicab and transportation network company (“TNC”) services in Philadelphia through its Taxicab and Limousine Division (“TLD”).¹

On August 15, 2024, Rasier-PA, LLC (“Petitioner”), holder of TNC license 1035574-TNC, filed a petition with the TLD seeking the creation of a TNC-Medallion Taxicab referral system.² The proposed referral system would permit users of the Uber app to select a medallion taxicab in lieu of a TNC vehicle. As proposed, the Uber app will work seamlessly with the medallion taxicab app provided by Curb Mobility, LLC (“Curb”).

Petitioner further proposes that Uber riders who select the taxicab option on the Uber app will see an upfront fare for the taxicab trip prior to selecting the ride. Per Authority Order No. 22-001, the taxicab tariff already permits the use of an upfront flex fare pricing model for trips requested through the Curb app.³ As proposed, each medallion taxicab driver will have the option to accept these Uber referrals, which will all go through the existing taxicab app provided by Curb.

Petitioners note that the proposed cooperation between the Uber app and Curb app has been in place in New York City since 2022. The Petition also attaches letters of support from Curb, Authority certified dispatchers, and Philadelphia taxicab drivers.

Upon filing of the Petition, the TLD began to gather information and comment concerning the Petition. The TLD sought written comments from the industry mem-

bers and the general public through various means.⁴ The TLD received 186 comments relevant to the Petition. The comments received were 53% in favor, 37% unfavorable, and 10% were neutral.

Now, Therefore, under review of the Petition and all related information, it is hereby *Ordered* that the TLD take the following actions in furtherance of this Board’s consideration of the Petition:

(a) The TLD shall test the operability and functionality of the proposed referral system;

(b) The TLD shall determine if the proposed referral system will comply with the Act and the Authority’s regulations and orders including, but not limited to:

1. Taxicab rates and approved tariff, based upon time and mileage;⁵
2. Meter activation, display and receipts;⁶
3. Complaints and lost & found;⁷ and
4. Trip reporting.

(c) Upon conclusion of this investigation, the TLD is to report its findings to this Board together with any further recommendation concerning the Petition; and

(d) The TLD staff shall broadcast this Order to all members of the taxicab industry by email as well as posting it on the Authority’s website and within TLD Headquarters along with depositing this Order with the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* for publishing.
